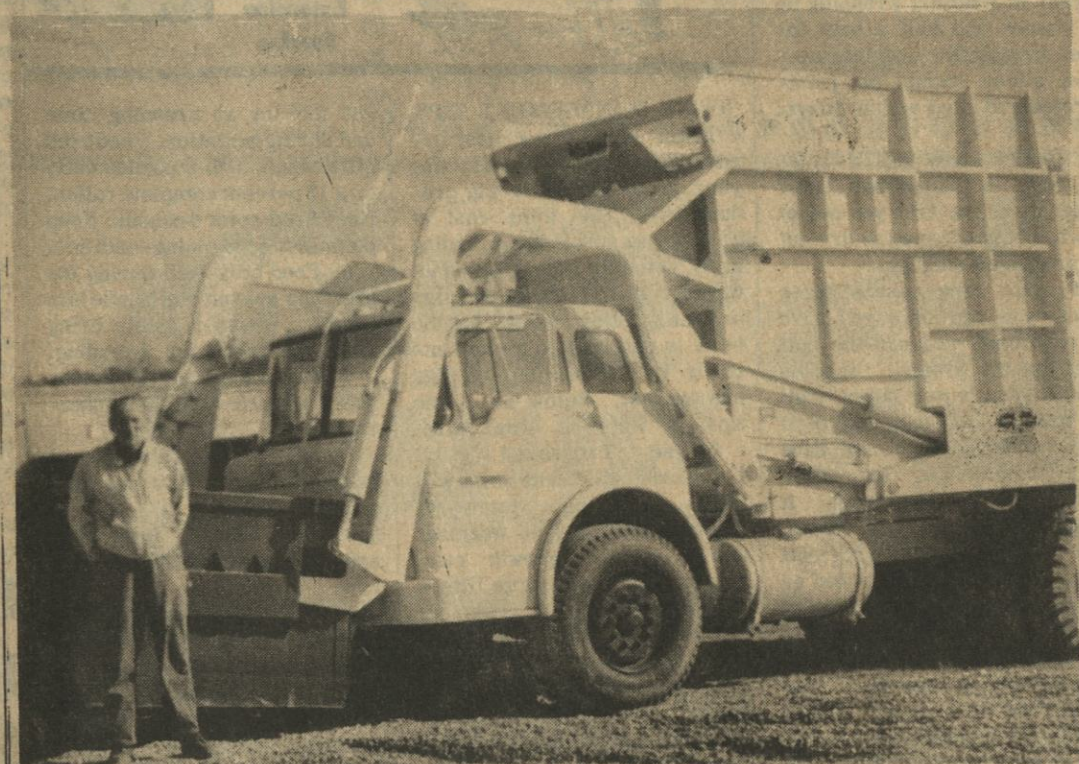

## COUNTY-WIDE GARBAGE PICK-UP UNDERWAY

Durham, along with the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, strongly urges all rural residents to take advantage of this most worthwhile effort.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors has now put into operation new garbage pick-up equipment for the rural residents of the county, representing approximately \$200,000 worth of trucks, compactors, and equipment for the new 20 acre land-fill garbage dump. Included in the new equipment are two 30 cu. yd. compactor trucks with 120 containers for rural garbage pick-up only, and land fill equipment for the new site to be used by both city and rural trucks.

According to Max Ray Whitehead, President of the Board of Supervisors, the containers are being placed throughout Tishomingo County for the use of rural residents who do not have city waste pick-up. These large green collection units are placed on state aid and state highway department roads, because of the extreme weight of the garbage trucks.

"This garbage pick-up program is for the benefit of the people, and we urge everyone to begin using them now," Whitehead said. "We only ask that garbage be deposited into the containers and be securely tied in a bag. If the collection unit is full, place your bag beside the container." Only basic waste should be left, as heavy objects such as concrete could damage the compactor trucks -- please - no dead animals. The cooperation of the people is needed in making this program a success.

The county's new land-fill is located off Highway 25 South of Midway. Traveling south, turn right just past the B. L. Mercer home. It is open 5 days a week, 7 until 4, with two attendants on duty. Due to the opening of this new land-fill, the Iuka City dump is now closed.

## JAIL INTRUDERS FREE PRISONERS

Randy Payne, a Parchman parolee, of Golden, is being held in Tishomingo County Jail following armed seizure of the jail facilities late last Wednesday night, December 7. Johnny McRae, of Belmont is also being held after apparently being forced to contribute to the crime.

Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputy Harry Bowman gave the following account of the Dec. 7th jail overthrow.

Around 11:30 Wednesday night, County Jailor Tebus Holland and his family were disturbed by someone knocking at the back door of the jail. Thinking it could possibly be a drunk, he radioed the Iuka PD for assistance. When Mr. Holland opened the door, Payne, armed with a gun, and McRae, unarmed, entered the jail. In the confusion, a shot was fired, hitting the jailor. When Iuka Policeman Woodrow Davis and nightwatchman David Sanders arrived on the scene, Davis entered the rear door of the jail and was confronted by Payne. The policeman took Payne's gun away and fired at him as he attempted to run away. He escaped to his car, leaving McRae behind. The man had allegedly told Davis that he entered the jail looking for Marion Osborne, a suspect in the December 1 shooting of a

Belmont policeman. Davis found Mr. and Mrs. Holland locked in a cell and two of the 13 prisoners in the jail missing.

Third District Constable, Floyd Whitaker, who also answered the call for help at the jail, said that he left the facilities after the ordeal and was sitting in his car near Frank's Dairy, talking with a friend, when they heard neighborhood dogs barking. This disturbance caused the men to notice two figures crossing Highway 25 on foot. Whitaker radioed for help, and then he and Albert Monroe pursued the two. They found Robert Gardner, of Booneville, hiding in some bushes on the west side of Hwy. 25. Gardner was one of the two prisoners who fled from the jail.

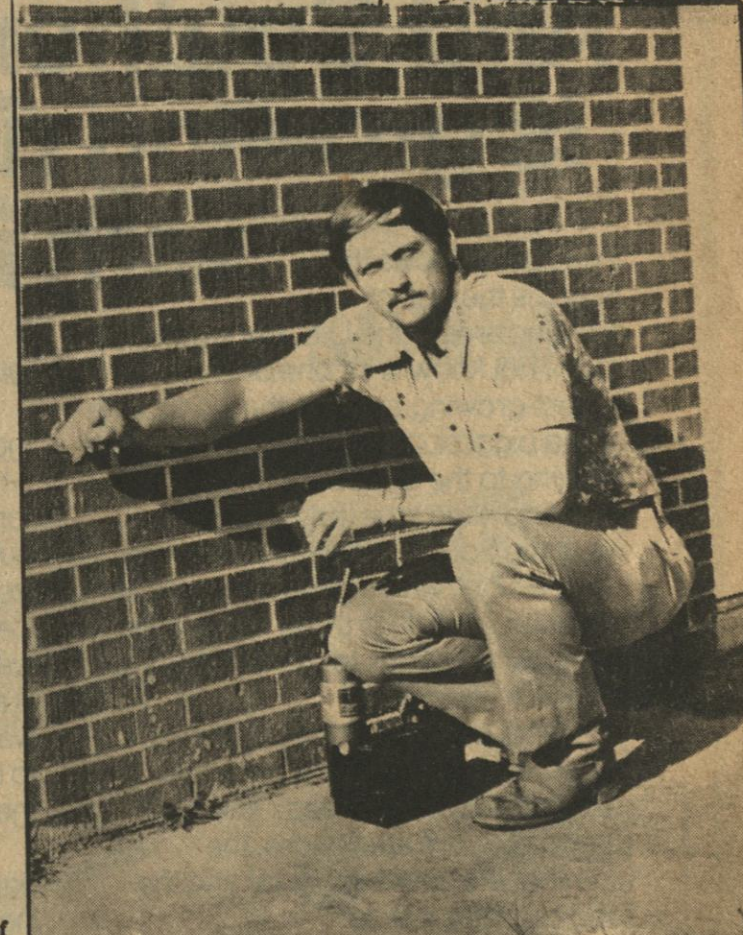
The second prisoner, Michael Warren, of Nashville, was picked up in Lafayette, Ind. this week. He had apparently stolen a First District dump truck from the yard of Cotton Wade, in Iuka, abandoned the truck in Madisonville, Ky., and traveled to Lafayette where he is now in custody. Warren has waived extradition to Mississippi.

Randy Payne was arrested some 40 minutes after the jail seizure at his home in Golden by Deputy Harry Bowman, assisted by Sheriff's Deputy Bob

Kemp and the Belmont and Golden Police Departments.

