\$1.00 Fee In Effect For Entering State Parks

As most of you are aware, legislation has been passed making law an entrance fee to all Mississippi State Parks beginning July 1. The fee will be \$1.00 per vehicle of one to four people. A vehicle carrying over four will be assessed an additional twenty-five cents per person. Buses will be charged twenty-five cents per person also.

For those who visit the parks often, a \$10 yearly pass is available, which is a window sticker that goes on your car. Each time you drive out to the park, you enter at no additional cost as long as you are in the vehicle bearing the yearly pass. This same pass will gain you entrance into any Mississippi State Park for the year's period the pass covers. Those staying overnight in a cabin, motel, or camping are exempt from this fee as it is included in their charge for overnight accommodations.

The entrance fee came about through legislation resulting in House Bill 1369. It is a means of collecting additional revenues needed by the state. This is not the only means being used to collect additional revenue, but it is one that probably hits closer to home for us all than

possibly some other. I think it is also important for you to know that no one individual is responsible for this act of legislation. The legislative body voted, and the majority voted to impose the fee.

I realize many of you have had questions about this new policy, and I can understand that. My primary interest is in letting you, the people who have so graciously supported Coleman State Park, know the full details of this legislative action.

From a personal standpoint, I have never been disappointed by a single person from Iuka or Tishomingo County when it came to being supportive of the park and its policies. The same goes for other dedicated people who live outside Tishomingo County but visit the park often. I simply want to return that courtesy by keeping you informed and assuring you that I and my staff will assist you with any questions or problem you may encounter about this newly established fee. Please don't hesitate to let us know how we can help you.

If you haven't been out to the park in the past week, we have moved the entrance station from the side of the

road as you cross the creek to the center of the road. That was done solely to make the building more operative in collecting the fee. Additional asphalt will be poured on each side to widen the drive-through. We believe this will help us quickly and efficiently handle the transaction so that no one has to be detained by a line of traffic.

In hearing the comments of those who have seen the newly located entrance station, everyone has remarked that it makes the entrance to the park more attractive. We hope you will agree.

Someone on staff will operate the entrance station from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. Monday through Sunday. We are going to do our best to make this thing work, and hopefully one day we will see some of this revenue used to build more facilities here at the park and to improve the ones we have. Together we can make it happen. Thank you for your support and pride in J.P. Coleman State Park. With warmest personal regards, I remain

B'ville Restaurant Hit By Burglars

The Pour House Restaurant, in Burnsville, was hit by Burglars Thursday, June 26. The break-in occurred sometime between 8:00 p.m. closing time on Thursday, and opening time at 5:00 a.m. on Friday morning, June 27.

Mrs. Eloise Johnson, owner of the restaurant told The News that she discovered the burglary when she opened the restaurant on Friday morning.

The heavy metal back door of the building had been beaten with some object until the lock was knocked out. The inside drawer of the cash register containing coins, keys, and an envelope of money was gone. Mrs. Johnson stated that the drawer contained approximately

\$1,000.00. The doors had been torn off several of the game machines and the money taken from them also.

According to Mrs. Johnson money was apparently all the thieves were after. Some cigarettes were found lying on the floor but, the money was the only thing found missing.

Mrs. Johnson said the incident was investigated by Burnsville Police Officer Marcus Ivey, and Deputy W.C. Mayhall of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department. "Some footprints were found, and some subjects questioned, but no arrests were made," Mrs. Johnson said.

The News was unable to contact Mr. Ivey to obtain more information.

Tishomingo Officer Stops Robbery

Tishomingo Policeman, Wayne Roberts interrupted a robbery in progress at the Fairless Hardware store in Tishomingo, while night checking merchant doors during the weekend.

Anthony Gilley, mid to late 20's, of Tishomingo, was arrested and has been charged with breaking and entering in the incident.

The report indicated Officer Roberts was making routine checks about 2:35 a.m. Saturday when the subject was spotted inside the premises of the business. A pillowcase containing ap-

proximately \$500 worth of miscellaneous items including knives, water hose, tape measures, router and drill bits was taken into evidence.

Reports said Gilley had entered the door of the store by using a key. What type key or how he got possession of it was unknown. It was stated that Gilley had not been employed by the business.

