Frank A. Russell Announces Candidacy For Re-election



Frank A. Russell, 45, officially announces his candidacy for re-election as circuit judge of the First Circuit Judicial District of the State of Mississippi.

Russell is a graduate of Tupelo High School, Mississippi State University and the University of Mississippi School of Law.

A Methodist, Russell is married and the father of six children, ages through 21.

He was admitted to practice law in 1970 and practiced in the general field of law for 14 years.

Before his appointment as circuit judge by Governor Bill Allain in May 1984, Russell served 14 years as attorney for the City of Fulton, was twice elected as Itawamba County's prosecuting attorney and served as the attorney for the Itawamba County Board of Supervisors.

Judge Russell issues the following statement:

"It has been indeed an honor and educational experience to have served as your circuit judge for the past six years," Russell said. "I have attempted to carry out the duties of this important position by treating all folks equally and by attempting to administer justice in a fair and equitable manner."

"Being the father of six children,

I am very concerned about the problems facing our young people such as child abuse, drugs and other crimes that have a direct bearing upon them.

"Our most crucial problem facing this state and nation is the drug problem. Drugs are directly or indirectly involved in nine out of every 10 cases that come before the court."

"We must take steps to educate people in the war against drugs, and we must look for effective methods of working with these offenders in addition to incarceration."

"Our judicial system is one of the most crucial branches of government and if it fails, society fails. Our judicial system has a direct bearing on the quality of life that each of us enjoy, and its effective administration guarantees the freedoms and liberties that we so often take for granted."

"Another major concern of mine is the rights or lack of rights for the victims of crimes."

"I am concerned that each person who is guilty be convicted; however, the trial must be conducted in a fair manner affording the accused all rights guaranteed by the constitution. I am equally concerned and will continue to insure that the victim's interest be taken into account in the course of the proceedings, especially during sentencing," Russell said.

Russell strongly supports restitution centers and the regimented inmate discipline program.

"I will continue to use the restitution centers we have in this state to place those who commit crimes where they may be employed and have the ability to make restitution to the victims," he said.

"I will also continue to utilize the regimented inmate discipline program where youthful offenders receive boot camp type training for discipline and also receive counseling for drug and alcohol abuse and other types of helpful psychological counseling."

Russell sincerely asks for your vote and support in the June 5 election.

Scott Paper Company Public Hearing

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) will hold a public hearing on Monday, May 21, 1990, 7 p.m. (CDT), at Pickwick Landing State Park Inn, Pickwick Dam, Tennessee.

The purpose of this hearing is to provide an opportunity for the public to comment on a request, by Scott Paper Company, for a permit to construct and operate a wood loading facility at Mile 3.4, left bank, Yellow Creek (Pickwick Lake) (Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway Mile 447.4, right bank) in Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

The public is invited to present their views, opinions, and information related to the proposed facility. All comments will be considered in evaluating the proposal. Written comments may be submitted at the hearing or sent to the address below until 10 days after the public hearing.

NASA Awards Lockheed Contract To Develop Solid Rocket Motor

HUNTSVILLE, ALABAMA -- NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center awarded a definitive contract late last Friday to Lockheed Missiles & Space Company to design, develop, test and evaluate the space shuttle advanced solid rocket motor (ASRM).

The new shuttle motor will be phased in during the mid-1990's as a replacement for the current redesigned solid rocket motor. It will provide improved safety, reliability and performance for the shuttle flight program well into the 21st century.

The value of the basic contract is \$971 million and calls for production of 20 of the new rocket motors -- one as a nonflying, form-and-fit "pathfinder," seven for ground test-firing and qualification, and 12 (six flight sets) for shuttle launches.

A contract option, totalling up to \$1.388 billion, would call for production of up to 88 additional motors (44 flight sets).

A companion contract for consolidated facilities is expected to be awarded in the near future. This contract provides \$292 million for construction of facilities, plus an additional \$236 million to provide for purchase and installation of tooling and equipment for ASRM production. Major facilities to be built at Yellow Creek will be for production of motor segments, nozzles, and associated hardware, at a rate of up to 30 motors per year.

The development schedule calls for delivery of the first flight set of motors in 1995. NASA plans to phase in the ASRM hardware over approximately a three-year period.

Lockheed, of Sunnyvale, California, will be the prime contractor and systems engineer/integrator for the

project. Aerojet Space Boosters Co. of Sacramento, Calif., is Lockheed's principal subcontractor for development of the motor, and RUST International of Birmingham, AL, is the construction contractor.

Preliminary design efforts on the project have been underway since December 1989 under interim contracts between NASA and Lockheed -- one for hardware and the other for facilities design activities.

