Funeral Services Held For Cecil H. Gann

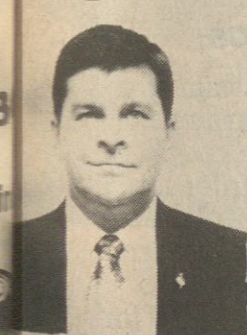

Bethel Cemetery Hit By Vandals

Four juveniles have been arrested in connection with the vandalism of Bethel Cemetery near Iuka. According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Richard Dobbs, several other arrests could possibly be made in the case. The youth have been charged with vandalism. Chief Deputy Mike Higginbottom worked hard following the discovery of the damaged cemetery, leading to the arrests made. It is believed the vandalism was nothing more than a cruel Halloween prank.

The destruction of the cemetery was discovered Friday evening, November 3, by Mr. and Mrs. Duck South. The grave of Mr. South's mother had been "half dug into". Some 22 tombstones were turned over, some completely destroyed and signs of digging were found throughout the cemetery.

Bethel Church is in a fairly secluded spot and had not been used for regular services since 1973. The cemetery, located behind the church, contains both old and new burial plots. The infant child of E. L. Bumpass was the first recorded burial in 1851. The vandals destroyed both new and old stones.

Bethel Methodist Episcopal Church South, as it was first known, was built on four acres of land bought for \$11.80 from T. J. "Jeff" Moser by the trustees, R. C. Bumpass, I. Canfield, L.P. Bonds and J.A. Moser. Today the church building is still used for funerals and the adjoining cemetery is used by many families in the area.

H. O. Carter Awarded Bronze Star



H.O. Carter of Iuka was recently awarded the Bronze Star Medal by the U.S. Government forty-four years after his service in World War II. This medal for valor, given for heroic or meritorious service, was awarded for his actions under General George S. Patton, Jr. in Tunisia.

Mr. Carter is the holder of several other decorations in-

cluding eight Battle Stars and the French Croix de Guerre which was awarded to his entire unit while they were attached to the French 12th army group. It is the highest award given to an American soldier by a foreign government.

The disabled veteran took part in four invasions. His unit made the invasion of

North Africa and two in Sicily and Italy. He has almost three years overseas and over two hundred actual combat days.

Mr. Carter served with the 2nd Armored (Hell on Wheels) Division with the 504th Combat Military Police Battalion and the 755th Tank Battalion. His unit was one of the first to enter the city of Rome on the morning it fell and later was declared an open city. The unit then moved out of Rome and on up to the Arno River in Northern Italy. There Carter served under General Mark W. Clark, commander of the 5th Army. When they reached the Arno River the soldiers were sent home on the point system. General Mark W. Clark told them as they departed for home "Thank you for a job well done".

question is asked in all seriousness. Most of us don't have an answer, even after we're out of high school. A career choice is a massive decision.

In the 4-H Career Exploration project, 4-H members are given some practical career possibilities related to their skills and personality, and to a realistic look at job positions. Since we're all individuals we each have traits and experiences and strengths of our own that others may not see. You may not even see them yourself. That's why it's important to analyze yourself. By doing so, you can discover what makes you special and what is likely to help you enjoy your career.

We all have positive and negative traits that make up our personality. When we consider a career, our traits influence our choices. For example, a curious person may enjoy research, while an outgoing person may want a career that deals with the public. Sometimes we may want to get rid of a few traits we're not proud of. Write these down along with things you could do to overcome these things. There may also be traits you would like to have. Write these down on a separate list and think about a career you might choose if you develop these traits.

Next in selecting a career, think about what's really important to you. What do you value more than anything else in life? List your values in order of importance. These may be things like independence, self-respect or courage. Think about careers that might best allow you to have what you value most.

Another step to take towards a career decision is to list your likes and dislikes. What subjects do you like best in school? What is your favorite after school activity? Do you like to read or to use your hands to make things. What are your favorite hobbies? Think about careers that are suited to these likes of yours.

Now let's look at your skills. Think of an experience you're more proud of than any other. List every skill you used to accomplish this goal or deed you're proud of. Have others to add to your list. Finally list skills you think you have. Some careers use certain skills more than others. Look at the skill area you seem to be strong in and list careers which require those skills.

