Five Indicted In Mail Fraud Scheme

Summonses to appear in federal court in Oxford to face mail fraud charges were served to five Tishomingo County residents last week. The five indicted on federal charges in a scheme to collect phony accident claims, include Circuit Court Clerk Lamar Rutherford, Daniel R. Freeno, Dale Edmondson, Devota Edmondson and Truman O. Williams.

The indictments charge that the defendants would file a claim with Mississippi Farm Bureau Insurance for an automobile accident that never occurred and would receive payment from M.F.B. adjuster, George Allen Woodhouse.

Woodhouse is serving a five year prison sentence following his conviction of

collecting kickbacks in similar accidents. He also was ordered to make restitution of \$16,500, according to authorities.

According to U.S. Attorney Bob Whitwell in Oxford, each of the Tishomingo residents face one count of mail fraud. All five are accused of aiding and abetting George Allen Woodhouse in a scheme to defraud money and property by false and fraudulent pretense, representation and promises.

Rutherford is charged with claiming to a pretended collision with a mule while driving his 1979 Cadillac on January 2, 1984. It's charged that Woodhouse made a claim with him for \$6,299.66 January 6, 1984, and they allegedly placed it in the mail.

Donald R. Freeno, Dale Edmondson and Devota Edmondson are charged in a joint indictment involving a fictitious claim of a pretended collision of a 1981 Buick driven by Loye Harrelson and O.C. Harrelson. Freeno claimed to hit the Buick in his 1975 Chevrolet truck June 1, 1982. It's alleged Dale Edmondson signed release claim of O.C. Harrelson; Devota Edmondson, as notary public notarized it, and that Woodhouse approved the claim in the amount of \$1,465.50 and \$6,943.24.

Truman O. Williams is charged with filing a false claim pretending an accident with a 1979 Chevrolet Corvette while driving a 1976 Chevrolet pickup March 17, 1985, and that Woodhouse as

adjuster approved fraudulent claims in the amount of \$1,046.39 and \$5,400. The indictment charges Williams with aiding and abetting Woodhouse in placing the claim in the mail March 25, 1985.

All five are scheduled to make an appearance in federal court Friday before Magistrate Norman L. Gillespie.

This is the second set of indictments handed down as the result of investigation by the U.S. Postal Inspectors.

The maximum penalty for conviction of mail fraud is a fine of \$1,000, five years in prison, or both.

Attorney Whitwell commented an over-all investigation is continuing.

County To Receive \$1,000,000 In-Lieu Taxes From TVA

Checks totaling well in excess of \$1 million will arrive in the county today, Representative Mack Wadkins announced Tuesday. In addition, \$127,611.86 will be returned monthly to be divided between the Iuka Separate School District, Tishomingo County Schools, and the County General Fund. These funds are in-lieu tax

from the Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant made possible through legislation passed this past session of the legislature.

According to Rep. Wadkins, Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors will receive the largest amount beginning with a lump sum payment of \$754,635.58. In addition the Board will

receive \$94,329.46 each month thereafter as well.

The Tishomingo County Schools System will get \$172,016.56 Thursday, the legislator said. Monthly payments in the amount of \$21,502.07 will continue to be received by the county schools system, he added.

Rep. Wadkins noted that the Iuka Separate Municipal School District will receive a lump sum payment of \$94,242.64 with the issuing of the checks today and then will receive \$11,780.33 each

month thereafter.

Wadkins said the money received by the Supervisors will go to the County General Fund. He said it can be transferred to road and bridge funds or school funds in proportion to other millage already in those funds. Wadkins said the in-lieu tax received by the Supervisors can be expended for any lawful purpose that county funds can be used for.

"I am pleased to see money coming back to Tishomingo County and feel it will help in our industrial recruiting by helping to produce better schools and by having more revenue available for industrial growth," Wadkins commented.

Rep. Wadkins is seeking his third term unopposed to the State Representative post. He represents Tishomingo County as well as a section of Alcorn County. Wadkins was recently appointed to the position of Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation.

CARING FOR YOUR PET



Tacky, Tacky Ticks

Ticks are perhaps the most aggravating external parasite known to attack small animals.

