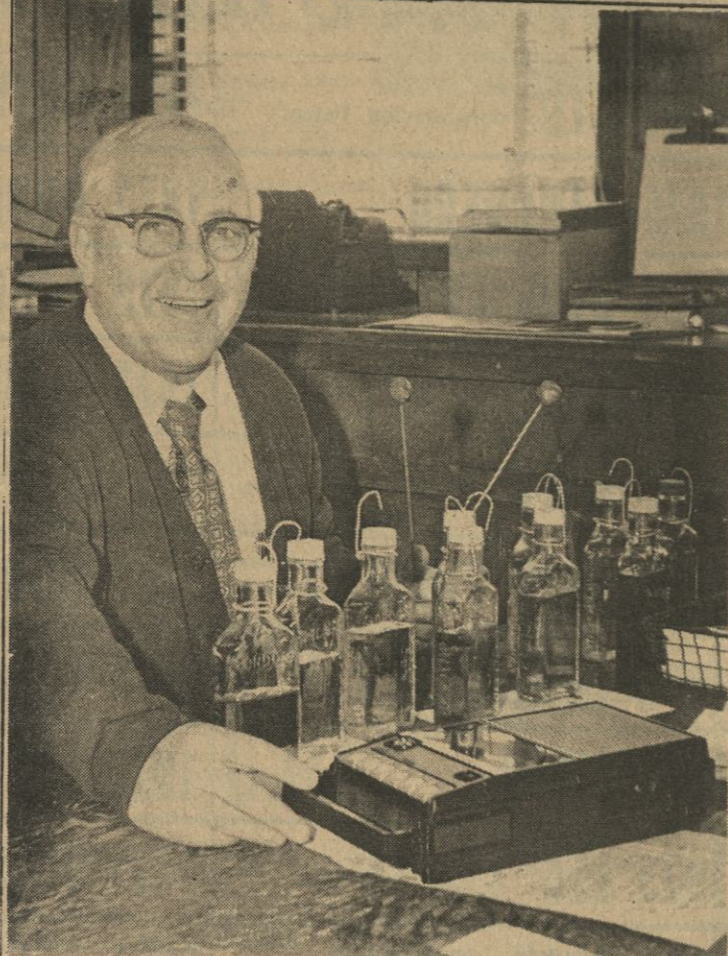

## Contract Let For TCH Expansion

C. S. Poole Contractors, Inc.,  
of Tupelo, Miss., was awarded  
a contract Wednesday, Jan. 18,  
1978 for the expansion of op-  
erating room facilities at the  
Tishomingo County Hospital.  
Amount of the agreement was  
\$100,000.

The contract was let by the  
Tishomingo County Board of  
Supervisors for the expansion  
of the existing operating room.  
According to R. E. Lambert,  
Hospital Administrator, the  
construction began Friday and  
will include an 850 square foot  
addition on the west side of the  
hospital. Funds were made  
available for this project through  
an Economic Development  
(EDA) federal grant.

## Insurance Commissioner To Speak At Iuka Rotary Club



George Dale, state insurance  
commissioner, will be speaking  
at noon, on Wednesday, Feb.  
1, to the Iuka Rotary Club.

Commissioner Dale will dis-  
cuss the Mississippi Insurance  
Department and the services  
which are available to the pub-  
lic through his office. Also  
included in his speech will be a  
discussion of the legislative  
activities of the department in  
the 1978 session in the pas-  
sage of a state fire code, im-  
proving the drunk driving laws,  
and amending the statutes re-  
gulating bailbondsmen.

A native of Gulfport, Dale  
was raised on a farm in Jeff  
Davis County where he gra-  
duated from Prentiss High  
School as a three-sport letter-  
man and student body pre-  
sident. He attended Pearl River  
Junior College from 1958-60,  
and was active in sports and  
campus activities, including his  
election as president of the  
Baptist Student Union.

Dale continued his education  
at Millsaps College in 1960,  
and in 1962 he graduated from  
Mississippi College. Receiv-  
ing his Masters Degree in 1966  
from Mississippi College, the  
new Commissioner has con-

tinued his education toward a  
doctorate degree in adminis-  
tration from the University of  
Southern Mississippi and Aus-  
burn University.

The new Insurance Commis-  
sioner served as teacher,  
coach, administrator and prin-  
cipal at Moss Point from 1962-  
1972.

