### "K.D." Spotted In Memphis

Keir "K.D." Sanders was reported to have been spotted by a family member in the Raleigh area of north Memphis Monday morning around 7:30. Construction workers in the area also reported seeing Sanders some 90 minutes later. However, police had no luck in turning up the 20-year-old fugitive. Sanders is wanted in Tishomingo County for the December 28 beating death of his grandfather, W.D. Crawford, and the shooting of his grandmother, Elma Crawford, who died in March. Sanders was living at the Goat Island retirement home of his grandparents at the time of the attack. The Crawford family has offered a \$2,000 reward for any information leading to Sanders arrest. The family has also hired retired police officer, Jim Kellum, as private detective to help find Sanders.

## Raid Leads To Arrest Of Local Radiologist

An Iuka doctor was arrested Friday after a raid was made of his Coleman Park Road home by Sheriff Bob Payne, Deputy W.C. Mayhall, Chief of Police Floyd Whitaker and city patrolman Ricky Cornelison.

Several plastic bags of marijuana were confiscated by the law officials, along with several cases of alcoholic beverages including beer, wine, cognac, champagne and scotch. In addition, officers seized containers of marijuana seeds.

The doctor was charged with possession of alcohol and controlled substances with intent to sell, Sheriff

Payne said, with possible other charges pending.

A Colt .45 caliber automatic handgun was taken from the doctor's residence by authorities with what is believed to be teflon bullets, which are more commonly known as "cop killers," Payne said. A bullet clip and case containing other suspicious bullets are also to be checked by investigators. The sheriff said teflon bullets are illegal and are capable of penetrating bullet proof vest.

All evidence seized in the raid will be forwarded to the state crime lab for analysis, it was stated.

Dr. Dzebolo, 39, joined the

Tishomingo County Hospital staff November 1983, according to hospital administrator, Bill Rutledge. He is a radiologist by profession.

Dr. Dzebolo has been released from custody following the posting of a \$3,000 cash bond.

Sheriff Payne said the search of Dzebolo's residence was the result of information from a confidential informant that the "X-ray specialist" had been dealing in drugs.

The Tishomingo County Hospital Board of Trustees met Tuesday night and according to hospital ad-

ministrator, Bill Rutledge, he has been instructed by the board to find a Director of Radiology to be approved by the board for the medical center. Dr. Dzebolo will be furnished office space at the hospital only through 5:00 p.m. Friday, September 19, the administrator said. "I am in the process of looking for a director of radiology and anticipate to have one by Monday, September 23," said Rutledge. The x-ray specialist came to the hospital in November 1983 and in 1985 when his contract was to be renewed, an agreement could not be reached, thus Dzebolo has been functioning as acting director for almost a year.

## Chatting With Your Home Economist

### Keep Energy Measures In Mind

If you are selecting, building or remodeling a home, you have a golden opportunity to be an energy conservationist. Many decisions you will make will affect the amount of fuel required to operate your home. Use the following suggestions to minimize the amount of energy you use:

\*Provide only as much space as you actually need. Remember you will have to

heat, cool, light, maintain and clean it.

\*Reduce space allowed for little used areas. Example: How large does a formal living room need to be if you only use the family room?

\*Consider multi-use rooms: living room-dining room, office-guest room.

\*A foyer instead of a door directly into a room will trap outside air and keep it from spreading through the home.

\*Locate "hot rooms" (kitchen, laundry) in cooler sections of the home away from the west summer sun.

\*Design and orient the house so that in the summer you do not have large unshaded windows facing the west.

\*Protect windows from the summer sun's rays by means of shade, screens and roof

## Sunglasses: A Must For Older Americans

The eyes of older Americans are particularly at risk from the harmful ultraviolet rays of the sun and should be protected by sunglasses that screen them out, according to Bill Rutledge, Administrator of Tishomingo County Hospital, and Dr. V. John Ford, Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board of the Mississippi Affiliate of the National Society to Prevent Blindness.

