### Weight-Off Wisely Course Offered

Are you having trouble losing weight? Many women in Tishomingo County are losing weight by attending Weight - Off - Wisely group. Seventeen Belmont members of Weight-Off-Wisely averaged losing 24 pounds each in sixteen weeks. One member lost 44 pounds in sixteen weeks and several lost over 30 pounds in sixteen weeks.

Weight-Off-Wisely is a sixteen week program to help people lose weight through sensible eating, nutrition information, and exercising. Too many people are turning to fad diets, pills and gadgets in effort to lose weight. These often lead to poor nutrition, economic loss and bad health.

The first objective of Weight-Off-Wisely participants will be to obtain their desirable weight through dieting and exercising. They will learn the principles of good nutrition and will change eating habits. If participants will follow eating habits once desirable weight has been achieved, it will be maintained.

The weekly classes are pretty well divided between nutrition and personal improvement, with nutrition getting the emphasis. Each session will include a weighing, exercise, and a brief

lecture. If for health reasons you cannot take exercise, you still could participate in the program.

The only charge is \$5.00 registration fee. This will be used to buy a good pair of scales and other materials.

A person must be 10 lbs. or more overweight to attend.

Weight-Off-Wisely will meet once a week for 1 1/2 to 2 hours. Classes will begin as soon as 25 people request for classes.

## TVA Stresses Public Safety At Yellow Creek Nuclear Power Plant Site

There are few episodes occurring at Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant as dramatic as Police Story or Emergency.

However, there is a force present on this Tennessee Valley Authority nuclear power plant construction site prepared in the event of violence, fires, and unforeseen medical emergencies.

TVA's Public Safety Service, a service organization in the Division of Property and Services, is an installation located at all major dams, steam plants, and nuclear power plants. Composed of 23 persons presently, Public Safety is on-site at Yellow Creek 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The day shift is the largest patrol unit, while

three or four men per shift work the evening and late night shifts.

According to Captain Curtis W. Emerson, Director of YCNP's Public Safety Program, "We are primarily a service organization and provide the various needs for a project of this magnitude. Our function is to provide security, fire protection, and ambulance service."

Emerson, a native of Athens, Alabama, is a 10-year TVA veteran, who originally started his tenure as a tool clerk in Muscle Shoals. Next he was a patrol officer with Public Safety and became captain at TVA's Bellefonte Nuclear Plant before coming here.

Public Safety operates two ambulances and two fire

trucks from its building at the project entrance. One ambulance is equipped with all modern lifesaving equipment. The two fire trucks, one a three-quarter-ton 320-gallon capacity pumper and the other a 750-gallon-per minute pumper with a 500-gallon water capacity, are equipped with portable fire extinguishers and dry chemicals.

The Public Safety ambulances function in coordination with the medical staff on the project. "On each run that is made," Emerson noted, "a TVA nurse must be picked up." Most Public Safety officers are EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) trained, and Emerson's goal is to have each officer EMT trained. EMT training consists of 96 hours in 10 days.

Lieutenant Bob Waddell from Counce, Tenn., is the firefighting specialist for the group and conducts a fire drill on the project every two weeks covering extinguishers, equipment, and unusual procedures. Each officer is required to attend one session per month. He also conducts and attends training sessions throughout the Valley.

Currently, Yellow Creek is the third nuclear power plant in the TVA system with its own public safety building and emergency equipment under one roof. Public Safety officers patrol the site constantly. The construction controlled area has been fenced to provide better control and security measures. A gatehouse will be established in the near future, and plant access will be available only by proper identification. Emerson added that he hopes to have a video camera system installed at strategic locations throughout the plant in the next few months. He noted that anyone having business would facilitate processing. Except for those authorized to enter the construction area, all visits must be approved by project management.

Most Yellow Creek Public Safety officers have four or five years of previous public safety work, and all are deputized and bonded in Tishomingo County. According to Emerson, "About 98 percent of the officers hired in the last four or five years have been college graduates."

Any new officer has to qualify with his service revolver during the first 90 days; qualifying means making a 70-percent score on the firing range.

