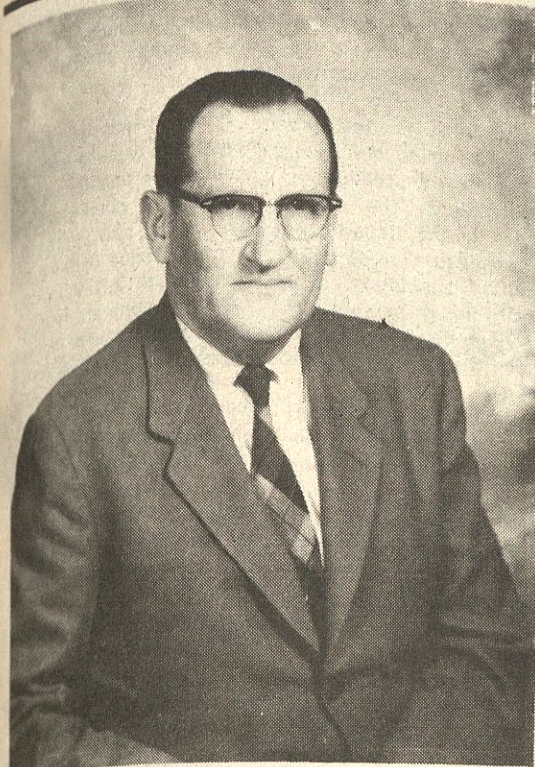

### FUNERAL SERVICES HELD FOR HIRAM A. JONES

Hiram Anselm Jones, 80, outstanding and distinguished citizen of Iuka, died November 30, 1985, after a two year illness. He was retired from the USDA Soil Conservation Service, a member of the Rotary Club, a Boy Scout Leader, and a member of the United Methodist Church.

Born in Pelahatchie, Mississippi, Mr. Jones lived the major portion of his life in Iuka and he will long be remembered for his love for this area and its people. He enjoyed the association with the many, many people he considered friends.

His first love was work for the Lord. In the church he served on many committees, was an official on the administrative board, was an active layman with an active interest in the parish and a Sunday school teacher. Mr. Jones was proud of the many plaques and medals he received from the church for distinguished service and appreciation.

Upon his retirement after approximately 30 years service with the Soil Conservation Service and other positions with the agriculture department throughout the state, he spent his leisure working in his garden and flowers. He took much pride in his yard and raised a variety of flowers. He was very humeloving and enjoyed reading the many, many books and set of books in his vast collections dealing in a wide range of topics.

Services were held Monday, December 2, at the Iuka Methodist Church with Rev. Frank Burton, Rev. Jack Williams and Rev. John Garrett officiating. Burial was in Oak Grove Cemetery.

Jones of Canton, Texas; one sister, Mrs. Mamie Sue Evans of Asheville, N.C.; five grandchildren.

### Chief Whitaker Apprehends Burglar

A man identified as Kenneth Wayne Strange, age 22, has been arrested and charged with burglary and larceny following the break in at the Kenwin Shop downtown Iuka Wednesday night, November 27.

Around 2:00 a.m. Thursday, November 28, while making a routine patrol Police Chief Floyd Whitaker said he noticed a green Ford station wagon parked in front of Iuka Guaranty Bank and a man walking from the alley carrying sacks. The suspect was apprehended and investigation revealed the contents of the bags to be various articles of womens clothing bearing Kenwin price tags. Further investigation determined that someone had entered Kenwin through a hole in the wall from an apartment which is located upstairs over the Kenwin store, and which is accessible from a stairway in the alley.

The merchandise estimated at \$700.00 has all been returned to the store according to Chief Whitaker. The suspect has been released on \$5,000 bond.

