Opinions Voiced At Environment Hearing demilitarization.

Area citizens and Gulf Coast residents were among those who voiced opinions at a public meeting

Thursday, May 17, in luka held by the state Bureau of Pollution Control. Expressing opposition to the

Members of the group warned that Northeast Mississippi area residents will be affected by toxic air contaminants resulting from the production of the rocket motors.

Group member D.C. Harvill, who lives near Stennis Space Center where the solid rocket motors are to be tested, said that the ASRM project was being opposed by NASA's own

safety council and that the plant would not be allowed to exist for the duration that NASA says it will.

In a statement, the environmental group said that the ASRM production would result in the production of approximately 1 million pounds of waste propellant per year, classified as hazardous waste, which NASA plans to burn at the luka facility.

"The toxic pollution from launches and static tests of solid rocket motors has damaged crops and personal property and killed fish and wildlife," the statement read. "Stratospheric emissions of hydrogen chloride and chlorine by solid rocket motors are contributing significantly to the destruction of the ozone layer." The group opposed open burning as the means of disposal of the waste and endorses an alternative called critical fluids

Royce Mitchell, NASA's solid

rocket motor project manager, defended the use of the solid rocket motor, which will offer more payload and demand fewer shuttle flights to accomplish missions.

"We will meet the environmental regulations, "Mitchell said. "If we can't, we won't continue with the project."

Charles Levinsky, project manager for Aerojet, explained the air quality permit and hazardous waste permit which will be required for the operation. The open burning of waste propellant will be the largest source of air emission at the NASA plant, he said.

Aerojet is the subcontractor in charge of design and production of the motor. Lockheed Missiles & Space Company is the prime contractor and systems engineer for the project which by 1995, will provide ASRMs to help launch America's space shuttles.

About 100 people attended the meeting held in the luka High School Auditorium. Several area residents expressed public comments in support of the rocket plant.

Bob Worsham, a Corinth businessman, said he had visited Lockheed and Aerojet facilities in California to answer questions in his mind about the environmental standards maintained there, and he noticed an abundance of wildlife living in harmony. Worsham also said that the fact that homes and property was being purchased near the facility told him how the safety professionals felt about the project.

Dr. Harry Cosby, retired luka physician, said he was in support of the NASA project and that it would be a good project if properly done.

An Alcorn County resident said that he was convinced that testing of the motors at the Stennis Center had not aroused the opposition of coastal residents "as we have been lead to believe." He also said that Aerojet had pleased the state of California and the Enviromental Projection Agency for 30 years. Tom Minga, who is retired from the Air Force Missile program, stood to voice his approval of the solid rocket motor, which is "very safe," he said. Minga lives three miles from the plant site and he is interested in the environment. Sam Mabry, in charge of the hazardous waste aspects of the project for the Bureau of Pollution Control, said that the hazardous waste permit would only be issued if the facility was designed and operated so that soil, surface water, groundwater, and air were protected. Levinsky said that all ASRM storage tanks at Yellow Creek will be above ground and will have secondary containment walls. Underground tanks inherited from the Tennessee Valley Authority will be removed in an environmentally safe manner, he said. The only water drawn from Pickwick Lake will be for the fire protection system, and holding ponds will prevent run-off back into the lake, Levinsky explained. Lockheed and Aerojet also intend to have an incinerator, which will be a thermal oxidizer, in effect, in operation before the start of ASRM production. The technology and equipment are being developed in a demonstration unit at Aerojet in Sacramento, and testing has already been approved by the Environmental Projection Agency. Clearance from the health department is now being awaited before the unit can be started up. Linda Campbell, who represented a toxics campaign, questioned the possibility of accidents at the plant, reading a newspaper article about such an explosion. Calling it a "dangerous business," Mitchell said that he didn't know of any rocket plant yet that had not experienced an accident.

Chancery Judge James L. Roberts, Jr., of Pontotoc is a candidate for reelection as one of three chancellors in the First Chancery Court District comprising Alcorn, Tishomingo, Union, Prentiss, Itawamba, Lee, Monroe and Pontotoc counties. The election will be held on June 5.

