## Tornado Sweeps Thru County Leaving Destructive Path

## Bush - Lott Elected

Tornadoes swept through northeast Mississippi Friday afternoon and at least one left major damage in Tishomingo County. The largest amount of destruction reported in the county occurred in the storm's path as it traveled in the Northeasterly fashion apparently originating in the Hazzard road vicinity as it grounded power lines and continued its sweep on to Indian Creek. Homes living in the Harmony Community, on Coleman Park Road and on Cagle Road communities east and north of Iuka are left with a lot of clean-up, re-construction, and in some cases complete rebuilding following the late weather outburst.

Tishomingo County Electric Power Association crews began working immediately after the storm hit at approximately 3:30 p.m. and continued to work through the night until 1 p.m. Saturday. Robert Grisham, Tishomingo County Electric Power Association manager, set the estimate of damage incurred by the utility service to be between forty and fifty thousand dollars as results of the storm. Numerous poles, broken lines, and insulators had to be repaired.

Service had been restored to those areas most heavily damaged by early to mid morning Saturday. The following areas reported major damage: Harmony

Road Community, Coleman Road area, and the Valley Community, East of Dennis. Other isolated cases were reported.

All Iuka and Burnsville service was interrupted due to damage to transmission lines and remained out until source of supply could be changed for each of those substations. Tuesday, crews from T.V.A. and T.C.E.P.A. were working to restore transmission lines from Burnsville to Iuka.

It is difficult to imagine the scene left in a storm's wake unless one has actually viewed such. Looking back upon the day's event, it is amazing that no fatalities or serious injuries were involved. Tishomingo County

was under a severe storm alert and it's unclear if tornado warnings were posted at the time. Although some local residents were sheltered in storm houses, others had no warning and were enroute home from work. School students were being bused, some to be delivered into the center of the storm.

Iuka Middle School Principal and Coach, Benny McClung was driving a school bus in the Rocky Springs area around 3:30 when he saw "a gray swirling mass". According to McClung, it was raining real hard and hailing some. I didn't have time to think about what to do and decided to try to out run the storm." McClung and his young passengers arrived home safely.

Touring the roads and inspecting the damage, much timber loss is evident. Trees were split, uprooted and some still standing with tops having been twisted and snapped by the winds as if they were match sticks. Debris is scattered recklessly throughout the area. The damage done to homes and to two churches in the area is most extensive.

It would be near impossible to document a complete and accurate report about the storm. The following information has been compiled to give our readers an idea of the vastness of Friday's tornado.

The residence of Roger and Linda Skinner, which is located where Hazzard Road enters Harmony Road, was lifted from its foundation and moved some six feet around. Trees were downed as throughout the path. Other damage was listed to the dwelling.

A house being remodeled by Tharan and Betty McBride Morgan (old home of Nander McBride) was greatly

damaged. Mrs. Morgan reported the downstairs shifted-twisted in two directions. A huge oak tree was laid across the newer top addition. A nearby shed and barn were ripped out, the tin roof carried away in the wind.

Moore's Chapel, a small undenominational church located a few miles west of Iuka on Whitehouse Road, was completely leveled. Mrs. Reba Grace Moore McBride, a charter member of the church, said nothing was salvageable in the rubble remaining. A few pews laden with concrete blocks were scattered at random and stood as a grim reminder of the twenty year old building where several families gathered faithfully for weekly worship services. Mrs. McBride's father, the late Tom Moore, was the founder of the original Moore's Chapel, which was destroyed by fire in earlier years. Whether this congregation will rebuild a second time is yet to be seen, said Mrs. McBride. The cemetery adjoining the church yard had some tombstones overturned, but none reported to be broken.

Elam Davis' property west of Moore's Chapel realized much timber damage.

At the Tommy and Dianne Dean residence on old Hwy. 25, the double rocked garage was ripped from the west end of the house and a couple of windows were broken, Dean reported. The owner said his belief was that his house was in the direct center of the storm and it's strong construction helped to limit more serious damage.

The Sid Bugg home was noted to have had the t.v. tower downed and timber damage.

The home of Jackie and Jane Dean on old 25 suffered severe damage. The house was shifted some six inches off the foundation, the chimney toppled and the bricks fell away from the structure. Windows were broken throughout and Mrs. Dean reported glass to be embedded in the interior walls and furnishings. She said the television antennae was crumpled as if it was a tiny wire someone could twist in their hand. The front porch was broken loose from the frame of the dwelling. The house the Dean's built twenty-four years ago has changed greatly in outward appearance by the November storm; however, it's memories and the love of the family is still intact, Mrs. Dean said, with a smile.

