State Unemployment Rate Rose To 12.3% In July

Mississippi's unemployment rate rose to 12.3 percent in July, an increase of seven-tenths of a percentage point compared to June's jobless rate of 11.6 percent, according to Mississippi Employment Security Commission Executive Director O.H. Simmons. Last year's July unemployment rate was 8.6 percent.

The 12.3 percent unemployment rate for the state was higher than the 9.8 percent national rate for July. MESC figures showed 130,800 unemployed and 932,800 employed out of a civilian labor force of 1,063,600. The initial unemployment insurance claims totalled 26,757 in July.

Sixty-six of the state's 82 counties had unemployment rates of 10.0 percent or higher in July. Seven of those sixty-six counties had unemployment rates in excess of 20.0 percent.

The counties having the highest unemployment rates in July were Jefferson, with an unemployment rate of 24.4 percent; Walthall, with an unemployment rate of 22.7 percent; and Attala, with an unemployment rate of 21.3 percent.

Issaquena, Rankin, and Oktibbeha counties had the lowest jobless rates in July. Issaquena had a rate of 5.1 percent, Rankin had a rate of 6.6 percent, and Oktibbeha had an unemployment rate of 7.9 percent.

Housing Hints

Some homeowners can afford to remodel and are doing so in spite of high costs. A recent survey revealed that a large number of remodelers were doing so to cut energy costs. More were trying to save energy than were remodeling to improve appearance or to increase living

space or even for higher resale value.

Whatever remodeling is done to the home should include some weatherization, insulation, or other needed energy conserving measures.

The price of housing has held steady or not increased in several sections of the country. The industry says the price is "flat". Prices have even declined in a few places.

However, the high interest rates continue to prevent people from buying a home. Buyers moving into new homes today may spend as much as 40 percent of income for the roof over their heads. The recommended percent-

tage of income to be allocated of housing is much lower at 25 percent.

When more than this percentage is spent on housing there is not enough left over for other essentials.

Buying a bulb for a lamp or fixture? What do you look for first, price or wattage? There's a lot more to selecting bulbs than just wattage or price.

For instance, bulbs other than standard inside frosted are available. You can select (a) a soft white bulb which diffuses the light more than an inside frosted, (b) miser bulbs with low wattage, (c) extended service bulbs usually last about 2500 hours and (d) soft white long life.

All of these have a lower light output per watt than the standard inside frosted. Some lower than others. You are not left to guess how much light (lumens) a bulb produces. This information is included on the package. Whether light is important for reading, sewing, shaving, etc., use a bulb with more lumens. Bulbs with lower light output should be used in closets, halls, and other places where seeing is not critical.

It is recommended that long-life or extended life bulbs be used in those hard to reach fixtures.

Lumens or light output is an important consideration when you buy bulbs. The same wattage in bulbs will not necessarily produce the same number of lumens.

If bulbs in your lamps and fixtures have to be replaced frequently look for the cause. They should last about as long as the number of hours listed on the package.

Bulbs burn out for several reasons:

- faulty socket
- excessive vibration
- overheating - using higher wattage than recommended for fixture or lamp
- high voltage - try 125 or 130 volt bulbs to replace the 120 volt bulbs.

You may have to search for the higher voltage, but it will be worth the effort.

Quick Oatmeal Bread

- 1 cup evaporated milk
- 2 tablespoons vinegar
- 1 cup quick cooking rolled oats (uncooked)
- 1 egg
- ½ cup finely packed brown

- sugar
- 1 cup sifted flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 1 cup raisins
- 2 tbsp. shortening, melted

Stir vinegar into the milk, pour over oats. Beat egg until light. Add sugar gradually and beat until fluffy. Add the oat mixture and mix well. Sift flour, salt, and soda together into the egg mixture. Blend well. Stir in raisins and shortening. Pour into a greased loaf pan which has been lined with waxed paper. Bake in 350 degree oven until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, about 50 minutes. Makes 1 loaf.

County Agent's Notes

Wheat Popular Crop

It looks like wheat production in Tishomingo County is a crop that's here to stay. We should have another fair-sized crop this year, although many of our farmers may set aside part of last year's acreage to qualify for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's target price.

On a statewide basis, our Extension Grain Specialist Dr. Charles Baskin tells me we will probably plant about 800,000 acres of wheat this fall is current prices hold. That would compare with a little over one million acres

last year.