In terms of performance, the new motor is intended to provide the shuttle with a capability to lift heavier payloads into orbit, with a design goal of a 12,000 pound increase over current payload delivery performance.

"The ASRMs will let our space shuttles lift the heavier cargoes needed to build the Space Station Freedom. The space station is planned as the base for human exploration of our galaxy," said Howard Trudeau, Lockheed vice president for ASRM.

Specialized facilities also to be constructed are a nozzle manufacturing area at NASA's Michoud Assembly near New Orleans, and a static test-firing stand at NASA's John C. Stennis Space Center near Bay St. Louis.

The ASRM team's other subcontractors are Babcock & Wilcox of New Orleans, which will manufacture the ASRM's steel casings in Mt. Vernon, Indiana, and Thiokol Corp. of Brigham City, Utah, which will produce nozzles at NASA's Michoud plant.

Signing of the contract between NASA and Lockheed concludes the process of definition, or spelling out in detail the types of work the contractor is required to perform, as well as the resources necessary to

accomplish the job as specified.

Lockheed was selected after an exhaustive review of the technical, management and cost proposals received in response to NASA's August 1988 request for proposals.

Aerojet will begin ASRM manufacture at Yellow Creek in 1992 using a computer-automated, continuous mix process that minimizes personnel exposure and maximizes propellant consistency.

Propellant ingredients are automatically added as they flow horizontally through a pipe and are mixed by a worm gear. Sensors in the flow continuously monitor quality and consistency.

The propellant is piped directly into steel motor casings set in deep pits in the ground -- a safer procedure than using the traditional bowl-shaped vertical batch mixer that must be moved by vehicle and tilted to pour its propellant into the motor casings.

Once completed, the ASRMs will be barged down inland waters to the Gulf of Mexico then to the shuttle launchport in Florida. When propellant is expended soon after liftoff, the casings will be dropped into the sea, retrieved, and refurbished at Yellow Creek.

Each three-segmented ASRM will have better and far fewer joints than the current four-segmented motor. The ASRM is 126 feet long (150 feet with nozzles). It will pack more thrust because its diameter will increase from the current 146 inches to 150, adding 98,000 pounds of propellant per motor.

The Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville has management responsibility for the ASRM and will directly manage performance of the contract.

New Project Manager At NASA Welcomed With Reception In Iuka

A gathering of area citizens turned out last Wednesday night at the old Tishomingo County Courthouse to welcome Royce Mitchell, NASA's new project manager for the advanced solid rocket motor project.

At a reception sponsored by the Tishomingo County Development Foundation to honor Mitchell and bid farewell to Lowell Zoller, former ASRM manager, Mitchell said that his replacing Zoller was part of the process of moving from creating and design to actual production of the rockets.

A native of Florence, AL, Mitchell grew up in the Central Heights community, where he lives now. After the Challenger explosion, he was named manager of the space shuttle redesigned solid rocket motor project and moved to Brigham City, Utah for two years where intensive testing was performed to help correct the problems that caused the accident.

With the ASRM entering its production phase, it was only natural

that he be named manager of the ASRM to be manufactured at Yellow Creek, Mitchell said.

Zoller has been appointed assistant to the director of the Institutional and Program Support Directorate at Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville.

A graduate of Auburn with a degree in aeronautical engineering, Mitchell said he worried that he wouldn't have the opportunity to live and work in his hometown area.

"I love it here and I hope the people who move here will fall in love with the area also," he said.

Mitchell told the group he was a Sierra Club member "but not a radical member" and a preservationist. He said he would attend the first informational public hearing tonight in Iuka to discuss the permits required of the NASA facility and the application process.

As a welcome, Iuka Mayor David Nichols presented Mitchell with a key to the city.

Mack Loyd Wadkins, director of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation, presented plaques to Zoller and his administrative secretary Linda Mullins in appreciation for their work on the ASRM project.

Zoller told the group "your activities here can transform this entire area of the country." He unveiled a framed picture of the Challenger on its launch pad in a dense fog before one of its successful launches. He presented the picture to the Tishomingo County Development Foundation, urging those present to "keep your vision clearly focused on the future."

In addition, Zoller presented to the old courthouse a framed letter signed by President George Bush sending Bush's greetings and congratulations to the people of the Tri-State region on the April 10 groundbreaking and the construction and operation of the Yellow Creek plant.

Iuka Man Killed In One Vehicle Accident

An Iuka man was killed Sunday night in a one-car automobile accident in Booneville.

Tommy Gene Glover, 23, of Rt. 4, Box 465, Iuka, was dead at the scene, a spokesman for the Booneville Police Department said.