Billy and Virginia Dean were in the basement of their brick home and luckily so when the clouds gathered. Windows were blown out in the upper level and t.v. tower downed.

It's been estimated that when the twister crossed Hwy. 25 at the Coleman Park Rd., it's path extended between 500-700 ft. in width.

Hurchel Robertson's home on Hwy. 25 and his daughter and son-in-law's home (Jerry and Myra Barnes) on left just off 25 on Coleman Park Rd., were both damaged. New roofs are being installed and timber cleared away.

Other residences showing roof damage in the path were Mrs. Ola Mae Hobart's, the Cutshall brothers homes (Butch, Larry and Charlie), and Rocky Springs Methodist Church, where a large tree crashed the roof. Two mobile homes in the area were still standing, although the top to Mary Ramsey's was blown off. She has had to seek shelter elsewhere. Cecil and Julia Yarber's mobile home was damaged as was a barn nearby. Damage to the Dziebola house was apparently confined to the roof and

t.v. tower.

Traveling Cagle Road, perhaps the worst scene is that at Ted and Wilma Walker's home, which was totally demolished. Mr. and Mrs. Walker had just gone into the storm house in their yard, he said, and had been there possible three minutes when the storm struck. The four bedroom frame structure was blown away and the family car assessed as a total loss, Mr. Walker said. The well house and smoke house were destroyed at the home where Mr. Walker has lived since 1910. Mr. Walker's reply when asked if he planned to rebuild was "Of course!". He has been living there since he was nine years old and come January he'll celebrate his 88th birthday. After living in a place that long, it feels like home, he reckoned. "I'm just thankful nobody was hurt", he said, adding that "Something like this happens you find out how many friends you have. We're blessed."

Homes of two of Mr. Walker's daughters and sons-in-law, Leroy and Beatrice Vess and Cecil and Olene Jones, were damaged too, as was the home of Billy and Lillie Johnson.

A separate report from the south part of the county on Bear Creek Road East of Dennis listed damage to the home of Travis Cain. Several rafters were broken in the house frame and the chimney toppled. An old chicken house was destroyed there which housed a couple of trucks. It was said that the vehicles were not damaged. Whether or not this damage was due to tornado touch down was not verified at press time.

### IHS Chosen For Satellite Instruction

Iuka High School has been selected as one of four high schools in the state to take part in a pilot satellite instruction program beginning in January, 1989 in which students will take lessons in the Japanese Language and in Probability and Statistics. The satellite-link instruction program is supported by the State Department of Education and the Mississippi Authority for Educational Television. Students will respond and ask questions on telephone lines. The instructor for Introduction to the Japanese Language is from Nebraska, while the instructor for Probability and Statistics, an advanced mathematics course, is from Kentucky.

Iuka education officials are excited about Iuka's selection to the new instructional program, and the tremendous opportunity this affords our school and community.

Republican George Bush saw an easy victory and seized control of the White House Tuesday. Vice President Bush will become the 41st president in January. With seventy-five percent of the votes in, Mississippians polled 401,233 votes for Bush and 272,226 for Dukakis. Tishomingo County voters gave Bush 3,645 and Dukakis received 3,371.

In the race for U.S. Senator, Republican Trent Lott was victorious defeating Wayne Dowdy state wide for the seat in the senate. However, Dowdy carried Tishomingo County 5,295 to Lott's 1,982. Lott will accept the seat being vacated by retiring 41 year Senate veteran John C. Stennis.

United States House of Representative Jamie L. Whitten realized a resounding win over opponent Jim Bush in the county as well as throughout the 1st Congressional District. Local voters handed Whitten 6,182 and Bush totaled 771.

The county unit system referendum was defeated with all precincts reporting.

Totaled voters favoring the county unit system were 3,042. Those against the centralized form of government were 3,700.

The issue of abolishing the county school board superintendent of education reported 1,040 for and 5,553 against.

In the county's election commissioner races George M. Bonds in the first district won over incumbent Londee Kent. District two Clifford Wiginton ousted incumbent Noma Holland. Charles O. Bowling was chosen third district election commissioner over opposing Lamar Rutherford. Fourth and fifth district incumbents David P. Rushing and Vera Bostick were unopposed.

