### Subdivision Regulations

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors on Tuesday readopted a set of subdivision regulations for the county.

The regulations go into effect September 1 1990. Copies of the regulations are available in the Chancery Clerk's Office of the Tishomingo County Courthouse for potential developers and contractors, Chancery Clerk Hayden Ables said.

The regulations are designed to set forth certain procedures and standards for the development or redevelopment of subdivisions in the county to assure that development is orderly, healthful, efficient, and economical, the order states.

The supervisors first adopted the regulations on June 4, along with a order requiring residents to obtain building permits before building or altering structures in the county. In response to widespread protest to the building order, the board rescinded both resolutions on June 29.

Board-President D.W. McKee said that the subdivision regulations adopted Monday were essentially the same as the first set, but included some revisions. No major changes were made, he said.

The order calls for, at the time of filing an application for preliminary plat approval, a fee of \$300 plus \$10 per lot. The administration and enforcement of the regulations is included in the order, with violators facing possible fines of up to \$100.

### Iuka Businessman Arrested Saturday

An Iuka man was arrested Saturday in connection with a shooting that injured his son.

According to Iuka Police Officer, Trip Lomenick, Paul Beard was shot twice in the leg with a pistol. The incident occurred at the P. O. Beard Real Estate Agency on Eastport Street at approximately 12 noon Saturday.

P. O. Beard was arrested and charged with attempted murder. He was released on \$25,000 bond, Police Chief Amos Bates said.

The shooting apparently followed an altercation between Beard and his father, police said.

Paul Beard was transported to Baptist Memorial Hospital in Memphis for surgery. He was reported in satisfactory condition on Monday.

The incident remains under investigation, Lomenick said.

### Crash Fatal To One-----

Only twisted wreckage remained of an Illinois couple's Chevrolet pickup after it collided with a Mack tractor trailer on Highway 25 South Tuesday. Eva E. Hall, 68, of East Peoria, Illinois, died in the accident, while her husband, Robert E. Hall, was injured and transported to ECM Hospital in Florence. The Halls reportedly ran a stop sign at the intersection of Hwy. 25 and Hwy. 30 while travelling east and struck the trailer, causing it to overturn.

## Illinois Lady Killed In Two-Vehicle Collision

A two-vehicle accident on Highway 25 claimed the life of an Illinois woman and injured her husband Tuesday morning.

Eva E. Hall, 68, of East Peoria, Illinois, was pronounced dead at the scene of the crash, which occurred at the intersection of U.S. Highway 25 South and Highway 30, just north of

Tishomingo. Her husband, Robert E. Hall, 71, was transported to the Iuka Hospital and later transferred to Eliza Coffee Memorial Hospital in Florence. He was listed in fair condition Tuesday afternoon, a hospital spokesperson said.

According to State Highway Patrol Trooper Jerry Boyd, the Halls, who

were traveling eastbound on Hwy 30, apparently failed to stop at the intersection and collided with a 1979 Mack tractor trailer heading north on 25. The truck's driver, Billy Wayne Ham of Dennis swerved but could not avoid the crash. The Hall's vehicle, a 1990 S-10 Chevrolet pickup, slammed into the left rear trailer tire of the truck, causing the truck to spin and overturn. The truck was not loaded. Ham received only minor injuries, Boyd said.

All three occupants were wearing seat belts at the time of the crash, which occurred at approximately 8:20 a.m., Boyd said.

The Halls were reportedly on their way to Sheffield, Boyd said.

Boyd said that the Highway Patrol would reconstruct the accident, but based on reports of witnesses, the incident was unavoidable.

## Key West Inn Plans To Open Near Iuka

A Key West Inn and a separate apartment complex are being planned for just west of the Iuka city limits, and groundbreaking could take place within 30 to 40 days.

Cory Jackson, Jr., director of operations for Key West Inn, said the new 60-room motel would be a deluxe model of the Key West Inn on U. S. Highway 72 in Tuscumbia, Ala. The project developer is RDIG, Inc., a Muscle Shoals-based real estate development firm. Jackson said the proposed motel would be licensed with Key West, as a franchise, but he was unsure whether Key West would manage this inn.