Judge Roberts was appointed to the chancellor's post by Gov. Bill Allain. He has served in this capacity since January 11, 1988, and received the largest majority of votes cast in last summer's special election. Formerly, he was Mississippi Commissioner of Public Safety, which included administering a state budget exceeding \$30 million with more than 900 members of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol and related law enforcement agencies.

He served 12 years as the Pontotoc County prosecuting attorney. He was engaged in law practice in Pontotoc from 1971 until 1984. He is a graduate of Millsaps College with a B.A. Degree; of Mississippi State University with a Master's Degree in Business Administration, and was graduated from the University of Mississippi Law School with a Juris Doctor Degree in 1971.

Judge Roberts earned numerous academic and scholastic honors in high school and college and has received professional recognition through local, district, state and national bar association membership. He is a graduate of the General Jurisdiction Course at the National Judicial College in Reno, Nevada, a requirement now for any new judge.

"I ask the voters of the First Chancery Court District to keep me as one of the three judges to be elected in June," Judge Roberts said. "Because I have already completed the General Jurisdiction Course, there will be no requirement for additional expenses to the taxpayers in order to meet these requirements."

Judge Roberts is 44 years old and is a native of Robbs Community in Pontotoc County. He and his wife, Rose, are members of the First United Methodist Church of Pontotoc. He has been active in church affairs as a Sunday School leader and church officer. He is a 32nd Degree Mason and a Shriner.

Active in community organizations, Judge Roberts was named Pontotoc County's Outstanding Young Man by the Jaycees, has served as an officer in the Pontotoc Rotary Club, including president, is a member of the Pontotoc County Chamber of Commerce, and has served as county

Pontotoc County Association, the First Judicial District Bar Association, the Mississippi Bar Association, the American Bar Association, the American Judicature Society, and is a member of the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Association, and the Tennessee-Mississippi Sheriffs & Peace Officers Association. He is a member of the Mississippi Judicial College and Chancery Judges Conference, the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges, the National College of Probate Judges and the Judicial Division of the American Bar Association. He is a former member of the Mississippi Prosecutors' Association, the National District Attorneys Association, the Mississippi Trial Lawyers Association and the International Chiefs of Police.

Judge Roberts is a member of the Millsaps, the Mississippi State University, the University of Mississippi, and the University of Mississippi Law School alumni associations. He has served as a member of the Rotating Faculty Pool, the Court Education Program, Law Center, the University of Mississippi. Additionally, he is a member of the Mississippi Conference on Social Welfare. He served as a member of Governor Allain's Commission on Constitutional Revision for 1985-86 and was a member of Project Second Chance Advisory Board, a program initiated by Governor Allain to address the problems of released offenders from the correctional system and to relieve prison overcrowding.

He received the Herman C. Glazier Award from the Mississippi Chapter of the American Society for Public Administration as Outstanding Appointed Administrator on the State Level for 1985. He was also presented the National 1987 Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Exemplary Practices Award for providing leadership in the area of equal opportunity while serving as director of the Mississippi Department of Public Safety.

"I hope to see the voters of this district before the election to ask personally of as many as possible your vote and consideration," Judge Roberts stated. Since I will be presiding over court sessions during this time, I will have limited opportunities to make personal visits. I sincerely do seek your support. I appreciate the kindnesses you have shown to me in the past. To those who may not know Jim Roberts, I invite you to ask your lawyer friends, or those who work with courts about me. Thank you."

"I can candidly say that in the life of this plant, there will be some type of incident," Mitchell said.

Charles Chisolm, director of the Bureau of Pollution Control, said that the meeting was the beginning of the permit process. No applications for the project have been received by his agency yet, he said. The permit process would not end without additional public participation, he said.

*Keep a one-ounce bottle of syrup of ipecac, which is used to induce vomiting, in your medicine cabinet.

