

NASA Impact To Affect Iuka School System

Iuka Special Municipal Separate School District Board members and Iuka Mayor and aldermen will meet February 13, to consider alternatives in relation to the anticipated impact NASA's Advanced Solid Rocket Motor project will have on the system.

At a meeting held Monday night the main issues discussed by the group surrounded what paths of action to take. It was agreed with all members present that Superintendent Dr. Jerry Stone would prepare and provide a cost list of choices

that are possible at the February meeting.

"It's a process of making decisions right now of what to do," Dr. Stone said.

"By the time we meet again in February, the final Yellow Creek report being done by Dr. Tom Saterfiel, will be

prepared," he reasoned. Saterfiel is deputy (assistant) state superintendent of education.

The Yellow Creek report will become a part of the decision making process for the Iuka school officials. This report will show differences and make comparisons in

courses in schools surrounding Yellow Creek. It will also provide some cost estimates for construction and building.

"The Iuka school board will employ a consultant to work between now and our next meeting," Superintendent Stone said. At least three different matters will be looked at by the consultant.

Dr. Stone named the following alternatives to be considered: 1. Cost of building a new high school. 2. Cost of building a new middle school. 3. Cost of building a new high school in stages.

"Other options may

materialize," he said.

Reports indicate the State Board of Education will decide this week what recommendations to make to the Legislature concerning new school buildings, increasing the number of teachers, and voluntary consolidation of some school districts. Final assessments and recommendations from their report will not be determined until January.

Other topics expected to be addressed by the state board will include what curriculum changes need to be made in the Yellow Creek area school districts.

Furniture Manufacturer To Open Golden Facility

The expansion of an Okolona furniture manufacturer will benefit Tishomingo County when 20th Century Enterprises, Inc., starts production in the old Oakwood building in Golden. A company official projected operations to begin in early 89.

Gary Young, president of the company, announced Monday that a three year lease had been signed with the Oakwood owners and his company hopes to be in operation by March. Initial employment is set between 80-85 people. The company hires both men and women workers. The company expects to build their work force up to 150 workers at the Oakwood facility.

Exactly how or when applications will be taken hasn't been fully decided, Young said. Most likely company officials will make an announcement and will be using the local employment service.

20th Century Enterprise, based in Okolona, has been in the furniture making business for 3 1/2 years. The company has seen success under the leadership of three partners which include Young, Robert Tallant, vice president of administration and finance and Terry Robinson, Vice-President of Manufacturing. Jerry Stockset plays a very important role in his position as

vice-president in charge of sales and merchandising.

"Incline specialists of America," is how Young referred to his company which has seen an estimated revenue to be near \$30 million at the Okolona plant last year with it's 400 employees.

The Golden facility will complete all steps involved in constructing quality upholstered motion furniture, Young said.

"We build and make them incline .. motion furniture," he said, naming such pieces of furniture as sofas, loveseats, chairs, and sectionals.

With recent layoffs in the county due to the closing of two Blue Bell plants and the recent unemployment figure standing at 11.7 percent, it is hoped the arrival of 20th Century will compensate, said Leon Cook, county supervisor. The factory will operate from Cook's 5th district.

The available work force in Tishomingo County had an influence on company officials in determining to locate a satellite plant here, Young said. However, the availability of the existing building was an added bonus, he said.

"Terry Robinson and myself will be spending a lot of time in the Belmont-Golden area initially, creating interest," the company spokesman said. It is anticipated they will find capable support and use Tishomingo County people in

their operation.

"We intend to be a good neighbor," Young said.

Any experience with the furniture industry, upholstery or sewing industry should be helpful to potential employees. However, according to Young, 20th Century employees have to be trained by company people in the making of motion furniture, which is a style of it's own.

Tishomingo County Development Director, Mack L. Wadkins welcomed the plant president and visualized the new industry as "home

grown and home operated". Wadkins explained that all the partners of the company were from Mississippi.

"The industry is one that is accustomed to hiring and buying locally, he said."

"We are happy they are interested in seeing the Northeast Mississippi area grow. We are excited over their decision to locate in our county and will be interested in seeing them grow also," he said.

The plant will be the fifth furniture manufacturer in the county, according to officials.

Actions Taken By Iuka City Board

Topics of discussion at last week's meeting of the mayor and board of aldermen of Iuka included a base rate increase for water customers and the possibility of expanding the city limits.

"The purpose of a base rate increase for Iuka residential water customers is to generate extra funds for future water and sewer expansion," said Mayor John Biggs.

A \$2 increase over the present \$4.50 per first 4,000 gallons used will set the residential base rate at \$6.50 beginning in January.