The accident occurred on Highway 45 south inside the Booneville city limits at approximately 10:58 p.m., the spokesman said. The victim's 1979 Mercury station wagon hit a bridge abutment and bounced across the highway. Glover was thrown from the vehicle on the impact, the police report said.

There were no other passengers in the car.

Services for Glover were held Wednesday at Memorial Funeral Home Chapel with the Rev. Frank Williamson officiating. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery in Tishomingo County.

He is survived by his mother, Linda

Keele Wren of Corinth; two brothers, William Linton and Randy Linton, both of Corinth; two sisters, Cora Ann Linton and Joy Linton, both of Corinth; and his grandmothers, Eunice Glover of Savannah, TN, and Mable Keele of Iuka.

FmHA's To Begin New Community Loan Program

The Farmers Home Administration is extending its guaranteed loans to community program projects, thereby expanding its lending ability, FmHA State Director, James B. Huff, Sr., said today.

Until now, all of FmHA's loans for water and sewer systems, fire stations, health clinics and other community facilities, have been direct loans from the agency to the borrower.

"With the addition of guaranteed loans, we can assist communities that are able to qualify for commercial loans with the support of an FmHA guarantee," Huff said.

Under this program, FmHA guarantees a loan made by a bank, savings and loan, insurance company,

Federal Land Bank or other qualified lender against a certain percentage of loss. Since the mid-1980's, guarantees have become the major component of FmHA's farm loan program, accounting for more than 50 percent of all farm loans.

The 1990 fiscal year appropriations bill authorizes \$74.5 million in guaranteed loans for water and waste disposal loans \$23.9 million for other community facilities on a national basis.

1. Visual Presentations help mem-

bers develop:

--Poise in speaking before a group.
--Self-confidence

2. Visual Presentations give members experience in teaching others.

3. Members can learn more about their selected subject and project. Visual presentation is a form of speech using visual aids. A visual presentation includes demonstrations and illustrated talks.

Illustration talks differ from demonstrations. An illustrated talk is not expected to end with a finished product. Emphasis is placed on

choice of visuals, skills of the individual in their use and their appropriateness in explaining the particular subject.

A demonstration is a visual presentation that goes step by step to show how to do something or how something works. How to bake cookies, repair a motor or splint a leg are examples of demonstrations.

The starting point is preparing a visual presentation is to select a subject that fits your interest, experience, knowledge and skills. You should plan your visual presentation on paper. Planning saves time and is the key to an effective presentation.

The primary purpose of visual aids such as posters and charts is to add interest and sparkle and help explain a point. Members should experiment to determine the type of visuals best suited to the topic - objects, posters, charts, cartoons, flannel boards, flip charts or something else. Use actual objects unless it cannot teach an effectively as some other visual.

Blood Pressure

Few hidden medical conditions can have such sudden and devastating results as hypertension, or high blood pressure. Untreated, it can damage the eyes or kidneys, and is the number one risk factor for fatal or incapacitating strokes. It is also one of the three major controllable risk factors for heart attacks (the others are smoking and high cholesterol).

Hypertension has been called the "silent killer," because there are usually no symptoms whatsoever, until it is too late.

Since May is High Blood Pressure Month, it is appropriate to point out the disturbing fact that more than one out of every four adults has high blood pressure. Of this huge group, forty percent are unaware they even have a problem.

The good news is that high blood

SAFE GLASSES

If you wear glasses and work in a job environment where extra protection is needed because of dust, noxious fumes, or other hazards, you may want to have the lenses checked more often by your eye doctor to make sure they are kept in good condition.

All glasses made today are shatter resistant because this is required by federal law. But they're not all the same. Some glass lenses are made from laminated glass, which tends to be somewhat thick and heavy, or from case-hardened glass that has been specially treated.

Others are made of plastic, which is becoming increasingly popular. It has the same protective qualities as safety glass but it is much lighter in weight. It is also more resistant to fogging. Plastic does have one disadvantage in that it scratches more easily than glass. However, you can avoid this by not laying plastic glasses down on their lenses or polishing them. Instead, wash them in cold water and pat them dry with cloth or tissue. When not wearing them, carry them in a case that has a soft lining.

Bone Mineral Content In Vegetarians

My best friend and her mother are vegetarians. Her mother has osteoporosis. Will my friend be likely to develop osteoporosis also because she is a vegetarian?

Osteoporosis is a major public health problem in the elderly, especially in postmenopausal white women. The tendency to develop this problem seems to be inherited. Bones lose mineral content and tend to break and crumble.

