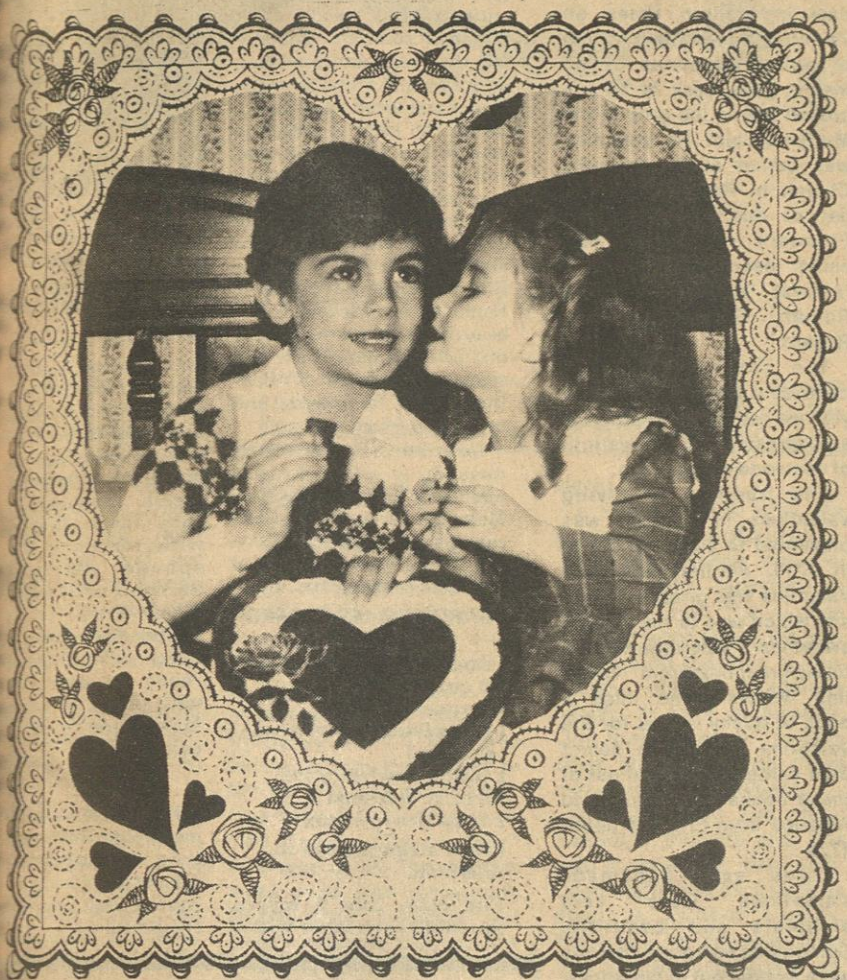

Three Northeast Mississippi Counties Eligible For Disaster Loans

Farmers in three Northeast Mississippi counties are eligible to seek emergency loans due to losses suffered this month from ice and snow, U.S. Senator Thad Cochran (R-Miss.) said.

Senator Cochran said the Farmers Home Administration in Washington notified him it was declaring Itawamba, Monroe and Tishomingo counties eligible for disaster declarations.

The agency said the designation came after farmers and poultry producers in the area suffered heavy losses and property damage during ice and snow storms which occurred Feb. 1-7.

Farmers Home said farmers in those counties had until Oct. 14 this year to apply for emergency loans at the agency's local offices in those counties.

Senator Cochran said Farmers Home informed him the disaster declaration for Itawamba, Monroe and Tishomingo was effective Tuesday.

Icy Road Conditions Claim Life of Golden Woman

Icy road conditions in Itawamba County claimed the life of a Tishomingo County woman in an automobile accident Wednesday, February 6.

Sonja Davis Horn, 43, of Golden, was pronounced dead on arrival at the Itawamba County Hospital following a head-on collision with another car. The Mississippi Highway Patrol reported that Mrs. Horn apparently lost control of her car on a patch of ice on MS 25 and collided with a car, driven by Lowery Grown, also of Golden. It was said the driver of the second car was not injured.

Mrs. Horn was reportedly on her way to work at the Itawamba County Chancery Clerk's Office when the accident occurred. She had been employed there for about two months. The accident took place around 7:30 a.m.

Mrs. Horn was a member of Antioch Baptist Church. Services were held Thursday, February 7, at the Antioch Baptist Church with Rev. Ray Cantrell officiating. Burial was in the church cemetery with Deaton Funeral Home of Belmont in charge of arrangements.

Survivors include her husband, Billy Ray Horn, of Golden; a son, Mark Horn, of Golden; three daughters, Mrs. Rhonda Bohannon, Miss Michele Horn and Miss Stephanie Horn, all of Golden; a brother, Harmon Davis, of Golden; two sisters, Mrs. Pansy Davis and Mrs. Brenda Reeves, of Golden; and one grandchild.

Icy Road, Wreck Injures One

An Iuka man was hospitalized following an early Monday evening weather related automobile accident at the crossing of Pleasant Hill Road and the new four-lane US 72.