Payne is being held at the Tishomingo County Jail charged with two counts of assault with deadly weapon of police officers, aiding and abetting a jail break, and holding hostages. McRae was charged with aiding in jail breaking. Both men are wanted for questioning in Itawamba County in connection with the armed robbery of a gas station.

The incident is still under investigation.

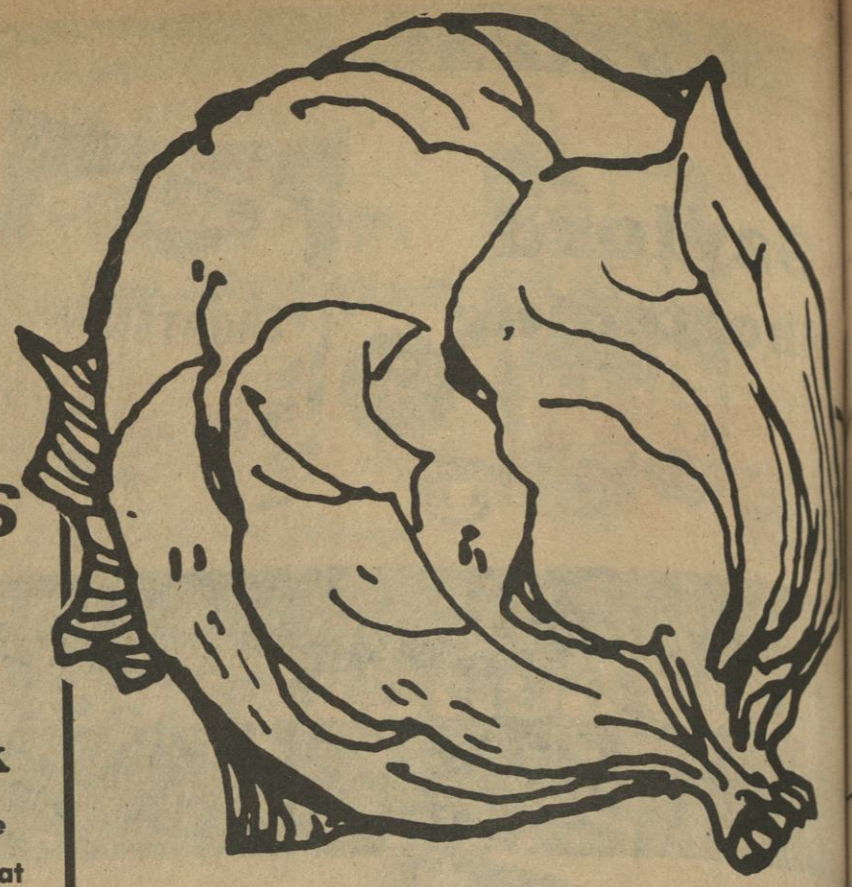

**"HOLIDAY FOODS"**

**CHRISTMAS HAM**

If you buy a ham or receive one as a Christmas gift, you may have questions about what to do with it. Correct storage is essential for preserving quality and assuring food safety.

A cured ham requires refrigeration unless stated otherwise on the label. Country-style cured ham with a high salt content can be kept safely in a cool, dark, dry place, or it can be refrigerated. Know the kind of ham you have and read the label carefully for storage directions.

Cured pork stored in the freezer retains quality for only a short time. Salt added in the curing process hastens rancidity; therefore, cured pork should not be stored in the freezer for more than 1 to 2 months.

Canned hams should be refrigerated unless directions on the label specify that refrigeration is unnecessary. Before buying an unrefrigerated canned ham, read the label to be sure of the correct storage method.

A large canned ham in an

unopened container will keep for up to one year in the refrigerator at 35 to 40 degrees F. After the can is opened, refrigerate the ham and use it within a few days. Follow storage directions on the label.

Store a cured or smoked ham (other than country-style cured) in original wrapping up to 1 week and half a ham for five days in the refrigerator. Ham slices should be refrigerated and used within 3 days.

**SELECTING A TREE**

Buying a Christmas tree? Make sure the tree you select has not been allowed to dry out by prolonged storage.

If your tree passes these tests, you can know you have a fresh one. Bounce the butt hard on the ground. Needles should not shower down. Pull at needles at the end of a branch. Needles should have good resistance. Rub your finger across the stump. It should be sticky with resin.