Sewer rates are based on the amount of water used and will also realize an increase. Sewer rates amount to about

one-third of the water bill.

The six rural water associations that purchase water from Iuka will see an increase in their rates too. These associations include customers of Eastport-Snowdown, Midway-Pleasant Hill, Walker's Switch, Bart Smith's Sub., Harmony Central, and a part of Short-Coleman.

The area considered for possible future intake within the municipal's boundaries will include a section of U.S. 72 southwest of Iuka where a Comfort Inn motel is scheduled for construction.

In other action, the mayor and aldermen approved the hiring of Bobby James as relief fireman for the city.





Homeowners often have a tendency to overreact in these situations. Excessive use of an insecticide in the home is neither safe nor smart.

CHRISTMAS TREE ARE

I've seen many beautiful Christmas trees in Tishomingo County this year. About the best entertainment going right now is to drive around after dark to see the efforts some of our county residents have made in decorating their trees.

If you have a beautiful tree, you'll want to keep it beautiful with tender, loving care. Here are a few tips I'll share with you.

Don't let your Christmas tree run out of water. Most trees need at least 1 quart of water per day. Check the water level of your tree every day. Mist tree branches and needles with water every day to keep the tree fresh.

Make sure your tree is not placed near a fireplace, radiator, television or another heat source that will dry it out. Don't place lighted candles or open flames on or near the tree.

Check tree light cords and electrical outlets for wear. Unplug your lights when no one is home and when you go to bed.

If you follow these suggestions, your tree will stay pretty for the duration of the holidays.

PAY FOR DHIA?

I received some information on a recent study by Iowa State University about the cost of production testing programs for dairy herds. The study concluded that dairy farmers have much to gain by putting their herds on a program, such as the one promoted by the Dairy Herd Improvement Association.

Here's what the study said. Average production increased by one-half pound per cow per day on the program. The program also lowered the age of first calving to 24 months, a 1.7 month decrease per cow. It improved the calving interval

by almost six days.

Dairy farmers were able to save on feed costs during the lactation period. Their feed costs savings averaged 3 pounds per cow per day for the last 90 days of lactation. They also had a reduction in days dry by almost six days per cow.

I encourage our dairy farmers in Tishomingo County who aren't participating in the DHIA program to think these facts through.

LOW SOIL pH

I've been notified that many of the soil samples our county farmers and home gardeners are testing have low soil pH. This is not good. Make adjustment of soil pH your No. 1 priority. While lime is expensive, the consequences of not liming when it's needed, are more expensive. December and January are good months for liming, if soils are dry enough to support your lime truck.

Plan For Indoor Exercise

Winter's cold, rain, and snow bring many people's outdoor exercise programs to a halt; yet a regular exercise program may be more important during the winter than at any other time of year," according to Diane DeMarco, executive director of The National Exercise for Life Institute.

The extra activities and stress of the holidays, coupled with fewer hours of sunlight and the hassle of nasty weather and long days indoors, can bring on cabin fever and "the blues."

However, regular exercise stimulates the brain's production of the hormone norepinephrine, which is related to emotional stability. Exercise may also stimulate substances in the brain called endorphins. These chemicals are referred to as "natural opiates," because they give a natural feeling of well-being.

"Regular aerobic exercise is important because it helps you to maintain and improve your flexibility, strength and endurance. It also improves your mental acuity and helps you to manage stress," said Dale Moss, M.S. clinical exercise physiologist at Abbott Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

"People who live in 'winter cities' where the average January temperature is 32 degrees Fahrenheit, especially need to plan for winter exercise activities," noted DeMarco. Cities in this category include: Minneapolis; Chicago; Spokane, Washington; and Kansas City, Missouri. However, parts of Arizona, New Mexico and Texas also average between 40 and 80 days of snow cover per year.

"Even in warmer parts of the nation, people can't rely on being able to pursue their regular outdoor exercise activities year-round," said DeMarco.

"The exercise people select should be something they enjoy, and be endurance-based," noted Moss. "Cross-country skiing, of course, is the Cadillac of aerobic exercise," he added.

Fitness experts agree that cross-country skiing is the world's best exercise because it uses all of the major muscles in the body. Even in snow-belt states, however, cross-country skiing is not always available.

In fact, it was the exceptionally cold winter of 1975, plus temporary lack of suitable snow, that inspired cross-country ski enthusiast Ed Pauls to invent the Nordic

Track cross-country ski exercise machine.

"Nordic Track simulates the motions of cross-country skiing, but it also became popular with non-skiers because it provides convenient, total-body workout," said Pauls, a mechanical design engineer and the chairman of NordicTrack. "Today, 75 percent of all NordicTrack owners have never cross-country skied," he added.

