Death Of Alabama Man Leads To Murder Charges For County Brothers

Two Burnsville brothers are being held on the charges of Aggravated Assault and Murder from an alleged ambush

shooting on Saturday, January 19, about noon, which resulted in the death of one man and left another

wounded, according to Prosecuting Attorney, Al Jernigan. Billy Hubbard and Horace

Hubbard, brothers and both from Burnsville, are being held in Monroe County Jail, Aberdeen on the charges of Aggravated Assault and Murder. A third suspect in the incident has been released.

According to authorities, the dead man was identified as William E. Hall, of Montgomery, Ala., and the wounded man as Sonny Kyle Livingston, also of Montgomery. A third Alabama man, identified as A. C. Chapman, was not injured. Livingston is owner of the Sonny Livingston Bail Bonds Co., and Hall and Chapman are believed to be employees of the company.

According to Mr. Jernigan, the trio had come to Tishomingo County to apprehend Horace Hubbard, who had allegedly jumped bail on charges that were pending in Montgomery, Alabama City Court stemming from a Klu Klux Klan march on the city of Montgomery during the summer of 1979. The three charges against him being, parading without a permit; carrying a concealed weapon, to wit: a knife and carrying a firearm within 1,000 feet of a parade.

According to Prosecuting Attorney Jernigan, Sheriff Bates received a radio call around noon on Saturday to meet deputies being dispatched to Walker Switch Road near Burnsville to investigate possible trouble. Sheriff Bates, along with the Prosecuting Attorney and deputies proceeded to the scene of the alleged trouble and upon arriving found three armed men, who approached the Sheriff's vehicle, later identified as the Hubbards. Upon the Sheriff's orders, the men laid down their weapon, and one of them indicated that he believed one bondsman was shot and also the possibility of a second bondsman being shot. The third bondsman had apparently left the scene before the shooting fearing possible trouble and had sought assistance from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department.

The defendants were placed under arrest by Sheriff Bates and a search was instigated for the two injured individuals believed to be at large in the vicinity. Deputies Payne and Boyd found Mr. Hall, approximately 200 feet from where the shots were believed to have been fired, lying in a pool of blood near the Walker Switch Road. An ambulance was summoned to the scene and prior to its arrival Livingston emerged from the woods on the Walker Switch Road and was found to have been wounded by an apparent gunshot.

The Tishomingo County Hospital Ambulance Service transported the victims to the local facility where, unsuccessful attempts were made to revive Hall. Livingston was treated and released and advised by medical authorities to check into a hospital in his hometown for observation.

The suspects were taken to Tishomingo County Jail and later transported to Aberdeen, Ms., to the Monroe County Jail where they are being held on \$50,000 bond each. Livingston is listed in satisfactory condition in a hospital in Montgomery.

Switch Road, south of Highway 72, resulting in the death of one man and wounding another. The guns confiscated from the six men

during the arrests made were: .45 Colt ACP; two .38 caliber revolvers, three 12-gauge shotguns, one 7mm Magnum rifle and one 30-30 rifle.

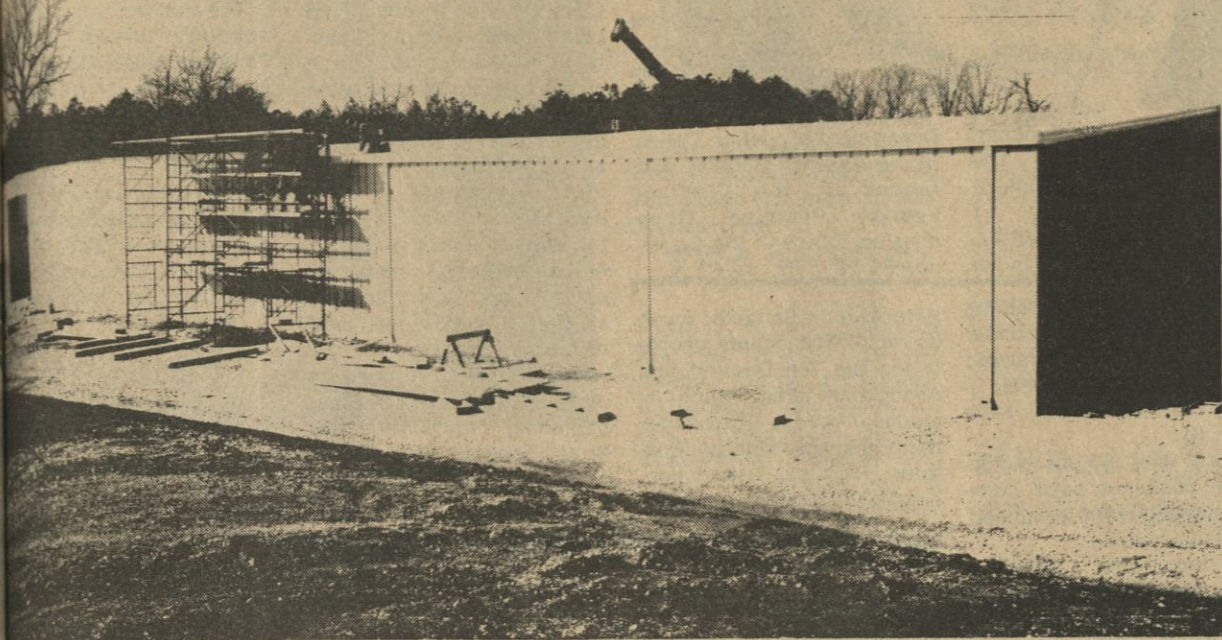
Carl Sartain, President of the Tishomingo County Fair and Livestock Show, announcing the dates for the 1980 County Fair. The dates are August 25-30.

