

TVA Awards Piping Contract

TVA has awarded a \$20 million contract to the Dravo Corporation of Marietta, Ohio, for the balance of plant principal piping systems for the Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant.

Delivery under the contract will begin in March 1980. The piping assemblies will connect major components in the turbine, service and office buildings of the plant.

Yellow Creek is the seventh nuclear power plant planned for construction on the TVA system. Site preparation and preliminary construction activities began in February under a Limited Work Authorization from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. A full construction permit was received in November. When completed in the mid-1980's, the two-unit plant

will have a total electrical generating capacity of about 2.7 million kilowatts. Total project cost is estimated to be about \$2.1 billion.

Another major contract award approved by the Board and approved by the Board includes: Triangle PWC, Inc., Glendale, West Va., intermediate metal sheet conduit and rigid steel conduit (hot-dipped galvanized) for the Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant, \$1,687,764. (5-823698)

Killed were Miss Julianna "Julee" Long, 19, of Iuka; Travis Maynard Anglin, Jr., 23, of Memphis; and Jerry Moore, 26, of Cherokee.

Corps Plans Biggest Contract For Tenn-Tom Waterway

Invitations to bid on the largest contract of the 232-mile Tenn-Tom Waterway project are being readied for release later this month by the Nashville District of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Col. Robert K. Tener, district engineer, said bid documents are scheduled for issue Dec. 20, with bid opening set for Feb. 22.

The work includes excavation of 94 million cubic yards of material from the divide separating the Tennessee and Tombigbee basins, north of Paden, Ms.

Also specified are one million cubic yards of stone protection with plastic filter fabric; construction of two major concrete drainage structures; 100 pipe and concrete shut drainage structures; installation of 120 relief wells; operation of 163 existing deep wells; clearing, grubbing and seeding.

The successful bidder on the contract will have 1,830 calendar days in which to complete the work after receiving notice to proceed.

Col. Tener pointed out that in addition to being the biggest single contract on the waterway, this major construction feature is also the largest earth moving effort.

Construction of the project is under direction of the Nashville and Mobile districts of the Corps. The Nashville District portion, known as the Divide Section, requires excavation of 150 million cubic yards of material and construction of Bay Springs Lock and Dam -- which will form a 6,700 acre lake.

Injured was Larry Biggs, 21, of Iuka.

Anglin and Miss Long were killed instantly in the 1:35 a.m. crash, which occurred four miles north of Iuka on Hwy. 25 near the Old Central School. Moore died shortly after being brought to the Tishomingo County Hospital, and Biggs was carried to the county hospital and later transferred to Coffee Memorial Hospital in Florence. He is listed in very critical condition in the Intensive Care Unit, suffering from extensive head and chest injuries.

Mississippi Highway Patrolman, Curtis Butler, said Anglin, who was visiting friends here, was a passenger in the pick-up truck driven by Moore, and Miss Long was traveling with Larry Biggs. He said the two vehicles hit head-on in the south-bound lane of 25. It is believed that Biggs was traveling south and Moore was headed north. No charges will be filed in the accident, Mr. Butler said.

Funeral services for Julee Long were held at 11 a.m. Monday at the Iuka Baptist Church with Rev. Charles Dampier officiating. Burial was in the Oak Grove Cemetery.

Miss Long was a freshman at Northeast Mississippi Junior College in Booneville and a 1977 graduate of Iuka High School. While in high

school she served as president of her senior class, majorette, cheerleader and Senior Homecoming Maid. She was a member of the Beta Club, Student Council and Co-Op Club. After graduation Miss Long attended the Draught's Business College in Memphis. She was an active member of the Iuka Baptist Church.

Surviving are her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Julian Long, of Iuka; two sisters, Mrs. Lonnie Kent, of Iuka, and Ladye Love Long, of Iuka; one brother, John Long, of Iuka; her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. C.W. Long, of Golden.

Funeral services for Jerry Moore and Travis Anglin were held at 11 a.m. Tuesday at Cutshall Funeral Home chapel.

Mr. Moore was employed with the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway. His burial was in the Mar-gum Cemetery.

Surviving Mr. Moore are his wife, Mrs. Sheila Moore, of Cherokee, Ala.; one

daughter, Brandi Lynn Moore, of Cherokee; parents, Mr. and Mrs. Lester Moore, of Iuka; three sisters, Mrs. Frances Green and Miss Brenda Moore, both Iuka, and Miss Emma Moore, of Memphis; five brothers, James C. Moore and Harold Moore, both of Iuka, L. D. Moore and Bobby Moore, both of Memphis, and James Moore, of Tulsa, Okla.

Mr. Anglin was buried in the Antioch Cemetery.