"NordicTrack gives the benefits of an aerobic workout, without the trauma of running or jogging," noted Roy Bergman, M.D., F.A.C.S., Liaison to National Governing Bodies, United States Olympic Committee on Sports Medicine.

"In addition, it can be used indoors -- a lot of people won't run if it's raining outside. And if you can use something inside, you're much more likely to keep up the program year-round, and avoid becoming sedentary," Dr. Bergman added.

People who use in-home equipment tend to want to get the maximum workout in

the least amount of time. "NordicTrack gives a complete aerobic workout tones the entire body in little as 20 minutes a three days a week," Pauls.

Vision is never more important than in the first 12 years of a child's life. According to the experts, about 80 percent of all learning in those years is accomplished through seeing. The child has to be able to see well to study the world around him, to read, and to protect himself.

How can you tell if your child has a problem with his vision? Does he tilt his head to one side when looking at someone or something? Maybe he is seeing better with one eye than the other. Does he put his head close to a book when he's reading? This may be a sign of nearsightedness.

Have you noticed him blinking often or rubbing

his eyes? Does he complain of headaches? These are telltale signs that he may be having problems with his vision. The only way to know for sure is to call your eye doctor for an appointment.

A good eye examination is thorough and it's painless. If there is a vision problem, it can usually be corrected with proper eyeglasses or contact lenses.

Chatting With Your Home Economist

At this time of year, most of us are guilty of eating too much, simply because we are exposed to more food. Parties at work and after work, family gatherings and other holiday events -- even refreshments at stores -- offer us the opportunity to indulge. And indulge we do, often to the point of overindulging.

Maintaining a desirable weight is important to many people, but it does not mean

they cannot participate in holiday occasions. However, it does require some planning to enjoy special occasions without adding unwanted pounds.

Try these weight saving tips for the weeks ahead:

Early in the season, determine your personal weight goal. Weight at least once a week to keep track of weight gain. If you gain simply eat more sensibly during the next week.

As soon as you arrive at a party or social function is the time to put your plan into action. If alcohol is being served, limit yourself to one drink and then substitute club soda, seltzer, mineral

water or plain water with a twist of lemon or lime. Bourbon, scotch, gin and vodka contain 95 to 125 calories per 1/2 ounce serving and the calories increase when added to drink mixers such as cola and juice.

If rich desserts are being served, take only a bite of fruit cake, brownies, iced cakes and rich cookies. Be aware of the cheese tray as well. Cheddar cheese has 114 calories per ounce and process cheese spreads have more. Moderation is the key.

Nuts are a holiday favorite, but can add lots of salt, fat and calories to your diet. Eat only a few and savor them one at a time. Eight or ten salted nuts adds up to 50 calories or more.

Focus on the low calorie foods such as raw vegetables and fruits. They are crunchy and colorful, more nutritious, and of course, low in calories. Go easy on high-calorie cream cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise or dips with whipped cream for the fruits and vegetables because 1 tablespoon of dip can have 100 calories.

Another excellent way to avoid the pitfalls of holiday party-going is to eat a light, but filling, nutritious meal before going to a party. If you are not hungry, you will be less likely to overindulge.

Also, remember if you are the hostess, be kind to your guests that are weight-conscious. Be sure to offer low calorie food choices, such as fresh raw fruits and vegetables with yogurt-based dips and low calorie beverages. Don't be offended when guests do not stuff themselves and do not be too pushy in offering food.

HOLIDAY LOAF

3 cups biscuit mix
3/4 cup sugar
1 egg, beaten
1 1/4 cups pineapple juice
1/2 cup chopped pecans
1 cup finely chopped apples
1 pkg. (6-oz.) semi-sweet chocolate pieces, divided

Combine biscuit mix and sugar. Combine egg and pineapple juice; stir into first mixture; beat hard 30 seconds. Stir in pecans, apples and

3/4 cup chocolate pieces. Spoon into well greased loaf pan 8 x 5 x 3 inches. Sprinkle remaining chocolate pieces on top. Bake at 350° for 55 to 50 minutes. Let cool thoroughly on cake rack before slicing.

Small flying insects can be a nuisance in the home during the holidays. Some of these pests seen flying around include foreign grain beetles, stored grain beetles, moths and other insects attracted to light.

Several Tishomingo County residents have called asking what to spray to get rid of these pests. Identify what type of pests you have before you treat. Identification is important; otherwise, the treatment won't work.