There is evidence that osteoporosis is more likely to occur in women who do not obtain adequate dietary calcium over long periods of time. Heavy exercise and use of estrogens after menopause may decrease osteoporosis risk. Some research has shown that eating meat may cause minerals to leave the bones. Therefore, it could be argued that vegetarians might have less osteoporosis than those who eat meat and vegetables.

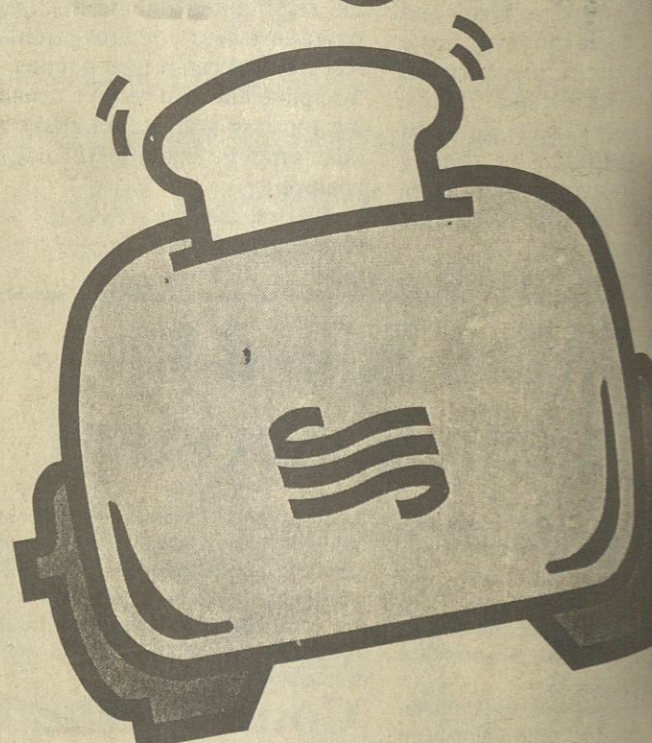
A study recently reported in *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition* indicated that there was no difference in bone mineral content of women who were vegetarians or meat eaters. In other words, as related to loss of minerals from the bone, the vegetarian diet was neither better nor worse than the diet which contained meat. It appears, therefore, that your friend is not at risk of developing osteoporosis because of her vegetarian diet.

Salmonella bacteria, a common cause of poisoning. Trichinella spiralis in pork and Anisakis larvae in fish can survive in under-cooked food to cause illness. She offered the following advice for safe cooking with the microwave oven:

Use only microwave - safe utensils.

Arrange meat pieces uniformly in covered dish.

Stir food and turn dish.

Observe standing time.

Check with a meat thermometer

Cook stuffing separately from poultry.

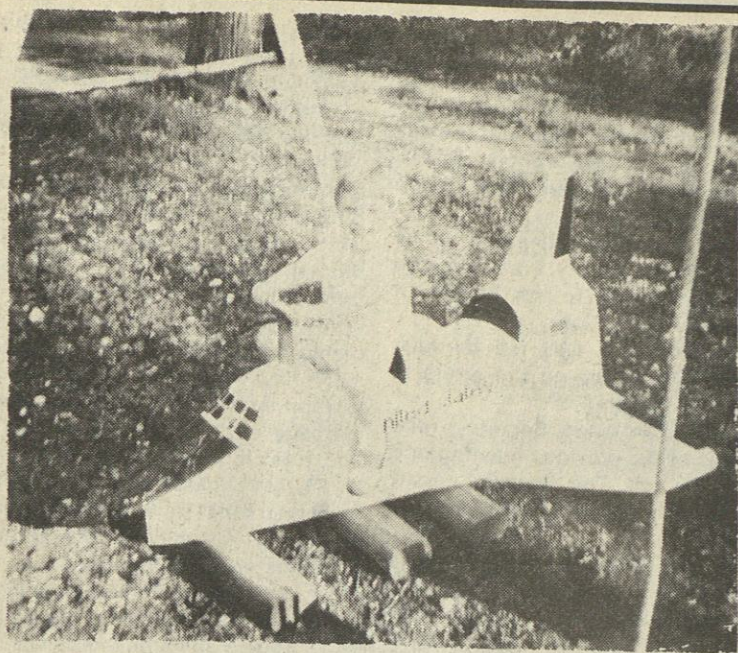

Local Man Runs In Boston Marathon

John Winston Thomas was having serious trouble walking because of an accident with a chain saw which left his left knee in a painful condition.

Thomas, project manager for an electric company in Memphis, will run his first Boston Marathon at age 56. It's something he always wanted to do.