As you can imagine there are thousands of career possibilities. The process of choosing a career best suited to you is confusing. Some experts say people enter careers by chance. Others believe that career choice is a long process that takes place over 8-10 years. A young person makes a series of decisions over time which gradually narrow the number of career choices. Still some people feel your self-concept or how you think of yourself affects your career choice. No matter which expert you choose to believe, one thing you need to accept is that the better you understand yourself the better job you'll do in making a career decision.

Timberline

Got a source for your winter supply of fuelwood yet?

Well, if you are among that group of hardy folks who will be cutting and gathering your own this year, I hope you'll read on in our column this week. We've got a few suggestions to pass along:

Whether you'll be cutting on your own land or, by permission, on someone else's property, here are some guidelines you'll want to keep

in mind:

1.) Don't cut straight, vigorously growing trees that have (or will have) far greater market value for some use other than fuelwood.

2.) Look for sound (standing or down) dead trees first.

3.) Diseased, insect-killed or badly fire scarred trees should be cut next.

4.) Tops from logging operations; weed species; trees that are very crooked and trees of poor shape and quality that are competing with better trees for light, water and nutrients should also receive high priority for cutting into fuelwood.

5.) Fallen limbs, pasture trees (leave a few for shade), and unwanted fence-line trees can also be converted to stove or fireplace wood.

6.) Leave trees that are serving as dens for wildlife. Cut them only as a last resort.

If you'll use these guidelines you'll be helping make the woods more productive as you satisfy your need for fuelwood. If the land is your own, you've done yourself a favor. If it belongs to someone else you've benefitted them -- and if you show them you are such a careful and caring user, they'll probably be glad to let you get your fuelwood there next year and for years to come!

One final thing: Here are a few measurement facts that might be helpful:

It takes about 170 hardwood trees averaging 2 inches in diameter at breast

height (d.b.h.) to make up a cord of fuelwood.

About 50 trees with an average d.b.h. of 4 inches will make a standard (128 cu.ft.) cord.

Only three (3) trees that are 14 inches in d.b.h. will be needed to produce a cord of stacked fuelwood.

Just 2.2 trees make you a cord of wood. average 16 inches in diameter. Need a brock "Buying and Firewood" or Chainsaw Safety?

Chatting With Your Home Economist

SWEATER SELECTION
Sweater weather has arrived so it's time to open the cedar chest, get out your old favorites and maybe purchase a couple of new sweaters for the season.

Sweaters are made from a wide variety of fibers. Some of the most popular fibers are polyester, acrylic, nylon, cotton, wool, mohair, angora and cashmere. The last four are the warmer fibers.

Natural fibers (cotton, wool and the specialty fibers -- mohair, angora and cashmere) are comfortable to wear. They resist wrinkling and absorb moisture. The absorbency will lengthen the drying time.

Unfortunately, the weight of these natural fibers may cause stretching when they are wet and during wear. Keeping the sweater in its original shape may be further complicated because natural fibers may shrink when washed.

To maintain their original shape, outline new sweaters on a large sheet of paper. After hand-washing the sweater, block and fabric back to the original shape using the outline to minimize

shape changes.

While all natural fibers require a certain amount of insect protection, wools are generally more susceptible to insect damage.

Man-made fibers (acrylic, polyester and nylon) are lightweight, yet warm. They may pill from abrasion and may have static electricity. Most are easy to wash, dry quickly, need no blocking and resist insects.

Natural and man-made fibers are sometimes used in blends. A blend combines the strength, shape retention and easy care of man-made fibers with the durability, absorbency and luxuriousness of natural fibers.

When purchasing new sweaters look closely at the knit. Knit fabrics have grain just as wovens. With a closer look, vertical and horizontal directions are easy to see. In knits vertical grain is called wales. Horizontal grains are called courses.

Check the knit fabric carefully. Was it cut on grain? Is it a close firm knit? Is the ribbing firm? Does the ribbon spring back to shape quickly after being stretched? A close firm knit will hold shape better and keep it elasticity longer than will loose knits.

Also look carefully at construction details and notice the following.

*A double thickness at the neckline will resist stretching out of shape more than a

single thickness.

*A knitted band or grosgrain ribbon may be used to finish the edge. Ribbon is less bulky, prevents stretching and is stronger but it may not have been preshrunk. The knitted band matches the sweater and requires the same care but is bulkier.

*Any trim used should either require the same care as the sweater or be detachable.

*Buttonholes should follow a wale or a course. Be sure the stitches are even and close together. Vertical buttonholes come unfastened easily.

*Check buttons to see if they are smooth and securely sewn. Usually an extra button and yarn is included with the sweater.