Emerson noted that when a public safety organization is begun at a new location, at least 5 or 6 people have to be brought in from other locations. Of the 20 officers here, 8 were hired here while the 12 others transferred from other areas. Of the 8 men hired here, 2 are from Iuka; 1 is from Corinth; 1 is from Tishomingo; 3 are from Alabama; and 1 is from Tennessee. The transfer breakdown includes 8 from Alabama, 3 from Mississippi, and 1 from Tennessee.

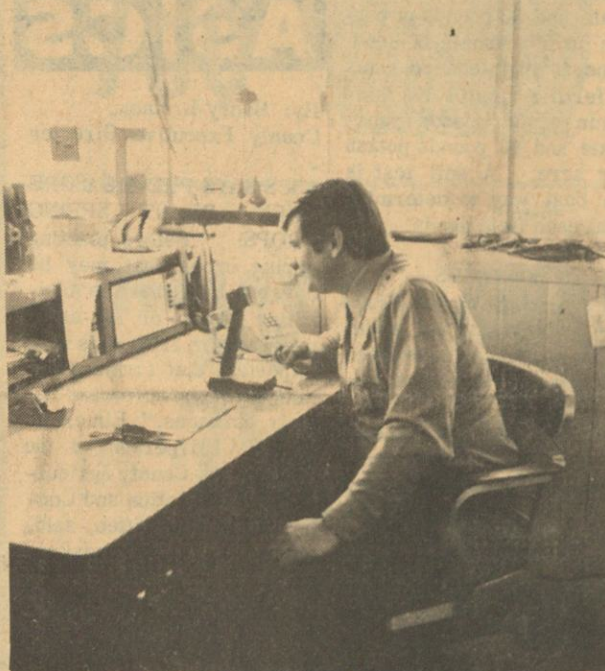

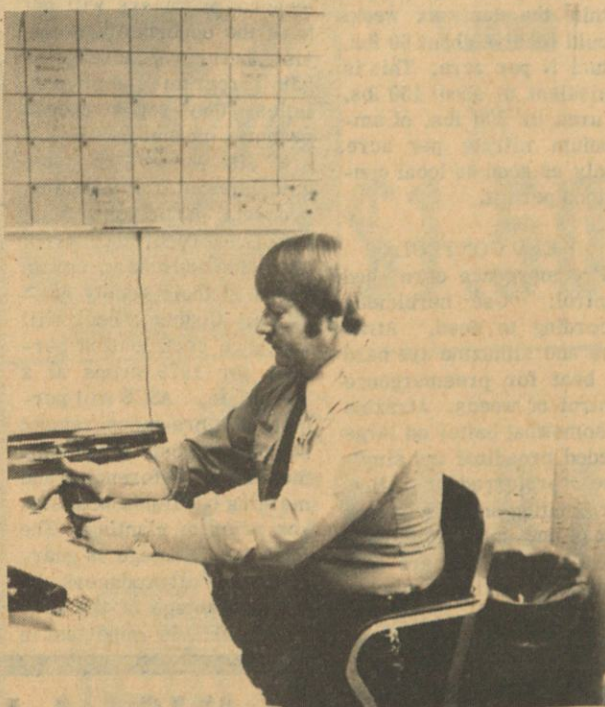

## HOME ECONOMIST'S NOTES

### SHOPPING STRETCHERS

Plan your shopping dollars and use a calendar for 1979. List needs, especially for the big ticket or expensive items and plan ahead to buy these items when they are at their lowest prices. Be alert to price advantages when they occur. A general calendar is available in Extension Publication 732, "Dollar Shopping."

Sharp shopping means you get the type and quality of merchandise you want for less money. For example:

- Save 10 to 20 percent by using store brands instead of nationally advertised brands;
- Save up to 15 percent by comparing prices of goods and services;
- Save 15 percent or more on day-old bakery products;
- Save 6 to 30 percent by paying cash instead of using credit;
- Save up to 25 percent on promotional sales items;
- Save 10 to 30 percent on clothing by shopping seasonal sales;
- Save up to 18 percent on cosmetics by avoiding national brands and shopping special sales;
- Save 10 to 18 percent by comparative shopping for

new cars; (also remember the price of a new car can be increased 25 percent or more by the type and amount of optional equipment chosen.)

