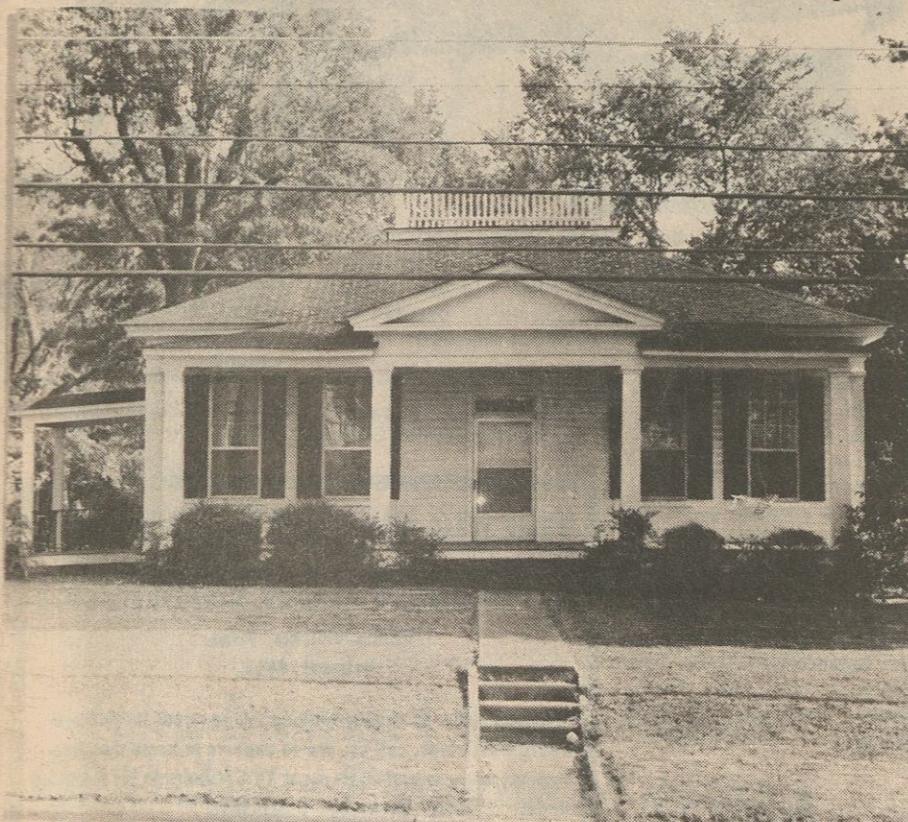

## Historic Tour Of Iuka Landmarks

A special feature of the Battle of Iuka reenactment festivities September 19 and 20, 1987, will be a historic tour of Iuka's landmarks. The event has been planned and organized by Mrs. Robert Sims, Mrs. O.C. Nelson and Mrs. R. L. Brown, III, and sponsored by Tishomingo County Development Foundation.

Permanent markers will designate the approximate thirty sites of interest featured on the tour. This tour highlights mainly Meigs, Quitman and Eastport streets. A brochure will offer a map of Iuka showing each site's location and it's brief history. This brochure will be an excellent keepsake.

One house featured on the tour will be the Merrill-Nelson House, c. 1855. Facing south on the north side of Quitman

Street the house was built in the early 1850's and was the home of the Edwin Merrill family. Dick Merrill, a famous and well known aviator was born here. He became the chief pilot for Eastern Airlines and logged 44,111 flying hours, more than any other pilot before or since. The small structure beside the house was built in the same period and was once used as a school taught by Professor Newhardt, who married a Merrill daughter. The home received extensive damage during the Battle of Iuka when a cannon went through the roof of a front bedroom. The Nelson family purchased the home from Mrs. Lila Merrill McDonald in 1936 and the present owner is Mrs. James Omer Nelson, Sr. Pilot Club members, serving as hostesses and many of the home owners, will be in

period costumes. Residents are encouraged to participate in the reenactment weekend by wearing clothing in the style of the Civil War period. Antebellum reproduction dresses are available for rent from Sara's Sewing in Belmont, 454-7693.

The intention of the committee or T.C.D.F. has not been to neglect the many historic landmark homes not mentioned on this tour. Limited time prevented the inclusion of more than three areas. It is our hope that all remaining historic structures will be designated and so marked at a later time.

## Battle Re-Enactment September 19 and 20

This year marks the 125th anniversary of the Battle of Iuka and plans have been finalized to re-enact this battle at 1:00 P.M. on September 19 and 20 in Iuka, Mississippi. The battle will be staged across from the Tishomingo County Fairgrounds which is less than one mile from the original battle site. Re-enactors from Alabama, Arkansas, Mississippi, and Tennessee will participate in this battle. In addition, a group of local Civil War buffs have organized a regiment and will participate in this historic re-enactment with uniforms made by Prentiss Manufacturing Company and Blue Bell.