The projected cost of the new inn would be around \$2 million, said John Duncan, president of RDIG, Inc. The motel would offer queen size rooms, executive suites, and jacuzzi suites, as well as the standard double rooms, Duncan said. Two large meeting rooms able to accommodate 30 people each, continental breakfast, a large lobby, and a swimming pool are also part of the plans.

The site of the proposed inn is a 4.5 acre tract located near the intersection of Mt. Gilead Rd. and Hwy. 72 West, Duncan said.

The Key West corporation, based in Birmingham, operates inns in Boaz and Tuscumbia, Ala., and the Iuka inn would be its third location, Jackson said.

"Based on our assessment of the needs of the area, this should be an

outstanding location," he said.

About 14 employees will be hired to staff the new facility, Jackson said.

RDIG is also planning to develop an apartment complex on property adjacent to the inn. Duncan said the complex will consist of 48 apartments - 40 two-bedroom apartments and eight one-bedroom apartments.

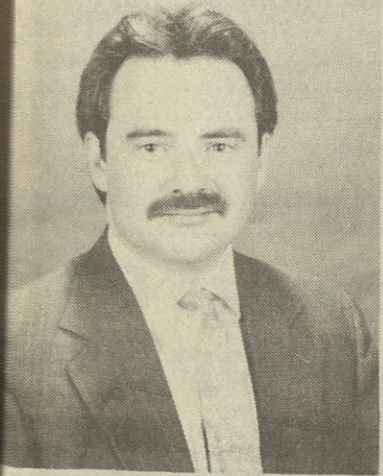
He said the inn would be completed five months after groundbreaking, while the apartments would take about four months to construct.

Construction has been delayed by lack of water and wastewater services available to the site, Duncan said. His firm is waiting to see whether the state approves a Community Development Block Grant for the city of Iuka that will help launch the Key West project.

Iuka Mayor David Nichols said that the outlook was very positive for Iuka to be awarded the \$150,000 grant from the Department of Economic and Community Development. The grant, which will require no local match, will be used to provide water, sewer, and gas services to the western edge of the city limits, which includes the Key West project and also area near the county's proposed magnet high school. Nichols said.

The Key West Inn is the second motel to be announced recently in Iuka. Groundbreaking was held July 24 for a Days Inn Motel to be located at the corner of U.S. Highway 72 and Highway 25 bypass.