County deputy, Benny Parrish and auxiliary officer, Bill McNatt assisted Roberts with the matter.

Sheriff Payne said Gilley was jailed under a \$5,000 bond. The case will be presented to the grand jury.

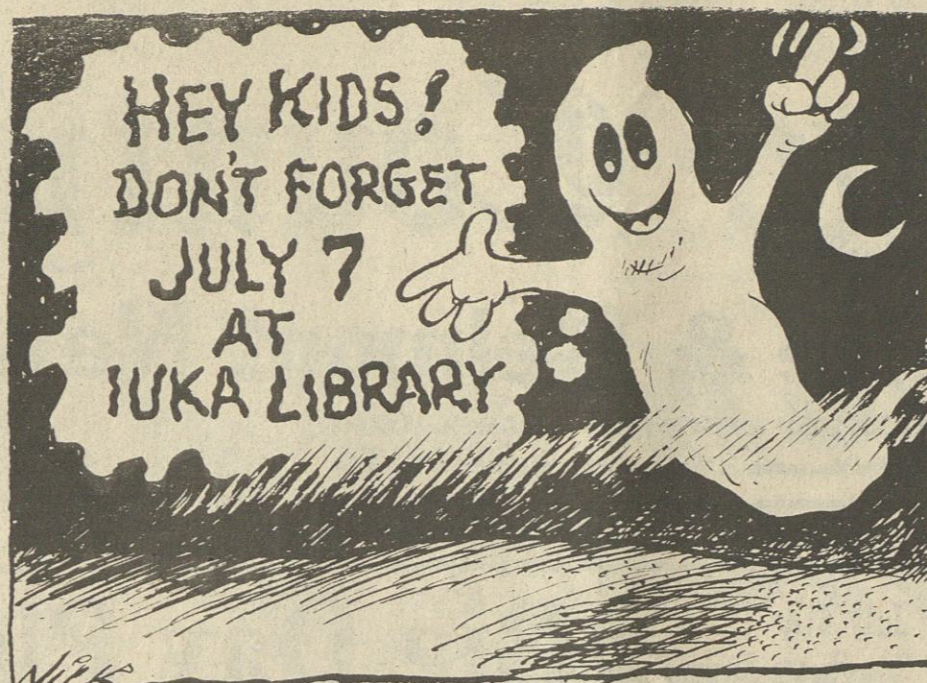

THE TISHOMINGO County Soil and Water Conservation District and local Pizza Inn and New Orleans Fried Chicken have teamed up to recycle empty pickle buckets into nesting boxes for wood ducks. These boxes are necessary because increased cutting of bottomland hardwoods in recent years has destroyed many natural wood duck nesting areas in Tishomingo County. These restaurants receive pickles and other ingredients in 5 gallon buckets that are discarded when contents have been removed. As a result of this union, inexpensive and economical wood duck nesting boxes can be constructed. The district collects these buckets and converts them into nesting boxes. Each structure requires two buckets. The top rim of each bucket is modified so that one bucket fits over the other like a huge medicine capsule. A 3 1/2 inch hole is cut on the side of the top half and drainage holes are drilled in the bottom half. For nesting material, 6 to 7" of wood shavings are placed in the bottom. These structures are then attached to posts or trees near water. These pickle bucket boxes have several advantages over other type boxes. Since top and bottom are pressed together, the structure can be unsnapped in seconds for cleaning and checking. Our

Chatting With Your Home Economist

C'mon, Let's Have
A Picnic

When a fine summer afternoon makes everyone "think picnic," you could find your self organizing one.

Never fear. Find the picnic hamper and the cooler. Then read through these warm weather food care hints before you head to the store.

Picnic Shopping--Buy perishable products last at the store and get them right home to the refrigerator, or into the portable ice-chest or insulated bag you're taking on the picnic. Never leave perishables in a hot car while you run other errands.

Cold Storage of Picnic Foods--For quick use, perishable products can be kept in the refrigerator for a few days. If the store wrap on meat and poultry is clean and not torn, leave it on. Otherwise, re-wrap products in clean plastic or aluminum wrap. Make sure the refrigerator is cooling food to 40 degrees Fahrenheit or lower.

