## Two New Ministers NEMCAA Community Cannery Come To County Opens In Burnsville City Hall

Two new ministers have been assigned to Tishomingo County in the Annual North Mississippi United Methodist Conference.

Reverend James T. (Jim) Smith is coming to the Golden Charge from the Walnut Charge in Tippah County, Mississippi. He and his wife, Joanne, are the parents of three children, Cheryl, age 19; Cynthia, age 18; and Wayne, age 16.

Jim is a native of DeSoto County and has held appointments in Rome, Ga., Greenleaf and Oakland, Mississippi, as well as having been a conference evangelist in our North Mississippi Conference. He attended Northwest Mississippi Junior College, Memphis State University and Emory University.

Coming to the Iuka Parish

is Reverend Jerry Horton, from the First United Methodist Church in Walls, Mississippi. He is from Columbus, Mississippi, and is married to Patricia Jan Taylor, and they have two boys, Thomas Christian, age 12; and William Andrew, age 9.

Rev. Horton attended Wood College, the University of Mississippi and Emory University. In 1976 he was selected Outstanding Young Man by the Jaycees in Walls, Miss. He has also served as a volunteer chaplain for the Walls Ambulance Service.

One change is anticipated in another pastoral appointment. The present pastor involved in the change is Reverend Dudley Brown, from the Iuka Parish, to the First United Methodist Church in Lexington, Mississippi.

The Northeast Mississippi Community Action Agency Community Cannery will be open June 15, 1981, in Burnsville City Hall Building, Burnsville, Ms.

The Cannery facilities are available for low-income citizens to operate without charge. The facilities are used for canning, blanching and preparing string beans, broccoli, corn, tomatoes,

figs, peaches, peas, pickles, lima beans and soup mixture, etc. The jars and lids are free to those who qualify under poverty guidelines.

Donations of a portion of the canned goods for the Emergency Crisis Food Bank to distribute to persons in dire need will be greatly appreciated.

Those residents who do not qualify under poverty

guidelines will be charged a minimum fee on a sliding fee scale. Jars will be available for those residents at cost. The Community Cannery participants will be billed on a sliding scale, based on their ability to pay. Money collected through the billing system will be placed back into the program.

The Cannery will be open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. under the

management of Mrs. Betty Anderson. For scheduling of appointments for the use of the facilities, please call Community Cannery at 427-9535. If transportation is needed to the Community Cannery, please call Community Outreach Centers in Alcorn County, 286-9261; Prentiss County, 728-8141; and Tishomingo County, 423-3842. No appointments will be scheduled after 2 p.m.

## Public Meeting June 11 For Local Landowners

County Attorney Al Jerigan reports that his office has been flooded with complaints from angry county residents about the loss of use of private waterwells in or near the area of the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway in this county. It is suspected that the planned lowering of the watertable in that area of the county has caused many private waterwells, which were heretofore relied upon by private landowners for water production, to either run dry or to fill so slowly that they are of no practical value

to the landowner, Jerigan said. It should be noted that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is operating electric waterpumps 24 hours a day in areas of the county with an intent to lower the watertable so that construction work on the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway may be unimpeded by rising or flowing groundwater. "A surprising number of lan-

downers have complained to this office about the apparent loss of water allegedly caused by the operation of the waterwells by the Corps," and in response thereto, County Attorney Jerigan is calling a meeting of all area residents who find themselves in a similar position as to that outlined here, on Thursday, June 11, 1981, at 7 p.m. in the main courtroom of

the Tishomingo County Courthouse. Those interested in taking some action to restore water service or to recover the costs of establishing their own connections to community water systems should attend this meeting. At that time, the group will decide what course of action should be taken. Everyone is invited to attend and voice his or her opinion.

## Ten Ton Load Limit Enforced On County Road



## Load Limit Enforced Again

The 10 ton load limit is again being enforced on a small rural road in Tishomingo County, which connects Midway to the Alabama State Line. A.C. Ryan, Third District Supervisor, reports that the road is in bad need of repair, with four to five inches of overlay needed, plus two additional feet to widen each

side of the road. At least this much is necessary to have it in good enough condition to handle the trucks, which haul slag from the Mississippi Stone Company, located in the Providence Community. In September of 1978, the 10 ton load limit was strictly enforced, but with minor repairs made on the deteriorated road, the heavy trucks were again allowed use of the road.

