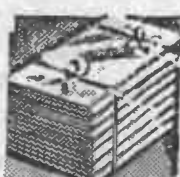

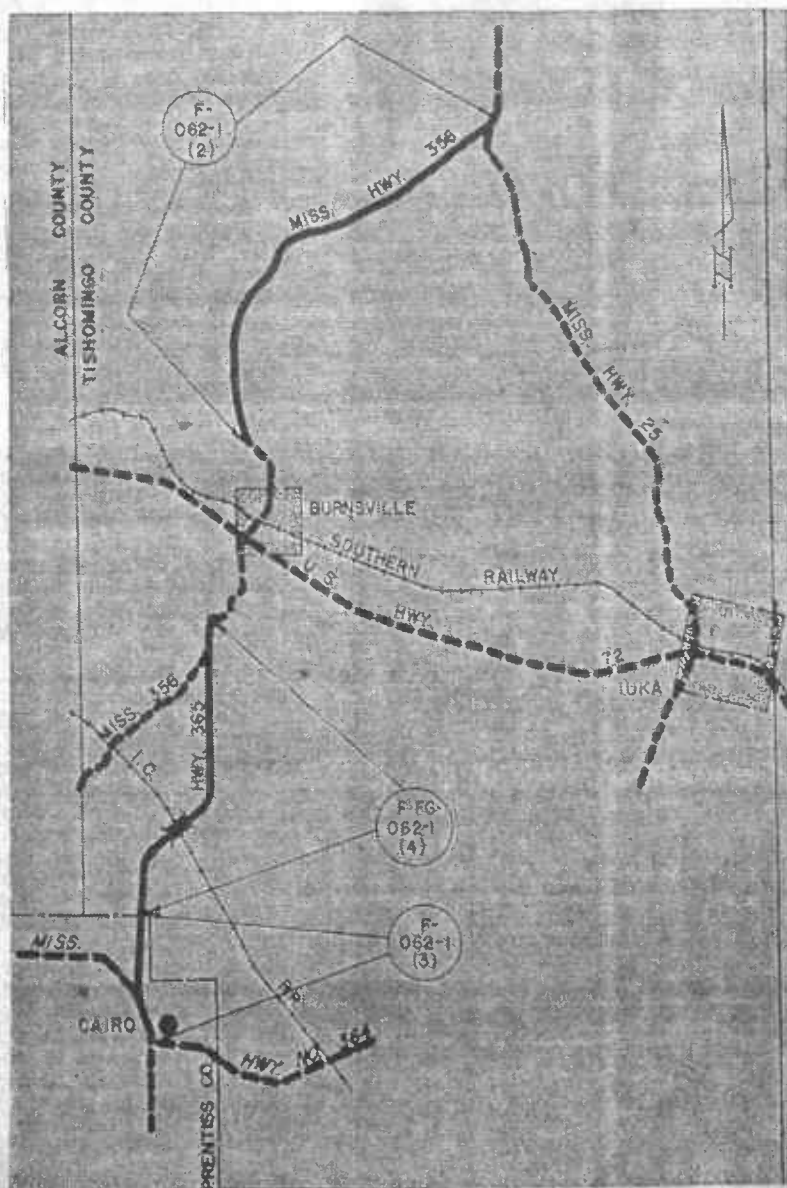

## AN OPEN LETTER TO THE CITIZENS OF ALCORN, PRENTISS AND TISHOMINGO COUNTIES



On or about May 10 we will start construction of a new seven-mile link of Mississippi Highways 365 and 356 south of Burnsville to Cairo in Tishomingo and Prentiss Counties, the exact location of which is shown on the accompanying map. This work will be done concurrently with construction of 6.8 miles of Mississippi Highway 356 north of Burnsville, also shown on the map.

The Mississippi State Highway Commission accepted bids on the Burnsville-Cairo work Tuesday, March 28. Bids on the Burnsville-Cairo link were taken in August by the Commission. In each instance, the Highway Commission advertised for the required 21 days. Our firm was awarded the contracts on the basis of the low bid and the furnishing of a performance bond guaranteeing that we would complete the work according to our contract and the specifications.

Work on these projects will be paid for with 50% federal funds and 50% state funds. In reality, they are being paid for by you, since both State and Federal governments obtain money from taxes paid by you. In other words, these are your roads being built by us, for your future use.

Here are some of the pertinent facts regarding these projects which you as taxpayers will want to know:

1. These highways are being built for your future safety, comfort and convenience. There will be a certain amount of inconvenience to the public during construction but every effort will be made by our firm and the State Highway Department to keep this inconvenience to a minimum. Your cooperation and understanding will be appreciated and will expedite the completion of the work. If practical, the use of alternate routes, rather than traveling on roads under construction, will cause you, the traveling public, far less inconvenience. Your best and most practical solution would be to avoid, if possible, these roads while they are under construction.

2. The cost of these projects will be \$869,333.31. Much of this money will remain in Alcorn, Prentiss and Tishomingo counties through payrolls, purchase of materials and supplies. This money will help bolster the economy of the area. Money will be spent on the purchase of additional equipment, supervision, engineering and overhead. This too will reflect itself in local channels of trade. A small percentage should accrue to the Contractor for profit on his investment. This is in keeping with the free enterprise system under which we operate.

3. While the actual construction of this highway will have an immediate economic impact the major benefit will come in the future growth and development which it is certain to generate. In this age, when every business operation, efficient farming methods and almost all other phases of daily living are keyed to economical movement of goods and people, highways are the biggest single factor in progress. Your interest and support will keep our highway program on the move.

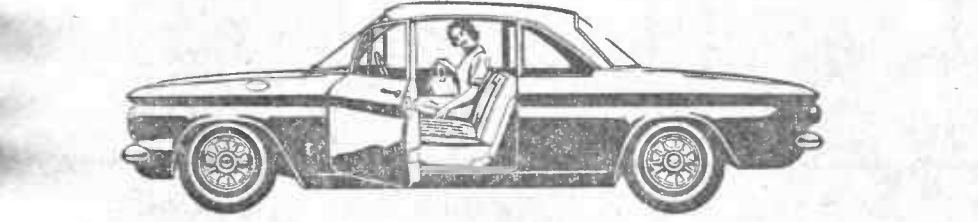

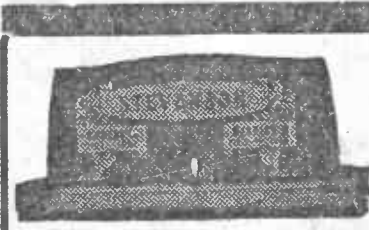
