### 1 Directory For Each Household

To conserve paper and reduce costs, South Central Bell has revised its procedure for distributing telephone directories, according to Bill Hardin, the company's local manager.

The new plan calls for distributing one directory per household, instead of one for every two phones in the past. The new policy does not apply to business customers.

"The 'one directory per household' plan will mean a significant saving of paper for the Iuka directory," Hardin said. "The plan will also help hold down the ever increasing costs associated with the production of directories."

Iuka's new directory is now being distributed under the new plan. If you have a special need for more than one directory, additional copies may be obtained at the local South Central Bell business office, Hardin noted.

### Public Hearings

Governor Cliff Finch today urged residents of Tishomingo County to take part in the Governor's Public Hearings on Highways this Monday.

Six hearings will be conducted by the Governor, the Mississippi Highway Department, the Legislative PEER Committee and the Research and Development Center.

Finch said, "We want to get moving now to build the total road system so desperately needed by our people. I urge all Mississippians to come to these hearings so that we can hear what they think and benefit from their ideas."

Hearings for North Mississippi will be held Monday, Sept. 19, in Batesville and Tupelo.

The Batesville meeting will be held at 9:30 a.m., in the Courtroom of the Panola County Courthouse, and the Tupelo session will begin at 2:30 p.m. in the Lee County Library.

Maps, drawings and other information developed by the Governor, the State Highway Department, the PEER Committee and the Research and Development Center will be presented at each hearing.

The general public will be invited to comment at the meetings and written statements will be accepted up to ten days afterwards.

The Governor said he hopes for "great citizen involvement" so we can come up with a highway program which truly meets the needs of our people."

### Records Show 3,370 Enrolled

Total enrollment of students in schools throughout Tishomingo County has reached the 3,370 figure and is still climbing as late enrollees continue to register.

The breakdown begins with Iuka Special Municipal Separate School showing a figure of 1,169 students in school. There are 555 registered in grades 1-6 at the Iuka Elementary School and 614 registered in grades 7-12 at the high school.

The Tishomingo County School System reports a total of 2,201 students enrolled following the first two weeks of the term.

According to Alvia Blakney, Superintendent of Education, Tishomingo County, the breakdown for the county schools is as follows: Belmont Elementary, 408; Belmont High School, 413; Burnsville Elementary, 387; Burnsville High School, 352; Tishomingo Elementary, 282; and Tishomingo High School 329. Late enrollments have altered these figures.

## Tishomingo County Is Eligible For Emergency Loans

A more liberal formula for determining the amount of grant funds, supplementing loans available for improvement of rural community water systems affected by drought, has been put into effect in Mississippi by the Farmers Home Administration (FmHA), the Acting State Director, John S. Cassell, announced this week.

Tishomingo County has been made eligible for FmHA emergency loans and grants under President Carter's drought assistance program to help communities having diminished water supplies, resulting from drought conditions, in designated drought areas. Applications for projects approved must be made in time for funds to be obligated by Sept. 30, 1977.

Acting State Director Cassell said the revised regulations will enable FmHA to apply a formula on grants similar to that used by other federal agencies that help to finance drought emergency water system projects. In calculating a community's ability to repay an emergency loan for water system improvement, FmHA previously has taken into account existing indebtedness only for water facilities. The new formula lets FmHA take into account the applicant's existing indebtedness for all purposes. This is expected to increase the grant portion of FmHA funding of many projects.

The new regulation also provides that some projects, previously not eligible for grant assistance, may receive FmHA grants of up to 20 percent of total eligible project development costs, if they are needed to safeguard public health and safety. A larger proportion of grant funds, up to 50 percent, may be provided if justified through the formula for determining the community's

ability to repay a loan. Application of the revised formula has been made retroactive to May 6, 1977, except where loan and grant funds have been delivered to the borrower. Financing or projects previously approved but not yet funded will be adjusted to the new formula, Cassell said.