These small, ugly parasites firmly attach themselves to your pet and gorge themselves on the animal's blood. Animals are likely to acquire ticks anytime they get into shrubbery, undergrowth or high grass.

While ticks are more likely to be found on dogs, they are often found on cats as well. Both cats and dogs should be examined frequently for ticks. Most often, ticks are found in the neck area, between the toes, in the ears and in the fold of the body between legs and torso. They may appear to be a small wart or seed.

Other than discomfort, ticks pose two basic threats to your pet's health. First of all, frequent scratching to get rid of a tick may break the skin and lead to a serious bacterial infection. Secondly, ticks -- because of their blood sucking -- lower an animal's resistance to disease and transmit infections from animal-to-animal.

In addition, ticks pose a threat to human health. They are known to transmit Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever, a frequently fatal disease to humans. Many of the programs

currently available for flea control are designed to help control ticks as well. Remember, however, that the program must be ongoing in order to be effective. Not all products used to prevent ticks are safe for all animals. The best person to advise you concerning safe products for your pet is your veterinarian.

Like many other external parasites that threaten small animals, ticks are experts at survival. They can go without food for as long as two years.

The female lays her eggs -- as many as 3,000 of them -- virtually anywhere. Therefore, your pet has only to roam outside the protected environment of your home to pick up new ticks.

Be on the alert. Protect your pet. Guard against ticks.

The Budgeting Process

Many families in Tishomingo County need help with a budget to plan for spending and saving. It requires you to estimate your available income for a particular period of time and decide how to allocate this income toward your expenses.

A well planned budget helps you prevent impulse spending, decide what you can or cannot afford, know where your money goes, increase savings, and decide how to protect against the financial consequences of unemployment, accidents, sickness, aging, and death.

A working budget need not be complicated or rigid. However, preparing one takes planning and following one takes determination. To budget successfully you must communicate, compromise, exercise willpower and develop a good record-keeping system.

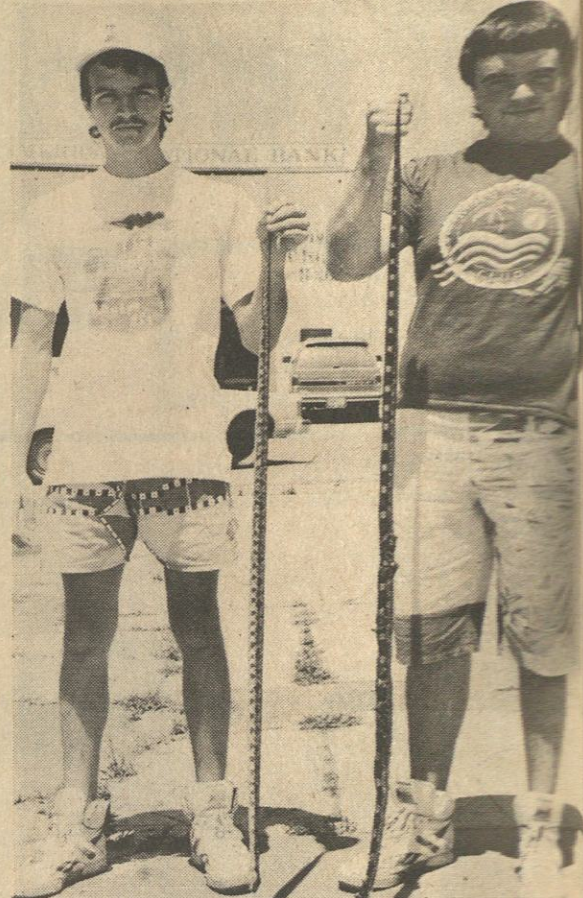
A successful budget requires communication with other members of your household, including older children. Consider each person's needs and wants so that all family members feel they are a part of the plan.

Everyone may work harder to make the budget a success and be less inclined to overspend if they realize the consequences. When families fail to communicate about money matters, it is unlikely that a budget will reflect a workable plan.

To be successful at budgeting, you must be prepared to compromise. This is often difficult. Newlyweds, especially, may have problems. Each may have been living on an individual income and not be accustomed to sharing, or may have been in school and dependent on parents.