- Save 6 percent by paying insurance premiums annually instead of monthly.

Shopping for savings does not mean buying the lowest priced item. It means getting the item that meets your purpose at its best price. For many items, especially the big ticket items, a family can plan ahead and make the purchase at a price advantage. Remember, no purchase is a bargain, no matter how low the price, unless it meets the family's need and will be used. Shop for savings, not for waste. Keep a record of savings made by planning ahead for needs and waiting to buy at the best price. Watch your profits grow.

### GIVE TOASTER-OVEN REGULAR CARE

A convenient and popular kitchen appliance, the toaster-oven needs regular upkeep. First disconnect from the convenience outlet before any cleaning or care. Allow to cool, then clean. Pull out a removable crumb

tray; unlatch a hinged tray. Brush out crumbs. Wash tray with a sudsy sponge; rinse and dry. If the unit is both an oven and a broiler, remove each tray and wash. Wipe the interior of the appliance, the oven door, racks and exterior with a damp cloth or sponge wrung from suds; rinse and dry. Polish with a dry cloth. Some toaster-ovens have removable racks for easy care.

REFRIGERATOR  
BRAN MUFFINS  
15 oz. box raisin bran  
3 cups sugar

5 cups flour  
5 teaspoons soda  
2 teaspoons salt  
1 teaspoon each - cloves, nutmeg, cinnamon  
4 eggs, beaten  
1 cup cooking oil  
1 quart buttermilk  
2 teaspoons vanilla  
1 cup chopped pecans (opt.)  
Mix bran, sugar, flour, soda, salt, spices in extra large bowl. Add eggs, oil, milk and vanilla. Mix well. Store in refrigerator in a covered container. Grease muffin tins. Bake 15 minutes at 400 degrees. Will keep for weeks in refrigerator and be ready to bake and serve hot as desired.

## COUNTY AGENT'S NOTES

### SOYBEANS

Varieties: It is time to line up the seed of desired varieties. There should be ample seed of most varieties, and the quality is generally quite good. Some of the best adapted early varieties for Mississippi are Hill, Forrest, Mack, and Bedford. Mid-maturity varieties include Lee 74, Davis, Tracy, Pickett 71, and Centennial. Late varieties to consider are Bragg, Ransom, and Coker 338.

Soybeans Need Lime: Best results come with soybeans when soil pH is in the 6.0 to 6.5 range. About two-thirds of soybean soil samples tested in the Extension Soil Testing Laboratory require lime. Research shows yield increases averaging 7 to 10 bushels when pH is raised from below 5.5 to above 6.0. Finely ground, quick-reacting lime applied this month will still have time to help the 1979 crop.

Fertilization: High yields are associated with high fertility. Soybeans remove about 24 pounds of phosphate and 42 pounds of potash in 30 bushels of seed. General maintenance rates of fertilizer call for a minimum of 30 pounds phosphate and 60 pounds potash per acre. A soil test is the best way to determine what each field needs.

### FORAGES

Fertilizing Winter Grazing: Ryegrass and small grain pastures have been unproductive in recent weeks because of cold weather. However, few stands have been severely damaged. With adequate warm weather (temperatures above 42 degrees F) and nitrogen fertilizer, these pastures will bounce back rapidly. An adequate supply of available nitrogen will help produce the growth desired. Winter grass pastures not receiving nitrogen within the last six weeks should receive about 60 lbs. actual N per acre. This is equivalent to about 150 lbs. of urea or 200 lbs. of ammonium nitrate per acre. Apply as soon as local conditions permit.

### WEED CONTROL

Preemergence corn weed Control: Use herbicides according to need. Atrazine and simazine are hard to beat for preemergence control of weeds. Atrazine is somewhat better on large seeded broadleaf and simazine is preferred for shallow germinating annuals. A tank mix of one-half rate of each looks good. Both are long lasting and will give trouble to fall crops. Both are weak on johnsongrass, signalgrass and fall panicum.

was increased from 8-3/4 to 9 percent after the agency's close of business on Friday, February 9.