### Arts Guild To Meet

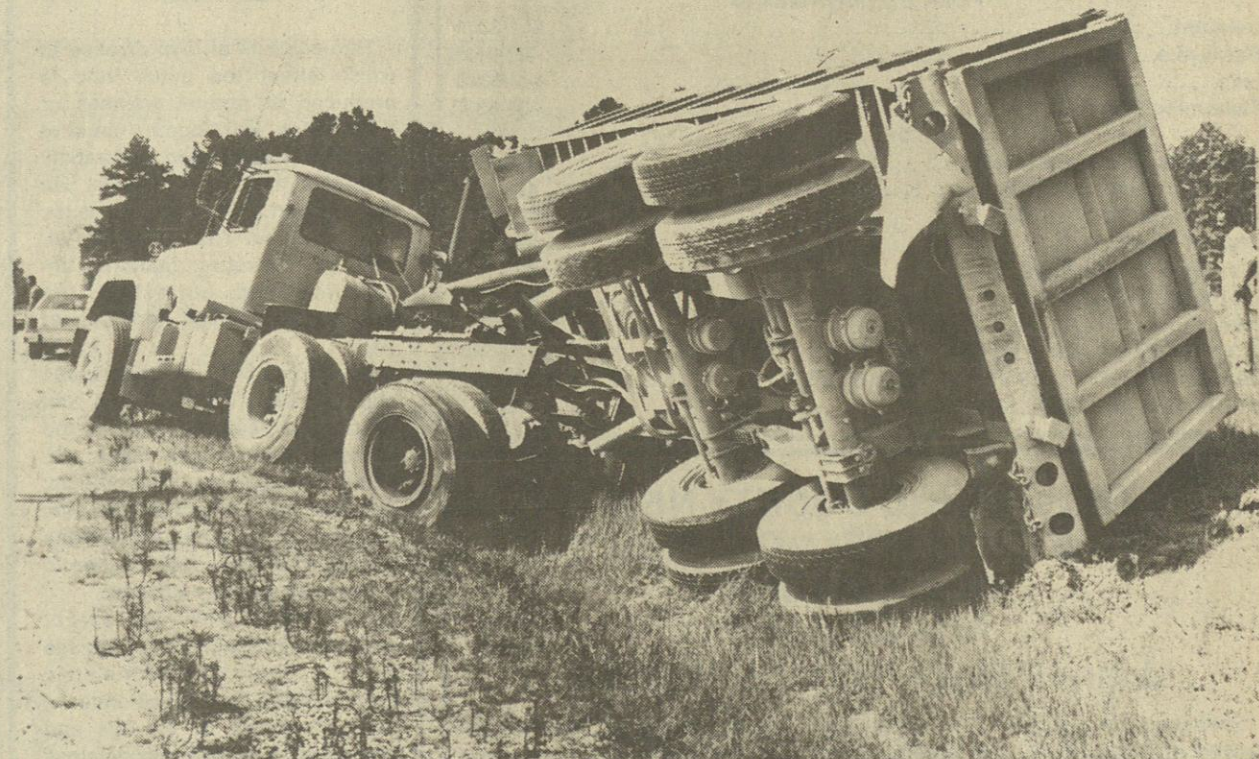
The Tishomingo County Fine Arts Guild will meet August 9 (2nd Thursday night) at 5 p.m. at the Southern Style Restaurant in Midway.

## Chatting With Your Home Economist

CHARCOAL GRILLING

Cooking outside over a charcoal fire is fun. The food tastes so good, and everyone can be a part of the action. You'll need some basic equipment, food, a few safety rules and your family or friends to share the fun.

### BUILDING A FIRE

Getting the fire ready is half the work in outdoor cooking. Place the grill firmly on a level surface in an open area at least six feet from any buildings, shrubs, dry wood or low branches. Do not place a grill in a closed area such as a garage -- even if it rains. Fumes from charcoal are dangerous.

Arrange charcoal briquettes in the bottom of the fire bowl. Place briquettes in a small pyramid. Soak the briquettes in charcoal lighter fluid. Do not use gasoline for starter because it can cause a dangerous flash fire. Let charcoal lighter fluid stand a few minutes and ignite using

long matches or a special electric starter. Do not add charcoal lighter fluid after the coals are lighted.

Charcoal burns slowly. It will take 20 to 30 minutes for the coals to become gray and ready for cooking. Spread gray coals evenly in the fire bowl and adjust the grill for cooking.

You may wish to line the fire bowl with heavy duty aluminum foil. The foil will reflect heat and make the food cook faster and more evenly. When the coals are cool, you can fold the foil around the ashes for easy cleanup.

### EQUIPMENT

Outdoor cooking requires some basic equipment. The equipment need not be expensive. You can even make some of it yourself. To start you will need several items.

\*A fire bowl or container for the charcoal briquettes can be purchased or made from bricks, cement blocks or a gallon bucket.

\*Obtain a metal grill with wires close enough together so that food will not fall through.

\*Don't forget smaller items such as a long-handled fork, tongs and spatula for arranging coals and turning or handling food.

\*Remember a potholder or mitt to protect hands.

### FOOD ITEMS

Why not try a meal in a bundle. A hobo dinner is a nutritious meal cooked in a bundle of foil over a charcoal fire while you enjoy a game of badminton or chat with your friends. You can do the food preparation in the kitchen and bring the prepared bundles to the cooksite. The rest of the meal can be prepared ahead and refrigerated until it is time to eat.

For each person you will need 1/4 pound of ground beef shaped into a patty, one medium potato, one small carrot, a slice of onion, a strip of green pepper, salt and pepper.

