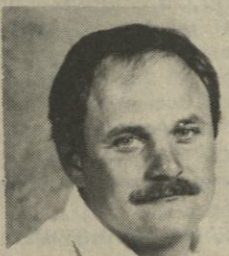
fairs of city government. My primary concern, if elected, will be to attract industry to Iuka because of the NASA announcement. This growth should be well planned, and orderly.

Gambling & Pornographic Materials Taken In Raid Of Convenience Store

Gambling machines and pornographic materials seized during a raid of an Iuka business are being turned over to federal officials, according to Richard Bowen, Iuka city attorney.

Iuka police officers, Ricky Cornelison, Bobby Flynt, Benny Parrish, and Randy

Stringer, executed a search warrant to the premises of Handy Sandy Wednesday, March 15. The business is located on East Quitman Street (old Hwy. U.S. 72) and is owned by Carrol Edd Sanders, Bowen said.

The officers confiscated over 300 pornography and homosexual magazines

during the raid, along with three video poker machines and other evidence said police officer, Bobby Flynt.

No arrests have been made in the case thus far. Results of the raid and follow up investigation will be turned over to the U.S. Attorney's office, Bowen said.

Report To The People By Parents For Quality Ed.

By Parents for Quality Education

As many of you are already aware there has been a lot of controversy concerning the Iuka School System lately. This report is to bring you up to date on what has been happening over the last few months. It began early this year with a debate on education sponsored by the Iuka Chamber of Commerce. This was followed shortly by a public meeting at which a group of approximately 100 citizens expressed a great deal of dissatisfaction with the present situation of the school in general and with the present Superintendent of

Education in particular. About the same time another group also started a petition calling for the replacement of Dr. Stone. The result has been that a single group calling itself "Parents for Quality Education" has been formed. Several meetings of this group have brought about the following results. We met with both the Board of Aldermen and the School Board to let them know of our dissatisfaction with the way the school system is presently being run, and with the way Dr. Stone has performed his duties as Superintendent of Education for the last 12 years. We also let them know of our determination to bring about some changes.

The School Board has been presented with a list of 17 questions that they apparently have gotten the answers to and will be giving to us shortly. A petition with over 400 signatures has been filed with the School Board asking for the removal of Dr. Stone from his current position. Official complaints have been lodged with the Equal Employment Opportunity Com-

mission and the State Ethics Commission. Additional complaints will be filed with the State Auditor's Department and the State Board of Education. A law suit will be filed shortly asking for a change in the selection method of the School Board members, since the present method seems to be a case of taxation without representation for those people in the school system but outside of the city.

With most of the complaints and legal parts of our endeavor now either accomplished or in the hands of the appropriate agencies, we now hope to turn most of our attention and efforts to making positive suggestions and changes in the school system. Positive action can only be taken if there is a large show of community support for the ideas that will be presented. This is your school system and these are your children. We therefore request that you show your interest and willingness to give both of them a better future by being at the next School Board meeting.

Chatting With Your Home Economist

"GARDENS - 1989"

With the spring weather in Tishomingo County, gardening is beginning to move into full swing. More vegetable seeds and plants are put in gardens during these two months than any other months of the year.

Soil preparation before planting directly affects gar-

den success. Soils high in clay when worked wet and allowed to dry form clods that may remain throughout the gardening season. Hard clods make good seedbed preparation impossible and result in poor stands of vegetables having small seeds. Clods interfere with the laying of plastic mulches for weed control as well as the application and effectiveness of chemicals for weed control.

Fertilization of the garden site without benefit of fertilizer recommendations based on soil test results is risky business. Old garden sites generally are overfertilized and underlimed.

Fertilizer that comes into direct contact with seeds and transplant roots injures the germination seeds and plant roots. To prevent this type of damage, broadcast recommended fertilizers on the row and mix them in during soil preparation.

Organic matter improves garden soils but undercomposted organic matter, such as noncomposted animal manures, freshly turned winter cover crops, and leaves, interfere with preparation of good seedbeds.

Black plastic mulch applied to well-prepared soils can raise by several degrees the soil temperature underneath the plastic. This permits earlier than normal planting as the warm soil hastens seed germination and stimulates early root growth. Black plastic mulch is recommended for tomato, eggplant, pepper, melon, cucumber, and squash transplants as well as seeds of okra, squash, cucumber, and melons.

Sweet corn is available as normal, sugary enhanced, and super sweet. Look for the identity of type on the seed packets and in variety descriptions. Normal sweets (Merit, Silver Queen) and sugary enhanced (Tender Treat, Miracle) are treated the same and may be planted early as they are tolerant of cool soils (50-60 degrees). Super sweet seed requires warm soil (70-85 degrees for good germination. Late-planted sweet corn is subject to heavy insect damage.

Lima beans, southern peas, squash, cucumbers, melons,

and okra seeds require warm soils for food germination. Tan and colored snap bean seeds are more tolerant of cool soils than white snap bean seeds.

For Good Friday gardeners, Good Friday is March 24, one week earlier than in 1988. Be cautious about planting warm-season vegetables too early in north Mississippi.