*Wrist seams should be on the outside of the sweater if it has turned back cuffs.

*Last, but not least, check the sweater for fitting points. The neckline should fit snug and lie flat. Shoulder seams should be droop. Armholes should be comfortable when you move. The fit should be roomy unless specially designed to fit snugly. There

should be no gaping between buttons when sweater is closed. The top and bottom openings should be even. Zippers should lie flat and ribbing should fit snugly.

SWEET TATER PUFFS
2 cups mashed cooked sweet potatoes
1/2 teaspoon salt
Dash of black pepper
1 egg, beaten
8 marshmallows
1/2 cup crushed cornflakes
Oil

Put sweet potatoes in bowl, add salt and pepper; add beaten eggs. If mixture is too dry add a little milk, just enough to keep it dry enough to handle. Form into 8 balls with a large marshmallow inside each. Roll in crushed cornflakes. Deep fry to hot oil until brown. Drain on paper towels. Serve while warm. Yield: 6-8 servings.

Fluoride Works

Q. What is fluoride and how does it affect the teeth?

A. Fluoride is a mineral that strengthens tooth enamel. The American Dental Association cites studies of communities with low rates of tooth decay which found that fluoride was naturally present at certain levels in their drinking water. Today, public water supplies serving more than half of the United States population are fluoridated to a level of one part fluoride to a million parts of water. According to the ADA, children who, from birth, drink water containing sufficient fluoride, have been shown to have 50 to 65 percent fewer cavities than others.

With or without fluoridated water, it's a good practice to make daily use of toothpastes and mouth rinses containing fluoride. For people who need additional fluoride protection or whose water is not fluoridated, the dentist may apply a fluoride gel or solution to the teeth or prescribe fluoride tablets or drops.

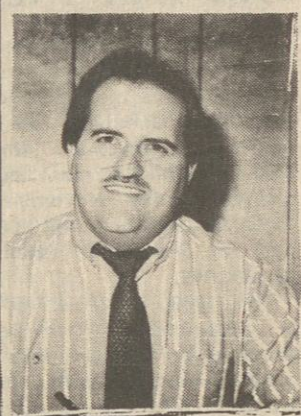

The carousel originated in Europe (actually the concept can be traced to the Byzantine era, about 500 A.D.) and the name comes from the Italian word meaning "Little War". Many craftsmen immigrated to America in the mid-1800's, set up shops, and began carving carousel horses and other animals from

wood. Apple, poplar, and basswood were used to create the beautiful animals with intricately carved saddles and trappings. Private collectors now have many of the original individual animals and carousels; some are in museums, and some are still operating in parks. We in Mississippi can be proud of the antique carousel in Meridian which is still operating. It was manufactured by Gustav Dentzel in the late 1890's and installed in Highland Park in Meridian in 1909. It is one of only four existing carousels of its type

created by Dentzel, and has been placed on the U.S. Department of the Interiors Register of Historic Places. This carousel has 28 magnificent animals: horse, giraffes, a lion, tiger, deer and also two sleighs. The details of these animals are impressive and a wonderful example of the talented craftsmen who created these American treasures. On display during the month of November is a collection of miniature carousel horses that belong to Mrs. Beth Stahl of Iuka. Fredda Sanderson invites you to visit the library to see the beautiful collection.

ASCS Farm News

HEADLINE NEARING

Producers who are not actively applying an approved Conservation Plan of operations (CPO) on their farm by January 1, 1990, and then plant a crop on the land after that date, may be in violation of the (HELC) Highly Erodible Land Conservation Provisions of the Food and Security Act of 1985 and as a result may be ineligible for any U.S. department of Agriculture benefits, including FmHA payments, CRP Conservation Reserve Program payments, (ACP) Agricultural Conservation Program cost share payments, Price Support loan payments, Feed Grain program payments, etc. If you have highly erodible

land and do not have an approved CPO for your entire farm or if you have some questions about whether you are actively applying a CRP that you may have, you should immediately contact your local ASCS or SCS office.

Please remember before planting a field that has been in pasture, trees or idle for several years to first contact the ASCS or SCS office to make sure the field is eligible to be planted and would not be in violation of the 1985 Food Security Act.

1990 FARM PROGRAMS
The 1990 sign-up for cotton, feed grain, oats, and wheat will begin January 16, 1990 and run through April 13, 1990.