During September, which is National Sight Saving month, Tishomingo County Hospital is joining the Society to Prevent Blindness to remind people in our community about the importance of caring for their eyes.

In addition to emphasizing the need for regular eye examinations, people are advised to wear "sunshades" when you go outdoors, but caution you not to wear them after sundown or when driving through a tunnel.

Although eyes are equipped with good built-in blockers of ultraviolet radiation, this natural protection is not enough for most people, particularly as they get older.

Sunglasses are a must for people who have had cataract removal, whether they have had an intraocular implant, wear contact lenses, or wear cataract glasses. People who take diuretics and tranquilizers are also more sensitive to these harmful ultraviolet rays.

Eye researchers are examining the possibility that excessive sun exposure may be a significant factor in the formation and growth of cataract.

Without proper eye protection, people who work or have worked in outdoor occupations may be at high risk for cataract. And older Americans who spend a good deal of time in outdoor recreation, be it golf, or gardening, could also be prone to this eye disease.

Lens tints of grey, green, or brown have been long regarded as the best shades to

filter out these harmful rays. Now there is also a new yellow-tint lens.

If you're already wearing prescription sunglasses, check with your optician to make sure that your lenses have the maximum protection available. If you wear non-prescription sunglasses, look for those which carry a tag indicating that they conform to American National Standard Requirement Z80.3.

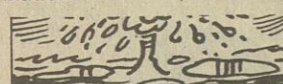

## CARING FOR YOUR PET

### MISCELLANEOUS FACTS

Upper respiratory infections are the most common health problem seen in cats. An excellent vaccination is available to prevent the worst of the upper respiratory viruses.

Vaccination of cats and dogs against rabies forms an invisible buffer between the wildlife population and the human population. Inoculation of your pet, therefore, protects not only the animal, but you and your family as well.

A cat -- even a small kitten -- has more bones in its body than a human being. A human being has 206 bones; a cat has 230.

Studies indicate that 85 percent of all medical problems in pet birds occur because of improper nutrition. Birds which lack one or more essential nutrient in their diets will eventually become sick -- and by the time the problem is noticed, it may be too late to correct.

Due to certain ecological factors, certain species of animals rarely have rabies. This group includes commercially-raised pets, such as hamsters, gerbils and ferrets, as well as certain wildlife, such as

squirrels, rabbits, minks, opossums, and mice.

More than 700 plant species have been identified as producing physiologically active or toxic substances in sufficient amounts to cause harmful effects in animals. These plants produce a variety of toxic substances and cause reactions ranging from mild nausea to death.

As little as one ounce of anti-freeze, ingested, may be fatal to a 15-pound dog. Just one-third of an ounce can quickly kill a pound cat.

Although there are some 27 orders of birds recognized, nearly all of our caged birds (parrots, parrot-like, psittacines, canary-like) and pigeons (canaries, doves, etc.) are brought to you by public service from IUKA.