Admission to the battle will be \$3.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children under 12. Advanced tickets are being sold at \$2.00 for adults and \$1.00 for children under 12. As an added bonus, the advanced tickets include a coupon for a free "Blue Plate Special" at the local Jack's Restaurant. Tickets are available for purchase at Iuka Family Clinic, Tishomingo Hospital, Knock on Wood, Super B Drugs, Curtis Drugs, Sweeney's Auto Parts, Clark's Amoco, Iuka Discount Drugs, Tishomingo County Development Foundation, and Republic Bank.

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation is the sponsoring organization for the Battle of Iuka. Sizable donations have been received from the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors and the City of Iuka. In addition, merchants, and local businessmen in Belmont, Burnsville, Iuka, and Tishomingo have purchased ads and a program will be

sold prior to the battle. Many other activities are planned in Iuka in addition to the re-enactment of the battle. Beginning at 8:00 A.M. on September 19, members of the local Wagon Train Association will be conducting wagon tours of historic sites in Iuka. The Old Tishomingo County Courthouse has been refurbished and tours will be available to see that building. In the Mineral Springs Park, there will be an Arts and Crafts Fair beginning at 8:00 A.M., a puppet show performed by the New Prospect Church beginning at 10:00 A.M., a pet show that will begin at 9:00 A.M., skits performed by the Girl Scouts beginning at 11:00 A.M., and square dancing beginning at 12:00 noon.

The Iuka Library is contributing to the celebration by sponsoring a lecture series and displaying Civil War relics. The schedule is as follows:

August 27: Setting The Stage, by Pastor David E. Gegg. From the founding of Iuka to the Civil War. Also including a background of the leaders in the Battle and finding your Civil War ancestor.

September 3: Battle Without A Victor, by Dr. Ben Kitchens. A history of the bloody Battle of Iuka.

September 10: A Recreation of the Battle of Shiloh in Video. If you didn't make it to Shiloh this is for you. Television and VCR courtesy of Murrah Electronics.

September 17: A Day In The Life Of A Confederate Soldier, by Dr. Rickey Bullard. An authentic re-enactor will take you through the life of a Confederate soldier.

A Log Meeting House will be constructed on the battle site and a Civil War music presentation will be held at the Fairgrounds Building on Saturday night, September 19 at 7:00 P.M.

On Sunday morning, September 20, a memorial service for the Confederate Dead will be held at Shady Grove Cemetery and at 10:00 A.M., a devotional by a Civil War Chaplain will be given at the Fairgrounds Building.

Located next to the battle site will be some authentic sutlers which will have some memorabilia of the Civil War days. In addition to the authentic sutlers, local business people and civic organizations will have booths with food and souvenirs for sale.

## Dobbs Takes Primary Race

Tishomingo County joined voters statewide in Tuesday's second primary in nominating State Auditor Ray Mabus as their Democratic choice for Governor. Mabus had 395,174 votes to opposing Glendora businessman Mike Sturdivant's 214,617 with 87% of the vote.

Tishomingo County voters went to the polls to give Ray Mabus 5,690, and 1,784 for Mike Sturdivant. Mabus will face the Republican nominee, Tupelo businessman Jack Reed in the November 3rd general election.

For the Attorney General's office Mike Moore was victorious Tuesday in the Democratic run off with Jackson Mayor Dale Danks. Moore will face Republican Jim Herring of Canton in the November 3, general election.

Marshall G. Bennett won an impressive run off victory as Democratic nominee for State Treasurer over William L. (Bill) Gilbert. Bennett faces

Republican Will Colom, a Columbus attorney in the November 3, general election. Clarksdale financial consultant Pete Johnson received the Democratic nomination for State Auditor of Public Accounts over Al Gary, a former department of audit official.

Closer to home in the District 19 House of Representatives William R. (Bill) Wheeler, Jr., showed a strong lead over Edward O. (Eddie) Pearson. Total unofficial results showed 5,937 votes for Wheeler with 3,429 for Pearson. (County totals on chart on page 6.)

Richard Dobbs was successful in receiving Tishomingo County's approval in the race for the top law office. Dobbs who emerged second from an eleven primary field, pulled off a run off victory Tuesday in the race for sheriff. Dobbs polled 4,552 votes to Marcus Ivey's 2,938. Dobbs is now headed toward the November 3, general election bid for sheriff against Independent

nominee Mike Kemp.

In the race for Circuit Clerk's race incumbent second district supervisor and board president Gerald C. Parsons captured 3,860 votes to win the Democratic nomination. Ruth Page Dawson, received 3,626 votes. Parsons will face independent candidate Dale D. Tapp in the November 3 election.

Political newcomer Frank Williams was successful in upsetting incumbent District 1 Supervisor, Lyonel "Cotton" Wade in his bid for office. Following Wednesday mornings certification of votes by the county Democratic Executive Committee, Williams led by an 8 vote margin.

Williams tallied 944 to Wade's 936 votes. Ricky A. Cummings won his nomination in the bid for District 2 Supervisor with a vote of 1,007 over Burnsville Mayor Bobby H. Johnson's 728 votes.

Incumbent District 5 Supervisor Leon Cook was reelected with 868 votes over

Vance Credille 584.

In the Justice Court Judge North Post race James R. (J.R.) Blakney showed 2,116 and James J. (Jim) Kirk tallied 1,867.

