Downpour Of Rain Fails To Stop Parade Wed. Many Floats Participate In Spite Of Handicap; Curtis Drug Wins

Cloudy skies and a steady downpour of rain failed to stop the annual Christmas parade scheduled to tour the business district of Iuka late Wednesday afternoon. Over 40 entries were lined up with Parade Marshal Junior R. Long and most of them were ready to take their places in the parade line at 4:30.

The first place winner in the parade was awarded \$25.00 in cash, second place winner received \$15.00, and third place winner, \$10.00.

In judging of the floats, first place winner went to Curtis Drug Store. The float, carrying the theme "Before the Flood," pictured a scene of Noah's Ark with animals and people.

**Farmers Approve

Quotas For Year**

E. N. Allen, County ASCS Service Manager, reports that cotton farmers strongly favored marketing quotas in a referendum held Tuesday of this week. Of the farmers voting in the referendum, 526 voted in favor of the controls and 8 voted against.

"Farmers who grow cotton cannot afford to vote out marketing quotas. When they vote the controls, they are guaranteed support price on the 44 crop of cotton at 65 to 90 cents, which will mean 30 to 40 percent more," Mr. Allen said. Ninety-eight and one-half percent of the farmers voting favored the marketing quotas.

Only other company making a bid on complete job was the Charles Story Construction Co. of Kentucky whose bid was \$147,000.00, plus additions.

"To date the total stands at \$187.00, which means we are far short of our goal of \$862.00," the chairman said, "many families will have to be left out unless you send in your contribution today."

Work is expected to begin immediately on the plant that is scheduled to be ready for occupancy by middle of next spring.

Additions to the primary bid of \$111,364.00 are: a cyclone fence at \$3,420.00; a railroad spur at \$8,373.00; roads, streets and parking areas at \$7,692.00.

The Board of Supervisors, in legal session, publicly opened the bids Tuesday morning. Members of the Board present were O. L. Wade, Russell Bonds, and Luneford Stormont. Officials of Consolidated Aluminum Corporation present were F. V. Vahle, manager of engineering, R. G. Michie, administrative assistant, J. G. Orrell, mechanical engineer, and Don Fiske, who will be manager of the Iuka plant when operation is begun.

Consolidated Aluminum Corporation will operate an aluminum foil laminating plant in Iuka. The new industry comes to this area as a result of a bond issue held Dec. 2, in which voters of Supervisors' Districts One, Two and Three overwhelmingly endorsed the company by approving a \$150,000.00 bond issue. Money derived from the bond issue will be used to construct the building only. An additional \$800,000.00 will be spent in installing equipment that will be used in the plant's operation. Total expenditure is expected to be in excess of \$750,000.00.

The new industry will be located in the Iuka industrial park, occupying about 22 acres of the area. Men only will be employed with original operations to require about fifty people. Company officials state that local labor, with the exception of a minimum of supervisory personnel, will be used.

Veterans' Corner

Q—Who is entitled to receive an invalid lift from the VA?
A—Veterans receiving regular aid and attendance support from the VA. In addition, the life must be medically indicated for the veteran.

Q—Will the boys who are in the service now be entitled to government loans when they return to civilian life?
A—Not unless part of their service was before January 31, 1955, when such rights came to an end.

Q—I hear that dependent parents compensation was recently raised but I am still receiving \$75 because of my son's death in World War II. When does this raise become effective?
A—The increase, effective last July, applied to Dependency and Indemnity Compensation only. The older "death compensation" is paid for service-connected deaths occurring before 1957. You may change to the new Dependency and Indemnity Compensation if you wish but this will be advantageous only if your income from all other sources is not over \$750 a year. The graduated rates of the newer law may pay less than your present compensation.

HOME AGENT NOTES

As you make your Holiday cakes and cookies and special breads, you may be trying one of the recipes that call for unsifted flour. But if you are using a favorite recipe you have used for many years, the measurements are for sifted flour.

Since there is more flour in a cup of unsifted flour than in a cup of sifted flour, you must either sift before measuring or adjust the measurement to get the right amount of flour for these older recipes.

To adjust the measurement from sifted to unsifted flour, simply spoon flour into your dry measuring cup, level it off, and remove two level table-

spoonsful.

Gifts You Can Make
Kitchen Items. Decorate wastebasket, recipe file, box, flower pot, and bulletin board to match. You might use an adhesive-backed plastic or some other covering that is inexpensive and easy to use.

Snack Bucket. Paint a child's sandpail with enamel—black is especially modern. Decorate with flowers or an appropriate slogan. Fill with cookies, candies, nuts or other goodies.

Planter Pair. Paint flower pots and decorate with decals that harmonize with colors used in the kitchen or place they will be used. Add a watering can, decorated the same as the flower pots, for an attractive set.

Dressing Table Glamour. Gild a miniature tin loaf pan with gold paint and use household cement to bedeck it with beads, sequins and fancy buttons. For an earring tray, paint a tiny tin muffin pan with gold paint.

For a Traveler. Sand unfinished wooden hangers to remove any rough spots. Wax. Trim with a ribbon bow. For a special touch, tie a tiny fragrant sachet on one, some artificial flowers on another, a small package of bubble bath on another.