Surviving are his mother, Mrs. Shirley Moore, of Memphis; and his father, Travis Anglin, Sr., of Memphis; two sisters, Shirley Anglin and Debra Anglin, both of Memphis; two brothers, Rickey Anglin and Richard Anglin, both of Memphis; grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Hubert Slate, of Memphis.

There will be regular Sunday morning activities but the five o'clock service will be the only evening activity. The public is invited to attend.


The annual Christmas Pageant at Eastport Baptist Church will be held on Friday night, December 22, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

As youngsters heard the old folks say: Treat a cold and cure it in two weeks; let it alone and it will go away in a fortnight. The time element isn't that exact, but the theory is the same.



producers will be encouraged to remove from production an acreage equal to 20 percent of the acres that they plant for harvest in 1979, a percentage identical to the 1978 program, according to Elmer A. South, Chairperson of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee. Basically the same as in 1978, the 1979 program offers corn and sorghum producers a 10 percent set-aside and a 10 percent diversion program. There is a 20 percent set-aside and a 10 percent diversion program. There is a 20 percent set-aside and a 10 percent diversion program for barley. Instead of a combination set-aside diversion program. According to South, the acreage a producer participating in the diversion program can plant to a feed grain in 1979

is not restricted to the prior year's acreage, as was the case in 1978. Under the previous program, the diversion payment was related to the acreage a producer planted for harvest. In 1979, the diversion payment will be related to the acreage a producer diverts from production which must equal 10 percent of the acreage planted to the crop for harvest. "Feed grain producers will again be eligible for target price payments on their entire planted acreage by restricting plantings from 1978 by 10 percent for corn and grain sorghum and 30 percent for barley," South said. The incentive to participate in the 1979 feed grain program totals \$2.30 a bushel for corn and \$2.40 a bushel for sorghum and barley. The corn target price will be \$2.20, instead

of \$2.10 a bushel; \$2.30 per bushel for sorghum and \$2.40 a bushel for barley. The loan rates will be identical to those in effect for the 1978 crops of feed grains. They are: \$2.00 a bushel for corn, \$1.90 for sorghum, \$1.63 for barley, \$1.03 for oats, and \$1.70 a bushel for rye. No set-aside or diversion program is offered for oat producers in 1979. For more details on the program, contact the local ASCS Office.

Mark is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Bill Godwin. He is 16 years old and a junior at Iuka High School. He is on the honor roll and is a member of DECA. He plans to be in second year co-op next year, and after he graduates Mark plans to go to Northeast Junior College and major in engineering.

Kevin Poling is a junior at Iuka High School and the son of Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Poling. He is a member of DECA and plans to be in the second year co-op program next year. After that, he plans to attend college and major in biological science.

Christmas For The Birds



joyment to their holiday season. The girls not only decorated the grounds but also sang Christmas carols to the patients.



topping:

- 2 t. sugar
- 1/2 t. cinnamon

Plans are being made for the new year. The January meeting will be January 9, in the Dennis Club House.



Peanut Spice Cake—An Inviting Dessert

Cake is a natural accompaniment to coffee. Although good quality cakes and pastries can be bought in most bakeries, nothing surpasses the homemade variety.

"Come for coffee and dessert" is a traditional invitation which has remained popular since colonial times. An evening gathering of friends for coffee and dessert is a pleasant way to extend your hospitality in an All-American way. Invite friends back to your house after a movie or local town event. Serve a special cake for the occasion and brew lots of coffee.

Suggested here is Peanut Spice Cake, a moist tube cake laced with peanuts, cinnamon and spice and topped with a luscious Cream Cheese Frosting. A sprinkling of chopped peanuts gives the cake added flavor and texture.

PEANUT SPICE CAKE

- 2 cups unsifted flour
- 2-1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- 1/2 cup margarine, softened

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/3 cup molasses
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup chopped Planters Cocktail Peanuts
- Cream Cheese Frosting (recipe below)
- 2 tablespoons chopped Planters Cocktail Peanuts

Sift flour, baking powder, soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg and cloves together. Set aside.

In large bowl, cream margarine and sugar together. Add eggs; beat well. Blend in molasses. Add dry ingredients alternately with milk, beating until well blended. Stir in 1/2 cup peanuts. Pour

into greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Bake at 375° F. 45 minutes or until done. Cool in pan for 10 minutes. Remove from pan and cool completely on wire rack. Completely cooled from pan, spread with Cream Cheese Frosting (recipe below) and garnish with 2 tablespoons chopped peanuts. Makes one 10-inch cake.

Cream Cheese Frosting: small mixer bowl cream package (3-ounce) cream cheese, 2 tablespoons margarine and 1 teaspoon vanilla extract together. Gradually add 2 cups confectioners' sugar, beating until creamy and well blended.