Funds are badly needed for these repairs in order for these trucks to travel the road and deliver their material to the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway Project and TVA's Yellow Creek Nuclear Project. The residents of this community, along with the drivers of these heavy trucks, who need to maintain their jobs, would like to see the road safe and passable again.

## Chatting With Your Home Economist

### Home Canning of Tomatoes

There have been numerous questions this food preservation season on recommendations for canning "low acid" tomatoes. Scientists

with the USDA Agricultural Research Service (ARS) believe seed companies have contributed to misinformation about tomato acidity.

Some varieties of tomatoes, such as cherry, patio and light-colored (yellow) tomatoes, are described as "nonacid" or "acid free". These descriptions are based on taste, the balance between sugar and acid, not the scientific measurement of pH or acid content.

The ARS scientists found

## County Agents Notes

### Soybeans After Wheat

Looks like our early maturing wheat crop gives us a chance to plant soybeans behind wheat earlier than usual this year. We've received plenty of moisture in the past few days, and that should help our double-cropping chances even more.

These two factors -- late planting and not enough soil moisture -- are the main reasons soybeans following wheat doesn't yield as much as normal planted beans. Weeds and poor stands don't help either.

Planting beans behind wheat requires special considerations. One if managing the wheat straw. Burning the straw gives the big advantage of higher yields, but planting in the wheat stubble helps conserve moisture and slows weed germination.

If no-till options are not available, you may have to rely on conventional seedbed preparation by disking and harrowing. This tends to dry the soil and delay planting, but it gives you a chance to incorporate herbicides for weed control. In fact, where johnsongrass is a problem, this is the preferred method.

There is no single best ap-

proach to double-cropping. Your approach depends on your particular situation. Generally, it's suggested to plant in narrow rows and use mid to late maturing varieties if you plant after June 15. Earlier planting or irrigation reduces the importance of row spacing.

### Turf Weed Control

Chemicals take a lot of the drudgery out of weed control in the home lawn. For most emerged weeds in bermudagrass and zoysiagrass lawns, the herbicide MSMA is a good choice.

Rates for using MSMA vary, but you'll know you have the mixture about right when the turf just starts to yellow or a slight tip burn occurs on the grass. For those tough problem weeds like dallisgrass, bahiagrass and goosegrass, you'll need to repeat the treatment every 10 to 20 days.

It's safe to apply MSMA on newly established bermudagrass lawns after two or three mowings or when the new root systems are active and extensive.

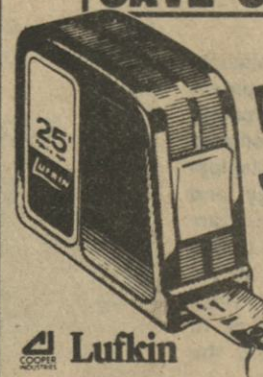

### 1980 Cotton Crop Totalled 11.1 Million Bales

Farmers in Mississippi produced 1,143,000 bales of cotton in 1980, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's May crop production report. Valued at \$1,148,807, the crop is up from the 1979 crop. Last year's cotton plantings totaled 1,150,000 acres. This compares with 1,090,000 acres in 1979 and 1,200,000 acres in 1978. Farmers harvested 1,125,000 acres of cotton in 1980 and realized an average crop yield of 488 pounds per acre. In 1979, 1,090,000 acres were harvested with a crop yield of 657 pounds per acre. Mississippi farmers received an average price of 76.6 cents per pound for their 1980 cotton crop, 13.1 cents per pound more than they received for 1979 crop cotton.

Howard R. Bridges, Chairperson of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee, said program participants had placed about 0 bales of their 1980 cotton crop under price support loans at a rate of 48 cents per pound for upland and 93.5 cents per pound for extra long staple. ASCS will offer farmers loans on their 1981 cotton crop at a rate of 52.46 cents per pound for upland and 99 cents per pound for extra long staple. The cotton program authorizes nonrecourse loans to farmers. "This means that a farmer may forfeit the crop in lieu of paying back the loan money," Bridges said. ELS cotton growers are required to comply with the farm's 1981 acreage allotment to be eligible for loans. U.S. cotton production totaled 11.1 million bales in 1980, 24 percent less than in 1979, but 2 percent above the 1978 production. Upland cotton accounted for 11.0 million bales and American-Pima 104 thousand bales. USDA officials said the decline in production from 1979 was a result of lower yields in all states except Arizona, Florida and New Mexico.