WHEREAS, we have an excessive number of automobile accidents each year in our community; and

WHEREAS, automobile accidents are proven to be the leading cause of death among people 44 and younger, accounting for over 30,000 fatalities in our nation each year; and

WHEREAS motor vehicle accidents are the number one cause of on-the-job fatalities and cost the average employer nearly \$120,000 per employee death; and

WHEREAS, it is proven that seat belts cut the number of injuries to people by 50%, and cut the number of human deaths by 60-70%; and

WHEREAS, car accidents are the leading killer of children, and a common cause of their death is their being crushed by adults who are not wearing their seat belts; and

WHEREAS, it is a law in Mississippi that all children two years old and younger be secured in an approved child car seat; and

WHEREAS, our own law enforcement authorities have agreed that many of our hometown folks killed in traffic accidents could still be alive had they used their seat belts; and

WHEREAS, one life wasted is one person too many;

### S.N.A.P. PROGRAM INITIATED IN AREA

In the last year many from our small community have died in car accidents. Too many. Since January 1, 1985, Tishomingo County has lost 14 people, Alcorn County has lost 8 people, and Prentiss County has lost 7 people. Over half of these were young people, tragically killed on our streets and highways. Some of these children could still be alive, according to the authorities, if only they had used their seat belts. They died needlessly. And everyone felt sorrow. And some folks took action.

The S.N.A.P. Program (Stop Needless Automobile Accidents) was created to save lives by educating folks—especially young people—about the life-saving value of seat belt and child car seat usage. S.N.A.P. was originally founded by several dynamic community leaders in Corinth distressed by our children's deaths. Though the program now receives federal funding, these same folks still provide advice and direction.

The people in our community need your help. S.N.A.P. is enlisting the talents and services of community leaders such as yourself in their effort to save our people. December, because of the holiday season and its excessive traffic accidents, has been selected to be "S.N.A.P. Your Seat Belt!" month. During this time, we are actively carrying out several different projects that should make our folks more aware of seat belt safety, and hopefully increase seat belt usage. These projects include a tri-county-wide English Composition Con-

test, involving up to 3,000 students; a special Christmas card mail-out in cooperation with area banks; extra media coverage; and quite possibly the launching of our child car seat loaner program.

You are invited to become a part of the S.N.A.P. Force. Please join with Mayor John H. Biggs and other area political leaders in declaring December "S.N.A.P. Your Seat Belt!" month. The people in our town will appreciate this expression of care and concern. With your involvement and, with God's help, we can keep some of our people safe.

### \$140,076 Highway Contract Awarded

Zack Stewart, Northern District Highway Commissioner has announced the awarding of a contract to Eutaw Construction Co., of Aberdeen, the low bidder of a contract cost of \$140,076.

Commissioner Stewart explained that the contract will provide for slide repair on Mississippi Highway 350 in Tishomingo County. The work will begin at the Tishomingo County line and will extend to Mississippi Highway 25.

The Commissioner said that the slide repair will prevent dirt along the slides of the highway from being washed onto the pavement, therefore, providing a safer traveling surface for all motorists. Commissioner Stewart encourages all those driving thru the project limits to exercise caution.

The completion date is May 30, 1986.



### Sisters Die In Car Crash

The lives of three sisters were claimed in a weekend car accident about four and one-half miles south of Iuka on Mississippi 25, late Friday. State Trooper, Jerry Boyd identified the trio to be Miss

LuVera Blissit and Miss Gertrude Blissit, both of Tishomingo and Mrs. Mary Blissit Jackson of Hernando. Trooper Boyd said the driver apparently lost control of the vehicle and crossed the oncoming left lane before

veering back across the highway and going off the right shoulder of the road. The car crashed into a tree. Witnesses to the accident have reported the possible involvement of a second vehicle which was described

to officials to be a small older model white car. Investigation into the accident was still being conducted at press time. The wreckage of the late model Oldsmobile was towed in by Moore's Body Shop wrecker service in Iuka.

## THREE SISTERS KILLED IN CRASH NEAR IUKA

A Thanksgiving holiday weekend automobile accident within the county claimed the lives of three senior citizens Friday, November 29. The three victims were identified as sisters; two of whom were residents of Tishomingo, the other of Hernando, Mississippi.

LuVera Blissit, 77, of Tishomingo; Mary B. Jackson, 71, of Hernando, and Gertrude Blissit, 73, of Tishomingo, were all pronounced dead at Tishomingo County Hospital following the late afternoon tragedy.

