Two Arrested In County Break-In

Two suspects have been arrested and charged with breaking and entering and destroying private property after they allegedly kicked open the back door and vandalized a house belonging to W.C. Hamilton of Tishomingo.

Matthew T. White, 22, of Tishomingo, and a 17 year old juvenile were arrested Tuesday, April 14, after Mr. Hamilton surprised the suspects while they were still inside the house, according to Deputy W.C. Mayhall.

Mayhall said, the house had been wrecked with light fixtures shattered and glass what-nots broken throughout the dwelling. The gas heater had been lit and turned up on high.

When Mr. Hamilton realized someone was in the house, he called out to them from the back door. The juvenile fled through the front door and White remained in the house hidden in the attic.

While Mr. Hamilton was notifying the authorities both subjects fled into the woods. They were apprehended by Deputy Mayhall as they came out of the woods.

The juvenile has been released to the parents.

White remains in jail pending a \$5,000 grand jury bond.

One Vehicle Collision Fatal To County Man



A one-vehicle accident claimed the life of a Midway Community man Sunday, April 12, just south of Midway near the Rutledge-Salem Community. Tishomingo

medical examiner/investigator, Dale White said James Edwin Pardue, age 39, was pronounced dead at the scene from multiple trauma resulting from the wreck.

According to Deputy W.C. Mayhall, Pardue apparently lost control of the 1982 Chevrolet Silverado pick-up as he traveled over a hill and into a curve on the gravel road around 10:45 a.m. The truck appeared to have gone off the right side of the road, struck a tree, and then rebounded with the rear end hitting an embankment, Mayhall said. The vehicle then spun around, flipped over and fell upside down penning the driver, the deputy said. Mr. Pardue was traveling alone.

James Pardue was raised in the Holcut Community, at-

tended the county school system, and graduated from Burnsville in 1967. His family moved to the Midway Community at Route 1, Tishomingo, following construction of the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway. He was a member of the Baptist Church and a construction worker, employed with TVA. He was a man who was held in the highest esteem, soft spoken, kind and considerate of his fellowman. His untimely and tragic death has touched the hearts of scores of friends of his and those of his family members as well.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday, April 14, at South Crossroads Baptist Church with Rev. J.A. Blunt and Rev. Harold Holley officiating. Burial was in the church cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Survivors include his wife, Martha Pardue; two daughters, Jena Pardue and Shanna Pardue; his parents, Chester and Myra Pardue; one sister, Loretta Pardue; two brothers, Charles Pardue and Gaylon Pardue; his grandmother, Mrs. Mamie Grimes, all of Tishomingo.

Jury Renders Conviction In Pruitt Murder Case

Following 65 minutes deliberation April 2, a Marshall County Alabama Jury convicted Billy Joe Brannon, 23, of Albertville of the December 20, 1986, murder of Danny Gregory Pruitt, a native of Iuka. The victim was the son of Vester and Mavis Pruitt, Fairgrounds Road.

Young Pruitt's gunshot body was recovered by Etowah County Rescue Squad from Aurora Lake approximately 12 hours after the brutal slaying. An anonymous phone call made to the Boaz city police led authorities to the lake area and to the subsequent arrest of Brannon and two other suspects.

Michael Hunt, 24, and Tabitha Sue Moore, 20, both of Albertville, each face murder charges placed by Alabama authorities, as well. Brannon is the first of the

three to go to trial. Court dates for Hunt and Moore are forthcoming.

Pruitt was living with his brother, Mark Pruitt, in Albertville and had reportedly been with him and his wife at a supper club the night of the incident. Albertville Chief of Police, Jerry Mitchell stated Pruitt had been "lured off to the secluded place" where the crime was committed.

Mike Lee, a medical examiner for the Department of Forensics Sciences in Tuscaloosa, told the seven-man, five-woman jury that Pruitt died from multiple gunshot wounds, "primarily a gunshot wound to the head."