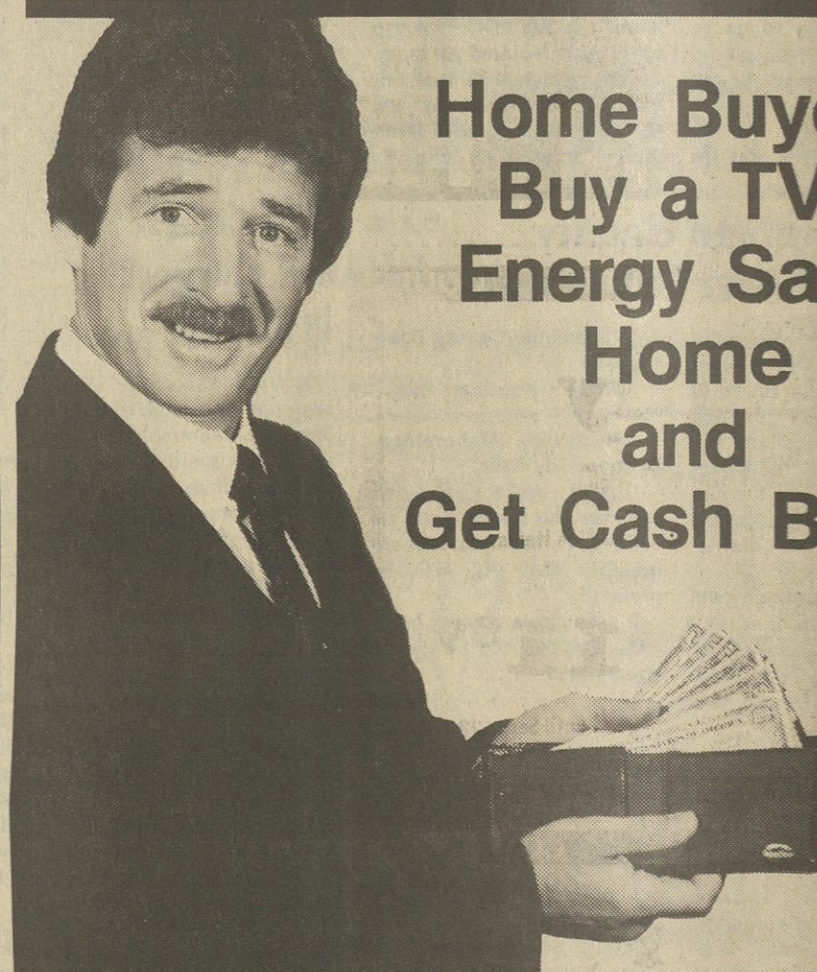

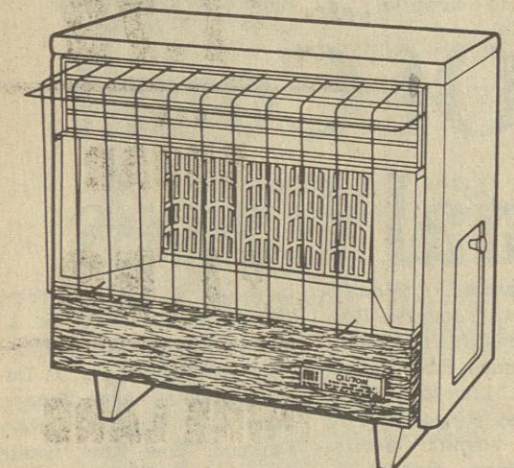

## New Literacy Program Needs Tutors, Students

Thousands of adults in northeast Mississippi cannot read and write. The newly established literacy program now available at the Iuka Library is aimed at overcoming these obstacles. Literacy is often necessary for the job and many people are unemployed because they lack the reading and writing skills necessary to hold a job. It has been shown that an illiterate adult earns 42% less than a high school graduate. Realizing that the lack of a sufficient education can prove to be a strong stumbling block to employment, Nedda Sanderson, Iuka head librarian, saw the need for the program and worked to get it established.

Mrs. Ellen Green has been assigned to coordinate the local "Each One Teach One" program and will spend 25 hours a week helping to recruit students and tutors. According to Mrs. Green sufficient funds were obtained from the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) in conjunction with the Northeast Regional Library to pay her salary and provide funds for purchasing teaching materials. Help also came from the City of Iuka and the county board of supervisors. According to the 1980 census, 35.7% of the population

of Tishomingo County have less than an 8th grade education. Mrs. Green stresses that not knowing how to read is nothing of which to be ashamed. Inability to read is, in itself, neither a disgrace or a sign of low intelligence. What would be shameful however is for an individual who knows they have this problem to waste such an opportunity to correct the deficiency.

The purpose of the program is to teach out-of-school adults how to read. Anyone sixteen years and older is eligible to participate. Mrs. Green is also seeking the help of volunteer tutors to be trained to teach students by the Laubach method - reading symbols and word sounds.