If your child accidentally swallows a poisonous substance, call your doctor or a poison-control center to find out whether you should use syrup of ipecac to induce vomiting and how much should be given. Do not use ipecac if the poison is lyebased or a corrosive alkali.

A PLAN FOR MAXIMUM

FREEZER USE

Freezing is easy and convenient. To get maximum convenience and economy takes careful planning. The secret lies in an easy management plan.

Plan the freezer contents. Freeze foods you need and use often. Freeze only the foods your family likes and in amounts you will use within the recommended storage time.

Budget freezer space. Budget freezer space first for basic foods such as meats, vegetables and fruits. Then, if there is room, plan to freeze baked goods, main dishes, snacks or desserts.

Keep contents organized. An orderly freezer holds many more packages than a disorderly one. Stack similar foods together. Packages you will use first should be the easiest to get to. Use baskets, shelves, or dividers that are furnished with the freezer to help organize the contents.

Keep an inventory. You will always know what is on hand if you keep an inventory of the foods that are in the freezer. A current inventory can help you plan meals, and remind you to use old packages of food within their recommended storage times.

Keep the inventory in a handy place so food can be added and subtracted without much touble. Remember, the simpler the inventory system is to use, the more you will use it to manage your freezer.

FREEZER BISCUITS 5 cups self-rising flour 1/4 cup sugar 1 cup shortening 2 (1/4 oz.) packages dry yeast 1/2 cup lukewarm water 2 cups buttermilk 1 teaspoon baking powder

Sift flour and sugar together; cut in shortening. Dissolve yeast in water and add to mixture. Add buttermilk and soda (which has been mixed together). Stir well. Knead dough and place in large greased bowl and refrigerate overnight. Knead lightly; roll to less than 1/2 inch thick. Cut out, grease tops and place on greased cooking sheet to freeze. Place in freezer bags the number usually needed for cooking. Place amount of biscuits on pan and place in COLD oven. Bake at 450 degrees until brown.

***Chinch bugs that suck juices of corn plants. Spray sevin or lorsban for control.

***Root maggots that damage cabbage transplants. Use diazinon 50 WP in transplant water to prevent such damage.

***Whiteflies can be a problem on your ligustrums and gardenias. The adults are small, white, mothlike insects that are found underneath the leaves of these plants.

The flies suck sap from the leaves. They also excrete large amounts of honeydew, and this substance develops into black, sooty mold.

Control your whiteflies with foliar applications of cygon, diazinon, malathion or orthene. Full coverage is necessary for control. **BUYING TREATED LUMBER**

There has been an explosion of southern pine products available to the do-it-yourselfer for outdoor building projects.

You can buy pressure-treated lumber, posts, landscaping logs, trellises, patio blocks and tomato stakes -- all made of pine.

In Tishomingo County alone, more homeowners are interested in improving their homes. Patio decks and privacy fences are increasingly popular here, and many of you are building them.

Creosote, pentachlorophenol and copper chromium arsenate (CCA) are the preservatives generally used for pressure treatment. When buying treated wood, look for a quality mark stamp on each piece.

This mark is your guarantee of quality. It should give the name of the treater, type of preservative used and designated use of the wood (ground contact or above ground). The mark should also carry the letters AWPB (American Wood Preservers Bureau) or SPIB (Southern Pine Inspection Bureau).

These organizations monitor the treating companies for use of quality control standards. If you need more information on pressure-treated pine, please come by the office.

Requirement Of The B.E.S.T. Bill

The State Board of Education at its May meeting stated that all established kindergarten programs in the state, public or non-public, will be deemed acceptable for the 1990-91 school year. However, minimum standards and guidelines to establish a program as an acceptable kindergarten will be set for the 1991-92 school year. These guidelines will be written by State Department staff and presented to the State Board for approval in December, 1990.





Fluoride Content of Bottled Water

The recent recall of bottled water has made me wonder if there are risks associated with these products. What do you think?

According to Sheila McGuire. D.D.S., at the Harvard School of Dental Medicine, there are two types of bottled water: drinking and mineral. The former is for everyday drinking and cooking. Mineral water often is carbonated and is an alternative to soft drinks and alcoholic beverages. In 1988, Americans spent over two billion dollars for mineral waters.