Willie Joe Sparks received 1,876 to oust incumbent Justice Judge South Post J. W. Southward who received 1,629.

North Post voters reelected incumbent Constable Tim Blivins with 2,297 votes over opponent Allen (Troy) Hendrix who totaled 1,627 votes.

## Three Escape County Jail

Three prisoners escaped from the Tishomingo County Jail Thursday, August 20, during the chaos created when another inmate started a fire by putting paper into the air vents and causing smoke to fill the jail, according to Chief Deputy W. C. Mayhall.

The three were identified as Billy Cruse, 36, of Belmont, Hubert Brown, 49, of Adamsville, TN, and Dwayne McKinney, 24, of Alabama.

According to Officer Mayhall, during the confusion one of the prisoners removed a steel plate that covered a hole in the wall of one of the cells, crawled through, released the other two men, and walked out the back door. The incident occurred about 9:00 p.m., Thursday. The men were not missed until 5:00 a.

m., Friday, when someone went to wake them up.

Mayhall said a thorough search of the county was made, and authorities in surrounding counties were notified. Iuka police officer Red Taylor, who was working the night shift, reported monitoring truck drivers on the C B radio who were talking about three men walking on Highway 72 in the direction of Alabama. The Alabama authorities were alerted to be on the lookout for the escapees. The trio was soon located in the EconoLodge hotel, Tusculum, Alabama, after being identified as the suspects by a desk clerk. Mayhall said the three had apparently spent the night drinking from evidence found in the room. He said the men offered no

resistance when the arrests were made.

After being returned to jail, Mayhall said the prisoners gave the following account of their escapade. Upon leaving the jail they walked to the new four lane (Highway 72) hiding along the side of the road as traffic passed. One of the men walked to the state scales and pretending to be a truck driver whose truck was broke down just down the road, asked for change to make a telephone call. He then called a cab from Tusculum to come and pick them up.

Brown was jailed for auto theft, Cruse was being held for parole violation, and McKinney for burglary charges, it was reported.

This is the second successful jail-break from the Tishomingo County Jail this year.

Cruse was arrested July 12, 1987, by county law officers as the results of his involvement in the July 11 burglary of the Eugene Butler residence in Paden, according to an earlier report by Mayhall. Cruse had just recently been released from Parchman at that time, the deputy noted.

The next meeting of the Battle of Iuka Re-enactment Committees will be held Tuesday, September 1, at 7 p.m. at Iuka City Hall. This will be the next to last meeting. It is a very important meeting, therefore, it is mandatory that all committee chairmen be present.

It's difficult to believe that with the weather in Tishomingo County being almost 100° in one month

clothes. It is time to start planning your clothing needs.

It's fun to shop for clothes - especially when you have plenty of time and money to buy anything you want. But what happens when time and money are scarce? Buying clothes can still be fun if you first spend a little time planning.

Buy Classic Styles.  
They Last Longer.  
Simple styles with natural silhouettes and an easy fit remain fashionable for a long time. Tailored suits, shirtdresses, and A-line skirts are always in style. Tailored or casual clothes usually are wearable longer than extremely frilly designs.

Here are some classics (style features for women that never go out of fashion):  
\*Medium-width collar and lapels.  
\*Jacket hemline that is slightly below widest part of

hip.

- \*Set-in sleeves.
- \*Sleeve of medium fullness gathered onto a moderate width cuff or band.
- \*Moderate width in blouses and dresses.
- \*Straight-legged pants without a cuff.
- \*Pant hem at top of heel.
- \*1 1/4" to 1 1/2" waistbands.
- \*Slim, A-line and slightly gathered skirts.
- \*Shirtwaist dresses.

### Find Good Quality - It Pays

High priced does not guarantee good quality in clothes. Quality clothing, however, will usually perform better and last longer. Good quality is the result of appropriate design and fabric selection as well as fine sewing.

Here are some things to look for:

- \*Labels telling fiber content and recommended care.
- \*Information about finishes - i.e., soil release, permanent press, moth resistance, shrinkage control.
- \*Smooth, balanced collars and lapels; smoothly eased sleeves on tailored clothes; no puckers.
- \*Sufficiently wide seam allowances. (Fabrics that do not tend to ravel and knits that do not run may be durable with narrow thread bound seams.)
- \*Appropriate seam finishes for fabrics that ravel.
- \*Firm, balanced, and even

## FmHA Announces EM Loans Available For 4.5 %

Seventy counties in Mississippi have been declared eligible for FmHA Emergency Loans because of losses to fruit and nut crops due to frost and freeze between March 15, 1987 and April 15, 1987. Alcorn County was one of those declared eligible. Tishomingo County qualifies for the same benefits, being a contiguous county to Alcorn.

To be eligible for EM loans, an owner-operator must have experienced a 30% or greater loss. The maximum EM loan for production losses is limited to 80% of the total calculated actual production loss sustained by the applicant. Applicants must also be unable to obtain sufficient and suitable credit elsewhere to finance their actual needs.

Any owner-operator feeling they may qualify for this type loan should contact Billy D. McClure, local FmHA County Supervisor for Tishomingo County. The local FmHA office is located at 105 1/2 Eastport St., Iuka.