County school board members being seated include first district, Virgil Rhodes; second district, Larry Bonds; third district, Paul Whitlock; fourth district, Harold Oswald. Fifth district incumbent Harold Sparks was unopposed.

## Jerry Bonds Appointed County Coordinator

Jerry Bonds has been appointed by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to be the county coordinator to develop fire protection in rural areas.

Commissioner of Insurance George Dale, who is also state fire marshal, is responsible for implementing a new law which requires each county to develop this program to receive state funds from the municipal and county fire protection funds. "I am pleased the county

has appointed Jerry to assist us in organizing this program," said Dale. "Jerry will provide the technical assistance on the local level to insure that every person in the county is provided the best fire protection service available."

The coordinator will also compile reports from local fire departments to prepare a five-year plan for improving county fire protection.

"This position is the most important link in making this program successful, and we are very dependent on local commitment and leadership," Dale said.

## Hercules-Atlantic Drops Bid On Montgomery Site - Bids In On Yellow Creek Facility



The news is out! Tishomingo County's Yellow Creek is the only site to be bid on for a NASA Advanced Solid Rocket Motor project.

Only two proposals were submitted to National Aeronautics Space Administration officials by two separate contracting teams last week meeting the October 31 deadline.

"Since Montgomery is now a moot subject, the task is before us to continue working in an effort to soften the impact that is expected to be made on Tishomingo County," Tishomingo County Development Foundation Director Mack Loyd Wadkins said Tuesday.

Lockheed-Aerofjet recommended the Yellow Creek site for the \$1.5 billion facility all along. The other contracting team, Hercules Atlantic had retained the option to consider a site in Montgomery, Alabama, but apparently decided the lower cost of Yellow Creek was a more attractive venture.

"Studies indicate that existing buildings, utilities, roads and other features left intact when the nuclear plant was mothballed could save up to \$100 million in construction costs and a year in startup time," said Wadkins.

The County spokesman has worked with state officials, NASA officials, and representatives of both contract bidding teams. He has

maintained all along that Yellow Creek was the best site because of the infrastructure and savings involved. "I've been confident from the beginning that our site in Tishomingo County would be the final selection," Wadkins said.

Even though it will be early '89 before NASA makes the official announcement of which contracting team will be awarded the project, Yellow Creek was named as the space agency's choice for the rocket motor plant in July.

The construction phase of the project is expected to create 1,000 jobs, and eventually 1,400 - 2,000 permanent jobs. The annual payroll at the production facility is expected to be near \$20 million.

Thirty rockets per year are expected to be designed for a 20 year period at the plant with the first flight test of a rocket made at the Yellow Creek site planned for 1995.

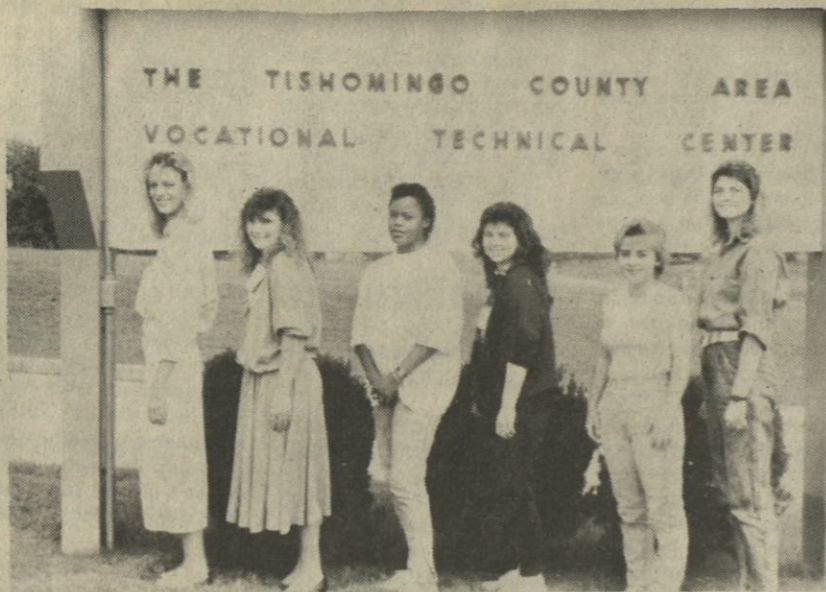

### Chatting With Your Home Economist

#### CONCERN FOR CHILDREN WITH POOR APPETITES

Day-to-day variation in a young child's appetite is common. There are several possible causes:  
Amount of physical activity. On active days, your child will probably be hungrier than on quiet days.  
Inappropriate snacking. Snacking too frequently or too close to meals could decrease your child's ap-