In 1972, Dale was named Ad-  
ministrative Assistant to Gov.  
Bill Waller and served in that  
capacity for three years.

Dale's entrance into elective  
politics came in 1975 when he  
won election as Commissioner  
of Insurance.

Commissioner Dale has been  
selected by the White House  
Office of Consumer Affairs to  
serve on the four-member In-  
surance Consumer Action  
Panel for reviewing and assist-  
ing in the settlement of prop-  
erty and casualty insurance  
claims.

He is also a member of the  
National Association of Insur-  
ance Commissioners serv-  
ing on the Life, Health and  
Accident Committee and Sub-  
committees on Life Insurance,  
Guaranty Fund, and Credit In-  
surance.

Throughout his career, Dale  
has been active in church and  
civic affairs. In 1966 he was  
selected Moss Point Teacher  
of the Year. In 1975 he was  
recognized as Clinton's Out-  
standing Young Man of the Year.  
Dale is also a member of the  
Jaycee Outstanding Young Men  
of American and was selected  
as "One of the Three Out-  
standing Young Men in Missis-  
sippi for 1975" by the Missis-  
sippi Jaycees.

Dale has been an active mem-  
ber of the Moss Point City  
Planning Board, the Westing-  
house Youth Program, and a  
member of the following or-  
ganizations: Mississippi Edu-  
cation Association; Clinton  
Jaycees, Board of Directors;

Mississippi College Alumni  
Association, Vice President;  
Secretary to Board of Direc-  
tors at YMCA of Jackson.

He is also involved on the  
Board of Directors of the Mis-  
sissippi College Booster Club;  
Mississippi Junior College  
Inter Alumni Association, a  
former member of the Missis-  
sippi Association of Coaches  
and member of the Clinton  
Lions Club.

The Insurance Commis-  
sioner is a Deacon of North-  
side Baptist Church in Clinton,  
Chairman of the Finance Com-  
mittee at Northside Baptist,  
and a member of the Board of  
Trustees, Mississippi Baptist  
Seminary.

Dale is married to former  
Yvette Bosarge of Moss Point,  
and the couple resides in Clin-  
ton with their four children.

John Newbery (1713-1767) made children's books an important part of publishing. John was born in England. He did not have much schooling but he loved to read and soon had a wide knowledge of literature. Newbery became a publisher of newspapers and magazines. He was described as a red-faced, good-natured little man who was always in a hurry. Newbery's first children's book was designed to make learning more fun. It taught the alphabet in song. Newbery published one of the first collections of nursery rhymes, Mother Goose's Melody.

His name still lives on in the Newbery Award. The Newbery Medal is given each year to the book judged the most distinguished contribution to American Literature for children. The selection is made by a committee of children's librarians. The following books have been awarded the Newbery Medal and are available at the library: Smokee, The Cow Horse Hitty, Young Fu Of Upper Yantze, Call It Courage, Rabbit Hill, Strawberry Girl, Rifles For Watie, Bronze Bow, Shadow Of A Bull, Up A Road Slowly.

From our reference shelves: Anniversaries and Holidays by Mary Hazeltine. This book is a calendar of days and events such as January 24th -- Gold discovered in California 1848; First Boy Scout Troop organized 1908. January 25th -- Weather Sign, it is an old belief that the weather of the whole year depends on this day. January 27th -- Thomas Edison was granted a patent on his incandescent light 1880.