If, for example, one wants to save for things and the other prefers buying on credit, they will need to discuss the pros and cons of both methods and decide on a middle ground each can accept. A plan cannot succeed unless there is a financial partnership.

Top each half with half of soup and cream. Seal foil. Place in 450 degree oven. Reduce heat to 250 degrees; bake for 2 hours or until tender. 4 servings.

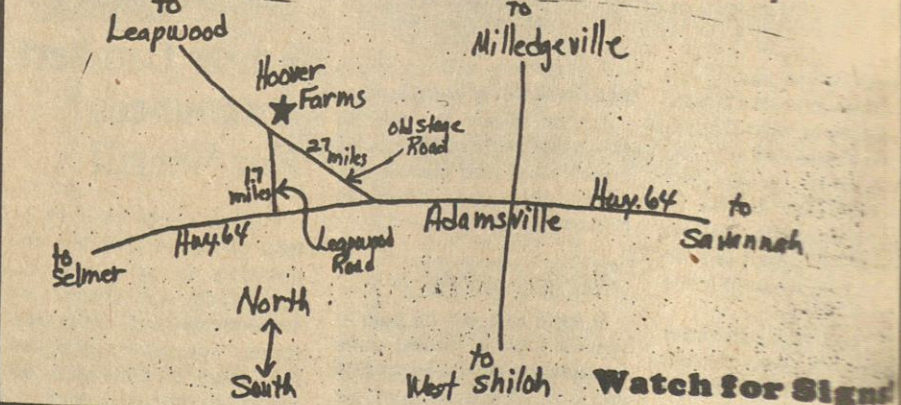

After a short wedding trip to Nashville, TN, the couple now resides in Olive Branch, MS.

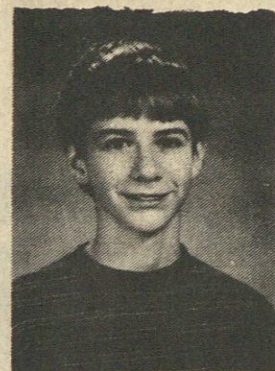

WIC Program Solicits Comments

The Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) is soliciting public comments to help develop its Fiscal Year 1988 State Plan.

Interested individuals may review a copy of WIC's FY 1987 State Plan in the Mississippi State Department of Health's Central Office in Jackson or any of the public health agency's nine district offices. District offices are in Batesville, Tupelo, Greenwood, Starkville, Jackson, Meridian, McComb, Hattiesburg, and Gulfport.

Those wishing to comment on the FY 88 plan should mail written remarks to WIC, P.O. Box 1700, Underwood Building Annex, Room 211, Jackson, MS 39215-1700. Comments must be received by June 15.

WIC -- a federally-funded, \$34.7 million program -- serves high risk maternity patients, infants, and children with economic and nutritional needs.

WIC participants receive monthly food packages. Supplemental packages for women and children contain iron-fortified cereal, dried peas or beans or peanut butter, fruit juice, eggs, and milk products. Infants up to 12

months get juice and iron-fortified formula and cereal. Mississippi's unique WIC distribution system and use of "all or nothing" bidding allows the state to provide food packages at the nation's lowest per-participant cost: \$21 a month, more than \$10 below the national average.

A recent five-year study documented increased birth-weight and brain growth among infants born to WIC participants and children directly benefiting from the WIC program. Infant mortality rates among WIC participant dropped by one-third, and the number of premature births decreased by 15 to 25 percent.

Tick Fever Reported In County - Doctors Stress Caution

Dot (Mrs. Lloyd Gene) Tucker of the Rutledge Salem Community is home recuperating from both gallbladder surgery and Rocky Mountain Spotted Tick Fever.

According to Mrs. Tucker she had gone to give replacement blood for her grandchild May 28 when it was discovered that her blood pressure was up and she was unable to donate. Thinking it unusual and not having previous blood pressure problems, she planned to go back the next day.

Within the next 24-hour span, Mrs. Tucker became quite ill suffering from symptoms of high fever, headache, chills, and vomiting. The symptoms became so severe she was hospitalized and tests began. During this time, she remembers being deathly sick and losing track of things. Her doctor was puzzled and ordered tests, cultures, and x-rays. From one of the x-rays, it was discovered that she had a bad gallstone, so gallbladder surgery was scheduled on the afternoon

of May 31st.