Already, many of our farmers are asking questions about wheat planting, specifically about varieties and seed supplies. We should have enough seed for grain production. Some of the newer varieties may be in short supply, but enough seed of good, older varieties should be available to plant our desired acreage.

Some newer varieties will be available in limited quantities or available only for seed production. They are Coker 916, Hunter, Terra 800-20, Terra-Norris, Omega 78, Ray, Pike, and Fla 301. Follow these varieties closely. They have good potential in our area in the next few years.

Under the plant variety protection act, the sale of a variety that is protected without proper arrangements with the owner of the variety is a violation of federal law. Farmers can save their own seed and plant as many acres as they like, but they shouldn't sell seed without permission.

Fertilize - Young Plants Need It

If you planted young trees and shrubs this spring, they could probably use another dose of fertilizer about this time. This should last them until next spring.

Mature plants older than three years usually don't need fertilizing but once a year unless a soil test shows otherwise. But younger plantings such as those made this spring need a second ap-

publication, preferably by September 15. Young and active plants need more nutrients than mature ones.

An empty coffee can with a plastic lid makes a good applicator. Cut holes in the plastic top to make a shaker. You may have to refill several times to apply the amount needed.

After applying, water the plants and soil thoroughly to dissolve the fertilizer and carry it to the roots. Don't use more than the recommended rate, and don't use a fertilizer mixture stronger than 10-10-10.

Letter To The Editor

To My Dear Friends In Christ,

For the past few days there has been much confusion over the issue of whether or not a woman should be elected to the office of deacon in our church. As a woman, as a Christian who has taught and studied God's Word in some

capacity for the past twenty-eight years, and as a Christian who's foremost desire in life is to do the will of my God and to witness to the saving power of the blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, I would like to give you my reasons why I do not believe that a woman should hold the office of deacon in the church:

I do not believe that it is scriptural for a woman to be in authority over the man in the church, and the office of deacon is an office of authority. We elect our deacons to work with the pastor in carrying out the spiritual role of the church in accordance with God's will. We look to our deacons to lead our church in business matters as well. So it is a position of authority; authority placed on the deacons by God and by the members of the church.

Throughout the history of the Old Testament, God never placed a woman in the position of serving as a priest.

Jesus' apostles were all men.

In the qualification requirements for becoming a deacon, as outlined in 1 Timothy 3, there is not the first indication that a woman is to be considered for the office of deacon:

Verse 1: "If a man (not man or woman) desire the office..."

Verse 2: "A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife." (It does not read "or the wife of one husband".)

Verse 4: "One that ruleth well his (not her) own house..."

Verse 11: "Even so must their wives be grave..." (It does not read "or even so must their wives be grave...").

Verse 12: "Let the deacons be the husband of one wife..." (It does not read "Or let the wife be of one husband").

I believe that electing women to the office of deacon in the church would be in open defiance of the rules that the Apostle Paul, through the leadership of the Holy Spirit, laid down for the HEADSHIP of our Lord's church.

Our God is not a God of confusion. I Corinthians 14:33

ASCS Farm News

CCC LOAN INTEREST RATE INCREASED TO 14 PERCENT — Commodity and farm storage loans disbursed in August by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Commodity Credit Corporation will carry a 14 percent interest rate. The new rate, up from 13.5 percent, reflects the interest rate charged CCC by the U.S. Treasury in August.

PRICE SUPPORT LOANS AVAILABLE ON HONEY — Price support loans are available on 1982 crop honey at a national average rate of 60.4 cents per pound. According to Elmer A. South, Chairman of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) Committee, this is up 3 cents from the 1981 rate. The

Chairman went on to say that individual loans are based on differentials according to color and class.

South said these are Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans which are administered by local ASC Committees. They are nonrecourse type loans under which the commodity pledged for loan serves as collateral. Upon loan maturity, the producer has the option of repaying the principal plus interest and redeeming the pledged commodity, or forfeiting the pledged commodity as loan repayment.

South went on to say that producers may apply for loans at any ASCS office through January 1983. Loans will mature not later than April 30, 1983. He advised honey producers to contact their local ASCS office for detailed information on loan rates for individual classes of honey, size and type of suitable containers, and other details.

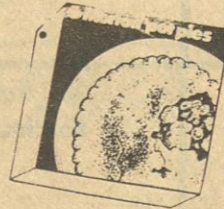