If you know of someone who would like to learn to read or learn to read better please share this information with them. If you are interested in training to become a volunteer tutor, the opportunity is available. Mrs. Green may be reached at the Iuka Library 423-6300 or a message for her may be left with the librarian. Applications may be picked up at any local library in the county.

### Diabetic Workshop

The Segars Clinic will be offering a workshop on diabetes on October 6 and 7, from 6:00 to 8:00 each night. This workshop will include: basic information on diabetes, patho-physiological effects of diabetes, monitoring your blood sugar at home, and diet instructions.

Many cheeses are named after the places where they were first produced or are made today. Perhaps the most well is Cheddar, named after a village near Bristol, England; followed by Romano

and Parmesan, who credit their names to the famous Italian cities of Rome and Parma. Limburger hails from the Belgian city of Limburg, and Tillamook, a well-aged Cheddar that's popular along

the Pacific Coast, from Oregon's Tillamook County. Monterey Jack was developed by Dan Jacks, a Scotch dairy farmer in Monterey County, California, and Colby by the Steinwand

family in Colby, Wisconsin.

With a few exceptions, cheese can be frozen if properly stored. Low moisture Cheddar, Gouda, Brick and

Parmesan are less affected by freezing than such high moisture varieties as cottage, cream and Neufchatel cheeses. These do not freeze well as they tend to become watery and mealy. To prevent

cheese from drying out, it should be frozen in its original wrapper or sealed in freezer wrap, heavy-duty foil or plastic bags. In addition, each piece should be no more than one-inch thick, or weigh

more than one pound. When ready to use, thaw cheese slowly in the refrigerator, and use as quickly as possible. Note that small amounts of Blue, Roquefort and Gorgonzola cheeses can be frozen

but may become watery when defrosted. The suitable, however, for salads or salad dressings.

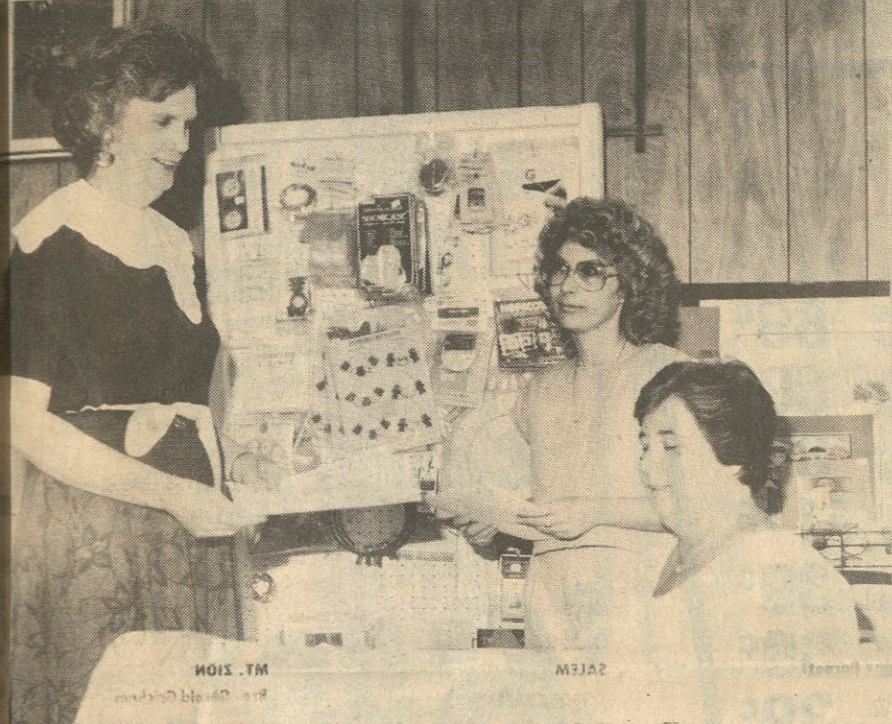