If you choose an artificial tree, be sure it is marked as being made of slow-burning materials. If it has a built-in lighting system, it should carry the Underwriter's Laboratories (UL) label. Metal trees will conduct electricity, so use only indirect lighting on them; strings of lights on a metal tree can create a dangerous shock.

**ICE BOX FRUIT CAKE**

1 lb. orange slice candy  
1 lb. raisins (seedless)

1 lb. marshmallows (large)  
1 lb. Honey Maid Graham Crackers  
1 lb. pecans (1 qt.)  
1 (16 oz.) candied cherries  
1 can Dime Brand Milk  
Get milk hot and put in the marshmallows and milk. Pour over all other ingredients. Mix well and put in tube pan lined with wax paper. Keep in the refrigerator. Slice as needed.

**PUMPKIN CHIFFON PIE**

3/4 cup brown sugar  
1 envelope unflavored gelatin  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/4 teaspoon ginger  
3 egg yolks, slightly beaten  
3/4 cup milk  
1 1/4 cups canned or mashed

cooked pumpkin  
3 egg whites  
1/3 cup granulated sugar  
1 (9") graham cracker crust  
Combine brown sugar, gelatin, salt, and spices in saucepan. Combine egg yolks and milk, stir into brown sugar mixture. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a boil. Remove from heat; stir in pumpkin.

Chill until mixture mounds lightly when spooned (test periodically). Don't let it get too stiff. Beat egg whites until soft peaks form; gradually add granulated sugar, beating until peaks form. Fold pumpkin mixture thoroughly into egg white. Turn into crust. Chill until firm. Garnish with whipped cream.

**SWINE MANAGEMENT TIPS**

Litter size is the most important single factor affecting your profit in feeder pig production. The total cost of carrying a sow in the breeding herd remains nearly constant whether she produces two pigs or ten. Her value in the herd is determined almost entirely by the number of pigs she weans. Below are some tips to improve litter size.

1. Use crossbred gilts. Crossbred gilts and sows will mean more pigs farrowed, more pigs living to weaning, and a greater growth rate. Select gilts from large litters and from breeds that are known for good mothering ability and large litters.

2. Don't breed gilts too young. Wait until they are near 8 months old and weighing about 250 pounds.

3. Breed sows twice, 12 to 24 hours apart and preferably the second day of heat.

4. Vaccinate all breeding stock twice a year for Leptospirosis.

5. Don't let gilts and sows

get too fat at breeding time and during gestation. Feed bred gilts about 5 to 6 pounds daily of a 15 percent complete ration. Feed bred sows 4 pounds. Keep them in a good-doing condition.

6. Feed boar well during the breeding season and handle him gently. Where possible bring sows to boar for breeding.

7. Provide a cool place for boars and sows during hot weather.

8. Keep a good salt-mineral mix before bred gilts and sows at all times.

9. Have a dry, draft-free, and clean area for sows to farrow.

10. Be on hand at farrowing time to wipe pigs off for drying, disinfecting navel cord, and seeing that pigs start nursing. Why not set a goal for increasing litter size? If your litters are averaging 10 pigs, you're on the way to a profitable and successful venture in the feeder pig business.

**BEEF CATTLE**

Continued improvement in demand and price is forecast

for feeder calves and yearlings during coming months, predicts R. O. Buckley, Mississippi Extension Livestock Specialist. "The reduction phase of the cattle business is winding down, and we're beginning to see a leveling off in cattle numbers," he notes. "In 1978, we should see somewhat improved prices for cattle at the farm level."

He cautions, however, "I don't really expect the top to blow off prices within the next year." He said economists are forecasting feeder steer prices in the low 40's for the rest of 1977, the low to mid-40's until mid-1978, then perhaps in the mid-40's for the balance of 1978.

"I certainly expect prices to be much improved in 1979 for feeder and fat cattle," Buckley says. "And 1980 should be a good year, as we get well into the buildup phase of cattle production. After reaching that point, the next three or four years should be good ones for cattlemen."

Liquidation of beef cows has been the most dramatic in history during the past few years, he notes. Cattle numbers, as of January 1, 1978, are expected to be down to the 1971 level of 50.5 to 51 million head. A peak of 56.7 million was recorded in 1975. Historically, with the exception of 1934, cattle numbers peak at 10-year intervals. The last four have been 1975, 1965, 1955, and 1945.