## CARING FOR YOUR PET



### Watch Your Pet!

Early diagnosis of an illness - when it is easy, and less costly to cure - is a major step in preventing a serious health problem for your pet.

That's why animal owners should be trained observers. Contacting your local veterinarian when the animal is "not feeling well" can prevent serious, sometimes fatal health problems.

A good appetite is important for all animals. Failure to eat aggressively, or not to consume the food within a reasonable time period is usually the sign of a problem.

The animal should seem content and alert, even when resting. Eyes should be bright and the animal should perk up readily when someone or something comes near. Glassy or glazed eyes or a drooping head indicate that something is wrong. The animal's coat should be slick, bright and pliable. Internal parasites - a major problem for all species - often cause a poor, rough hair coat.

Proper weight

neither overweight nor underweight - also is important for small animals. Any sudden weight change can indicate a problem.

Finally, be on the alert for any sudden changes in the animal's disposition. If the animal becomes suddenly withdrawn or suddenly affectionate, it could be the sign of a problem.

Anytime your pet isn't acting "normal," you should contact your veterinarian. But it's up to you to determine exactly what is "normal" for your animal.

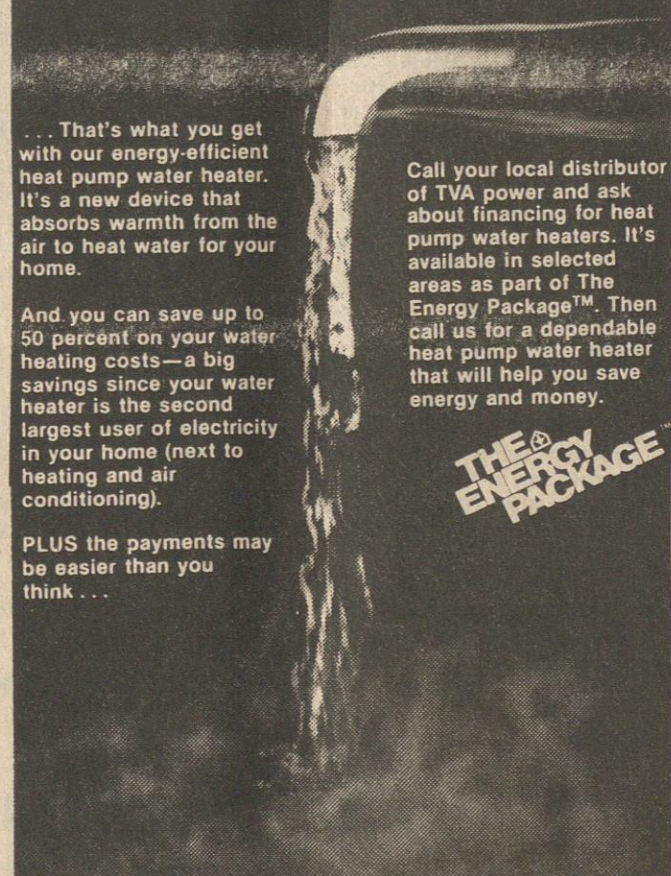

## Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor,

This letter is in response to the Tenn-Tom article dealing with abuse of public lands on page seventeen of the August 20, 1987, Vidette. While I am wholeheartedly in agreement with the message of the article, I do have something to add. To get my point across, I will start off with a scenario. 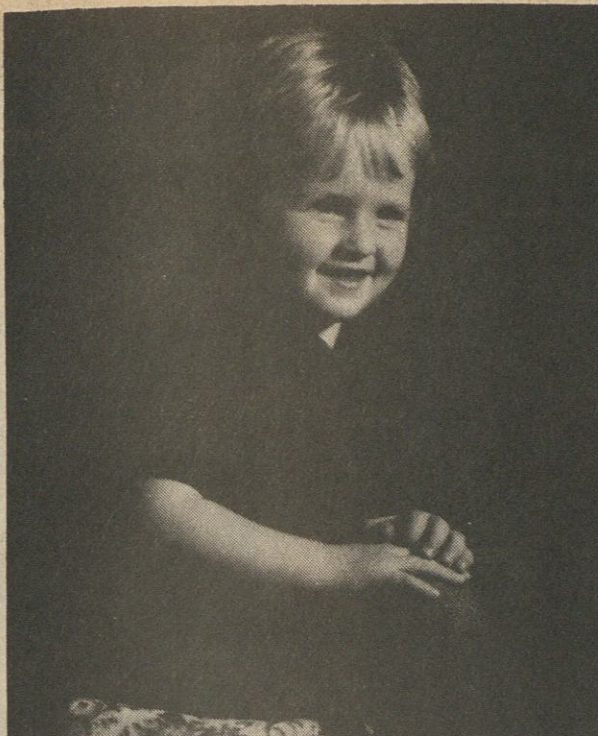