Training Facility Under Construction At Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant

A 100,000 square foot training facility located adjacent to Tennessee Valley Authority's Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant could be completed by late spring, according to George Pierce, Acting Director of the TVA Craft Training Staff.

The building, now under construction by TVA forces, will serve TVA employees and other persons interested in

extending their education. TVA, through agreement with Northeast Mississippi Junior College, will offer cooperative craft training programs, journeyman upgrading programs, refresher or welder training, clerical training of all types, training of handicapped individuals, and college-level courses. TVA employees will normally be trained on a voluntary basis after work

hours. Both credit and non-credit courses are to be offered.

"No limits have been placed on potential uses of the training facility," remarked Pierce. "We have already had inquiries concerning courses to be offered."

Through an agreement with TVA, NEMJC will provide administrative help, help select nonemployee candidates, maintain record systems, and furnish materials and supplies. Ronnie Walker with NEMJC's vocational division will be their representative at the center. It is the first training center of this type built by TVA.

Included in the building will be four classrooms, office space, and a 4,200 square foot shop which will include 30 welding booths, lab equipment for craft training and retraining, woodworking equipment, machine lathes, etc. Pierce added that extra space may be added if necessary. The total facility, as designed, can handle approximately 175 persons functionally.

"TVA is committed by the

TVA Act of 1933 to improve natural resources of the Valley," noted Pierce. He also stated that people are considered a resource. Particular emphasis will be placed on training local people to meet entrance level requirements of jobs expected to be available.

Ronnie Walker at Northeast Mississippi Junior College can supply additional information concerning programs being planned for the facility.

Chatting With Your Home Economist

There will be a meeting "Conserving Energy in the Home" on Tuesday, January 29, at 10 a.m. at the Iuka Library and at 1:30 p.m. at the Belmont Library. Mrs. Minnie V. Agnew, Home Economist with TVA, will present the program. The public is invited to attend and learn how to "Cut Your Energy Cost."

Sodium

Excess sodium in the diet is believed to contribute to high blood pressure (hypertension) and stroke in some people.

If you want to limit sodium intake, limit the use of table salt (sodium chloride) and salty foods. This means cutting down on:

1. Foods prepared in brine, such as pickles, olives and sauerkraut.
2. Salty or smoked meat, such as bologna, corned or chipped beef, frankfurters, ham, luncheon meats, salt pork, sausage and smoked tongue.
3. Salty or smoked fish,

such as anchovies, caviar, salted and dried cod, herring, sardines and smoked salmon.

4. Snack items such as potato chips, pretzels, salted popcorn and salted nuts and crackers.

5. Bouillon cubes; seasoned salts (including sea salt); soy, Worcestershire sauce and barbecue sauces.

6. Cheeses, especially processed types.

7. Canned and instant soups.

8. Prepared horseradish, catsup and mustard.

Read labels. You may be surprised to learn that some processed foods which contain no table salt and don't taste salty have lots of sodium. Look for the word "sodium" or sodium or the symbol "Na" on labels. Examples are sodium bicarbonate (baking soda), monosodium glutamate, most baking powders, disodium phosphate, sodium alginate, sodium benzoate, sodium hydroxide, sodium propionate, sodium sulfite

Slim Jim Baked Chicken

- 4 chicken legs (thigh and drumstick)
- 2 whole chicken breasts, split into halves
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 2 teaspoons paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon oregano, crushed.
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh grated lemon peel
- 1/2 cup fresh squeezed lemon juice
- 1/2 cup water

Season chicken pieces with garlic salt, rubbing well into flesh. Sprinkle with paprika. Place in shallow baking pan, skin-down. Combine remaining ingredients; pour over chicken. Bake, uncovered, at 400° F. about 40 minutes. Turn chicken and continue baking, basting with pan drippings once or twice, until done, about 20 minutes. Garnish with snipped parsley, if desired.

Fertilizer Prices Higher
Farmers will pay 16 to 20 percent more for fertilizer this spring than they did last year. Nitrogen prices are expected to be 10 percent higher; phosphate, 12 to 15 percent; and potash, 8 to 10 percent. Higher costs for labor, transportation and energy are mainly responsible. Because prices are expected to rise again before planting season, farmers should arrange for their fertilizer early to insure getting the analysis they need, a better delivery date and a lower price.

1980 Vegetables

Gardeners will have a new tomato variety for 1980 gardens -- Miss America Hybrid. This red tomato is resistant to tobacco mosaic virus, root knot nematodes and certain types of fusarium. It was developed by the Mississippi State University experiment station at Crystal Springs. Miss America Hybrid is not listed in the 1980 seed

Beef producers will have an opportunity to vote in a referendum to determine whether or not they favor a Beef Research and Information Order issued by the Secretary of Agriculture. All beef producers are urged to register with the County ASCS Office between January 18 and February 6, 1980.

Registration and voting may be in person or by mail. Producers requesting that forms be mailed to them may make their request in person, by mail, or by telephone. They may request registration cards and ballots at the same time. The voting period will be February 19 through 22, 1980. Contact the county office if you have questions about the referendum.

So, from these few scriptures and many more that could be cited, we can see by the marvelous words He spoke and wonders He performed He was the one true eternal God revealed in human form.