For longer storage, freeze food. Wrap items tightly in heavy freezer foil or bags. Make sure your freezer registers 0 F or lower. NOTE: Mayonnaise-based meat, poultry and fish salads don't freeze well. Nor do tomatoes and lettuce.

Thawing--Do It the Night Before--Contrary to common practice, it's NOT safe to thaw meat and poultry on the kitchen counter. Bacteria can multiply dangerously in the outer layers before inner areas are thawed.

To allow plenty of time for larger cuts to thaw, take meat or poultry out of the freezer and put in on a refrigerator shelf a night or two before you need it. Small cuts will usually thaw in the refrigerator overnight.

But if the meat is still partially frozen when you're ready to leave, no problem. Just cook it a bit longer at the picnic.

Cook everything thoroughly. Hamburger patties, pork chops and ribs

should be cooked until all the pink is gone; poultry until there is no red in the joints. Fresh fish should be cooked till it "flakes" with a fork.

Steak? If you like your steak rare or medium-rare, just remember that there is a chance that some food poisoning organisms can survive such short cooking times.

Take What You Know About Kitchen Cleanliness Out to the Grill--If there's no water faucet available, use disposable, wet handwipes to clean your hands before working with food.

Keep bacteria on raw meat and poultry from spreading. Wash your hands again after working with raw meat or poultry and before handling other food.

And take up cooked meat and poultry with clean utensils onto a fresh plate for serving. Don't re-use utensils, plates or bowls you used with the raw product--for either the cooked meat or the other food.

COOL-IT With a Cooler--For a relaxed, worry-free picnic, keep your perishable food--ham, potato or macaroni salad, hamburger, hot dogs, lunch meat, cooked beef or chicken, deviled eggs, custard or cream pies--in a cooler.

While all mayonnaise-based salads should be kept on ice, the mayonnaise you buy at the store is not a food poisoning villain. Its high acid content actually slows bac-

terial growth. But homemade mayonnaise, if made without lemon juice or vinegar, can be risky.

The cooler should be well-insulated and packed with ice, or you can use a freezer-pack insert. Cold drinks in cans help keep other food cool too.

When possible, place the cooler in the shade. Keep the lid on.

Serving Young Picnickers--Toddlers who don't chew food well can choke when they try to swallow things whole. To minimize this danger, supervise mealtime. Keep the child seated. Cut hotdogs lengthwise in narrow strips before serving. Watch carrot and celery sticks, grapes, apples, cookies and nuts, too. Cut or crumble these foods into pieces too small to block the child's throat.

Leftovers?--Put perishable foods back in the cooler as soon as you finish eating. Don't leave them out while you go for a swim or hike.

When possible, put the chest in the passenger area of the car for the trip home. It's much cooler than the trunk!

If you were gone no more than four or five hours, and your perishables were on ice except when cooked and served, you should be able to save the leftovers.

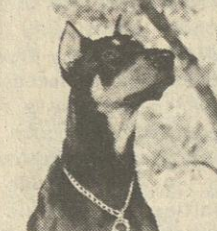

Remember pets and fireworks don't mix. The sound of fireworks can terrify your animal, causing it to run away--perhaps into traffic, perhaps never to return.

Remember also that an animal's ears are more sensitive than ours. Explosive noises may permanently damage your pet's hearing.

So while you are "shooting off" the

fireworks, leave your pet inside where it's safe.

And if you plan to grill outside on the Fourth, make sure your pet knows "it's hot". Cats in particular have become the victims of serious burns when jumping onto a grill.

Have fun on the Fourth. And make sure your pets do too.

**In Memory
Of**
Reba Wynn Bruton
By: Rebecca Bruton Moss
My grandmother, Reba
Wynn Bruton, was born July
7, 1903, in the Rutledge-
Salem community, the
daughter of S.A. Wynn and

Mary Stormont. She is
remembered by her family,
former students, and many
friends in the Midway com-
munity. Some may remember
seeing her cross Hwy. 25, at
Bruton Spring's bottom, to
tend the livestock. More will
acknowledge her sincere
concern for the people of this
community.

In honor of the anniversary

of her birth, I am pleased to
share some personal history,
and a fond remembrance of
my grandmother's life. The
following was copied from
her memoirs.