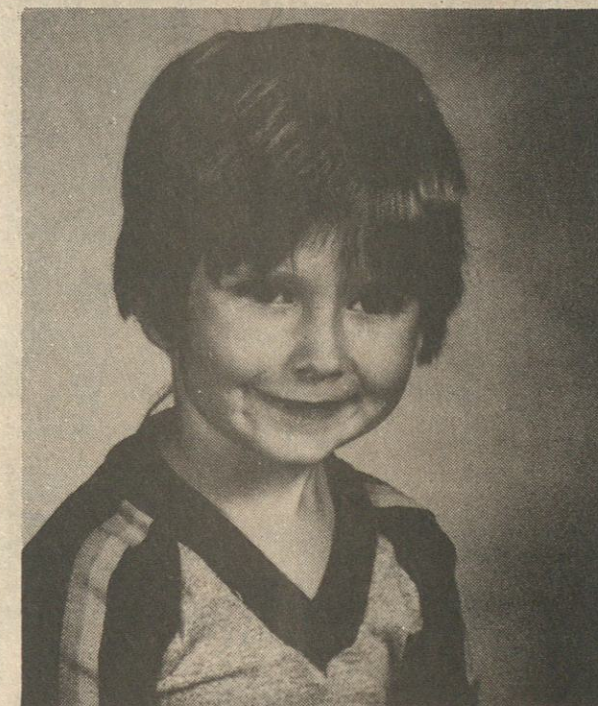

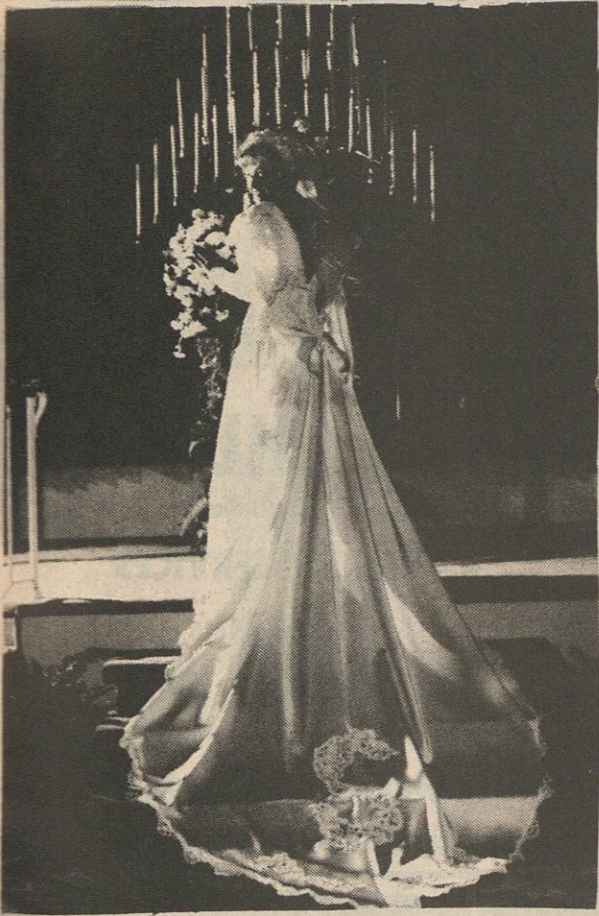

## County Agents Column

### Ripe Muscadines

Muscadine grapes are ripe now, and some early varieties have already been harvested in Tishomingo County. Our Extension home economist has recipes for making muscadine juice -- a really good treat on one of these hot days we're having -- and juice products. Don't overlook the old-time Mississippi favorite, muscadine hull pie.

Muscadine vines should not be pruned at this time or they may be damaged by later winter weather. If you need a few vines for holiday wreaths, leave several inches of stub, and be sure to prune these stubs more closely during winter. You do not need to mulch muscadine vines for the winter.

### Chlordane Update

I'm sure many of you have read or heard about the recent controversy over chlordane, an insecticide used to control termites. Chlordane is not being manufactured until application techniques can be revised by the company producing the insecticide. Although this chemical is not being made, supplies already in stores can be sold

and persons who have bought the product can still use it to kill termites.

If you use this product, you will not put yourself or your family in any immediate danger, provided the product is correctly applied. A possible link between long-term use of chlordane and risk to health has not been firmly established.

If there were an immediate danger to your health, the Environmental Protection Agency would have banned the use of chlordane and existing supplies would have been removed. Provided the company manufacturing chlordane can revise application procedures, the product may be back on the market. If the product is put back on the market, purchase would be restricted to certified pest control operators.

There are four alternative insecticides which can be used in place of chlordane: Dursban TC, Dragnet (or Pounce), Torpedo (or Ambush) and Pryfon. But, purchase of these products are already limited to certified applicators. I'll keep you informed of further developments.

### Help Directory For Farmers

Those of you who farm or know people who do realize

the problems within the agricultural community are difficult to cope with. The Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service has just published a directory of services for farmers and farm families under stress.

I've thumbed through the directory and found names, addresses and telephone numbers for almost every situation facing farmers today. Come by the County Extension office if you'd like a copy.

### Cool Season Grazing

Time is rapidly ap-

proaching for seeding cool season grazing crops such as ryegrass, small grains and annual clovers. Another plant which is becoming popular is fungus-free tall fescue.