Ask Ochsner

Q. I am concerned when my husband goes out hunting or fishing in the winter time. I tell him he doesn't dress warmly enough, but he says it rarely gets cold enough here to warrant him taking heavy

clothes and an extra jacket. Am I concerned needlessly? Mrs. BA, Lafayette, La.
A. Dr. Chesley Hines, Jr. of the Ochsner Clinic staff, and himself an avid outdoorsman, says that hunters and fishermen in the south are misled by the fact that temperatures are rarely in the freezing range in the Gulf South, and many fail to take proper precautions. Sometimes, a condition known as hypothermia - abnormally low body temperature - can result.

Hypothermia is usually caused by a combination of cold and wetness, and can not only cause severe illness but even death. It can occur even when the temperature is in the 40's, if the sportsman should fall into the water or meet a heavy rain, Dr. Hines says.

For those who carry liquor in the boat and tend to drink some when they are chilled

and wet, "don't do it," Dr. Hines says. "A drink of alcohol rather than warming you up, actually dilates the blood vessels in the skin and causes further loss of heat," he says, urging outdoorsmen to wait until then are safely back at camp before taking a drink.

All of the problems of hypothermia can be avoided with the use of proper protective clothing. This includes a hat. About 40 percent of body heat is lost through the head. Wearing a hat, which is both warm and waterproof, can go a long way toward protecting you if you're caught in a winter rain. Layered clothing, including thermal or long underwear, is a must in cold weather. A careful outdoorsman living in our mild climate always takes an extra layer of clothing with him in case there is a sudden weather change.

Down-filled clothing is no

good if you get wet. Dr. Hines says it is better to have clothing filled with synthetic materials which are as down. These can be wrung out, and you can allow body heat to warm them out.

Dr. Hines also says storing matches in a waterproof package about the boat just in case you spend the night in a shelter and need to make a fire. Every year a number of hunters and fishermen die needlessly from hypothermia because they don't take simple precautions.

HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN

Since children will be out of school during the holidays, they sometimes become bored and frustrated. They may complain because they don't have anything to do, or the weather confines them to the house.

Parents also become frustrated from listening to the complaints. Here are a few suggestions to help stop holiday boredom.

Let the children help decorate for the season. Listed below are some simple

ideas for this.

Tree Ideas:

A gum drop tree - Plan a trip to the plum orchard or just along the roadside and select and cut a small bare plum tree or a nicely shaped branch. Take the tree or branch home and "plant" in a pot or can of sand. Cover the can with foil or wrapping paper. Using multicolored gum drops, stick them onto the stickers" on each branch of the plum tree.

Gingerbread bag tree - Use the same kind of tree as above. Bake gingerbread boy and/or girl cookies. Let cool and place each in a plastic bag. Tie with a ribbon. Hang the cookies on the tree to give to young visitors.

Tree for the Birds - Collect

pine cones. Cover them with peanut butter and sprinkle with bird seed. Attach a string or ribbon for hanging and hang these on low branches or small trees in the yard.

Other simple ideas:

Good fortune chains - Use wrapping paper, colored on one side and white on the other. Cut paper into strips 4" x 1". On the white side write fortune or special wishes. Make a chain of loops of the fortune strips with glue. Use as a garland for the Christmas tree.

Metallic foil fans - Using foil or foil wrapping paper, cut into 12" x 16" rectangles. Fold in half lengthwise and pleat. Punch a hole in the pinched end and thread rib-

bon through and tie in a bow.



Christmas Tour



Cong. Whitten Remains Chairman

Congressman Jamie Whitten was approved by the Democratic Caucus for the sixth time as Chairman of the Committee on Appropriations of the U.S. House of Representatives by a vote of 212 to 5.

Congressman Whitten, whose Committee has consistently held the total of appropriation bills below the total recommended by President Reagan, said:

"Of course, we must hold down spending and work toward a balanced budget, but at a high enough level to maintain essential programs including taking care of our country, which is our real wealth. Our problems and massive debts come from providing entitlements and binding contracts and a failure to support our industry."

"We must hold down spending, but to live with what we already owe will require increased production and restoration of exports, which in turn will require that we return to competitive sales in world trade and provide the same support for our industry, including agriculture, that other countries provide for theirs. We are economically dependent upon regaining our volume -- which calls for exports and the regaining of much of our \$150 billion domestic market, which we hand over to foreign countries."

"We do have the appearance of prosperity, but from a national viewpoint, it is on borrowed money recovered from the sale of American land and assets to foreign countries."

"We must remember a nation, like an individual, can get so in debt that it has to check with its creditors before making domestic decisions."

Graduation At MSU

More than 850 Mississippi State University students are scheduled to graduate December 20 at the conclusion of the 1988 fall semester.

The university holds only one graduation exercise each year. Commencement for all graduates from the 1988 summer terms to the 1989 spring semester will be held May 13 in Humphrey Coliseum.