Scrub and slice vegetables. Place meat patty on 18-inch square of heavy duty aluminum foil. Arrange vegetables around meat and season with salt and pepper. Bring corners of foil up together in a pyramid shape. Fold openings together and seal ends by folding and pressing to package.

Hobo dinners can be frozen or packed in a cooler if they will be sitting out of doors before cooking.

When charcoal fire is ready for cooking, place bundles on grill set about 3 inches above the fire. Cook one hour or until done. Serve hobo dinner right from the foil bundle with radishes and celery sticks, crunchy buttered wheat toast and cold fruit punch. To make the toast, butter wheat bread on both sides and toast over coals three to five minutes per side.

### SQUASH DRESSING

3 cups squash  
1 large onion, chopped  
1/2 cup margarine or butter  
2 cups cornbread crumbs  
1 (10 3/4 oz.) can cream of chicken soup  
2 eggs, lightly beaten  
Black pepper and salt

Cook squash; drain. Cook onion in margarine. Mix squash with onion, margarine, cornbread crumbs, soup

CONTROLLING FLEAS AND TICKS ON PETS

Many of our county 4-H members have dogs and cats as pets and companions. Some of our members are even enrolled in the 4-H pet care project.

Many dogs and cats are considered "members of the family" and are kept inside the house most of the time. These pets can cause problems. If they get fleas and ticks on them, they may start infestations of these pests in the home.

Flea and tick control is easier when the pests are still on your animal -- before they infest your home. Information on chemical control of these pests is found in Extension Publication 906 "Parasite Control for Dogs and Cats." This publication is available from the Tishomingo County Extension Service Office.

Many kinds of fleas attack pets and people. Dog and cat fleas, however, cause most problems in Mississippi. Normally, fleas feed only on their host, but they will attack humans in the absence of a host animal.

Flea control begins with keeping your pet's sleeping quarters clean. Remove and bury feces and change their bedding periodically. If fleas are found in the home, clean the house thoroughly and frequently with a strong suction-type cleaner. Fleas can be effectively collected and the sweeper bag contents destroyed.

Remove lint and dust found in cracks and crevices along floorboards, baseboards, and the pet's sleeping area.

Ticks may be major pests of dogs, especially if dogs are allowed to run loose. The two ticks found most frequently on dogs are the American Dog Tick and the Brown Dog Tick. Ticks also transmit disease, may

produce paralysis, and are blood-sucking creatures.

The American Dog Tick is an outdoor pest and the main carrier of Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever. The Brown Dog Tick is a house pest. The American Dog Tick generally will not establish itself indoors, but the Brown Dog Tick may live in the house, feeding almost exclusively on dogs.

When you find a tick on a person or animal, remove it immediately. The best method is to gently pull the tick off with tweezers, grasping it as closely as possible to its point of attachment. After removing the tick, always treat the wound with a good germicidal agent.

To reduce ticks around the home, eliminate dense, woody underbrush and cut grass and other vegetation along paths and walks. Eliminating mice, gophers, rabbits, and other rodents may also help reduce ticks.

## Pharmacy & Your Health

### Medicines for Asthma Symptom Relief

According to the *Handbook of Nonprescription Drugs*, as many as 7 out of 10 Americans experience asthma symptoms sometime during their lifetimes. Asthma is an obstruction or narrowing of the small air passages in the lungs. An asthma attack typically produces symptoms of chest tightness, breathlessness, wheezing (a fine whistling sound), and coughing.

Much asthma occurs as an allergic response to substances in the environment such as grass and pollen. Foods such as shellfish, chocolate, and eggs have reportedly caused asthmatic attacks. Running or other types of exercise may cause air passage constriction.

Asthma symptom prevention and treatment may be achieved with a number of prescription medicines. *Theophylline* causes muscles around the air passages to relax, improving the flow of air into and out of the lungs. *Adrenaline* (epinephrine) and adrenal-like medicines such as *metaproterenol* also increase the size of air passages and usually cause rapid improvement of air flow. Another group of medicines which can improve air flow are the steroids, which include *prednisone*, *beclomethasone*, and *dexamethasone*. *Cromolyn sodium* is sometimes given to chronic asthmatics to prevent asthma attacks.