"With those points in mind and with the cattle cycle now on the upswing, the cow-calf man will be in the driver's seat," Buckley says. "Now is certainly not the time to get out of the cattle business. If the cycle runs true to form, the price will turn down again by about 1985, so cattlemen should be aware of that and begin now to shape up their operations."

**Dampeer Elected Member Of Board**

Charles Dampeer, pastor of Iuka Baptist Church in Iuka, was elected a member of the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board, during the 142nd

annual meeting of the Mississippi Baptist Convention in Jackson.

The convention, a cooperative effort of 1,900 Southern Baptist churches in the state, passed an \$8.6 million budget for 1978, and re-elected Robert Hablin, pastor of Harrisburg Baptist Church, Tupelo, as its president.

The convention operates four colleges, a medical center, a children's home, and a foundation. Plus, it cooperates in the operation of a medical center in Memphis and a seminary in Jackson. A convention board carries on the work of the convention between sessions.

**Men In Service**

Navy Machinist's Mate Third Class James D. Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Grady T. Johnson, of Route 4, Iuka, has completed the Basic Machinist's Mate Course.

During the course at the Naval Training Center, Great Lakes, students received instruction on the use of hand tools and machine shop equipment. In addition, they studied the basic operation, maintenance and repair of ships' propulsion equip-

FIVE GIFTS YOU  
NEED FOR CHRISTMAS

MATTHEW 2

Some years ago I introduced a sermon with the question, "Do you know what you want for Christmas?" Imagine my amazement when a little four-year-old yelled, "Yea, Preacher! I want a red wagon and a billy goat." Needless to say, he "got my goat." But let me raise the question to you. Do you know what you really need for Christmas?

First, you need the spirit of God who gave, John 3:16 teaches that just as God loved, so He gave. God became small in the form of a babe that we might become humble and childlike by trusting Him.

A mother of three carried her children on a picnic. One child was mentally retarded. The two other children picked a bouquet of flowers for their mother, but the little retarded girl gave her only a weed. The mother said to her, "Your gift is the best of all because you gave it in love."

Secondly, you need the sweetness of Mary who was the servant of God. Mary was a humble person whom God chose to use. God always uses the "poor in Spirit" and those who "hunger and thirst after righteousness." She likely was very young. Nevertheless, she was a chosen vessel of God. Baptists have too long pushed Mary into the background of Christian history. While she was not divine, she nevertheless was God's child dedicated to do His will. Yes, a Christian needs a sweet spirit like Mary.

Thirdly, you need the courage of Joseph who could play second best. When you read the story of Joseph, you discover an obedient servant who knew how to play second fiddle and play it well. That takes a real man. In addition, Joseph is portrayed as a trusting soul. He believed in God. He also had faith in the girl he was engaged to marry. After the birth of Jesus, Joseph is one of the lesser characters of the Bible. But he must have been a giant spiritually because it takes a big person to stay in the background. That's what Joseph did.

Fourthly, you need the adoration of the shepherds who were humble. After all, "watching over the flock by night" did not exactly put the shepherds in the upper class of society. But these humble men discovered that "the meek do inherit the earth" because they saw the world's greatest gift - the Christchild. Consequently, the shepherds discovered there is only room for one God because He fills heaven and earth as well as the heart. Strange, isn't it, that God chose such common people for this most important event! But wait, these people were not common, for they were God's people.

Fifthly, you need the wisdom of the wise men who worshipped Jesus. During the Christmas season, it is easy to get busy and not worship the one who is the hero of Christmas and all of history. Like the wise men of old, we need to bow in reverence and respect to our Lord. Just as Jesus Christ was their hope, he is our hope. The hymn writer was right when he wrote, "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in Thee tonight."