Thin vegetable seedlings to the proper spacing while the seedlings are small. Radishes mature in 28 days, so delayed thinning can result in failure of the roots to enlarge.

Frost damage to Irish potatoes appears as wilting. Freeze damage turns the plants black. Damaged Irish potatoes generally resprout but a reduction in yield may occur.

Sweet potatoes are tropical plants. Do not set plants until air and soils are warm and night temperatures remain at 60 degrees or higher. Pull flower buds from garlic plants and use onions that develop a flower bud as salad onions.

Sprinkle dill seed where the plants are to grow. Do this early; the seeds germinate when the conditions are right. Dill plants grown in cups or plastic trays can be transplanted, but dill seedlings dug from the garden are sometimes difficult to transplant successfully.

Watch leafy greens and other vegetables for aphid buildup in cool weather. Use recommended insecticides before aphid populations get out of hand. Early control eliminates problems of greens maturing before the required time interval between insecticide application and harvest.

Watch beans for bean leaf beetles and squash, melons, and cucumber beetles and squash bugs. Insect-damaged seedlings develop slowly, resulting in yield reductions.

County Agent's Notes

SOYBEAN PRODUCTION MEETING

A Soybean Production Meeting has been scheduled to provide Tishomingo County farmers the most up to date information on producing soybeans in 1989.

Dr. Nathan McKinney, Extension Soybean Specialist from MSU will be presenting the program on "Producing the 1989 Soybean Crop".

Also Danny Mears will discuss "The Use of Chemicals to Control Soybean Pests". All soybean producers are invited to this meeting.

SOIL INSECTS
Homeowners in Tishomingo County should have their spring garden spots cleared. After removing trash and other debris, turn under soil to expose insects to predators and weather.

If you expect soil insects to be a serious problem in your garden, treat garden soil with diazinon applications before planting. Follow label recommendations.

The sooner you treat garden spots the fewer insects you will find when you start

SOYBEAN PLANTING TIME
As we approach soybean planting season in Tishomingo County we find it's helpful to review a few recommendations. This advice is based on years of careful research by agronomists at Mississippi State University.

The best planting dates for north Mississippi are May 1 to June 10. These dates insure the best opportunity for high yields in most circumstances. Many of our producers had good yields with a late June planting date in 1988, but May and early June are still optimum times to plant.

FIRE SAFETY
Fire takes a serious toll of lives and property each year in the United States. The loss of farm property is estimated at \$250 million annually.

Rural and farm families are more endangered than other people because many of the communities where these families live don't have a fire department nearby or available water to pump.

It is critical for farmers to prevent fires whenever they can. Farm families also need to know how to put out fires in their early stages. Every farm shop in Tishomingo County should be equipped to handle emergencies, the most common being personal injury and fire.

Your best protection against fire is prevention. If a fire should start, don't panic. Assess the situation, and take immediate action.

A good measure of preparedness for fires around farm buildings is a water faucet with an attached hose long enough to reach most of the building. If running water is not available, keep a 55-gallon drum full of water near the building. Submerge two or more buckets inside the drum.

Keep fire extinguishers of the right type available too. Make sure they are charged and in good condition.

THE FLOATING CONTACT

A layer of tears is the only barrier between your eyes and firm contact lenses...that's just the natural moisture of the eyes; doing what nature intended, keeping your eyes moist. The job of your optometrist is to design a contact lens, made to match the contours of your cornea (the window of the eye), so that it floats on this moist layer of tears. The tears supply oxygen to the corneal tissue. Every time you blink, a fresh supply of tears flows through.

Contact lenses have to be precisely fitted, so they will be both comfortable and healthy for your eyes; also, the prescription for vision

correction has to be accurate to give your eyes the help they need.

After your contacts are fitted, your optometrist will have you return at regular intervals. This "after-care" is actually more important than the fitting, as the optometrist wants to make sure that the lenses are comfortable and not causing any problems.

If you have to miss a scheduled appointment, be sure to call and make another. Don't gamble with your eyes.

When Partial Does It

Q. When someone loses several teeth, how can they be replaced?

A. One very common method is to create a removable partial denture. Such dentures provide natural-looking teeth in a single unit that is easily inserted or removed from the mouth. Metal clasps on some of these dentures attach them securely to adjoining teeth. Other dentures are held in place by what are called precision attachments.

In each case, the removable partial denture is one of a kind, custom-made to fit the individual's mouth. Aside from improving appearance by eliminating gaps in one's teeth, the removable partial denture helps to maintain the remaining natural teeth. It eliminates the need to chew on one side that is common when teeth are missing - something that can lead to problems with gums and other mouth tissues. A partial denture also helps to keep natural teeth from tipping or drifting.