petite.  
Emotional distress. A child who is upset or tired may not eat well.  
Illness. Appetite will be affected when a child isn't feeling well.  
Before worrying about your child's appetite, check your expectations. Too often parents overestimate their child's food needs and judge their intake by what an adult might eat.  
Be patient if you do have concerns about your child's appetite. If your child is healthy and growing steadily, a small appetite is probably nothing to worry about. On days when appetite seems smaller, let your child eat when hungry and offer foods

that are enjoyed. Forcing or bribing your child to eat is usually not effective and may even have a negative impact on the development of good food habits.

#### CHECK YOUR KITCHEN FOR POISONS

Check under the sink and on low cabinet shelves for stored products that could be hazardous to young children. These could include products such as bleaching agents, rust removers, drain cleaners, ammonia, oven cleaners, detergents, scouring powder, furniture polish, floor wax, metal polish, wax remover, wood cleaner, floor cleaner and toilet bowl cleaner. Even food extract such as vanilla and almond are powerful poisons if taken straight from the bottle undiluted.  
A locked storage space is the best. If that is impractical, then keep these items high out of the reach of children. Store canned goods and dry foods in low cabinets and put potentially harmful products in upper cupboards and on high closet shelves out of sight and out of reach.  
Never store cleaning compounds on the same shelves as foods since one item might be mistaken for another. Keep all substances in their original containers.

1/4 cup honey  
2 T. prepared mustard  
1 T. reduced-calorie margarine  
2 L. low-sodium soy sauce  
2 (4 oz.) boned, skinned chicken breast halves, cut into 18 (1-inch) pieces  
1/2 cup cornflake crumbs  
1 t. paprika

Combine first 4 ingredients in a microwave-safe medium bowl; stir well, and microwave at HIGH 20 seconds or until margarine melts. Add chicken pieces, stirring to coat.  
Combine cornflake crumbs and paprika; dredge each chicken piece in cornflake crumb mixture, using wooden picks.  
Arrange half of chicken pieces in a circle around the edge of a large, heavy-duty paper plate; cover with wax paper, and microwave at HIGH 2 to 2 1/2 minutes. Repeat procedure with

remaining chicken pieces.  
Microwave remaining honey-mustard sauce at HIGH for 1 to 1 1/2 minutes or until hot. Serve with chicken nuggets. Yield: 6 servings (about 126 calories per 3 nuggets and about 1 tablespoon sauce).

#### GUN SAFETY AND 4-H GO TOGETHER

The 4-H Shooting Sports Project stresses safety at all times, and with various hunting seasons underway and others opening soon, now is a good time for all youth to be reminded of the 10 rules of shooting safety.  
We all cherish our county youth too much to let needless accidents be the cause of death or injury.  
Safety first, safety always is the most important lesson taught in the program.  
Safe gun handling involves both common sense and the development of safe habits. All shooters should practice these 10 rules of shooting safety:

1. Treat every gun with the respect due a loaded gun.
2. Be sure of your target before you pull the loaded gun.
3. Always be sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.
4. Never point your gun at anything you do not intend to shoot.
5. Never leave your gun unattended unless you unload it first.
6. Never consume alcoholic beverages either before or during shooting.
7. Never climb a tree or cross a fence carrying a loaded gun.
8. Never shoot at a hard, flat surface or the surface of water. Always make sure you have a safe backstop.
9. Carry only empty guns -- taken down or with the action open -- into your camp, car or home.
10. Store guns and ammunition separately, under lock and key.

Remember, carelessness is the largest single contributing factor in firearm accidents. Safety rules and proper instruction alone do not prevent accidents. It's up to every individual shooter to make the rules work.

### STEM BLIGHT

If southern stem blight was a problem in your garden this year, now is the time to turn garden soil to control this disease.

Use a mold board plow to turn soil so overwintering fungi, which cause the disease, are deeply buried. Many of you ask if using a garden tiller or plowing the garden will do the job. It won't, so don't.

### STORED VEGETABLES

Don't forget to check your stored vegetables this fall.

Irish potatoes need cold storage, but sweet potatoes need temperatures varying between 55 degrees and 60 degrees. Stored squash and pumpkins require cool temperatures, not cold ones.