Last year the agency made 1588 loans in Mississippi to families of moderate income, and 3032 loans to low-income families. Moderate-income borrowers pay the full interest rate. Low-income families may qualify for actual interest payments as low as 1 percent under "interest credit" provisions of the national housing act.

FmHA officials said the 1/4-point increase to 9 percent full rate is necessary to keep the interest rate to borrowers in line with the government's cost of money. The agency lends funds derived from sale of government securities to the public.

FmHA Mississippi state director Mark Hazard said loan applications approved before the close of business at FmHA offices on Feb. 9 will receive the 8-3/4 percent interest rate remaining in effect until that time.

The rate change applies to FmHA Section 502 insured loans for single-family housing, Section 515 loans for rental housing -- including multi-family apartment projects -- and Section 524 loans for homesite development. "Interest credit" benefits may be applied to reduce actual payments for low-income single-family housing, and for multi-family projects serving senior citizens and others of low income.

FmHA insured loans are made directly from the agency's county offices serving rural areas including communities of up to 20,000 population (10,000 in Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area counties). The agency also guarantees housing loans made by other lenders to families with above-moderate income. Interest rates on guaranteed loans are negotiated between borrower and lender.

WOUNDED FOR ME  
There's a place in Ger-  
many where a stone lamb  
has been erected as a mem-  
orial beside a church build-  
ing. Naturally, this causes  
strangers to ask for an ex-  
planation, and here's the ex-  
planation that's given.  
"Many years before a work-  
man was repairing the tall,  
steep roof of the church

building when the rope broke  
which was holding him. It  
appeared that he was headed  
for certain death; but a sheep  
just happened to be standing  
on the spot where he would  
have hit the ground. The  
body of the sheep softened  
the man's fall so that he  
was able to get up and walk  
away uninjured -- but the  
sheep was killed. The work-  
man was so appreciative that  
he erected this memorial to  
the sheep that saved his  
life."

How very much that re-  
minds us of what Jesus did  
for us! He saved our lives,  
but in doing so he lost his  
own. Isaiah wrote, "But he

## Countian Writes Book

The following excerpt is from the book, "My Twenty Years as a Foreign Missionary", by Leola (Wodley) Wilson, Iuka. "Sometimes daughters-in-law commit suicide because they are so wretched. They do this to spite the mother-in-law because then she will lose a servant and be sued by the girl's parents. I heard of one mother who told her daughter to commit suicide and she would avenge her. Sometimes when they commit suicide they jump in wells but do it in winter so

their padded clothing will keep them from sinking before they can be rescued. All single women wear bangs. After the groom takes his guests into a separate room, the bride is taken to the bridal chamber and her bangs are plucked out leaving her with a high forehead. She sits on the bed and is not supposed to eat much or talk much. I heard of one bride who was very bold. When given a bowl of food large enough for two bites in each piece, she took the whole piece at one bite. This shamed the mother-in-law and she stood where the guests couldn't see her

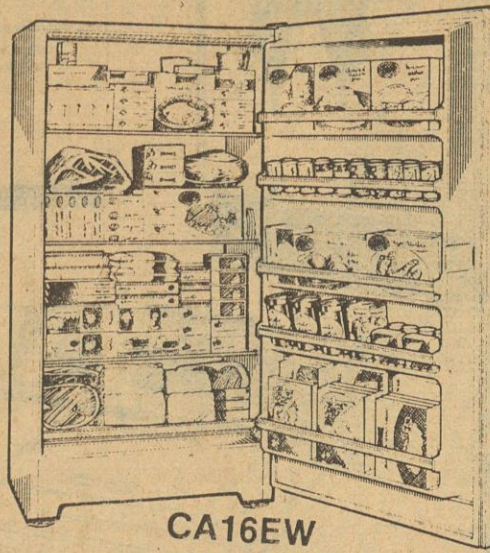
and held up two fingers meaning for the girl to make two bites of a piece. Instead, the girl took two pieces at a bite. The feasting and merry-making usually lasts two or three days. If any of the out of town guests leave before it is over, it causes the host to lose face.

If the first wife fails to bear a son, often the man takes another. But the first is the real wife and the second is the concubine. They call each other "sister."