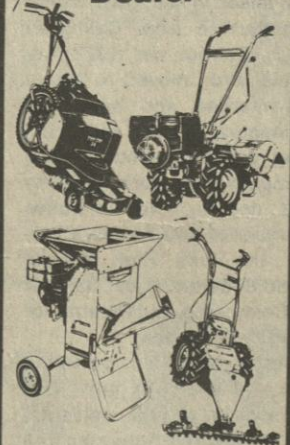

Recently some of our city officers stood up for family values and protection by confiscating pornographic books and magazines from a local convenience store. Several need to be highly commended: Rick Cornelson, Bobby Flynn, Benny Parrish, and Randy Stringer. Also our city attorney Richard Bowen was extremely helpful in the decision and the action taken. Others may have been involved for we have many good officers.

Not only our city is aware of the harmful affects of pornography, but also our county law enforcement officials. Thanks to our local sheriff Richard Dobbs, a video owner was arrested and above 150 pornographic tapes were confiscated. Obscene video tapes are inexpensive to buy and rent, but they take their toll in broken homes and molestations. Deputies Mike Higgenbottom and Timothy Robinson spearheaded this investigation.

Because some have misconstrued our freedoms to include such material, thousands of innocent people have been victimized and millions have been harmed. Ms. Alma J. Hopper, Iuka, MS, will be honored as an outstanding volunteer when she attends the seventh annual 4-H Salute to Excellence, March 18-25, 1989 at the National 4-H Center, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

Cannon Exhibit At Shiloh

At the Battle of Shiloh in April 1862, artillery played an extremely important role in the battle tactics of both the Federal and the Confederate armies. Fortunately, many Civil War cannons are still in existence on the nation's battlefield parks. Shiloh National Military Park has taken three very unique cannon tubes off the battlefield and has incorporated them into an exciting new exhibit which will be open to the public on April 8, 1989, at the Visitor Center Museum. These three cannon display rare and interesting inscriptions placed on the weapons by the soldiers themselves. One of the cannon, a 12 pounder howitzer

which was actually taken at the Battle of Shiloh, is inscribed "Taken and Retaken at Shiloh, April 6, 1862". Another reveals that the weapon was captured at Corinth, Mississippi. And the third shows that the piece was made especially for South Carolina artillerymen.

All three of the cannon had been on display on the battlefield grounds for approximately the last eighty years. In making this announcement, Park Superintendent Zeb V. McKinney said, "By bringing these cannon into the museum we will be able to conserve and protect their valuable inscriptions, and help tell the story of the Battle of Shiloh".

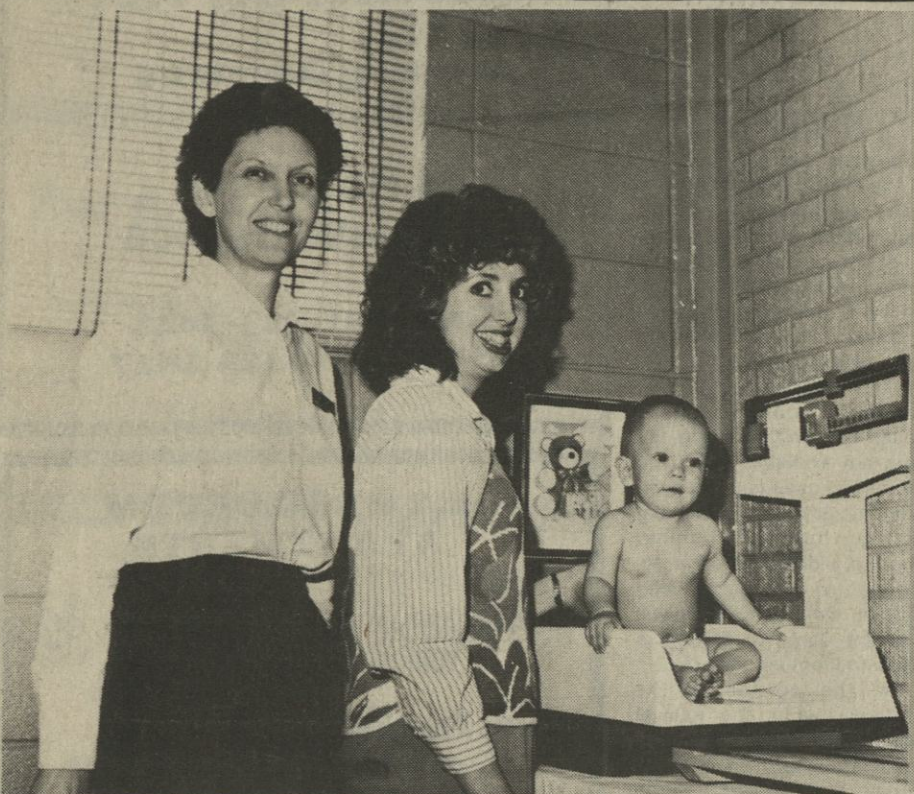


Girl Scouts Sponsor Girl

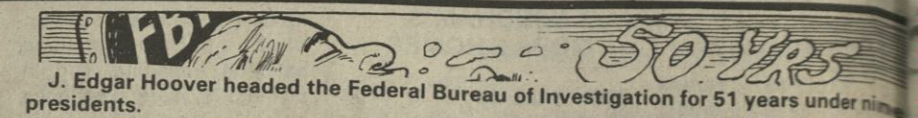
Balloon Release At B.H.S.