Circuit Court Judge Bill Jetton set sentencing date for Brannon for May 13 at the Albertville Courthouse. The sentence for a murder conviction is 10 years to life.

Theron Kendall (T.K.) Marlin, 81, died Monday, April 13, at Tishomingo Hospital after a sudden illness. He was born in the Fawn Grove Community, attended Itawamba Agricultural High School, Mississippi State University, and graduated from Draughton's Business College. He was a former school teacher and county

agent, served on the board of directors of Farm Bureau, and retired from Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service after serving in Louisville, Tupelo, and Iuka. He was a Mason, a member of Iuka Baptist Church, and has resided in Iuka for 45 years.

Services were Wednesday, April 15, at Iuka Baptist Church with Rev. Luther Gibson, Dr. Julian West, and Rev. W.T. Dexter officiating. Burial was in Fawn Grove Cemetery near Mantachie.

Survivors include his wife, Vivian Lucas Marlin of Iuka; one son, James A. Marlin of Iuka; one daughter, Judith Marlin Moore of Iuka; two brothers, Homer T. Marlin of Tupelo, and Wendall H. Marlin of Mantachie; five grandsons, Mike Marlin of Tupelo; Bob Marlin of Houston, Texas; and Ken Moore, Philip Moore, and Scott Marlin, all of Iuka; two great-grandchildren.

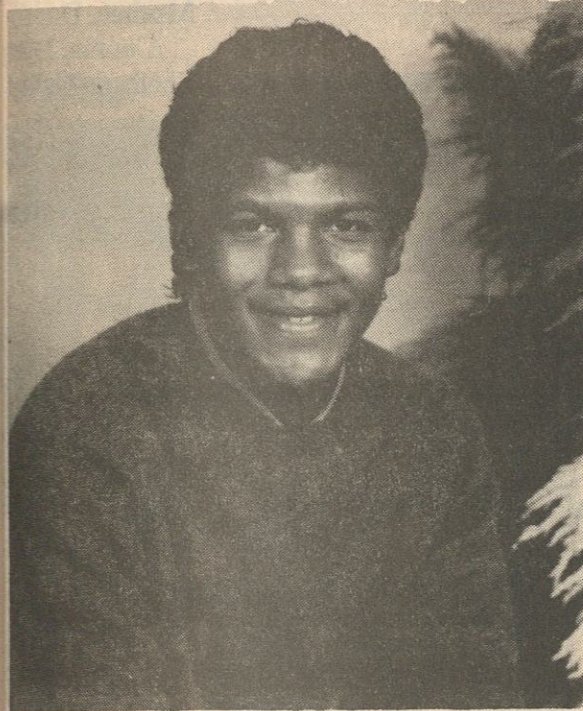

Both the STAR Student and the STAR Teacher will receive certificates from the Council, in addition to being eligible for competition for scholarship awards.