School Days
We lived far from school
and no one had heard of a
school bus in 1911. I was
eight years old when I started
school. I had to walk a half
mile to Uncle Ed's (Ed Wynn),
where I met his kids and we
walked another two miles to
school at Salem. I was so
eager to learn, the distance
wasn't a barrier.
I already knew how to read
and write, for my most prized
possession was my old "Red
Book", much worn from han-
dling. It had the alphabet,
figures, stories, and pictures.
Due to weather and distan-
ce, we did not go to school
everyday. We only had a four
month term then. Later it in-
creased to five months, then
six, and finally to the nine
months term it is now.
My first teacher was Mrs.
Fannie Miller, the aunt of Mrs.
Rhoda Stephens. Salem was
a one-teacher school with
pupils from six years to
grown.
By 1912, my brother, Ridley

was old enough to attend
school and Dad got us trans-
ferred to Springhill at Mid-
way. That was a long and
lonely route. We lived at the
old homeplace on Rutledge-
Salem road, near Joe
Aldridge's home. We went
north through the woods, to
where Alvis Stephens' house
now is, then uphill to George
Blisset's. We then followed a
path to where Hill's store is,
on Hwy. 25. The schoolhouse
stood where Springhill
cemetery is. We went to
Springhill for two years, and
then back to Salem.
Some of the teachers at
Springhill were: Luther
Owens, Blanche Wynn, and
Horace Long.
Teachers I remember at
Salem were: Aut Harvey,
Anice Reynolds, Blanche
Wynn, Pearl Reid, Gladys
Hodges, Leatha Glenn, Mae
Palmer, and Tom Duncan.
At the age of eighteen, I
finished the eighth grade at
Salem, with Tom Duncan as
my teacher. He helped my

ber. The exams began Thurs-
day at noon and lasted until
Saturday afternoon. My
brother carried Flora and me
to Iuka in the buggy. One
night we stayed at a Mrs.
Hudsons and a night at Uncle
Tom and Aunt Mollie Storm-
ont's house.
The first time I took the
exam, I only made a third
grade license. The pay was
thirty dollars a month. That
beat nothing, as teaching was
the only profession for
women. There were no fac-
tories and women did not
work in offices or stores.
My first position was at
Progress school, near
Bethlehem church. I stayed at
John and Eula Soloman's
house. I stayed from Monday
until Friday, for eleven dollars
a month. My brother would
play the Jew's harp, as he
drove me there in the buggy.
On the last day of the term,
we all went over to the rock

pit and took a lot of pictures. I
still have those pictures. I
look at them now and realize
how many have gone to their
reward.
Yet I remember still, those
people and the happy times
of my school days.