Austin Borden, 43, was said to have received multiple contusions and fractures and transferred from the local hospital to the North Mississippi Medical Facility following the accident.

According to a report made by Chief Deputy Mike Kemp, Mr. Borden was a passenger in a 1976 Mercury, driven by his son, Edward Borden, of Red Bay, Ala. Kemp said the Borden vehicle was traveling south on the Pleasant Hill Road when it hit ice and slid directly into front of a 1980 Dodge pickup, driven by John Chandler, of Independence, Mo. It was stated that Mr. Chandler, nor his wife, who was traveling with him, were injured in the mishap.

HIGH ELECTRIC BILLS TO BE SEEN IN AREA

The arctic cold air which has brought record temperatures to much of the country is also responsible for sharply higher bills to electric heating customers in this area, according to Cecil Brown, Manager of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association.

"Electric bills for most customers with electric heat are much higher than last month," Brown stated. "Most bills will also be higher than for the same period last year," he added.

This is due almost entirely to the colder weather and not to higher rates, Brown explained.

The cost of 2,000 kWh to Power Association residential customers is up only 38 cents over last year due to rate changes.

Weather bureau records in Tupelo show this January had 1018 degree days. December was much warmer than normal with only 363 degree days. This means that almost three times as much heat was required during January as compared with December. It also means that this January was 37 percent colder than normal and 15 percent colder than January last year.

Meter reading dates do not coincide with the calendar

month. But the above information can give customers an indication of what to expect in bills reflecting heating costs. Mr. Brown advises customers to plan their current budgets in anticipation of higher heating bills.

"Brown also urges customers who have not done so to request a free home energy survey. This can be done by calling the Power Association office. A trained energy advisor will make an on-site survey of your home and make recommendations for cost effective weatherization improvements

needed. Electric heating and cooling customers will probably be eligible for interest-free weatherization loans. Measures eligible for financing include insulation, storm windows, weatherstripping, and caulking.

Electric heating customers should also ask about the Heat Pump Finance Plan. This is a program for providing surveys, recommendations and low-cost loans for approved heat pump installations. "The heat pump is much more efficient and uses less electricity than ordinary electric furnaces," Brown added.

COUNTY DELEGATION PROTESTS T.V.A. IN LIEU OF TAX BILL

A delegation of Tishomingo County business and government leaders voiced strong opposition before a House Ways and Means Subcommittee last week at the State Capitol to legislation that would use the Tennessee Valley Authority's in lieu of tax payments owed them from a now defunct Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant.

Currently the in lieu money is going to pay for bridges spanning the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway, but those are slated to be paid for next year and the in lieu payments will eventually run out because construction has

been halted on the Yellow Creek Plant.

The bill, which was introduced in mid-January by Rep. Tim Ford, of Tupelo, and approved by Governor Bill Allain, would take about \$60 million from the money paid by TVA in lieu of taxes for the plant. If approved it would create an organization to oversee development along the Tenn-Tom with the TVA money.

The measure would also establish a governing board for the economic development council, giving all Tenn-Tom counties equal representation on the council board,

and all counties, except Lee, would be required to ante up a mill of local tax in support of the council.

Tishomingo County is one of several in Northeast Mississippi which receives payments from TVA in lieu of property taxes on land the federal utility owns and uses for power generation purposes.

Tishomingo was to receive the majority of those payments because of the Yellow Creek Plant. However, the state diverted those funds in 1976 to a sinking fund to pay for the 10 bridges, four of which are in Tishomingo County.

Representative Mack Lloyd Wadkins, of Iuka, has led opposition against the development bill since its introduction. He stated before the subcommittee that he does not oppose the much needed economic development in Northeast Mississippi. He pointed out, "What we are opposed to is raping Tishomingo County of funds to achieve this."

Iuka realtor, P.O. Beard, told subcommittee members that the in lieu of tax payments were indeed in lieu of ad valorem taxes to the county and not given out of the goodness of TVA's heart. The move to spread these payments over the several counties would amount to taking ad valorem taxes out of Tishomingo County.

Representative Jerry Wilburn, of Itawamba County, spoke in opposition to the measure, criticizing plans to establish a new agency to coordinate waterway development. "We don't need another agency telling us what to do. We don't mind being coordinated to up there," he said, adding "we do mind being dictated to by some people like we have been."

No definite action has been taken on the measure at press-time; however, it was expected to go before floor action during the latter part of this week.

BURNSVILLE GARMENT FACTORY SHUTS DOWN

Plans of moving into a recently completed industrial building have been discarded in favor of moving to Corinth by company officials of Dixie Sportswear of Burnsville.

Tishomingo's unemployment figures will realize an increase due to the January 29 close-down of the plant.

When contacted in regard to the action, County Board of Supervisor's President, Gerald Parsons, responded, "I was told by the company's owner, Thurston Little, of Corinth, that the facility was losing lots of money in Burnsville on their general overall operation. Thus, the decision to relocate the business to their Corinth based counterpart was made."