Dr. William Little at Methodist South in Memphis was the doctor who diagnosed her condition as being Rocky Mountain Spotted Tick Fever. Antibiotics were begun immediately and that was the turning point as far as her starting to get better. She returned home this past Sunday, June 7th.

Mrs. Tucker has shared this story with us in an effort to caution everyone of this very dangerous disease. She still has a way to go in returning to her normal health, but feels very fortunate. She goes back for a checkup June 19.

Dr. James Jarrat, an entomologist with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service said, "It is easy for pets or people to pick up ticks in fields or wooded areas close to residential areas." Tick repellants are available for people and just tucking pants into socks and shirts into pants protects most of your body, he suggested.

"When you find a tick on a person or animal, remove it immediately," Jarrat said. "The best method is to gently pull the tick off with tweezers, grasping it as closely as possible to its point of attachment, then treat the wound with a good

germicidal agent."

Mrs. Tucker did not find a tick attached to her and did not know exactly how she had come in contact with one. She said Dr. Williams suggested when removing a tick to use nail polish remover which will make the pest back out.

Dr. Jarrat warns to avoid skin contact with the tick. Juices from an infected tick can transmit Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever.

The American Dog Tick is an outdoor pest and the main carrier of Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever, according to Dr. Jarrat. Controlling this pest is important for both pet and human safety.

New Provisions For 1986 Disaster Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture said disaster payments on previously approved applications for 1986 crop losses will be increased

from 73.9 to 100 percent. Milton Hertz, administrator of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, said this is one of the new provisions to the 1986 disaster payments program made by the Farm Disaster Assistance Act of 1987. The provisions affect payments to farmers in counties declared disaster areas due to certain natural disasters during 1986. Hertz said farmers must apply for benefits under the new provisions by June 28. "Although the provisions are part of a new law," he said, "actual funds for the payments have not been appropriated by Congress."

Additional amendments to the 1986 disaster payments program made by the Act are:

"It authorizes payments for quality losses in 1986 upland cotton, with a limit of \$15 million in total payments."

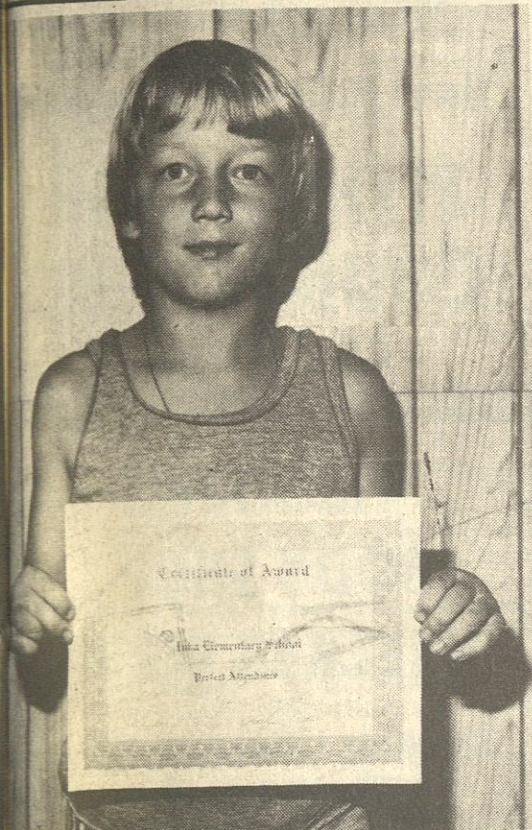
"It authorizes payments for losses due to freeze in 1986 apple production."

"In eligible counties in Maine, it authorizes payments for 1986 crop losses that amount to more than half of the normal production costs for all crops, not just those

covered by government programs. The law limits payments for crops in Maine to \$1 million. "It provides disaster payments for acreages of 1986 disaster affected sugar beets and sugarcane that were not previously eligible for payments due to 1985 acreage limitations. "It provides disaster payments for hay and straw harvested in 1986, stored on a field, and removed from the field by a flood. Total payments for losses of hay and straw may not exceed \$1 million, and payments to individual hay and straw producers may not exceed \$20,000."