This type of fescue is attractive to cattle producers because it is a longliving perennial. Cattlemen who cannot till their soils each year because of erosion like this fescue and are planting it.

Check with the seed and fertilizer dealers in Tishomingo County for any needed supplies. Don't let your seeding time be delayed

because you lack what you need.

## ASCS Farm News

### ACP Funds Available

ACP is designed to encourage farmers to voluntarily perform conservation practices on their land, and provides funds to help those who cannot perform such

practices to the extent necessary without some Federal assistance.

David Wilson, County Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and

Conservation Service, said limited funds are available for ACP practices that may be completed this fall or winter. Persons interested in planning fall grass practices should come by the ASCS of-

fice in Iuka to apply for cost-share assistance. ASCS establishes priorities and approves requests based on the loss of soil and/or water, and the amount that can be saved by performing the requested practice.

Mr. Wilson said farmers who are approved for ACP practices should report the completed conservation practices and submit bills to the county ASCS office by the expiration date on the ACP-245, Practice Approval and Payment Application, so that payments may be issued promptly. If, for some reason, an approved ACP practice cannot be completed by the expiration date, farmers should notify our office immediately.

## Dove Season Opens Sept. 5

A change -- no, a big change -- is just around the corner for Mississippi dove hunters.

If things go according to plan, Mississippi dove shooters this fall will be permitted a 15-bird per day bag limit.

The following 60-day dove hunting season has been approved by the Commission on

Wildlife Conservation: September 5-20; October 17-November 14; and December 19-January 2.

The increased bag limit came at the option of reducing by ten the total number of hunting days during the three seasons. Seven days were cut from the first season, one from the second season, and two from the third hunting period.

State wildlife officials say the dove resource is in no danger from the increased bag limit.

"Most dove hunters in Mississippi usually take real advantage of the first few weekends of the first dove season. So this will help them by giving them a chance to take home some extra birds," executive director Joe Stone said.

Stone said that other states have opted for the shorter season with an increased bag and have not hurt the wildlife resource by doing it.

While the daily bag limit is 15, the possession limit will be 30, with no possession limit permitted on the opening day of any season.

Since mourning doves are a federally regulated species, hunters must have their guns plugged and incapable of

holding more than three shells. Hunting hours are one-half hour before sunrise until sunset.

Of course hunters must have a valid hunting license in their possession before going afield.

**RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS OF SAID ISSUER IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$3,000,000 TO DEFRAY THE COST OF ACQUIRING AN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT, AND TO HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING THE SAME; AND DIRECTING THE PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION AND OF SUCH PUBLIC HEARING.**

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Issuer"), does hereby find, determine and adjudicate as follows:

1. The Issuer is a municipality as defined in Title 57, Chapter 3, of the Mississippi Code of 1972 (the "Act");

2. On July 7, 1987, this Governing Body, as authorized by the Act, adopted a resolution making application to the Mississippi Board of Economic Development (the "Board") for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (the "Certificate") authorizing the Issuer to acquire, own and lease a Project as hereinafter defined and to issue its industrial development revenue bonds to defray the cost of acquiring said Project;

3. On July 23, 1987, the Board ordered and directed the approval of the aforesaid application and issued its Certificate No. 738R to the Governing Body, which Certificate authorized and empowered this Governing Body, acting for and on behalf of the Issuer, subject to the conditions therein set out, to adopt and publish a resolution declaring its intention to issue industrial development revenue bonds of the Issuer as authorized by the Act in the principal amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 to provide funds to defray the cost of acquiring said Project and thereafter to lease said Project to Schnadig Corporation, a Delaware corporation (the "Lessee") or its designee for the purposes hereinafter set out;

4. In order to promote industrial development and to provide additional gainful employment for its citizens, the Issuer should declare its

intention to issue industrial development revenue bonds of the Issuer in the principal amount herein provided; and in order to give any person who may be interested in the issuance of said bonds a reasonable opportunity to be heard, a public hearing should be held with respect to such issuance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY, ACTING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE ISSUER, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** That this Governing Body, acting for and on behalf of the Issuer, does hereby declare its intention to issue Industrial Development Revenue Bonds of the Issuer in the principal amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 (the "Bonds") to provide funds for the purpose of defraying the cost of acquiring an industrial enterprise consisting of machinery and equipment (all of which machinery and equipment together constitute the "Project") located within the City of Belmont, Mississippi within the City of Belmont Industrial Park on the north side of Industrial Park Road west of the western boundary of the City of Belmont municipal airport and south of the Belmont Drive-in Theater and north of the former Golden Sales, Inc. property, for the manufacturing, processing and assembling of upholstered furniture or other permissible products under the Act, and thereafter to lease the Project to the Lessee; provided that the Bonds shall be payable both as to principal and interest solely from the revenue to be derived from the leasing of the Project, and neither the Bonds nor the interest thereon shall ever constitute an indebtedness of the Issuer within the meaning of any constitutional provision or statutory limitation of the State of Mississippi, nor ever constitute or give rise to a pecuniary liability of the Issuer or a charge against its general credit or taxing powers.