If your stored vegetables show shriveling or weight loss, the humidity in your storage area may be too low. Throw away any vegetables showing decay.

### NO PRUNING PLEASE

Do not prune fruit trees, plants or vines at this time of the year. If you do, your plants may suffer winter damage from hard January freezes.

### COOL SEASON GRAZING

Our cool season grazing situation in Tishomingo County has been much better this year than it was last year because of improved soil moisture.

You may still need to do several things to keep your grazing crops growing. Limit access of larger animals to your grazing. Feed your cows and older animals frosted

grass and row crop residues. Allow plants to become well established so they can support growth later in the season.

### Recreation Area Closings

Effective 7 November 1988, the Corps of Engineers closed all waterborne restroom facilities in the following areas: Beaver Lake, Cotton Springs, McDougal Branch, West Damsite and Crows Neck. These closures are being made during the winter recreation season because of reduced visitation, and to help reduce vandalism of these facilities. The tentative reopening date is 1 March 1989.

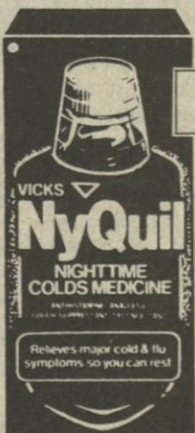

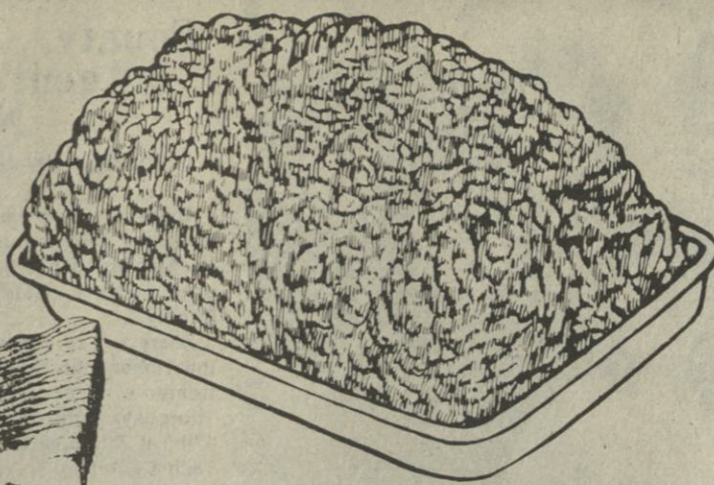

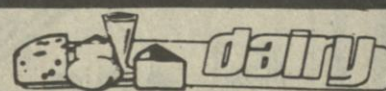

## Iuka Elementary Celebrates NASA

Area residents began celebrating when they learned that the Hercules-Atlantic aerospace team had recommended against located NASA's \$1.5 billion advanced solid rocket motor plant near Montgomery Thursday, November 3.

Iuka Elementary School principal, Charles Evans, said the celebration plans were made Thursday morning after the news was released.

Mr. Evans stated, "When the students came to school Thursday morning they were very excited, so he and the teachers got together and decided to do something that the students would remember for a long time." The students wrote poems about NASA coming to Iuka and posters were placed on the school's doors and walls. Mr. Evans said, "The poems would be placed in a Time Capsule for several years, and that one of these days we will be able to go back to the poems, read them and see

how NASA has changed the lives of these young children. Also each of the 635 balloons contained the student's name and a message welcoming the National Aeronautics and Space Administration."

Hercules Inc. of Magna, Utah, and Atlantic Research Corp. of Gainesville, VA, two firms that joined together to submit a proposal to NASA to build the rocket plant, made proposals on both and Montgomery and Yellow Creek sites, according to NASA officials in Huntsville.

Wednesday, the aerospace team apparently decided not to go with the privately owned site 8 miles west of the state's capital as a possible location for the rocket motor plant, apparently leaving only the Tennessee Valley Authority's abandoned nuclear plant the most likely site.

After NASA announced Wednesday there were no other bidders for the Montgomery site, Hercules-Atlan-

tic made its decision against the site.

NASA officials stated, in addition to the Hercules-Atlantic Team's proposal, a team comprised of Aerojet Solid Propulsion Co. of Sacramento, California, and Lockheed Missiles and Space Co. of Sunnyvale, California, proposed the Yellow Creek Site.

NASA officials are still not commenting on the proposals or any of the

details. They are also not saying if Hercules-Atlantic's actions assure the plant would be built at Yellow Creek.