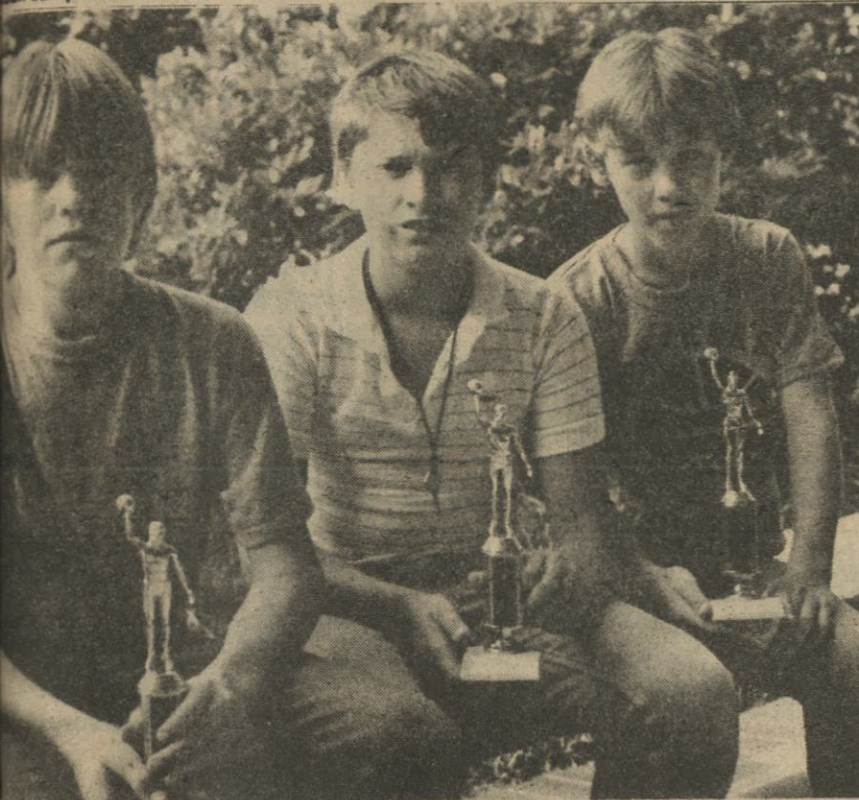

### Unemployment Drops

Mississippi's unemployment rate dropped to its lowest point this year in April, standing at 7.6 percent. This is a decrease of one percent compared to March's 8.6 percent jobless rate, according to Mississippi Employment Security Commission Executive Director O.H. Simmons. Last year's April unemployment rate was 6.6 percent.

The 7.6 percent unemployment rate for the state was higher than the 7.0 percent national rate for April. MESC figures showed 76,900 unemployed and 940,700 employed out of a civilian labor force of 1,017,600. The initial unemployment insurance claims for April totaled 16,798.

The counties having the highest unemployment rates in April were Jefferson, with a rate of 14.7 percent; Perry, with a rate of 14.4 percent; and Alcorn, with an unemployment rate of 14.3 percent.

Rankin, Yalobusha, and Lafayette counties had the

lowest jobless rates for April. Rankin had a rate of 3.5 percent, Yalobusha had a rate of 3.7 percent, and Lafayette had an unemployment rate of 4.3 percent.

Seventy-two of the state's 82 counties showed a decrease in their unemployment rates for April.

## Cost of Living Increase Set At 11.2 For 1981

The 1981 cost-of-living increase in Social Security and supplemental security income (SSI) payments has been set at 11.2 percent. The increase will be reflected in the July checks to about 36 million people receiving Social Security checks and 4.1 million people receiving supplemental security income (SSI) payments.

The increase was triggered by an 11.2 percent rise in the Consumer Price Index (CPI). Social Security and SSI payments increase automatically when the CPI goes up 3 percent or more in a year. The calculation is based on the change in the CPI from the first quarter of 1980 through the first quarter of 1981. Some people get both Social Security and SSI checks if their Social Security benefit is low and they have little or no resources or other income.