Trooper Jerry Boyd of the Mississippi Highway Patrol said the 1980 Delta 88 Oldsmobile, which was being driven by Miss LuVera Blissit, was traveling 4.5 miles south of Iuka on Mississippi 25 when the 4:30 p.m. accident occurred. According to the officer, the car apparently went out of control and crossed the oncoming lane before veering back across the highway going off the right shoulder and crashing into a tree.

Law officials continue to search for the driver of an older model small white car which witnesses to the accident said was possibly involved in the mishap. Officer Boyd said witnesses told him as the white car attempted to pass the women's vehicle, that it veered back into the sister's car when another car in the opposing lane approached. Investigation into the accident was still underway at press time.

Others responding and assisting with the wreck scene included area game wardens, members of the sheriff's office, and Iuka City Policemen.

### Insects On Firewood

Cooler weather has finally arrived, and many families will light a fire in their fireplace or woodstove. When you bring wood in the home remember that insects may get in the door, too.

Although a large number of insects may be found on the wood, most of them are harmless. The insects are usually looking for food or overwintering places under loose bark or in hollow wood.

One insect can be more bothersome than others, however. Roaches hide under loose bark and usually are more of a problem where wood has been stacked over a long period of time.

Beetles, termites and carpenter ants aren't likely to become established in the home through firewood because they usually leave the firewood when their colonies are disturbed.

It's easy to keep insects from entering your home on firewood, and no insecticides

are needed or recommended. Before carrying wood into the house, knock the sticks against something solid to jar the insects loose. Don't stack firewood in or against the house.

Stack the wood in cold areas of the house, such as the garage or unheated porch. Use any wood you carry in the house within a day or two.

### Kerosene Heater Safety

Kerosene heaters can help heat a home or camphouse when cold weather hits, but they are most effective when used safely.

New safety standards, established in 1984 provide safety features that may not be included on older models. Improved guards or grills reduce the risk of accidental burns and a manual shut-off device allows for quick shut-off in an emergency.

The new labels stress the use of water-clear 1-K kerosene only as a fuel. A new wick-stop mechanism

prevents the wick from being retracted to a dangerously low setting.

When buying a kerosene heater, be sure the heater has these safety features and has been approved by a nationally recognized testing laboratory.

Whether you buy a heater this year or use one you already own, following these safety tips will insure a safe heating season.

Use the heater in rooms open to the rest of the house. It is not safe to operate a kerosene heater in a confined area without the proper ventilation.

Place the heater at least three feet from flammable materials and don't use the heater in areas where gasoline, paint solvents and other flammable vapors may be.

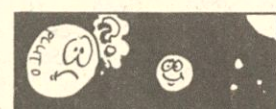
Never leave an operating heater unattended or while you are sleeping. Don't let children operate or refuel the heater.

Don't move, service or refuel the heater when it's on or still hot. Refuel the heater outdoors, away from flammable materials. Store the fuel away from living areas outdoors, in a well-marked container, out of reach of children.

These steps will insure

safe usage of kerosene heaters. If you already own a kerosene heater, be sure to clean it properly before operating it this season.

## CARING FOR YOUR PET



### Heartworms Are Major Canine Danger

A simple mosquito bite can spell death for your dog if that bite carries canine heartworm disease.

Heartworms are parasites, carried by mosquitoes from dog-to-dog. They mature in an unprotected dog's heart and large blood vessels, sometimes reaching a length of 14 inches and the diameter of a pencil lead.

Heavy infestations of heartworms—or even a few heartworms over a long period of time—impair the flow of blood throughout the dog's body, causing damage not only to the heart but to the lungs, liver and kidneys as well. Heartworms can cause a slow, painful death.

If discovered in its early stages, the disease can be treated effectively and leave little or no permanent damage to the animal. In its later stages, however, the disease becomes more difficult to cure and frequently causes permanent damage to the animal's health.

No vaccine currently is available to immunize your dog against canine heartworm disease.

Effective preventive medication, however, is

available in liquid, tablet and chewable tablet forms. The medication—which prevents larvae of immature heartworms from reaching adulthood—is given daily to provide continuous protection for the dog.

If given to a dog already infected with heartworms, the preventive medication can cause acute illness. It is vital, therefore, to have your pet checked for heartworms prior to beginning a program of prevention.