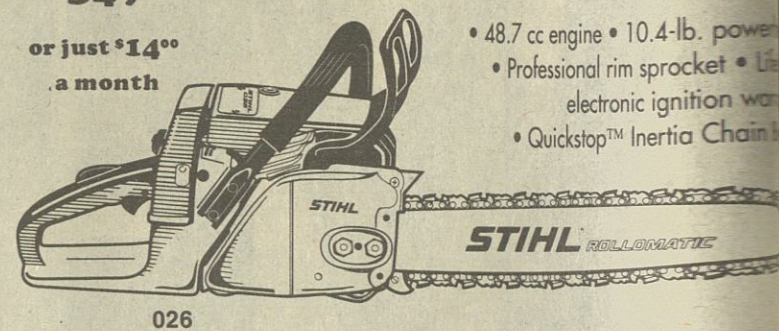

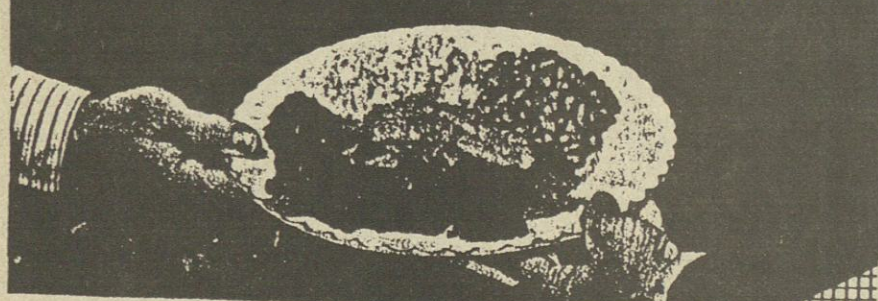

**ASCS Farm News**

**WOOL, MOHAIR PAYMENTS ISSUED**  
Price support payments for 1989 wool and mohair marketings totaled about \$800. The incentive payments went to 3 sheep and goat growers in the county.

The 1989 support price for shorn wool is \$1.77 per pound, and the national average market price was \$1.24 per pound - 53 cents less than the support price. The 42.7 percent payment rate is the percentage which brings the average price received by all producers up to the support price.

For mohair, the 1989 average market price was \$1.58 and the support price was \$5.88, making the payment rate 190.4 percent.

Payments were not made on the portion of a producer's sales proceeds which exceeded \$4.96 per pound for wool, or \$6.32 per pound for mohair.

In order to maintain normal pulled wool marketing practices, ASCS supported unshorn lambs at a level comparable to the shorn wool support rate. Therefore, producers received \$2.12 per hundredweight in price support payments for unshorn lambs that were sold or slaughtered during the 1989 marketing year.

Nationally, ASCS disbursed about \$100 million in wool and mohair payments-\$50 million for shorn and pulled wool, and \$50 million for mohair.

**CORN PLANTINGS COULD TOTAL 170,000 ACRES**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's prospective plantings report places Mississippi's 1990 corn seedings at 170,000 acres, 6 percent below last year. Corn plantings for the nation are expected to total 74.8 million acres this year.

Acres actually planted can vary from those indicated because of the 1990 farm programs the effects of weather and changes in market conditions before planting. The report is based on voluntary responses from approximately 75,000 farmers and ranchers to a mail survey collected between March 1 and March 15. The sign-up period for 1990 acreage reduction programs did not close until April 13. Therefore, the report provides only a preliminary indication of farmers' responses of this year's

programs. Under the feed grain program, producers who plant no more than 90 percent of their corn base this year will be eligible to receive a federal target price of \$2.75 per bushel and price support loans at \$1.57 a bushel. Ten percent of the farm's corn base would be removed from production to maintain a competitive world market position, and provide adequate supplies at reasonable prices to feed grain consumers.