"It provides that Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committees will establish historical planting acreage for soybeans and peanuts, when the 1985 acreage was reduced because of rotation. Payments to farmers may be available on the additional acreage."

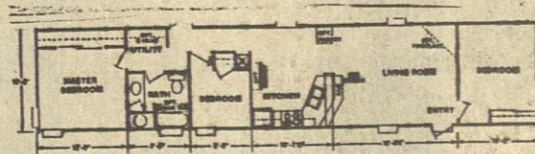

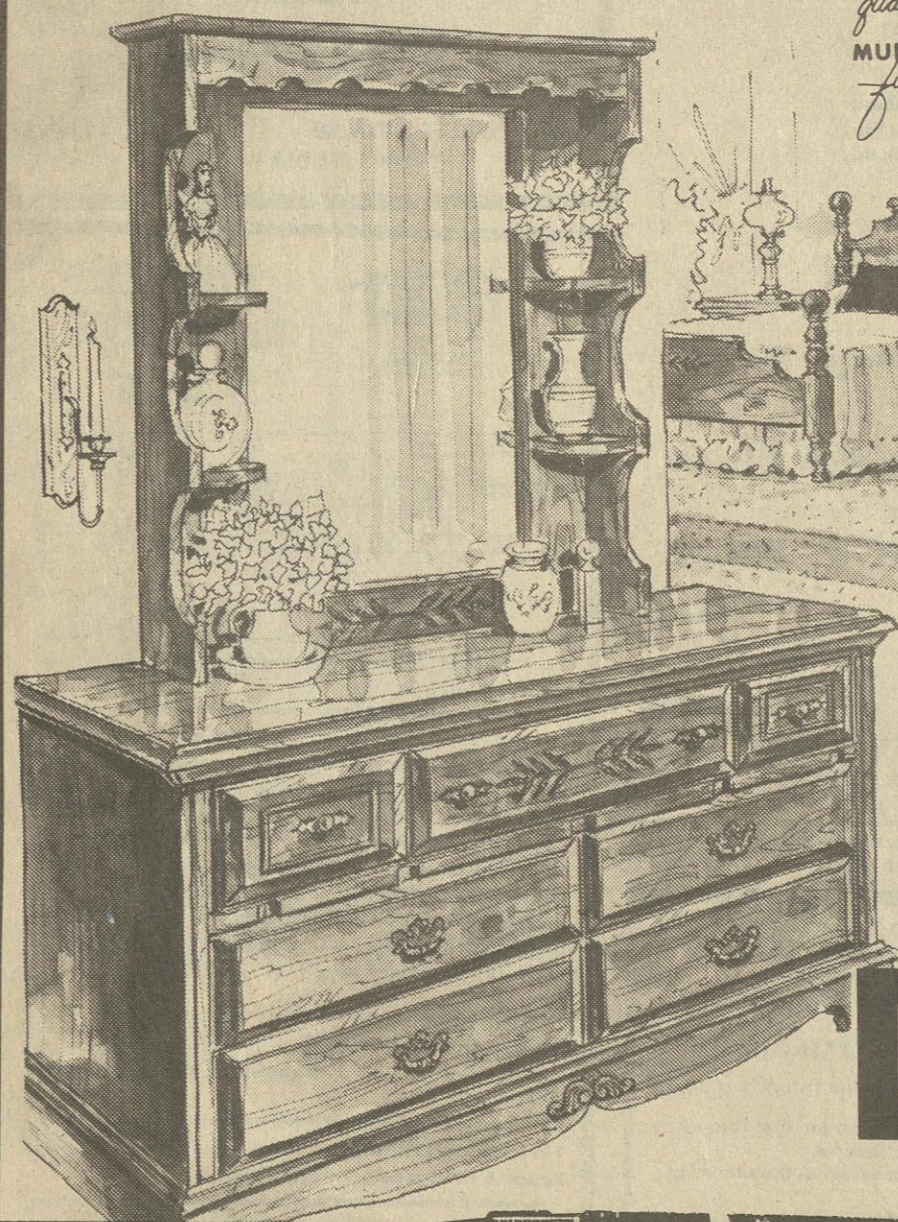
