### Ms. Tumlin Named Teacher Of The Year In Mississippi



A McComb English teacher who -- after 18 years -- is "still excited about being a teacher" is Mississippi's "Teacher of the Year" for 1977.

She's Mary Emma Tumlin, 40, a Tishomingo County native, according to Dr. Charles Holladay, state superintendent of education. Dr. Holladay said a committee of educators selected the state winner.

Ms. Tumlin decided she liked school when she went to the first grade, and she's been either learning or teaching ever since. She holds degrees from Wood Junior College in Mathisville, Millsaps in Jackson, and Ole Miss, where she got a master's. She also earned additional certification from Mississippi College in Clinton.

Ms. Tumlin's life shows the impact of parents on a child's education. "My parents taught me the value of learning. They encouraged me, showed interest, and were always present at every school function in which I participated. I'll never forget the tears of joy on my father's face when I gave my high school valedictory address." Her parents are Mrs. W. A. Tumlin and the late

Mr. Tumlin.

"To be a classroom teacher is a joy, a challenge, and a rewarding experience. I believe in teacher-student relationships based on mutual respect," she said.

Dr. Holladay said Ms. Tumlin is now eligible for National Teacher of the Year honors. The contest is sponsored by the Council of Chief State School Officers, Ladies Home Journal and Encyclopaedia Britannica. The winner of the national contest will be announced early in 1978.

Her professionalism is evidenced by her serving as president of the McComb Education Association, and president-elect of the Mississippi Department of Classroom Teachers.

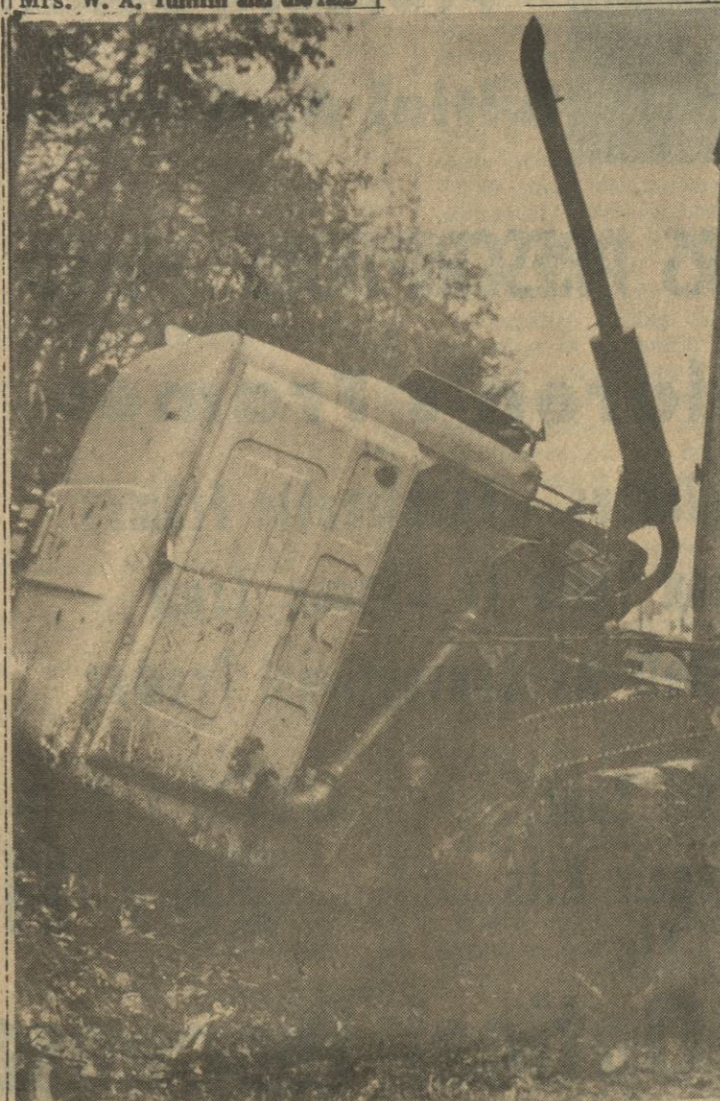

### FOOD BUYING IS BIG BUSINESS

Most families spent more for food than for any other single item in the family budget. This includes food eaten at home and food eaten in restaurants. To get the most for your food dollar, many decisions must be made. More food for less money is the aim of many, but this is not the only measure of wise food buying. Family satisfaction is also very important. Many factors affect wise food buying. Used together, these factors can result in both greater mealtime satisfaction and dollars saved.

### BUY IN SEASON

Seasonal buying offers many advantages: \*Economy \*supply larger \*quality better \*nutritive value high \*less waste.

### WHEN TO BUY

The right time for shopping will depend on needs, demands of time, cost of goods and community conditions.

Choose day and time to shop when: \*selection is large \*Quality is best \*savings can be made.

### WHERE TO BUY

Food prices vary from store to store. When selecting a store, look for: \*economy \*quality \*variety \*location

\*convenience \*credit availability  
\*parking facilities \*employee courtesy.

