"K.D." Spotted In Memphis

Keir "K.D." Sanders was reported to have been spotted by a family member in the Raleigh area of north Memphis Monday morning around 7:30. Construction workers in the area also reported seeing Sanders some 90 minutes later. However, police had no luck in turning up the 20-yearold fugitive. Sanders is wanted in Tishomingo County for the December 28 beating death of his grandfather, W.D. Crawford, and the shooting of his grandmother, Elma Crawford, who died in March. Sanders was living at the Goat Island retirement home of his grandparents at the time of the attack. The Crawford family has offered a \$2,000 reward for any information leading to Sanders arrest. The family has also hired retired police officer, Jim Kellum, as private detective to help find Sanders.