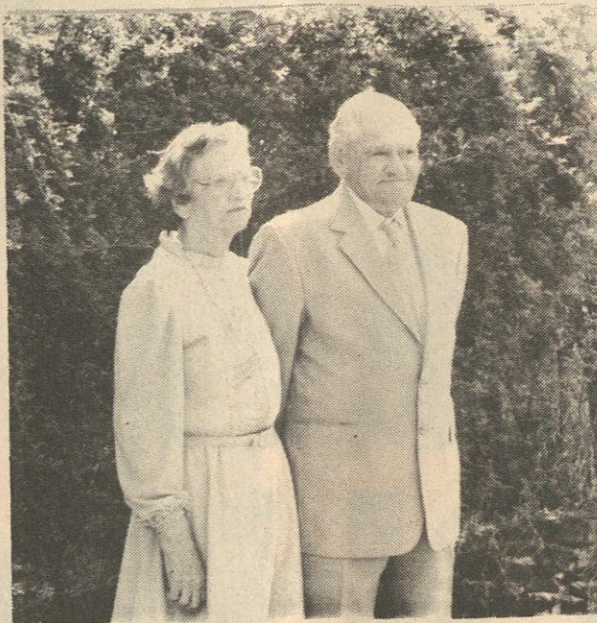
Iuka Students Claim Art Awards

Unemployment Down In County

According to figures just released by the Mississippi State Employment Service, the number unemployed in Tishomingo County declined slightly at mid-February. The rate of unemployment in the county was estimated to be 23.7 percent of the civilian labor force, representing 1,800 individuals. According to Charles Smith, Manager of the Employment Service, this compares to 24.5 percent in January and 18.7 percent in February, 1986.

The civilian labor force for the county remained at 7,600 for the second month experiencing a slight increase of 60 from one year ago. The number of individuals in the county employed totaled 5,800, 60 over the previous figure but 330 below the estimate for February, one year ago.

Smith also stated that manufacturing employment in the county stood at 2,560, 50 above the previous figure but 200 below the estimate for February, 1986. The number of individuals employed in nonmanufacturing jobs totaled 2,510, only 10 below the January estimate and 20 below the figure for February, one year ago.

Smith noted that the civilian labor force for the six-county area of Alcorn, Benton, Marshall, Prentiss, Tippah, and Tishomingo stood at 61,580 for February, 1987. The labor force decreased by 440 from last month and 540 from one year ago. The unemployment rate stood at 14.0 percent, or 8,600 individuals. This compares to 15.0 percent in January and 15.0 percent in February, 1986. Employment in the six-county area totaled 52,980, 280 above the previous estimate and 160 above the figure for one year ago.

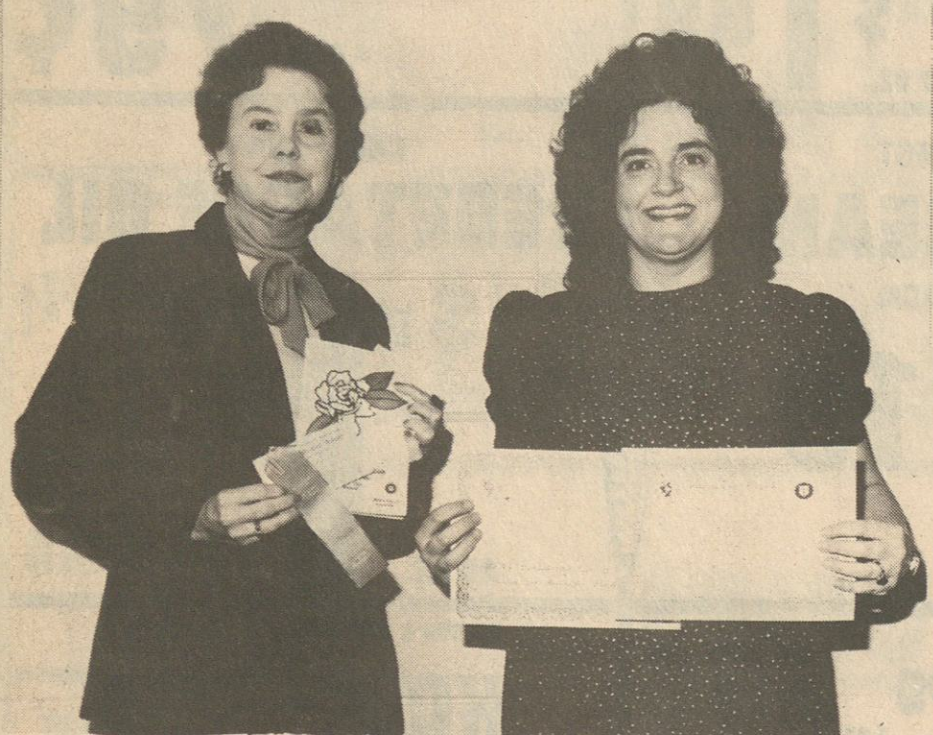
A total of 18,040 were employed in manufacturing industries at February. This figure increased approximately from last month but dropped 20 below the figure for one year ago.