The USDA report shows that Mississippi farmers planted 180,000 acres of corn in 1989, and 200,000 acres in 1988.

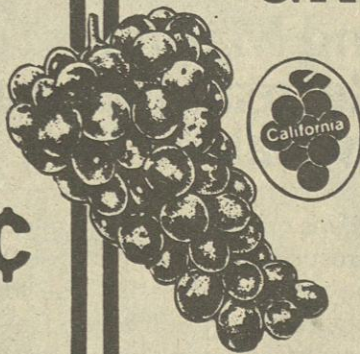

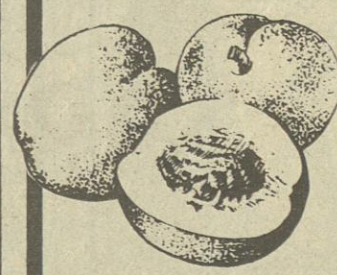

& Your Health**

**Spotlight on Vitamin**

In 1935 in Denmark, it was covered that hog liver fat or all cured a bleeding disorder in hatched chickens. The research believed that there was a vitamin these materials that assisted in "koagulation" of blood. They called the vitamin "K."

There are at least three types of vitamin K, and all assist in blood clotting process. Vitamin K1 is derived from green plants (phylloquinone), K-2 (menaquinone) produced by bacteria in the intestinal tract, and K-3 (menadiol) synthetic. Although vitamin K is fat soluble vitamin, water soluble forms of K-1 and K-2 are available. K is not stored in the body long periods of time.

Deficiency of vitamin K in adults is rare. However, infants born with low vitamin K levels appears that vitamin K does transfer across the placenta from the mother to the fetus. There is one injection of K typically is given to infants at birth. As microorganisms accumulate in their intestines infants are able to produce some of their own vitamin K.

Vitamin K is found in large amounts in green leafy vegetables, especially broccoli, cabbage, spinach, and lettuce. Small amounts are obtained from animal products, egg yolk and liver.

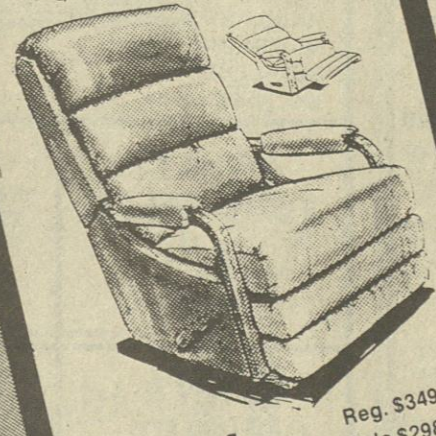

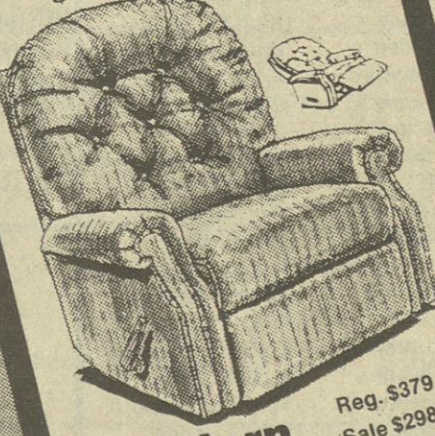

He is survived by a daughter, Dorothy Atkinson of Chulavista, Ca.; a son, Jerry Powers of Chico, CA; two sisters, Polly Sibole of Selmer, TN; and Alma Lamber of Iuka; and many nieces and nephews.

## County Agents Notes

### SOYBEAN PESTS

Soybean farmers in Tishomingo County should monitor their crop for foliage feeders such as loopers, armyworms, green cloverworms, and velvetbean caterpillars. These pests can cause damage worth thousands of dollars to the producer who doesn't regularly check fields.

Another pest that causes damage later in the growing season is the stinkbug. Much of the damage that stinkbugs cause goes unnoticed at first. By the time the damage is noticed, it is considerable.