Parsons stated the plant had employed approximately 125 workers primarily from Tishomingo County. He said a portion of the operators would continue to work for the plant in Corinth, while

others would not be as fortunate.

The plant had been operating under the management of Carl Hussey, of Corinth, and had earlier plans of expansion which would double the number employed and necessitate the move into the larger modern facility obtained by the Town of Burnsville through a Community Development Block Grant. Prior to its closing, manufacturing was done out of a Highway 72 building, owned by J.C. Lambert, of Burnsville.

In issuing a statement concerning the decision, Parsons said, "I sure am sorry to see it go out of business here. The plant certainly was a boost to our county coming during a time of high unemployment."

Parsons said he had confidence of getting new industry in the area to help replace the jobs lost by the move of the garment industry. He said several

prospects had made contact in connection with the leasing of the C.D.B.G. industrial building.

Ripley Industries To Consolidate

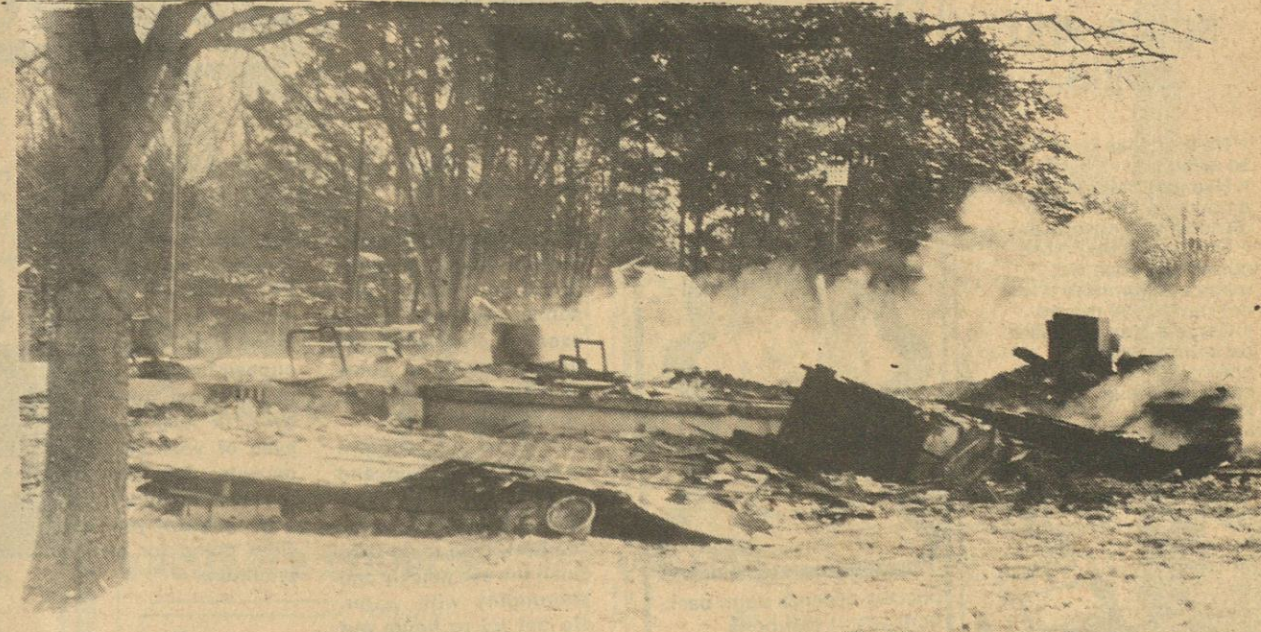
Ripley Industries announced that it will be phasing out its manufacturing operation in Collierville, Tennessee. The phase out is expected to be completed by the latter part of April, 1985.

Manufacturing will be consolidated into the other Ripley facilities in Adamsville, TN, and Iuka, MS.

Company officials say that the consolidation is an attempt to streamline operations.

Details of the move are incomplete, and representatives of the company will be meeting with union officials to discuss the impact of the decision.

Corporate offices will remain in Collierville.

Cold Damaged Landscape Plants

By: Leon Perry, Area Extension Agent

The cold temperatures in the past few weeks has damaged many landscape plants in the area. Just how the damage is may not be known until spring or early summer.

that landscape shrubs have been under severe stress during the past few years due to summer drought and extreme winter temperatures. Many ornamentals were trying to bloom in late December and were not sufficiently hardened off before the sub-zero temperatures in January. This extreme fluctuation in temperatures placed a tremendous amount of stress on all plants.

WHAT TO DO NOW

1. Wait and see how much of the plant greens up or sprouts in early spring. At that time you can see the dead twigs which need to be removed.
2. Save your leaves and pine straw during the spring

clean up. This makes excellent mulch which will be needed during hot, dry summer months.

3. Avoid over-fertilizing shrubs which are under stress. Follow recommended rates very carefully. Over fertilization will do more harm than good.

4. Learn a good lesson from this experience, and plant only those plants that are cold hardy for this area. Also provide recommended cultural practices that will promote winter hardiness.