Heartworm disease was once confined to the coastal areas of the South, along oceans and rivers. Today, however, the disease has become a major canine health problem.

Statistics in Tennessee indicate that more than 6 percent of the dogs tested in the state for heartworms prove positive.

### FOREIGN INVESTORS RE- MINDED OF AGRICULTURAL LAND REPORTING RULE

Foreigners who acquire or transfer any interest other than a security interest in Tishomingo County's agricultural land are required to report the transaction within 90 days to the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

County ASC official Howard R. Bridges, chairperson of the Tishomingo County ASC Committee said the requirement stems from the Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act and those who fail to report, or who are late in reporting face possible fines. The report provides the U.S. Department of Agriculture with the amount of agricultural land owned by foreign persons.

A foreign disclosure report must be filed when a single foreign individual, organization, or government holds a direct or indirect interest of 10 percent or more; when a group of foreign individuals, organizations, or governments, acting in concert, hold an aggregate interest of 10 percent or more;

when a group of foreign individuals, organizations, and governments each with less than 10 percent and not aggregating in concert hold an aggregate of 50 percent or more in agricultural land.

Bridges said agricultural land is any tract of more than 10 acres now in agricultural use, or timber production. "This includes land used for agricultural use when purchased, as well as land converted to agricultural use," He said foreigners who own or have an interest in the report unless annual proceeds from the sale of agricultural products grown on these acres exceed \$1,000.

Foreign disclosure reports contain the date the land was acquired or transferred, the value of the purchase price yet to be paid, and the estimated value of the land. The ASCS official said foreign persons are required to keep direct and indirect ownership information current, file a report if they cease to be a foreign person, and if the agricultural land ceases to be agricultural.

As of December 2, 1985, foreign investors had reported owning about 6,653 acres of Tishomingo County agricultural land.

1. STAY AWAY FROM DOWNED POWER LINES and broken utility poles. Please note the location and call us immediately. Even lines that look harmless can be dangerous.
2. If your power is out, check your neighbors. If they still have electricity, check your fuses or circuit breakers. If that doesn't solve the problem, give us a call.
3. Once you've called us, there's no need to keep calling; your request will be handled as soon as possible. However, if your power is still out once your neighbors' have been returned to service, you should call again.
4. When service is restored, overloaded lines could cause another outage. You can help prevent this by switching off your heating and cooling equipment and other appliances during the outage. Leave a light on so you'll know when service is back on.
5. Don't keep checking the refrigerator and freezer. Food will keep much longer if the doors are left closed.
6. Prepare a "lights out" kit: keep a flashlight, spare fuses, and battery-powered radio handy. Know where the electric service panel for your home is located and how to reset circuit breakers or replace blown fuses. Make sure your family knows where the kit is and what to do if you are not at home.

## In Service

Antisubmarine Warfare Operator Mark Emmons runs tests on all equipment prior

## "NAVY IS A FAMILY TRADITION" FOR PETTY OFFICER MARK EMMONS

Navy aviators have a saying: "Airplanes fly. Helicopters beat the air into submission."

Operating the machine that performs such a tricky task requires careful attention to every detail, from flight and major repair to so-called "minor" maintenance and repair. Mark Emmons of Iuka is part of a team that does just that.

Emmons, son of Lola Emmons of Iuka, is an aviation antisubmarine warfare operator with Helicopter Antisubmarine Squadron 43 (HSL-43), located at Naval Air Station North Island here. The 25-year-old petty officer third class is a 1978 graduate of Iuka High School.

"My job involves looking for submarines from a helicopter," says Emmons. "We use a lot of different sensors to detect, locate and track subs, including magnetic detection and sonar radio monitoring. We can use radar if they're on the sur-

face." "I'm also a rescue swimmer," he adds. "Our secondary mission on the helicopter is rescue. In the ship I'm the rescue swimmer instructor."

Emmons entered the Navy in February of 1984. "I've always wanted to fly," he says. "I was getting burned out at school, so I decided to join the Navy. I'm pretty familiar with the Navy, since my father was in for 23 years as a storekeeper. My brother is also in the Navy—he's graduating from basic underwater demolition school, so I guess the Navy is a family tradition."