Producers can stop by the Tishomingo County Extension Office for a soybean control guide. The information in the guide can really help identify pests and spare the crop from further injury.

### BIG SCARE

Many people call the Tishomingo County Extension Office this time of

year. They are concerned about what they call "large and frightful" insects they find around swimming pools, ponds, patios, and parking lots.

These insects are no mystery. Most of them are harmless. They are attracted to light, and that is why they gather around street lights and recreational areas that are lighted well.

Dodson flies look like prehistoric insects, but they only look frightening. In the larval stage, the flies live in moving streams of water. They make good fish food.

Water scavenger beetles are fierce predators in their larval stage, but they don't prey on humans and animals. They scavenge for food, and are usually found in ponds and streams.

Giant water bugs are also found in ponds and streams. They eat smaller insects, tadpoles, and snails. The adults inflict a painful bite if mishandled. The lesson to be learned about water bugs, then, is don't touch.

These frightful insects can be a nuisance, but they are also beneficial. They help control populations of other insects and they dispose of insect waste. Their populations can sometimes get out of control around homes and recreational areas.

For suggestions on control, call the Tishomingo County Extension Office for specific information that applies to your home.

### MOW'EM OVER

Reports from Mississippi hospital emergency rooms in Tishomingo County show lawn mower accidents are a leading cause of injury this summer.

We should remind ourselves that the lawn mower is a cutting machine. Incorrect use can cut a finger or foot.

The cutting blade is a potential hazard. When starting a push mower, brace it by putting one foot on the mower. Keep the other foot away.

Keep both feet away when starting a riding mower.

Don't clean grass from the mower while the engine is running. Clear the lawn of sticks, stones, wire, and glass that can be hurled by the blade.

Don't leave a mower running and

unattended, especially when children are present. Cut the mower off before you add fuel.

### WEEDING OUT THINGS

Weeds cause too many problems in Tishomingo County if allowed to grow out of control. Left to themselves, these plants create fire hazards, increase maintenance costs, damage asphalt, and spoil the beauty of the landscape.

Homeowners and producers can use herbicides to kill weeds and other unwanted vegetation. They can selectively kill weeds while allowing perennial grasses to thrive. Grasses and broadleaf weeds such as clover can create a ground cover for erosion control or landscape beauty.

By judicious in applying any type of herbicide or other chemical. Read labels first.

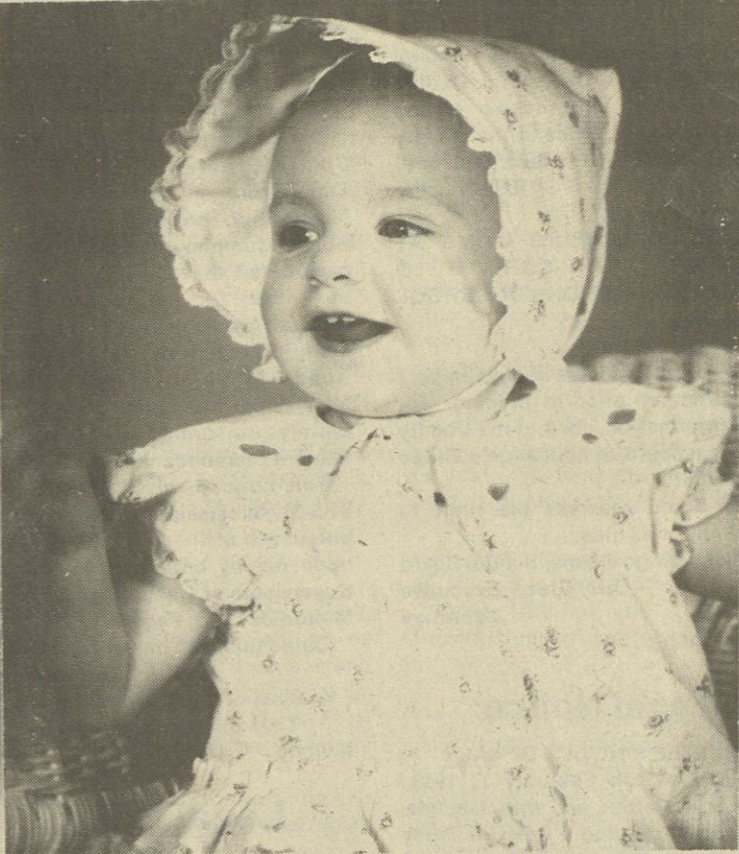
Dear Editor,  
I am writing to voice my concern about the problem we have with hwy. 25 from Iuka to Fulton. I am 49 years old and this hwy might have been safe when I was a child or even when I was a teenager. We were one car family back then. Now, we average 3 and 4 cars per family. We also have approximately 1500 trailers, rocktrucks and pulpwood trucks traveling from Iuka to Fulton daily. It is next to impossible to pass a vehicle on the stretch from Belmont to Fulton. I have had to slow down to 15 mph when going uphill and being behind a truck or trailer or both. I have also had