Thomas, who has been a runner for about 10 years, was at home of his mother, Mrs. Maggie Thomas, in Iuka, in the Snowdown Community, last March clearing out some trees and brush.

The saw ripped into his knee. He staggered back to the house, tied a pressure compress with a towel and drove to the Iuka Hospital.

"They kind of put it back together the best they could," he said.

A friend drove him to a Memphis hospital where he underwent two hours of surgery. He was lucky the saw had glanced off the kneecap and didn't tear up anything that couldn't

be fixed.

For the remainder of spring, he hobbled. By summer when he first tried to run he would get over-balanced.

It was about the same time that he learned that qualifying standards for Boston had been relaxed slightly to attract a larger field.

The endurance to hand in for 26 miles doesn't happen overnight.

A friend got him interested in running nine or ten years ago, he said.

Always in the back of his mind there was Boston, even while recovering from the accident. Last summer he limped through several 5Ks and decided that the knee was improving. He decided to try to qualify for Boston in December at the First Tennessee Memphis Marathon.

Thomas finished in 3:32 and won his age group championship.

The fact that the times have been relaxed kind of dampened his enthusiasm, he said. "But, I'm not going to make any apologies for being up there. I've always felt like Boston puts you in a special category of runners -- in a class that's the goal everybody seeks," he said.

He was among about 30 Memphis

area runners who heard the cheers of thousands of New Englanders who use the Patriot's Day holiday to throw roadside parties and encourage the marathoners.

Thomas says he was nervous. He expected it to be an emotional experience, and he's right.

New Signs Along MS Highways

In place now at exit points from most welcome centers and rest areas are similar signs erected by the Highway Department which read "Buckle Up - We Care."

According to John R. Tabb, Highway Department director, the old signs will remain in place unless they happen to be in a location where a new sign is to go.

The new law dictates that all drivers and front seat passengers of passenger vehicles must wear a safety belt. This order excludes farm equipment, United States Postal Service employees or utility meter readers while on duty, and any operator of passenger who obtains a

written verification from a licensed physician that he is unable to wear a safety belt for medical reasons.

Head Lice: Prevention and Treatment

Head lice are tiny parasites - about the size of small ants. Lice have claws on each leg that allows them to cling to the skin and suck small amounts of blood from humans. Infestations of head lice are common among elementary-age school children. Head lice bites often produce redness, itching, and scratching for up to 24 hours after bites occur. Severe bites may result in crusting and oozing from the scalp and along the hair line.

Prescription and nonprescription medicines are available to help get rid of head lice. Prescription medicines include shampoos and cream rinses that are applied to the scalp for a few minutes and then rinsed away. Nonprescription shampoos should be applied a second time, 7 to 10 days after the first application. Some of the shampoo products come with a hair comb for removing lice eggs (nits) that may remain after shampooing.

Prevent head lice infestations by washing infected family member's clothes in hot water and drying clothes in a hot dryer for at least 20 minutes. Vacuum areas such as the backs of chairs and head rests that may come in contact with infected persons. Disinfect combs and hair brushes and periodically check children's hair for lice or eggs.

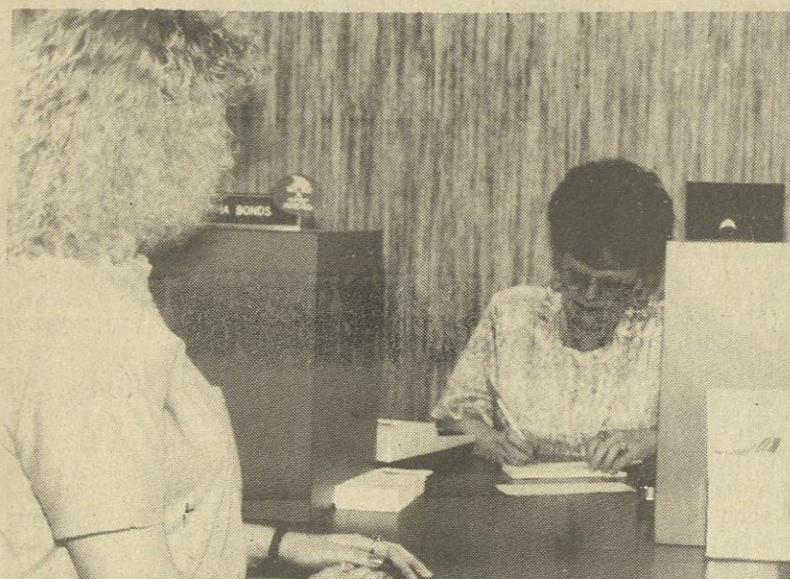