## Driving Fitness

Are you fit to drive?

Before you automatically reply "Of course," take stock of your mental attitude and physical condition. You may be unsafe behind the wheel, both to yourself and to others on the road.

You may think you are in good health. You may have an excellent safety record. Yet, under certain circumstances, it can be dangerous for you to be in the driver's seat.

The American Medical Association reminds that the emotional stability of the driver is as important as any single factor in maintaining traffic safety. That's why you owe it to others — and to yourself — not to drive when you have serious problems on your mind. If you're thinking about that argument you had before you left home or office; if you're in a depressed or angry "I don't care what happens" mood; if you're very worried about a personal problem, you're better off not driving.

The sleepy driver causes



many accidents. In fact, a sleepy driver is as much of a hazard as a drinking one. Dozing at the wheel can occur in broad daylight as well as at night. When making long trips, rest every two hours and drink coffee or cola to stay alert.

Many medicines, not just a few, can affect the way in which you handle the wheel. Certain commonly used drugs such as antihistamines, cold tablets and mild sedatives may dull your reflexes or impair your coordination. Stimulants can make you nervous. Tranquilizing drugs can cloud your judgment and interfere with driving skills. Consult your doctor about the side effects of any drugs you take.

Driving calls for clear, healthy eyesight, good side vision, judgment of distance and the ability to see well at night. Have your eyes tested regularly. If you have glasses for distance vision, don't forget to wear them.

If you have a nervous disorder or a heart condition, ask your doctor whether you are a safe driver. This also applies as you get older. Past 65, reflexes and coordination tend to be somewhat slower.

## OPEN HOUSE

Open House at the new Prentiss County Timber Hills Mental Health Center on the Highway 30 By-Pass in Booneville will be held on Sunday afternoon, March 11, from 2:00 - 4:00, according to Mr. Paul W. Hunninen, Executive Director.

Staff members will be available to conduct tours of the building and discuss the Center's various mental health programs, activities and services.

The Timber Hills Mental Health - Mental Retardation Centers provide services to the four counties of Mental Health Region IV which include Alcorn, Prentiss, Tippah & Tishomingo.

Comprehensive mental health services were initiated in the region November, 1978, when the agency received a \$644,000 grant from the Department of Health, Education & Welfare for their first year of expansion. The agency will receive approximately \$3.5 million by 1986.

"We are very pleased at this time to offer outpatient, partial hospitalization, children's services, aftercare, consultation and education, and alcohol and drug services in all four counties," Hunninen said.

"We hope by September to have all ten planned comprehensive services fully operable. We will be adding inpatient services, screening services, and emergency services."

Timber Hills continues to operate a day training program for developmentally disabled adults in each of the four counties, funded in part by Title XX of the

State Department of Public Welfare.

Residential alcohol rehabilitation services are available to male residents of all four counties at the agency's Haven House in Corinth. Funding for this program is in part by Title XX, state alcohol tax money, and by a Mississippi Department of Mental Health grant.

A twelve member board is

the governing authority for this new comprehensive program. Representing Alcorn County on the Board are: Brenda (Mrs. Buddy) Moses, Len Curlee, Dr. Bill Jackson; Prentiss County, E. O. Roden, Amy (Mrs. David) Moore, and Versie (Mrs. George) Jones; Tippah County, Troy Holliday, Sarah (Mrs. William) Washburn, and Jeff Wright; and Tishomingo County, J. O.

Southward, and M. R. Whitehead. A vacancy on the Board occurred recently with the resignation of Mrs. Margaret June Riley, of Iuka.

The public is cordially invited by the Commissioners, Board, and Staff of Timber Hills to attend the Open House.