**SECTION 2.** That a public hearing with respect to the issuance of the Bonds in the amount and for the purpose aforesaid shall be held by the Governing Body at their usual meeting place, at the County Courthouse in the City of Iuka, Mississippi, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M., on September 21, 1987, in order to provide a reasonable opportunity for persons with differing views on the issuance of the Bonds and the location and nature of the proposed Project to be heard.

**SECTION 3.** That following such hearing, the Governing Body shall consider and vote on the issuance of the Bonds in the amount and for the purpose aforesaid. Under the laws of the State of Mississippi an election on the issuance of the Bonds may be called and if on or before the aforesaid date and hour 20% of the qualified electors of the Issuer shall file a written protest against the issuance of the Bonds, the Bonds shall not be issued unless authorized at an election on the question of the issuance thereof to be called and held as provided by law. If no such protest be filed, then the Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof at any time within a period of 2 years after the date hereinabove specified.

**SECTION 4.** That this resolution shall be published once a week for at least 4 consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than 21 days prior to the date fixed in this resolution for the issuance of said Bonds and the last publication shall be made not more than 7 days prior to the aforesaid date.

**SECTION 5.** That the Clerk of this Governing Body is hereby directed to procure from the publishers of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of this resolution and to have the same before this Governing Body at their meeting to be held on the date and at the hour set forth in Section 2 of this resolution.

# The Segars Clinic Report



**Dear Dr. Scott:**  
My child has asthma. I don't understand a lot of things about this disease. Would you include this in your column sometime?

**What is an asthma attack?**

During normal breathing, airways in the lungs are wide open. The muscles that surround each airway are relaxed, and the walls of the airways are free of mucus. During an asthma attack, however, the muscles surrounding the airways tighten very quickly and partially close them. The inner walls of the airways swell, making their inner diameter even smaller. Mucus fills the remaining space, so there is little room left for air to move.

**What causes asthma attacks?**

Some asthma attacks are caused by "triggers" such as pollen, animal dander, mold, dust, respiratory infections, exercise, and irritants such as perfume or cigarette smoke. Other attacks occur with no apparent cause. Most people who have asthma experience both kinds of attacks.

**Isn't asthma an emotional disease?**

Strong emotions can worsen symptoms in someone who already has asthma, but

emotions do not cause asthma, and asthma is not an emotional disease.

**Are most people with asthma invalids?**

By no means. With the proper treatment, almost anyone with asthma can lead a full, active life and can even participate in sports. In fact, in the 1972 Summer Olympics, athletes with asthma won five gold medals in swimming events.

**How are asthma attacks prevented?**

Avoidance of triggers is the first step in preventing asthma attacks. You and your doctor will probably be able to determine which, if any, substances cause your attacks. Your doctor may also want to perform some allergy tests, although they are not always necessary. Avoidance is an extremely important part of asthma prevention, because medication will not be very effective if you continue to be exposed to asthma triggers.