### HOW MUCH TO BUY

Quantity buying often results in substantial savings in the food budget. However large quantities should be purchased only when there is: \*use for the item \*adequate storage space \*convenience \*low cost per unit \*good quality.

### WHAT TO BUY

The shopping plan or list will help, but decisions to make after reaching the store as to alternatives may be:

1. Which of similar products.

2. Which form -- \*fresh \*frozen \*canned.

Compare cost per serving for most economical buy. Remember, this varies with the season. Also consider: \*use, \*quality, \*economy, \*convenience in deciding which form to use.

Know which alternatives may meet family needs, compare cost and choose that which is most economical to satisfy the family.

### WHICH QUALITY

\*Use \*economy \*family satisfaction.

Check U. S. Grades and learn to use different grades for different purposes. Learn to judge

quality of foods in the market.

### REMEMBER!

Food buying is a skill developed through improved buying practices.

### CRANBERRY NUT BREAD

1/3 cup (1 stick) whipped margarine  
1-1/4 cups sugar  
2 eggs  
3 cups flour  
1 T. baking powder  
1 tsp. salt  
1/2 tsp. soda  
3/4 cup water

1/3 cup orange juice  
1-1/2 c. cranberries, coarsely chopped  
1 c. chopped nuts  
1 T. grated orange rind

Cream margarine and sugar; blend in eggs. Soft together flour and baking soda. Add alternately with water and orange juice, mixing well after each addition. Fold in cranberries, nuts and orange rind. Pour into a greased 8 x 5 inch loaf pan and bake at 350 degrees 1 hour and 10 minutes.

### SOYBEAN STORAGE

The following information was furnished by Dr. Wayne Jordan, Mississippi Extension Soybean Specialist.

Rainy weather and wet fields has slowed soybean harvest in Mississippi during the past couple of weeks, but perhaps it has helped make a more orderly movement of the crop from field to elevator and from elevator to barge, railcar, etc.

Through last week we were probably 70 to 75 percent harvested statewide, which was ahead of average. Some areas obviously were ahead or behind that stage of harvest.

The price movement last week was encouraging and hopefully, will not be short-lived. It has been discouraging to learn of so many producers who were having to sell on the low cash market because of no storage or no forward contracts.

### Significant Increases

On-farm storage has increased significantly in Mississippi this year. Even though the amount of new storage is not known, one only has to drive down the road to see many shiny new bins.

The favorable interest rates and liberalized payback of government loans has been a help to the soybean farmer who needed storage.

Managing soybeans in storage is important to prevent losses due to heating and molding. Going into storage with clean, dry (below 13 percent moisture) beans is one way to minimize problems from the very beginning.

### Moisture Levels

Normal harvesting moisture levels up to about 16 percent can be handled by drying with natural air, while higher moisture beans may require some heat. For storage over a long period, it is advisable to bring moisture down to 11-12 percent.

Aeration is necessary, regardless of seed moisture at time of storage, in order to reduce the temperature and maintain it at about 50 degrees F.

Once the moisture and tem-

perature are brought to the proper level, it is desirable to aerate periodically during times of low humidity and cool temperatures. That will help prevent buildup of moisture in pockets in the center of the bin or along the walls.

Presence of large quantities of trash makes aeration even more important.

There is much more to storing soybeans than just putting them in the bin. If you are a beginner this year, it will be a good idea to watch your beans closely and consult with some experienced person on tips for good storage management.



### 4-H PHOTOGRAPHY

It has been said that "one picture is worth a thousand words". That statement certainly holds true when it comes to assembling record books and other 4-H activities. Clear, sharp "before" and "after" photographs of 4-H projects can add more interest and impact than a comparable number of written pages.

Using camera skills to visualize 4-H experiences and accomplishments is important to young people in the 4-H photography program sponsored by Eastman Kodak Co. Rural and urban 4-H'ers from 9 to 19 years old participate in a variety of learn-by-doing photography activities.

But photography is more than a communications tool. It's a means of artistic expression and a medium for exploring the scientific world. It gives 4-H'ers an opportunity to benefit the community by visually recording the progress of civic action projects.

To aid 4-H camera enthusiasts, Kodak has helped produce a series of members' manuals and leaders' guides for use in the program. From the basics of camera operation to developing and printing to movie-making, there are educational materials to interest the 4-H photographer at any level of proficiency.

4-H'ers may find that their interest in photography as a useful, enjoyable hobby leads to a lifetime career as a commercial photographer, photojournalist, graphics designer or visual communications instructor.

Kodak offers incentives and recognition to program members through awards arranged and announced by the National 4-H Service Committee. Foremost among these awards are the \$1,000 college scholarships presented to six national winners in the program.

The six national winners are selected from 50 state winners who, this year, will receive expense-paid trips to National 4-H Congress. Up to four program members per county are eligible for medals of honor. All winners are chosen by the Extension Service on the basis of their record books.