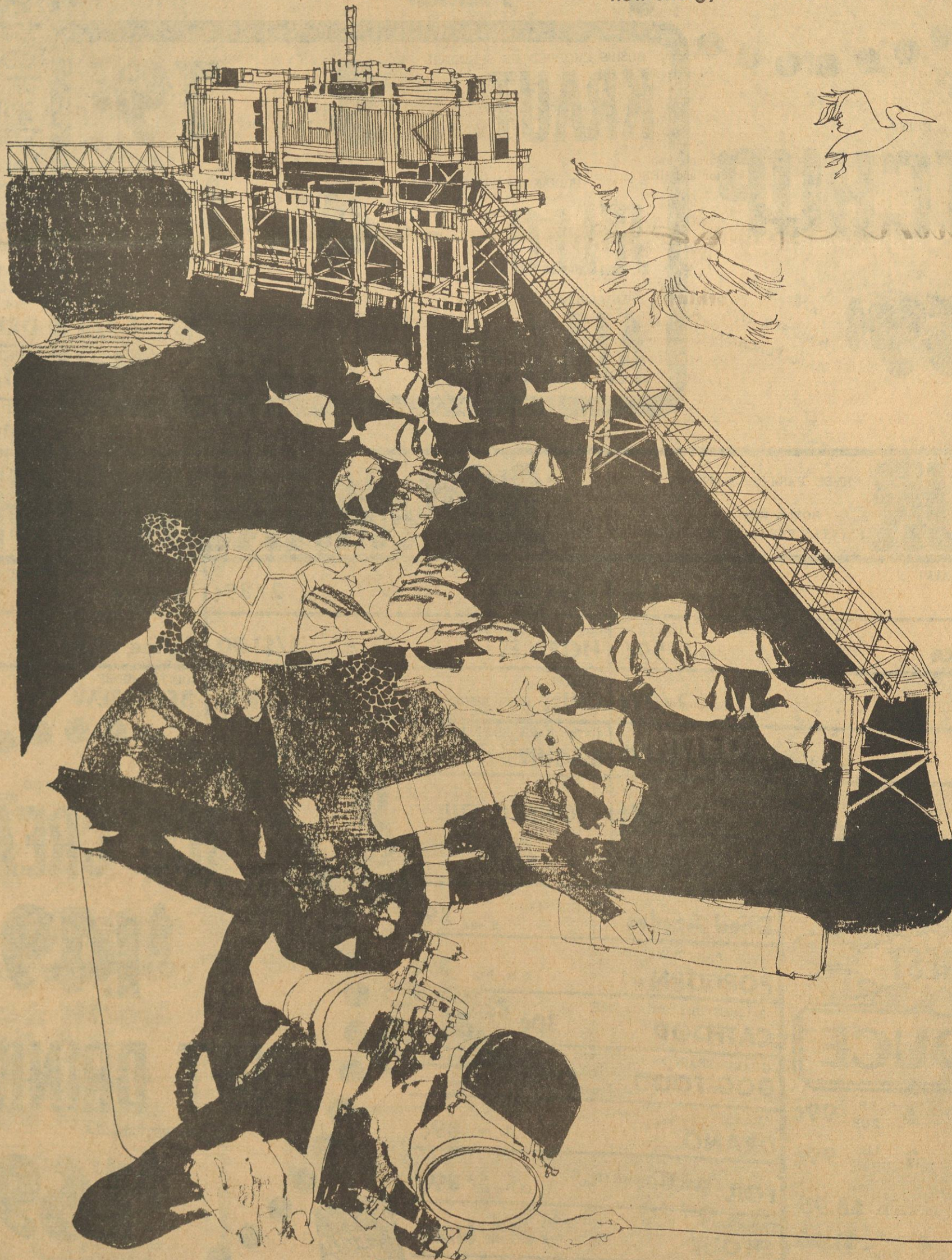

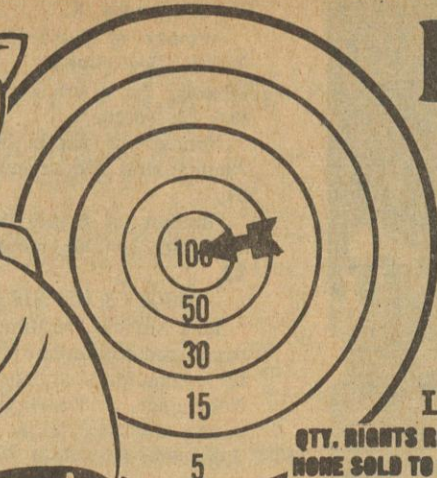