After boot camp at the Great Lakes Naval Training Center north of Chicago, Emmons received extensive Navy training in antisubmarine warfare. He also attended aircrew school and rescue swimmer school before reporting to HSL-43 in June of this year.

HSL-43 is the Navy's newest operational helicopter squadron. The "Battlecats" fly the Sikorsky SH-60B Seahawk, the Navy's newest and most sophisticated antisubmarine helicopter. Aboard the aircraft is the Light Airborne Multi-Purpose System (LAMPS) Mark III. Operating either independently or in concert with a cruiser, destroyer or frigate, the LAMPS-equipped Seahawk serves as an "eye in the sky," extending a ship's antisubmarine warfare and antiship surveillance capabilities well beyond the horizon. Using acoustic, magnetic and electronic methods, the Seahawk can locate and identify submarines hidden in the ocean depths.

Secondary missions of the helicopter include search and rescue, replenishment at sea, and communications relay.

"I love what I'm doing here," says Emmons. "It's the excitement of it, really. Just swooping down from out of the sky is a great feeling." "Sometimes you're too busy to look out of the window, though. If there's a big test exercise going on and you're working with a sub on a battle problem it can be a challenge trying to put the whole puzzle together. It's really interesting." HSL-43 provides detachments of aircraft, pilots, and support personnel to deploying Navy ships. The recent deployment of HSL-43's Detachment One aboard the frigate USS Crommelin marked the first West Coast deployment of the LAMPS Mk III system.

pecans may be purchased in quantity when prices are most reasonable and enjoyed all year through. You can store unshelled pecans in a cool, dry place for about six months. Unshelled pecans resist insects and aging much longer than shelled nuts.

However, shelling before storage reduces their bulk by approximately one-half. Shelled or unshelled pecans may be kept under refrigeration in airtight containers for about nine months or stored in the freezer for up to two years.

Pecans are usually the preferred nut, especially for the holidays. The reason is their full, rich flavor. Unlike some other nuts, they contribute a lot more than crunch to recipes.

Pecans can be enjoyed in a wide variety of ways all year round. Don't save them only for holiday baking. Instead, keep a supply of shelled pecan pieces on hand for ready use any time for casseroles, cookies or snacks.

Pecans also make excellent Christmas gifts, plain or prepared in favorite recipes.

## Chatting With Your Home Economist

### Pecans

Pecans are a naturally delicious, nutritious food. Whether served right from the shell; toasted with butter, sugared, spiced or salted; mixed into salads, entrees, vegetables, desserts or served in dozens of other ways, pecans are a tasty addition to flavor, crunch and nutrition.

With so little trouble and little money, too, pecans can be added to a multitude of dishes, appetizers and snacks. Yet they always add a fancy touch, not to mention rich flavor and appealing crunch. Only a handful or so added to most recipes will do the trick.

Although pecans have been traditionally popular in pies, cakes, other sweet baked goods and desserts, they're equally delicious in casseroles, salads, sandwich fillings and vegetables. It's fun to use your imagination to see just how many different ways you can use pecans to make a dish special.

As far as researchers can tell, pecan trees have been growing for thousands of years. A relative of the walnut and hickory, pecan trees are thought to have grown wild along rivers with flowing waters, which carried them throughout much of the country.

Records of early Spanish and French explorers show that American Indian tribes inhabiting the Mississippi Valley, as far north as Illinois and into Western Texas and Southern Oklahoma, knew about pecan trees long before the discovery of America.

To select nuts in the shell which are of the highest quality, choose those that are clean and free of splits, cracks, stains or holes. There is no correlation between the quality of a nut and its size.

When selecting shelled pecans, look for plump nutmeats which are fairly uniform in color and size. The best ones have a golden brown color.

You may choose halves for garnishes, but pecan pieces will suit most of your needs. They usually cost less and will save you chopping time.

Pecans are long lasting and, when stored properly, hold their freshness for up to two years. This means

"Baby's toys should be too large to put in the mouth, washable, lightweight and non-brittle."

"Some toys, such as roller skates or skateboards, will be less likely to cause your child injury if you insist that he or

she wears clothing-helmets, knee pads and elbow pads.