to drive up to 75 mph when a truck was on my bumper wanting me out of their way, but could not see to pass me.

**Fishing On Bay Springs Reservoir**

Fishing on the Bay Springs Reservoir isn't what it used to be.

Fisheries biologist, W.D. Hubbard, who is stationed at the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Aberdeen office, says Bay Springs is experiencing what is commonly called the "boom-and-bust" of new lakes.

"Boom" refers to the excellent fishing that occurs during the initial years when an abundance of food and habitat resources are available as new soils and terrestrial vegetation are flooded.

The "bust" occurs, usually within five to 10 years, when the fish population stabilizes at some lower level.

The Fisheries Division of the MD-WFP has monitored the development of fish populations at Bay Springs Reservoir since its impoundment in 1984.

The fish population quickly expanded after the lake was impounded, and Bay Springs became well known for its fishing, especially for largemouth bass. The economic and aesthetic benefits from Tennessee lakes such as Bay Springs have been welcomed by Mississippi residents in these areas.

What should we expect from Bay Springs?

Hubbard contends game fish populations in Bay Springs are adequate with respect to the productivity potential of the lake.

"It is important to realize that some lakes are simply more fertile and capable of producing more fish," Hubbard said.

For example, samples over the years show that Columbus Lake supports about 400 pounds of fish per acre while Bay Springs has about 175 pounds per acre.

"Local soils and in-flowing rivers supply nutrients that enable a lake to grow microscopic plants and animals that offer food to small fish, which in turn feed the bass," Hubbard explained. "It's quite evident with the clear water at Bay Springs that the food chain has less to work with than a lake like Columbus."

What can be done to bring back some of the "boom" to Bay Springs?

The first step is to identify the problem.

Shad are a major part of the fish pondage in most Southeastern reservoirs and are a very important food item for bass and crappie. Although shad exists in Bay Springs, very few small shad occur for the fish to eat. It is speculated that young shad have so little to eat in Bay Springs that they fail to survive.

A MDWFP-funded research project to begin this fall will combine the expertise of personnel from the University of Mississippi and Mississippi Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit to study this problem. Hubbard said many steps can be taken to improve the forage conditions at Bay Springs once the exact nature of the problem is realized.

The MDWFP also plans to monitor the success of smallmouth bass in Bay Springs. The release of adults during tournaments and subsequent spawning in 1989 has introduced them to the lake. Smallmouth fishing in Bay Springs depends on whether they are able to survive in the existing habitat and forage conditions.

If smallmouth show a tendency to survive and are capable of making up even a small percentage of the black bass population, measures such as stocking fingerlings or harvest restrictions could be taken to increase the abundance of this very popular sport fish, Hubbard said.

Surveys also will be conducted to monitor the abundance of bass of larger sizes in Bay Springs and the effects of fishing harvest.

Ron Garavelli, chief of the Fisheries Division, said fishing pressure is high on this relatively small reservoir.

"It will be the responsibility of everyone to practice catch-and-release and report violations of fishing regulations to your local conservation officers if fishery resources are to be preserved for the future," he said.