It's always a problem to know the exact size to buy when you select clothing as a gift for a child. Just remember, as you make your choice, to make allowances for growth, especially in length.

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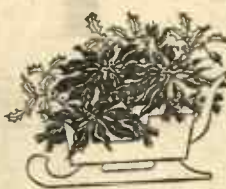
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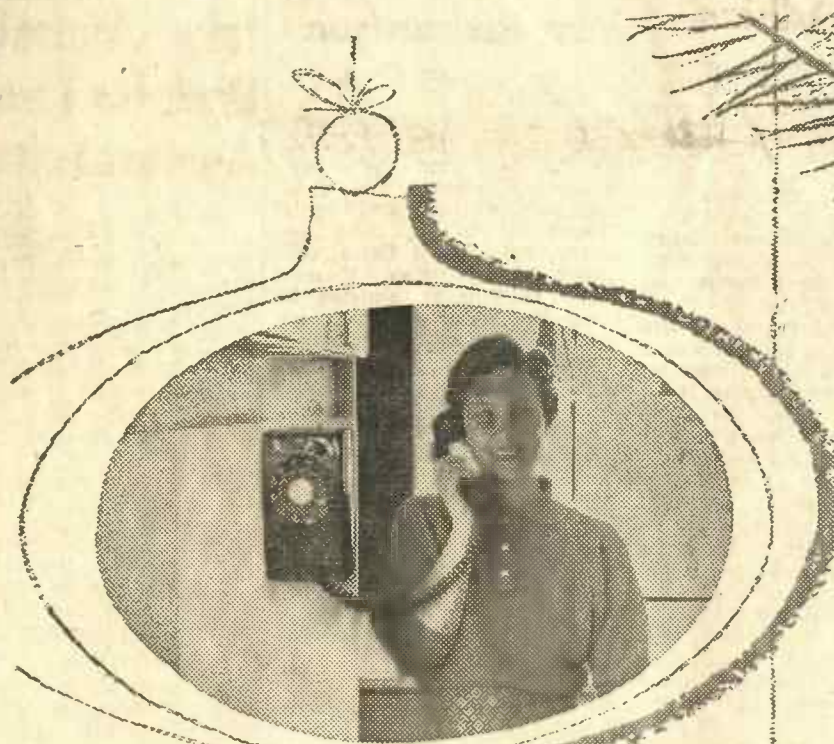
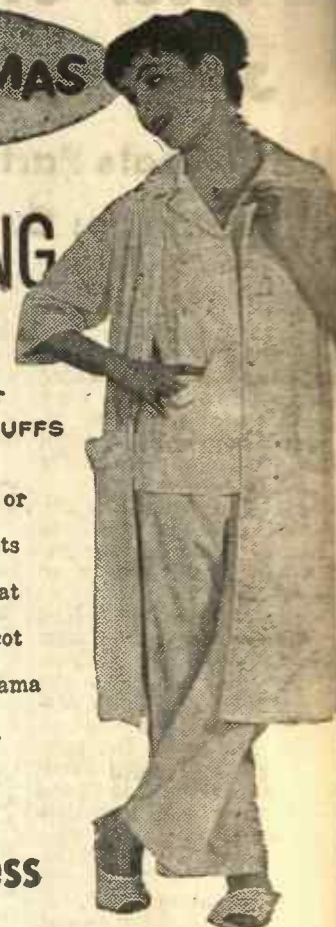

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County Agent's Notes

Fertilizer Notes
You apply phosphate and in band application on crop fields of heavy soils in fall, only little will be by spring.
Do not apply nitrogen in the winter. Neither should you apply phosphate and potash on light medium textured soils.
Watch the shortage of winter

grazing and in many areas, stored feed, farmers should seriously consider topdressing oats and other small grains with a round 40 pounds per acre of nitrogen.

With nitrogen applied the grazing crops will grow fast during warm periods of the winter, depending on moisture available. This is especially important for dairy farmers who may be short on feed.

Planned Dairy Breeding
There is more to planning a breeding program for your dairy cows than just selecting a good bull to use in the herd. A good breeding program should include:

Breeding all heifers at a time so they will freshen at or near the beginning of your base milk period.

After an animal freshens, periods, and breeding dates. Properly identify all females

breeding. Knowing the animals by tattoo, chain number or ear tag is necessary for good herd management.

in the herd to help prevent inbreeding at least 60 days before breeding her back. Breed your cows and heifers to a bull of the same breed. Keep a barn record of freshening dates, heat. Think about artificial breeding. Few dairymen can afford to own the kinds of bulls available in the Mississippi Artificial breeding program. The program offers proved bulls in all of the major dairy breeds:

Jersey—10 proved bulls with daughters averaging up to 11,800 pounds of milk and 671 pounds fat.

Holstein—11 proved bulls with daughter averages up to 17,274 pounds of milk and 654 pounds fat.

Guernsey—five proved sires with daughter averages up to 10,800 pounds milk and 553 pounds fat.

Ayshire and Brown Swiss proved bulls with daughter averages up to almost 14,000 pounds milk.

Costs of artificial breeding in Mississippi are the lowest in the Nation. It is far cheaper to use the artificial breeding program than it is to own and maintain a good herd bull.