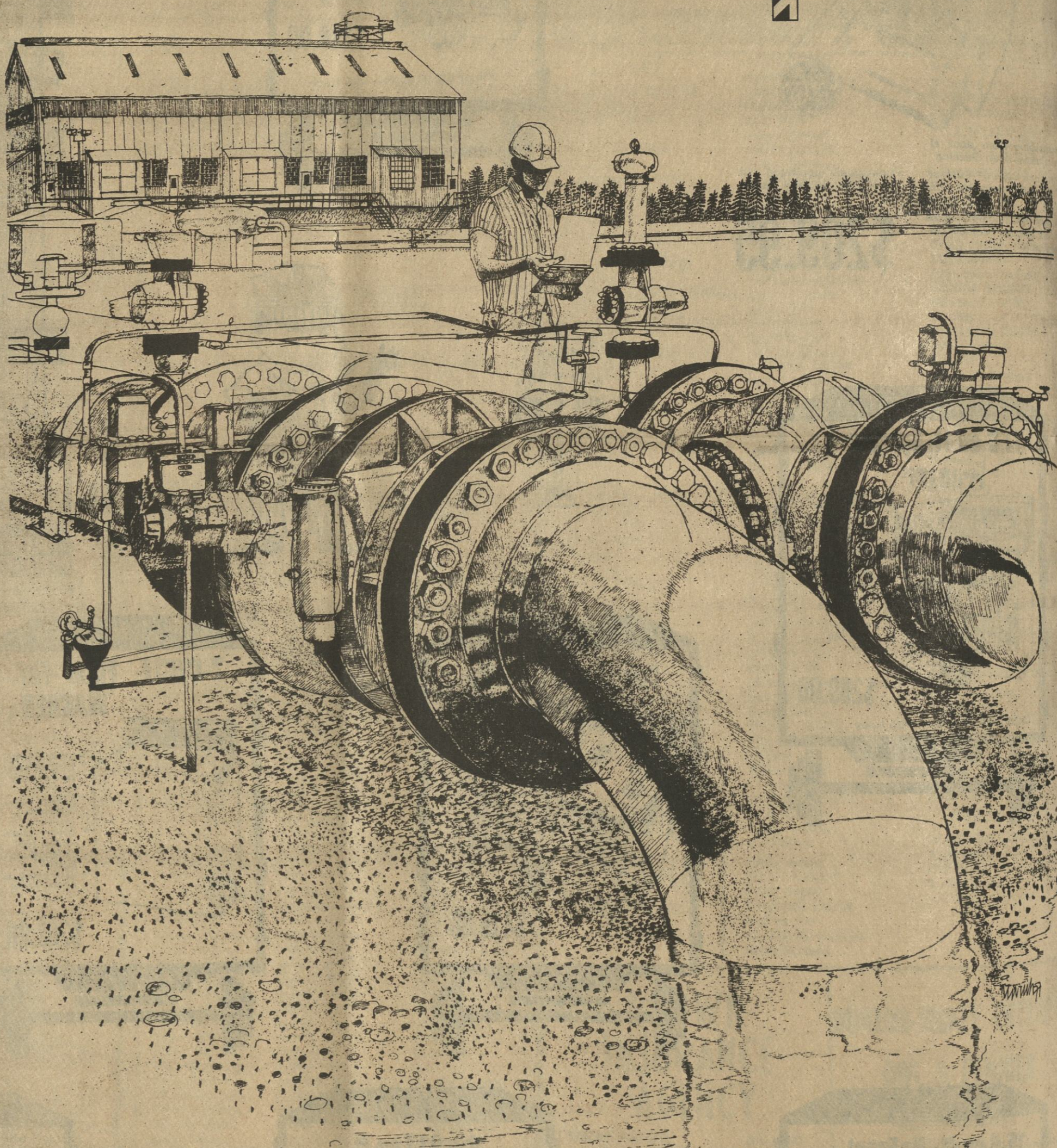

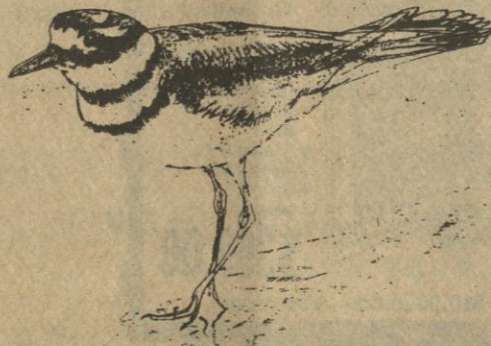

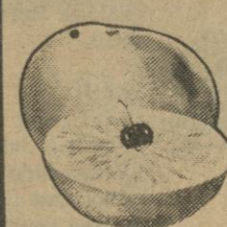

When Grandpa was growing up, no family would think of sitting down on New Year's Day without a mess of black-eyed peas and hog jowl!

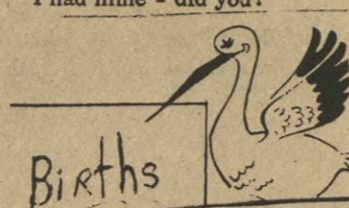

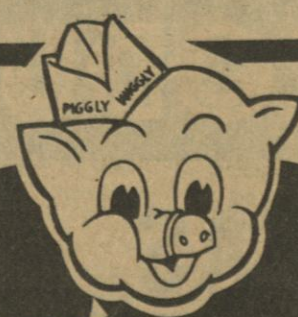