School. She was a very dedicated teacher and will long be remembered for her devotion to the youth.

Mrs. Williams was a lifelong member of Springhill Methodist Church. She was a charter member of Delta Kappa Gamma, honorary society; a member of Tishomingo County Retired Teachers Association, Midway Homemakers Club, the Midway RCDC, and took an

active part in all community affairs.

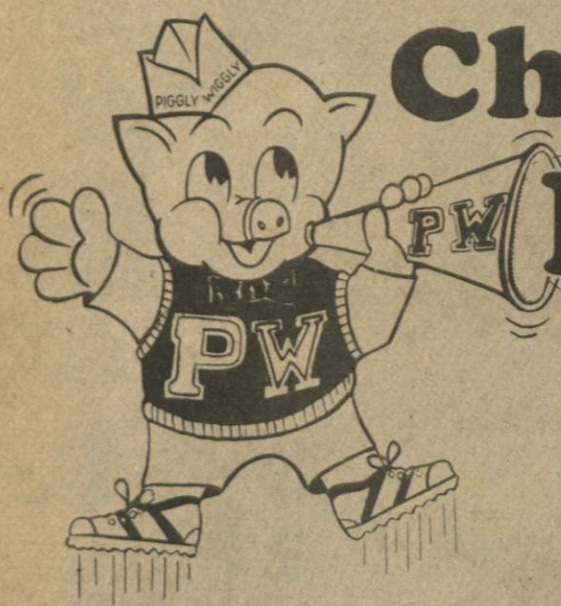

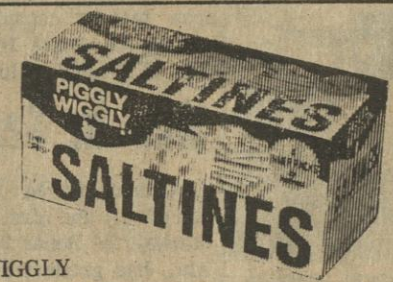

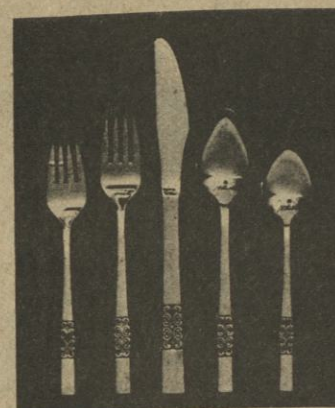

NOTES**HELP CHILDREN  
CARE FOR CLOTHES**

Encourage your teenager to take proper care of clothes - not only for the benefit of the apparel, but for self-discipline.

If you want children to take care of clothes, provide accessories as well as advice. Start the campaign in the clothes closet. There are many attractive, useful and inexpensive boxes, bags, hangers and shoe racks for storage use. For glamour, cover boxes and shelves with wall paper, self-sticking plastic or fabric. Label contents; store each item in its special place.

Cover hangers with bright

fabrics or plastic. Install hooks for belts, and put shelves or racks for shoes.

**CHICKEN LIVER

Halve chicken livers; snip out veiny parts of skin with scissors. Combine butter or margarine, oregano and Worcestershire sauce in a medium sized skillet and brown liver slowly; remove from pan.

Add onion; saute until soft. Blend in flour, salt and pepper; stir in the mushrooms and liquid. Heat, stirring constantly, to boiling; return livers; cover. Simmer three minutes, or just until livers lose their pink color inside.

Stir about 1/4 cup liver mixture into sour cream, then stir back into the pan. Heat very slowly just until hot. Serve over fluffy rice and garnish with crisp bacon slices. Makes six servings.

**COTTON DEFOLIATION**  
Chemical cotton defoliation is necessary for machine harvesting when yields are high and plants have green, succulent foliage. Chemical defoliation is important in producing high quality cotton fiber. However, if used improperly, defoliants or desiccants can reduce yields and quality.