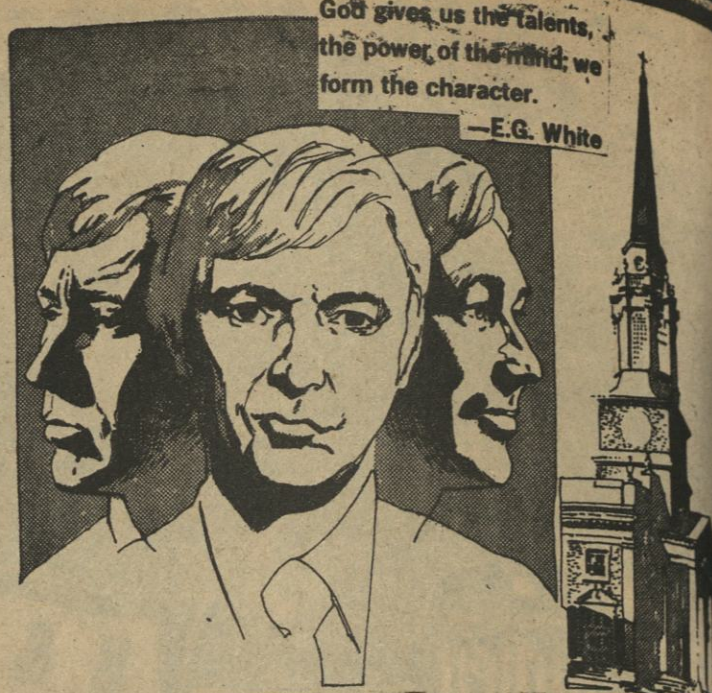

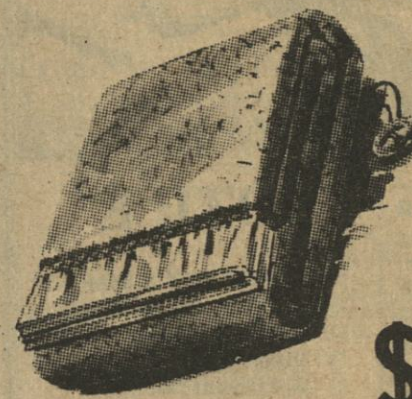

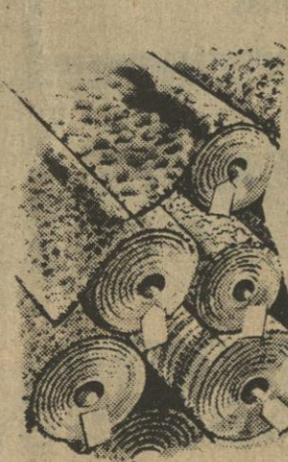

Are you interested in collectibles. Do you have "keep sakes" stored? Any that you think are not of interest to anyone, except you? Maybe you have and don't know it!

Often neglected in the area of paper collectibles is the materials published to interest young children in Sunday School.

School in Gloucester, England in 1780. His pupils were underprivileged children who worked in factories all week and were denied any kind of schooling. Reading as well as religion was in his curriculum.

The Nineteenth Century saw the rapid development of the Sunday School in the United States. It became the full-work for religious instruction in this country.

To interest children in learning their Biblical truths, a wealth of material was distributed to them, much of it from the 1800's was beautifully lithographed. These lesson cards were sent home with the children each week (and still are) with the hope that the children would reread them and absorb their ideas.

Sometimes lesson cards were very small. One series was "Bereans Lesson Pictures." These were mini-lessons complete with a few questions and answers on the back of a very colorful picture. The cost was only 12¢ for a full year.

Do you - or does Grandmother have a few treasured Sunday School cards? I have a card much smaller than those given today - 3" x 4", very colorful, the title being "A Song of Thanksgiving" and dated November 24th, 1944. Memory Verse - "Enter into his gates with thanksgiving and into his courts with praise -

Psalm 100:4."

The story presented tells of baskets piled high with every kind of fruit, ready to be taken to the temple for the thanks offering service. Reuben's father was one of the musicians that would lead the procession. "May I go with you," Reuben asked? Of course you may," his father answered.

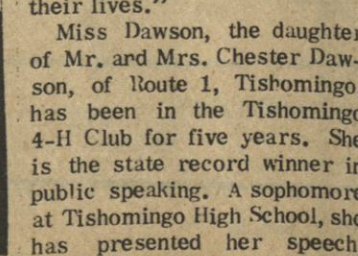

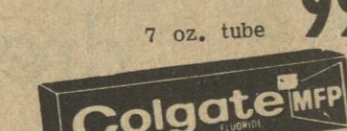

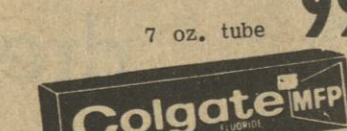