Writing in The New England Journal of Medicine, Dr. McGuire cautions that most bottled waters do not contain the amount of fluoride that the Environmental Protection Agency has set as being "optimum" for municipal water supplies. The optimum range for fluoride is 0.7 to 1.2 parts per million, and the maximum acceptable level is 4 parts per million.


Of 12 popular bottled waters tested, only Perrier Naturally Spar-kling Mineral Water – at 1.9 parts per million - contained the amount of fluoride that was in the "acceptable" range. All other waters contained no more than 0.65 parts per million, and three contained less than 0.1 parts per million of fluoride. Dr. McGuire concludes that, "bottled water could be lacking fluoride, one of the truly healthful and natural elements ... '

with the local Headstart, Welfare, Health and Mental Health agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Director to insure that the Referral-to-Placement procedures are followed. The director works with Local Survey Committees at each school to implement this procedure. The following activities briefly describe the procedures.

Prior to evaluation, a copy of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to parents. District personnel explain the Parent Information Pamphlet to parents and insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a nondiscriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are notified when a student is ruled eligible for a special education program. An Individual Educational Plan is developed for the student before the student is placed. Parents must sign permission for placement. Parents, teacher and students participate in this process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

We now have fourteen special education classes in our district which serve students who have physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional handicaps.

It is the goal of the Tishomingo **County School District to provide free** appropriate education to all handicapped children through age twenty-one by the year 2000.

The free summer library program is designed to encourage the enjoyment of reading. It is very impor-1 tant that children maintain their reading skills during the summer months. A Prescription for Fishing and Maintaining Farm Ponds

Good fishing can be enjoyed for years if you follow a sound pond management program. This includes proper stocking, fertilization, weed control and fishing.

First, stock the correct species of hatchery produced fish at recommended rates. In new ponds, stock a total of 500 bluegill and redear sunfish and 50 largemouth bass per surface acre. If desired, up to 100 channel catfish per acre may be added. Never add fish to an existing pond unless it is recommended by a biologist. Do not stock crappie in farm ponds because they tend to overpopulate. This results in a pond full of small stunted fish.

Fertilizers should only be used in a pond to address a recognized problem such as the need to produce more fish or to help reduce aquatic vegetation. If you need to fertilize, two options are available. Each year,

beginning in March, apply 8 pounds of triple superphosphate (0-46-0) per surface acre every 10 days until a pea soup green "bloom" appears. Reapply fertilizer only when the "bloom" begins to disappear. To apply fertilizer, cut the bags open and place in the water near the pond's edge. When the fertilizer is dissolved into the water, remove the bags. One station per 3 to 5 acres is sufficient. Or, for faster and more efficient results apply 1/2 to 1 gallon of liquid fertilizer (10-34-0) or 11-37-0) per surface acre every 10 to 14 days until a "bloom appears". Dilute the liquid fertilizer in water and then pour it into the propwash of a motor boat. Apply fertilizer as needed when "bloom" begins to disappear (about once/month). Discontinue fertilization in September.

Aquatic vegetation can best be prevented in most ponds by eliminating water areas less than 3 feet and keeping the water fertile. If a pond has a heavy growth of vegetation, it is best to seek professional help for approved

methods of control.

Most of the fish harvested from the pond should be bream. A general

recommendation is to harvest between 7 and 10 pounds of bream for every pound of bass. Removing to many bass is one of the most common problems in farm pond management. When this occurs, the bass' cannot control the bream, and the bream become overcrowned and stunted, while bass reproduction is either reduced or stopped completely, A balance between bess and bream can usually be determined by fishing results. When fishing produces large numbers of small bass and large bream, an overpopulation of bass is probably. When only a few large bass and many small bream are caught, the pond is probably overpopulated with bream. If fishing is satisfactory, the bees and bream balance is usually good. In addition, the Soil Conservation Service will check your pond from late June thru September, and make appropriate management recommendations.