Chemical defoliation may not be needed if fields have matured early, natural defoliation has begun, and remaining leaves are tough. If wet weather becomes a problem during boll opening, consider chemical defoliation. Defoliating too early will result in immature seed, which will contribute to low quality seed for planting next spring. It also reduces seed value to oil mills.

**WINTER GRAZING**

One way to eliminate or reduce hay requirements this winter is to make good use of winter grazing. Ryegrass and small grains seeded on a prepared seedbed should be planted by September 21. The benefit from small grain is early

grazing. However, this benefit is normally not obtained if seeding is after October 1. Seed 30 pounds of ryegrass plus 90 pounds of wheat or other small grain per acre. If seeding ryegrass alone, use 40 pounds of seed.

Winter grazing should be planted only on well-drained soils. Sandy loam and silt soils with good internal drainage and a slope of four to eight percent are ideal. Wet-natured poorly-drained soils are not suited for winter grazing.

**PREVENT FIRE LOSSES**

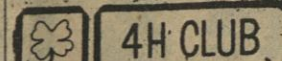
Fires occurring during operation of harvesting equipment pose a threat to farmers. These losses can be prevented by equipping combines, pickers, trucks and other harvesting equipment with a recommended fire extinguisher and training the operator to use it.

Fires on most harvesting equipment and farm trucks involve stalks, straw, gas and oil. This means two classes of fires are possible: (1) class A fires -- ordinary combustible materials such as straw

or wood, and (2) class B fires -- involving flammable liquids or gas and oil.

It is advisable to install a multi-purpose extinguisher rated at 2A - 10 B:C on your equipment. It offers protection for oil and gas fires and gives moderate help against class A fires.

Check extinguishers periodically to make sure they are fully charged. These practices may save your crop or equipment from fire damage.

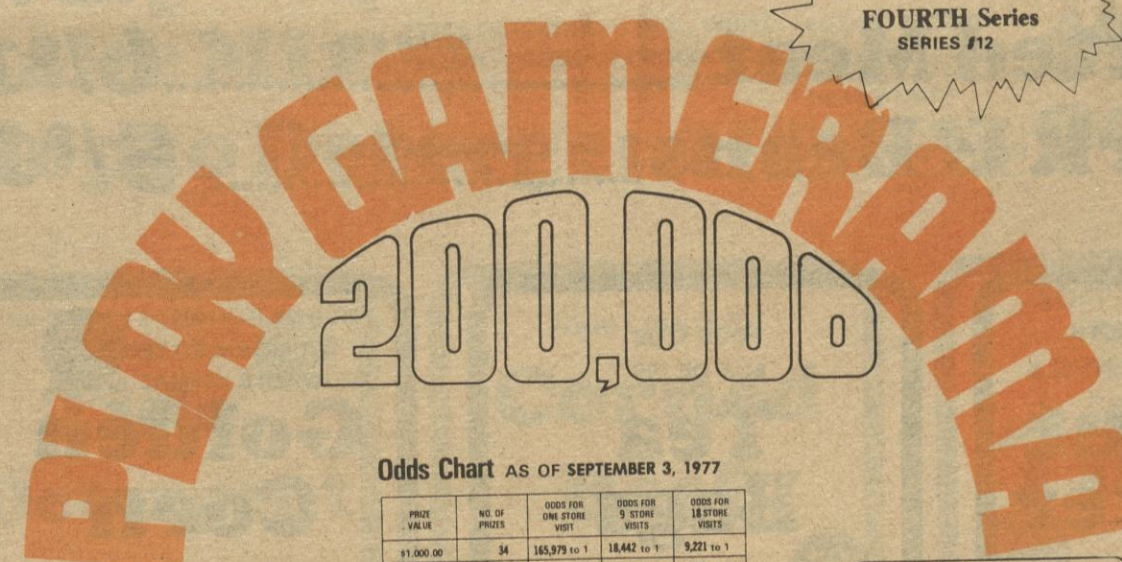