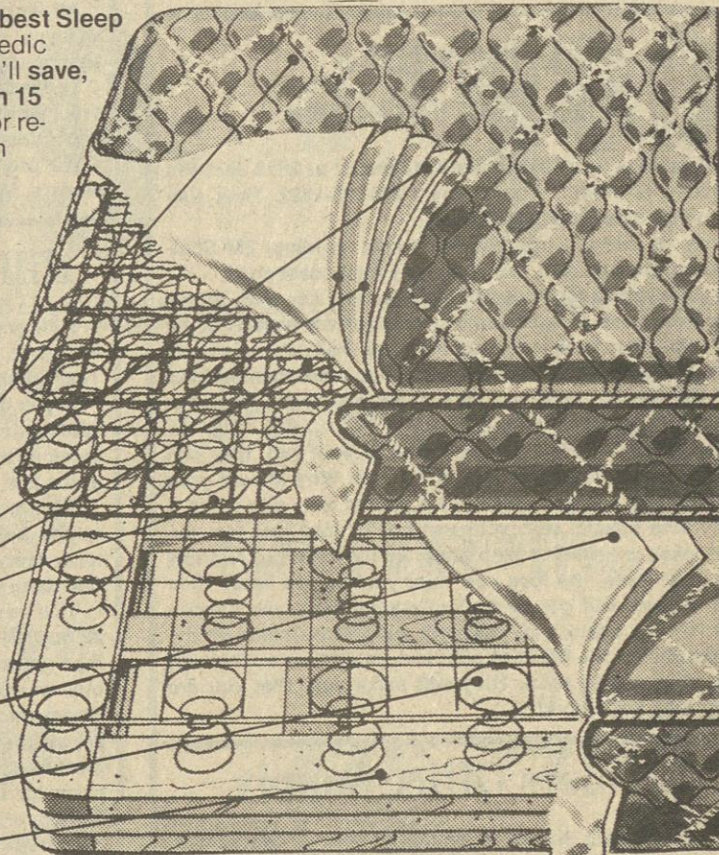

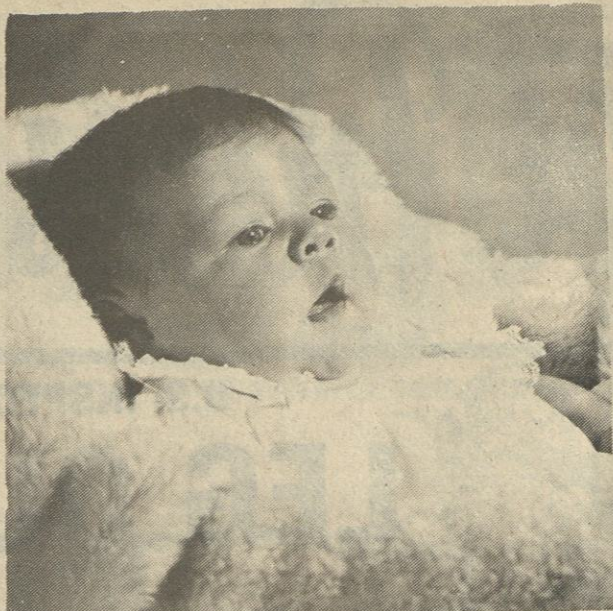

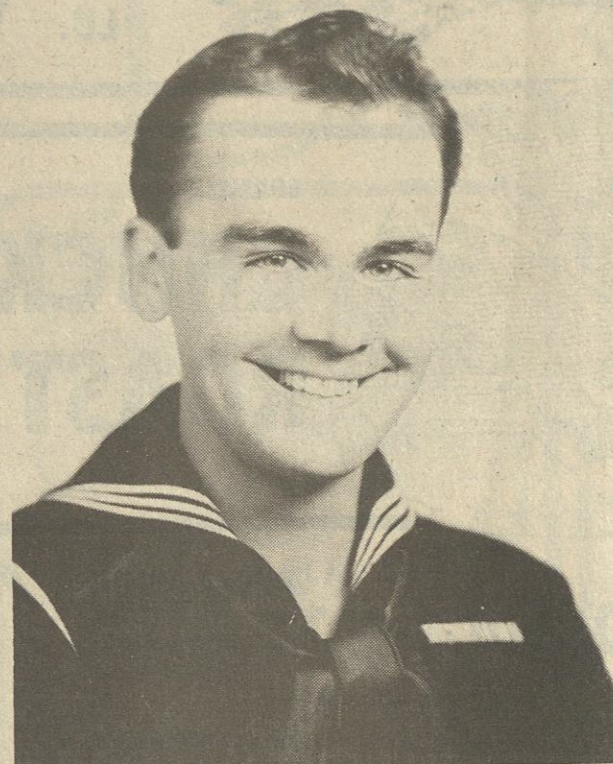

To: Commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Statue of Liberty.
The torch of the colossal

Statue of Liberty rises 305 feet into the air from the base of the pedestal built within the walls of Fort Wood on Liberty Island in the harbor of New York. Originally christened "Liberty Enlightening the World," the idea for the statue came from the French historian, Laboulaye, after the American Civil War.

The funds for the statue was created in France by the sculptor Fre'deric-Augustave Bartholdi. Sheets of copper were hammered by hand over huge steel supports that were designed by Alexandre Gustave Eiffel. The completed 225 ton statue was taken apart and shipped to New York City, where it was reassembled and formally dedicated by President Grover Cleveland on October 28, 1886.

The statue considered a navigational aid, was first administered by the Lighthouse Board but was transferred to the War Department in 1901. It was declared a National Monument in 1924. When Fort Wood was deactivated in 1937, the rest of the island became part of the monument, and in 1965 near by Ellis Island, a former immigration, was added.

The statue, which commemorates the friendship of the French and U.S. people, has become a symbol of
