Old Age Assistance
Miss M. C., age 75, lived with her brother in a South Missis-

sippi County. Her brother died and she applied for Old Age Assistance. She had no relative closer than a nephew, and he could not take care of her. She was approved for a grant of \$30, the maximum in Mississippi. Then she began with the help of the county welfare agent to try to find a room she could pay for and have a little money left for food and clothes. This was difficult. Later she fell and broke her shoulder. The agent secured transportation and she was taken to a charity hospital for treatment. On her return to her small, unsatisfactory room, the agent secured the co-operation of four neighbors. Each woman agreed to take turnabout cleaning the room and preparing her meals until she was able to be up again.