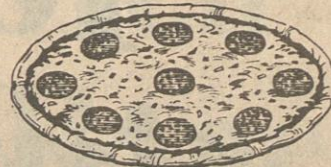

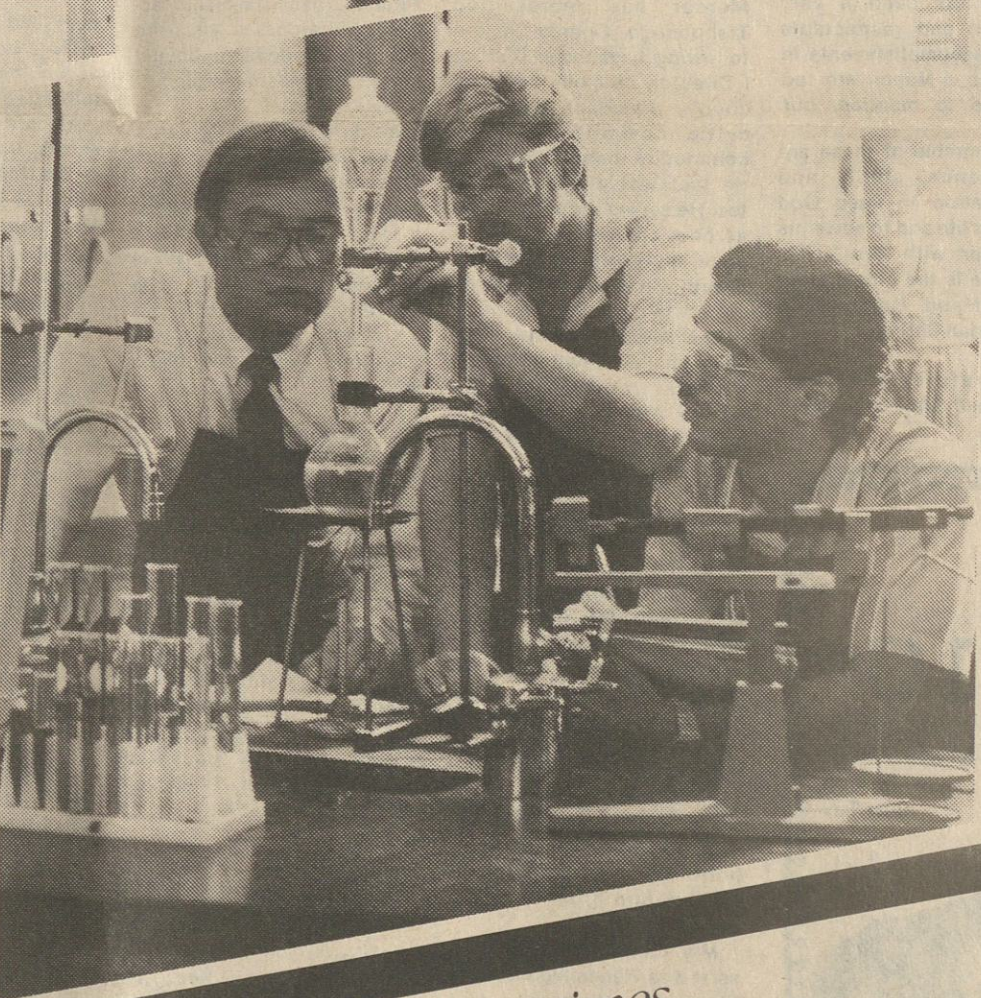
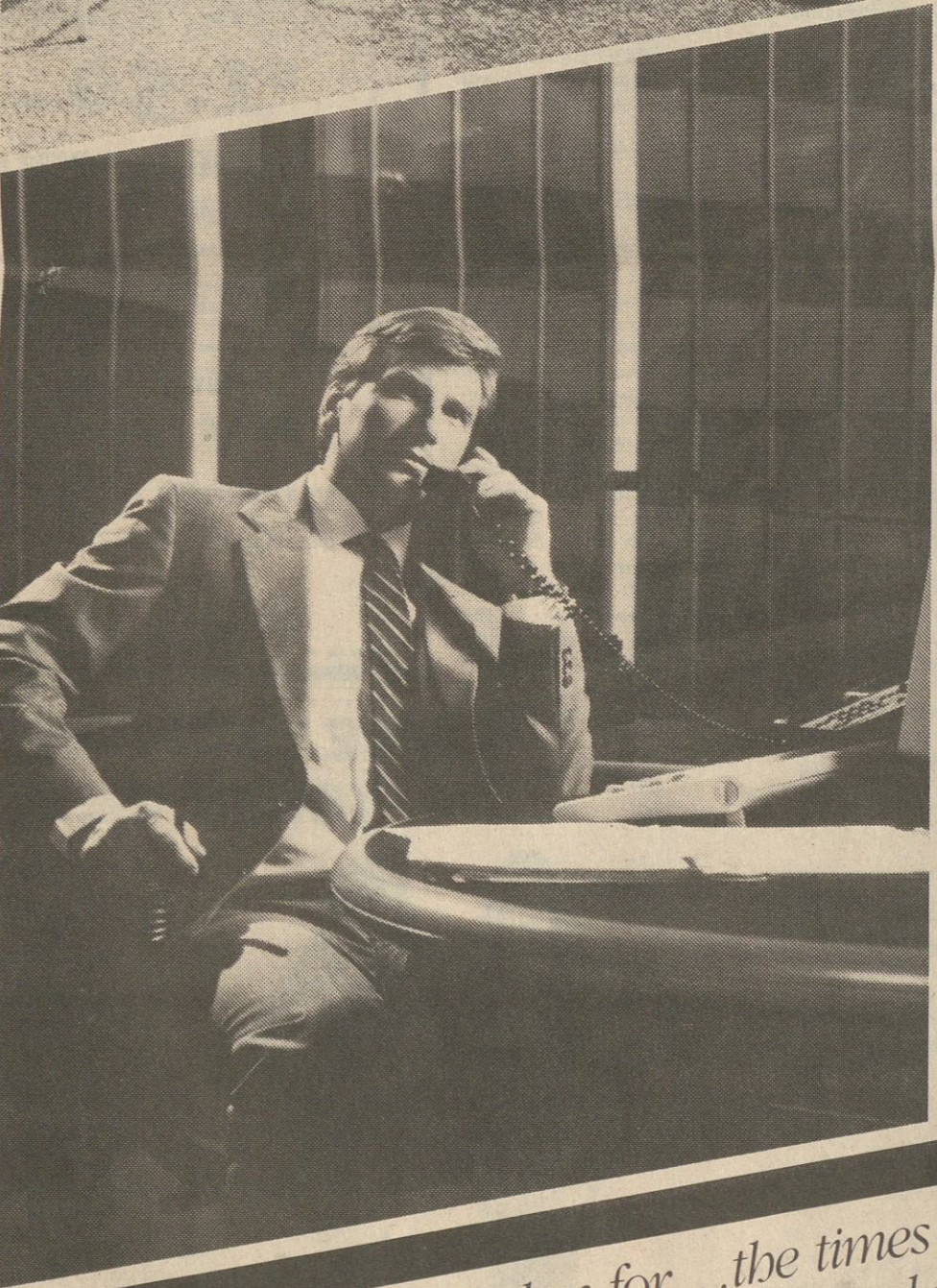