FARMERS IN Mississippi are continually changing and coming up with new ideas. The 1987 crop year will be no exception. High interest rates, low availability of

money, high fuel costs, and that constant unpredictable changing of market trends -- these factors cause farmers to change and adopt new ideas.

Soil Conservation Notes

What changes will you make this year? There is a sure way of reducing costs

and improving the profit picture for 1987. Thousands of Mississippi farmers are now looking more to all forms of reduced (minimum) tillage than ever before; not only does this practice reduce costs, but it also conserves the soil.

How does a reduced system work? First, it is true to its name. It reduces the need for extensive seedbed preparation and with the use of proper chemicals, it reduces the need for mechanical weed control. Depending on the system you choose (limited tillage or no tillage), you reduce soil loss from 50 to 90 percent.

Some soils in Tishomingo County require no-till to hold soil losses within the acceptable standard. Other soils require terraces and/or reduced tillage or no tillage.

Reduction in soil loss, savings in labor, fuel and equipment costs, better moisture retention are

positive reasons for a change in 1987. As fuel costs continue to increase, no-till may be the answer on fields where no erosion problem exists. For further details on the hows and why of reduced conservation tillage, contact the Soil Conservation Service Field Office at 115 Front Street or call 423-6272.

Ask Ochsner

Q. My son recently returned from a camping trip and his legs were covered with bright red bites which were very itchy. I'm told these were chigger bites. What are chiggers and how can we avoid the bites in the future?

M.R., Aberdeen, MS

A. With the increase in summer outdoor activities such as camping or hiking, comes the increase in chances that you'll be burdened with two of the most common summer pests -- chiggers and

ticks. Chiggers, or red bugs as they are also called, are tiny mites that lay clusters of eggs in grassy or bushy areas.

According to Dr. Jeffery Frey, an internist at Ochsner Clinic, New Orleans, the egg-laying adult chiggers generally don't bother humans. It's their offspring that do. Tiny chigger larvae hatch and attach onto the skin of humans as you walk through the grassy areas. Usually the chiggers attach to the areas of the skin which are covered with elastic such as the elastic tops of socks, underwear or any other constricting clothing. Chigger bites often won't appear until two to three days after the bites have occurred and will be noticeable due to the red color and swelling which usually appear in a line. The best way to treat chiggers, Dr. Frey says, is to coat the bites with clear fingernail polish or fingernail polish remover. The

chemicals in these products smother the larvae. Expect to wait a couple of days before your bites heal, however.

Ticks are commonly found in the eastern United States and a few varieties are found in this region. Ticks can be dangerous as a few kinds spread tick paralysis, tick fever and the Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever. Ticks are found in grassy, bushy areas, crawl onto humans and migrate towards the head. They commonly burrow in the scalp, latch onto the skin and stay until they are removed. Because they secrete an anesthetic fluid when they bite, they are not easily detected. Male ticks remain small, but female ticks grow larger and may lay eggs if not disturbed.

The best way to remove a tick, Dr. Frey says, is to make the tick back out and disconnect itself. This may be accomplished by painting the underside of the tick with clear fingernail polish.

Tweezers are a removing the tick. Be sure the tiny head is removed as well as the body.

To prevent chiggers and ticks in the future, says, particularly in going camping, participating in activities, it's best to wear door clothing with the wrists and ankles sprayed with insect repellent.

If you become fever or rash or itching in activities, see your doctor to make him aware of the situation. The fever may be connected with the presence of outdoor medical questions.

The Home Economics Department at the Tishomingo County Vocational Technical Center recently competed in the Mississippi FHA-HERO Proficiency Events in Jackson, Mrs. Margaret Carson, Food Service Instructor, stated that local competition was held in January with all members of the classes competing. Eight local winners entered the State Contest on February 24, 1987.