1990 WHEAT PROGRAM
Farmers who participate in the 1990 wheat program will have the optional 5% acreage reduction or the modified

acreage reduction program which allows them to increase their wheat planting and still participate. Farmers who elect to modify their wheat contract may plant more than 95% but not more than 105% of their 1990 farm wheat base.

1990 OATS PROGRAM
There is a 5 percent acreage reduction program for oats. The ACR requirement is 5.26 percent. **NO FINAL PAYMENTS FOR 1988-CROP CORN AND GRAIN SORGHUM - REFUND DUE**

No final payments will be made for 1988 crop Corn and Grain Sorghum under the price support and production program because the 12-month national weighted average market prices exceed the basic loan rates. The national average market prices per bushel received by producers from September

Schools Host Parents Night

Eleven Mississippi schools will receive courses by satellite from the Satellite National Resources Consortium (SERC) will host a "Parents Night" on Monday, November 14.

The 11 schools are Canton School, Collins High School, Forest High School, Hurst High School, Iuka High School, Iuka School, Newton High

School, North Forrest High School in Hattiesburg, Puckett High School, Rolling Fork High School and Simmons Attendance Center in Hollandale.

Parents Night will give the parents of students taking SERC classes the opportunity to learn about satellite instruction and to take part in a demonstration of a live, interactive SERC class.

The Parents Night teleconference will be one hour in length and will feature a short overview of SERC followed by

live segments with the teachers of the SERC first-semester high school courses: Japanese I, Russian I, Advanced Placement Economics, and Probability and Statistics. Toward the end of the program, parents and others in the audience will have an opportunity to observe how the interaction works between the classes and the SERC instructors.

Students at 12 schools in Mississippi are taking courses by satellite from SERC during this school year. SERC

(pronounced SER-SEE) is an organization, organized in July 1988, of 19 state members and four associate members. The 19 state members are composed of state departments of education and state ETV networks, including the State Department of Education and Mississippi ETV.

SERC represents an organized effort to provide certain courses to certain schools that show a particular need for these courses but cannot provide them on their own. What is unique about this project is the fact that the courses are transmitted by satellite directly to the schools, which are equipped with satellite receiving equipment to pick up the course and with telephone and computer equipment for the students to use to interact with the video teachers. These courses are not "broadcast" by way of a television station or network, but instead are transmitted live from where the courses are originating directly to the satellite and then to the schools and their classrooms.

SERC serves as a "coordinator" or "administrator" for the entire project—assuming a variety of responsibilities, such as providing and distributing the programming, determining

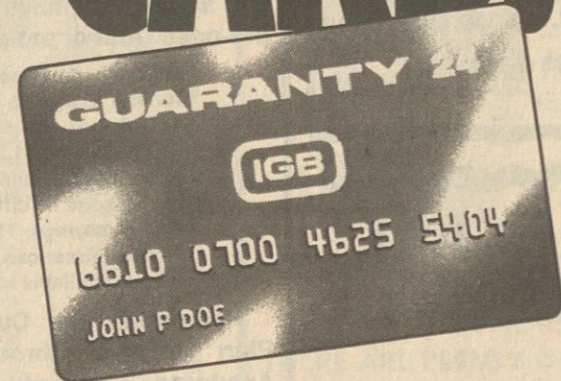

Stress Line

Stress Epidemic Sweeps USA

Dear Dr. Morris:

Could you tell me how stress and arthritis are connected?

(identity withheld by request)

RESPONSE:

Rheumatoid arthritis is the most feared and widespread

type of this disorder. It usually starts in young adulthood, striking three times as many women as men.

Although the causes of rheumatoid arthritis are not clearly understood, heredity and environmental influences seem to play roles. In addition, recent research points to emotional/mental stress as a major contributing factor both the onset and progress of this disorder.

One current theory is that the body literally turns on itself in what amounts to a breakdown of the immune

system. Stress may play a role in the malfunction of this system. Stress appears to affect certain mechanisms in the brain which in turn upset the body's normal level of corticoid, an anti-inflammatory agent secreted by the adrenals. Cortisone, a chemical relative of corticoid, is used to slow down the self-destructive process, preventing the body from harming itself.

Stress and arthritic attacks seem to go hand in hand in those cases where a complete disease history has been available for the patient.

This suggests that attention in stress reduction can be alleviated perhaps the increased doses of corticoid be curtailed and the effects avoided. The stress in arthritis does not seem to be explored more