"A site evaluation board is studying the proposals made by the two teams," said a spokesperson of the Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville. "Nothing will be said about the bids until next spring when we (NASA) announce our contractor and the selected site for the ASRM project."

**FILLING CAVITIES**

Q. What are restorations?

A. They are fillings of various types used to restore cavities after the dentist cleans out the decayed area.

A silver alloy, or amalgam, is widely used. Gold fillings have exceptional strength and are appropriate to restore weakened teeth that are subject to much stress from chewing. A white composite filling that matches the natural tooth color is often preferred in prominent places such as the edge of a front tooth.

Different techniques are employed, depending on the cavity. If a large section of a tooth has been trimmed down, pins may be inserted to help anchor a silver filling. In some cases, such fillings may require the added protection of a crown.

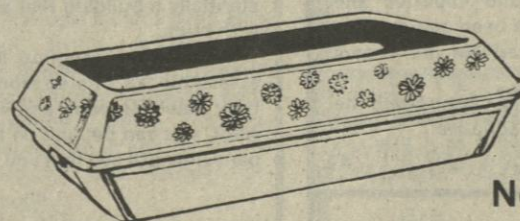

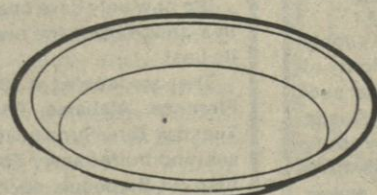

Tishomingo assistant coach, Vince Jordan said, "Falkner didn't know what to do, one guy even took off his helmet."

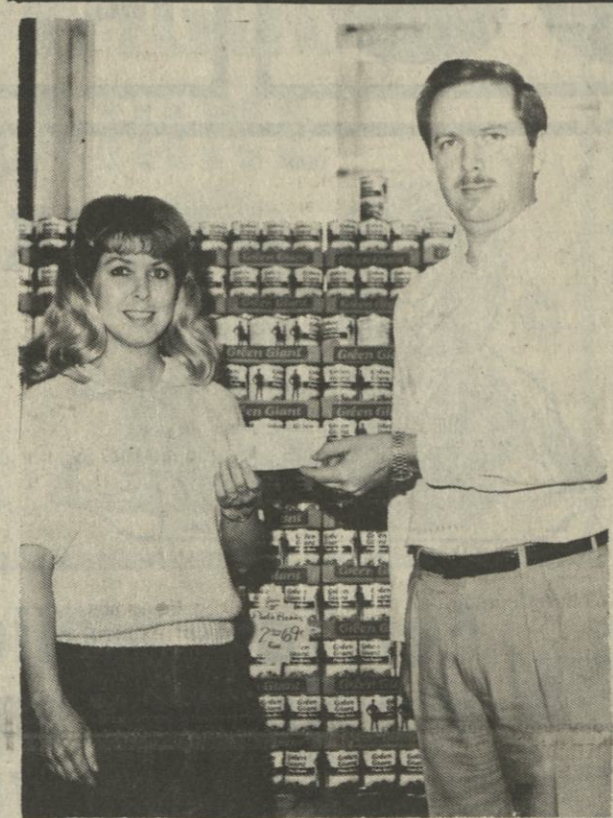
In overtime, Tishomingo won, 22-16, on a third-down, 2 yard run by Hill - who finished the game with 29 yards.

## Local Doctor Recertified

Dr. Kelly S. Segars, of Iuka, MS has been recertified as a diplomate of the American Board of Family Practice (ABFP) as a result of passing a recertification examination offered by the ABFP. The physician thus maintains a specialist status in the medical specialty of family practice.

ABFP diplomates must continue to show proof of competence in the field of comprehensive, continuing care of the family by being recertified every six years. The family practice specialty was the first to require diplomates to be recertified on a continuing basis.

The written examination is designed to prove the candidate's continuing competence in the basic components of family practice: internal medicine, surgery, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry and neurology, and community medicine.

To qualify for certification initially, a physician must have successfully completed three years of residency training in family practice and passed an intensive certification examination. There are some 380 residency training programs in teaching hospitals and university medical centers across the United States.

Nearly 37,000 family physicians have now been certified in the specialty. Most are members of the American Academy of Family Physicians, the national association of family doctors. The Academy was the first national medical group to require members to take continuing study, and was chiefly responsible for securing specialty status for family practice.
