

Authorities identified Garlin Thomas Bullard Jr., 17, of luka, to be the fatality. both remain. Those injured were identified as Benny Phifer, 22, and Jesse Ledbetter, 31, both of

Details of the accident are still being investigated, according to Chief Deputy, Mike Kemp; however, reports indicated that Bullard was traveling alone in his 1981 Camaro heading south on Eastport Road when he met the second vehicle involved, a 1984 Caprice, driven by Phifer, northbound in a curve virtually head-on. Ledbetter was the only passenger in the second car. The wreck occurred some three miles outside luka. Both vehicles were

Off duty luka Police Officer, Ricky Cornelison was the first law official to arrive at the accident scene and alerted the sheriff's office, also requesting that ambulances be dispensed to the scene. State Trooper, Jerry Boyd arrived, followed by Sheriff Payne, auxiliary deputy, William Lambert, and other city policemen. A large crowd of motorists and spectators gathered before the wreckage could be cleared.




Sports Car Totaled



Farmers in Tishomingo County who have highly erodible land should review the provisions of the conservation reserve program of the

If the land qualifies a producer may receive 50 percent cost-share for establishing a permanent cover and an annual payment for a 10-year contract period.

Planting trees has always been a good investment for many producers and the conservation reserve program might improve that invest-

At the end of the 10-year contract period, participants will have a stand of trees that will produce income for many years. On most sites pine trees could be ready to thin within three to five years after the contract expires. Those trees that are thinned will

Additional income could be supplied through hunting leases if the participant plants trees in combination with

approved wildlife food plants. Loblolly and slash pine seedlings and direct seeding of oaks (planting acorns) are approved tree planting practices in the program. Approved wildlife planting include bi-color lespedeza. serecia, kobe, perennial clover, autumn olive, sawtooth oak, crabapples and bahiagrass.

In Case Of Poisoning

Family pets risk all kinds of poisoning. And they can be poisoned in all kinds of places. Snakes can poison.

Some plants can poison. And hundreds of materials used around the home every day can poison. The list of what can poison a pet is virtually endless. The symptoms of

poisoning vary Sometimes the symptoms appear almost immediately. Other times, the signs are more gradual in their appearance. If you suspect your pet

has been poisoned, contact your veterinarian immediately. If possible determine

the nature of the poison, when it was ingested and the amount swallowed. If possible, take the container or label from the container with you to the veterinarian. Keep the animal warm

and quiet. Do not attempt to induce vomiting unless instructed to do so by your veterinarian. Most of the time

poisoning is accidental. Most of the time poisoning is due to carelessness. Most of the time poisoning is due to carelessness on the part of owners. Know where your pet is and what your pet is doing at all times. And above all, keep poisonous substances out of the reach of your pet.

Low-Salt Taste Test

World-wide population studies have linked high-salt diets, like those typical of the United States, with higher rates of hypertension. Half of U.S. citizens have some degree of high blood pressure by age 50. The condition can begin in childhood, when salt habits are learned. Could young people be persuaded to adopt low-salt diets? Two school groups addressed the Two school groups addressed the question.

A New Orleans elementary school reduced salt gradually in cafeteria lunch menus. Salt was eventually reduced substantially-for instance, 75 percent in rolls and 50 percent in

Two New England boarding schools for high-school-age students serving three meals a day reduced total salt intake by 35 percent.

In both schools, low-salt foods were accepted readily. In the elementary school there were no differences in the amount of food left on plates after salt reduction and no negative comments from students or teachers. At the boarding schools, students approved of the low-salt menus and even complained about salty taste when regular foods were returned to the table.