## ASC Farm News

FARMERS REMINDED TO CERTIFY PROGRAM CROPS  
"All farmers in Tishomingo County, who certify their crop and land use acreage on all 1977 cropland, will be eligible to participate in 1978 program benefits," Eddie A. Gresham, Chairman of the Tishomingo County ASC Committee, said. This also includes farmers who did not have allotments in past years. Certifying refers to reporting acreage on a field-by-field basis, Mr. Gresham added, and applies to farmers who wish to participate in the

voluntary farm programs. He said all these reports must be received in the County ASCS Office within the next few weeks to allow time for the Normal Crop Acreage to be established for each farm by the County ASC Committee. So far, approximately 250 farmers in Tishomingo County have certified. The programs that may become available to eligible producers include the 1978 loan, deficiency and disaster programs administered by the ASCS. "Farmers may not have needed to certify crop acreages last year," Mr. Gresham noted, "but we want to emphasize that they do need to contact us about their 1977 crop acreages this year if they plan to participate in 1978 programs." Producers will no longer have to pay a service charge for late filed acreage reports for cotton, peanuts, tobacco and rice. Applicants for all ASCS programs will be given equal consideration without regard to race, color, sex, for all ASCS programs will be given equal consideration without regard to race, color, sex, creed or national origin.

### CREDITING DOUBLE CROPPED ACREAGE:

There are many Tishomingo County farmers that have or will double crop acreage in the crop year 1977. We recently received instructions that future double cropping will be credited to one crop ONLY. This new instruction will apply to farmers who have planted soybeans this spring or cotton or any other crop and followed with some other acreage on the same land. If you have any questions concerning this new procedure, please contact the county office.

### 1977 ACP FUNDS AVAILABLE:

Tishomingo County farmers are reminded that 1977 ACP Funds are still available at the county office. If you are interested in this cost-sharing program, please contact the county office at 423-5036 or stop by for further details.

### 1977 CROPLAND ACREAGE REPORT:

To date approximately 475 farms out of a total of 1696 farms in Tishomingo County have reported their total cropland acreage for 1977. If you have or had cotton, corn, soybeans, wheat, hay, pasture, truck crops, and idle land on your farm for 1977, then you should make a report immediately. This report must be on a field-by-field basis. The

planted harvested acreage in 1977 will be used to determine eligibility for program participation for 1978. Please contact the county office if you have any questions about your farm.

This feast lasted three days. There was enough roast turkey to feed the company a week, as there were large numbers of the now famous "Thanksgiving Bird" in the neighborhood of Plymouth.

We read of feasts, fasts, and Thanksgiving Days being observed each year after this, but it was not until ten years later in 1630 that we find such a celebration as we now have. Then we read that the Colonists gathered in the old meeting houses and worshipped, singing songs, reading Psalms, and praying. Their services lasted from 8:30 until noon or after. Following the sermon they gathered for the feast.

During the Revolutionary War, the Continental Congress set December 18, 1777, to be observed.

President Washington, during his first year of office, issued a proclamation setting November 26, 1789, aside for "National Thanksgiving" for a form of Government that had made for safety and happiness.

For years the custom was exclusively a New England institution, but later it spread to the west and south.

In 1864, Lincoln issued a proclamation setting the last Thursday in November as a national Thanksgiving. Since that time each president has done the same. The religious significance of the occasion is now largely overshadowed

by feasting and merry making. Thanksgiving prayers - It is revealing and relaxing to capture the feelings and reflections of children who haven't been exposed to the confusion of what we call "World Affairs."

One Thanksgiving a teacher asked her class to tell her what they, individually, would thank God for in their Thanksgiving prayer.

After receiving all their replies, she made the following composite into one prayer:

"We bow our heads and thank Thee for the sound of laughter, for colored leaves that swirl and fall in autumn, for the smell of chocolate cake in the oven, for big red tomatoes in the garden, for my playful kitten that gets tangled up in pink yarn, for erasers that make our mistakes disappear, for the feel of wet grass on my bare feet, for the good taste of hot cherry pie, for my warm soft bed, for my sister's smile on Christmas morning, for the boots and sea gulls on

the wallpaper that carry me across the sea when I look at them, for the shade of maple trees in our yard, for windows that let me watch the world go by, and for God's care.

## Iuka Library News

The Iuka Public Library will be closed tomorrow, November 24, for Thanksgiving.

In the United States and Canada, a day is set aside each year as Thanksgiving Day. On this day people give thanks with feasting and prayer for the blessings they have received during the year. The first Thanksgiving Days were harvest festivals, or days for thanking God for plentiful crops. The American Thanksgiving Day probably grew out of the harvest-home celebrations of England. The first Thanksgiving was celebrated less than a year after the Plymouth colonists had settled here.

For many years there was no regular national Thanksgiving Day in the United States. By 1830, New York had an official state Thanksgiving Day. Virginia was the first southern state to adopt the custom. This was in 1855.

Mrs. Sarah Josepha Hale, the editor of Godey's Lady's Book, worked many years to promote the idea of a national Thanksgiving Day. President Lincoln proclaimed the last Thursday in November, 1863, as a holiday. Each year afterward the president of the United States has formally proclaimed

a Thursday late in the month of November as Thanksgiving Day. Congress finally ruled that after 1941 the fourth Thursday of November would be observed as Thanksgiving Day and would be a legal federal holiday.