Marecia Broadway, a junior from Tishomingo, won first place in Short Order I; Kim Jeffreys, a senior from Tishomingo, won second place in Short Order II. In Cake Decorating, Julie McKee, a Belmont senior, won first place in Level I, and Lisa Davis, a Tishomingo junior won first in Level II. Melanie Gattis, a Tishomingo junior, placed second in Quick Breads I, and Cindy Coggins, a Tishomingo senior, placed second in Quick Breads II. Christy Davis, a senior from Iuka entered Salad Preparation I, and Margie Wells, a Belmont senior won second place in Restaurant Service, Level I. The purpose of the Home

Economics Related Occupation competition is to provide students opportunity to become more proficient in the skills consistent with their career objective.

The Tishomingo County Vocational-Technical Center offers several areas of training which are available to high school students in all the schools in the county. Mrs. Carson is the Occupational Home Economics instructor at the Center, where her program is geared mainly toward Food Service. During the year, her students learn about the labor market demand, how to become employable, with emphasis placed on personal grooming, personality, and human relations. Safety and sanitation are stressed, and students learn to operate large and small equipment representative of a quantity foods kitchen. Menu planning is learned as well as all areas of food production. Students become proficient in preparing quality and quantity foods for many occasions such as luncheons, banquets, foreign food meals, short order, holidays, and catering cakes for weddings, birthdays, anniversaries, and showers.

This course has been very profitable and beneficial to many of our area youth. In addition to being of immense help in students own homes, this course enables students

to work in restaurants, hospitals, kitchens, and other quantity food service establishments. Some students have worked in bakeries, restaurants, and hospitals; other have begun private catering services in their homes.

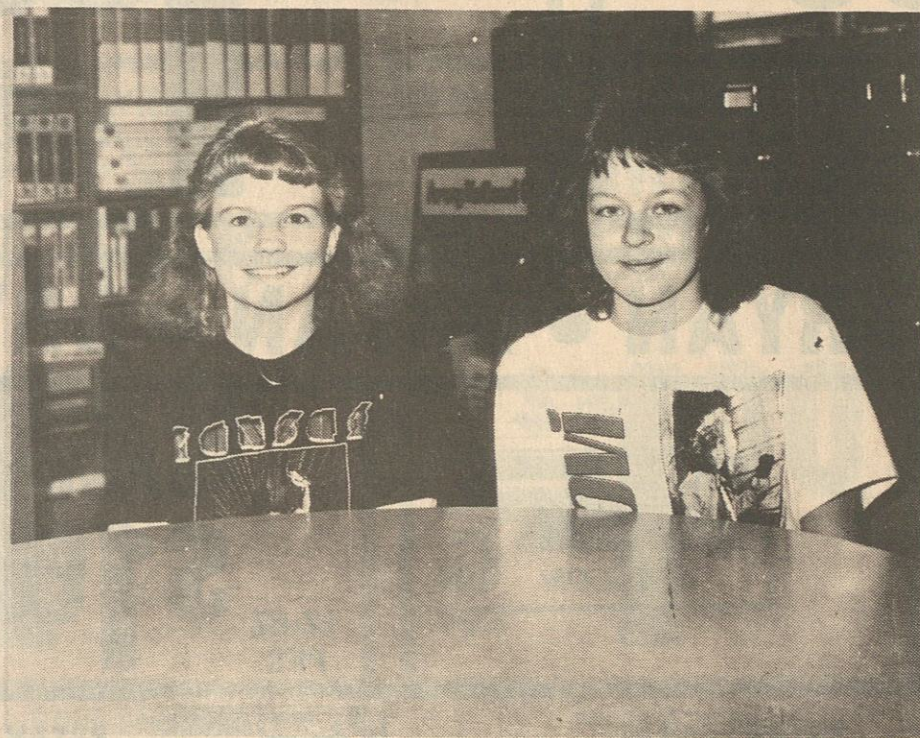


Mathematics Contest Representatives
