Crow's Neck Education Facility Planned For Bay Springs Area

Plans are underway for the Crow's Neck Education Facility to be built at Bay Springs Lake in Tishomingo County.

Bids for construction may be awarded this fall, with construction to

start hopefully by the end of the year, said Mack Loyd Wadkins, director of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation.

The facility will be a multi-purpose complex used to educate elementary

and high school children in ecology and environmental issues.

Plans call for the facility to include four dormitory buildings, each holding 24 people. A central building, or cafeteria, will include an eating area, kitchen, library, and learning labs.

Federal funding will be used to construct the \$3.8 million facility on a 530-acre tract. A Nashville District Army Corps of Engineers landscape architect designed the building, which may be like an overnight nature center, Wadkins said.

Once construction is complete, the Nashville District will turn over control to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and the North Mississippi Education Consortium, which consists of Mississippi State University, the University of Mississippi, Itawamba Community College, and Northeast Mississippi Community College, Wadkins said.

The facility has been in planning stages for about a decade, and it will "enhance the educational opportunities of the area and help in industrial recruitment," Wadkins said.

"People are very environment-conscious these days, and the facility is designed to be an environmental training center," he said.

Some uses for the complex might be camps for gifted children, workshops for teachers, courses for college students, and programs for high school and elementary school students, Wadkins explained.

A resident manager will stay on the premises to oversee operations. The dormitory buildings will also accommodate camp counselors, he said.

Elderly Man Killed In Two Vehicle Crash

An elderly Iuka man was killed in a two-vehicle accident Wednesday night, August 8.

Tishomingo County Deputy Mike Higginbottom identified the victim as Allen Jackson Berryman, 79, of Iuka. Berryman was driving a 1984 Ford pickup truck when he collided with a 1973 Chevrolet pickup driven by Ravis Harris, 24, of Iuka.

The accident occurred at about 6 p.m. on County Road 196 just off Pleasant Hill Road, about 1 1/2 miles south of Iuka, Higginbottom said.

The vehicles hit head on, with most the impact on the left front sides of the vehicles.

Berryman was pronounced dead at Iuka Hospital. Harris received only minor injuries, the deputy said. Berryman was a member of the Mt.

Joy Baptist Church, a Mason and a member of Woodmen of the World.

Services were held at 11 a.m. Saturday at Cutshall Funeral Home Chapel with the Rev. G.D. Jones and the Rev. Leonard Casabella officiating. Burial was in the Memorial Gardens.

Survivors include his wife, Jewel Berryman of Iuka; two daughters, Mary Frederick and Elvie Davis, both of Iuka; two sons, Zane Berryman and Harold Berryman, both of Austell, GA; one step-daughter, Barbara Sansome of Key West, FL; two step sons, Robert E. Glover of Iuka and Ralph Glover of Athens, AL; one sister, Ida Mae Wright of Cherokee, AL; two brothers, Nolan Berryman of Cherokee and Austin Berryman of Tishomingo; seven grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Jobs Available At Lockheed-Aerojet

About 50 local employees from the tri-state area of Mississippi, Alabama, and Tennessee have joined the workforce at the new Lockheed Aerojet office facility in Iuka.

Rosemary Younts, director of public affairs for Aerojet, said that 130 job openings are still available, in the areas of engineering, business operations, computer science, test operations, technical writing, and secretary/clerical.

Over 100 Aerojet workers from the Sacramento, Calif., core group have made the transition to the Iuka office, and another 100 are expected to be on the job by the end of September, Younts said.

Younts gave an update to Iuka and Tishomingo County community leaders Friday morning on the firm's operations since Lockheed Aerojet occupied the building in late June.

By the end of this year, the total Aerojet workforce should be 300, Younts said. By 1993, during production and manufacture of the advanced solid rocket motor, there will be 500 employees, including welders, machinists, electricians, and engineers. When the plant reaches full production in 1995, Aerojet's employment will reach 1,000.

Lockheed is the prime contractor on the project in charge of systems integration and overall coordination. Aerojet, which will design, develop,

and produce the rocket motors, will be the major employer.

Individuals interested in employment can come by the office, located at 1 NASA Drive off Paul Edmondson Drive, and leave a resume or complete an application. A receptionist, Janet Biggs, is located in the front lobby to assist job applicants, and her telephone number is 423-0167.

In addition, job-seekers may dial Aerojet's newly installed information line at 423-2058 to hear a prerecorded message listing current jobs available and employment information.

Iuka and Corinth have seemed to be the most popular choices for homes of the California transfers, Younts said. A few families have chosen to live in the quad-cities area in Alabama, or in southern Tennessee, she said.

The ASRM plant will be the largest undertaking by NASA since the Cape Canaveral project of the 1970s, Younts said. The 1,200-acre Yellow Creek site will include 1.25 million square feet of building space. Twenty-two existing facilities from the abandoned TVA nuclear power plant will be used with an additional 31 new buildings to be constructed, she said.

The plant will take three years to complete at a construction cost of \$500 million.

The ASRM will replace the existing

shuttle motors used to launch the space shuttle.

Younts described the size of the facility as including 100,000 yards of concrete, which would be sufficient to pave a road 40 miles long.

RUST International of Birmingham, which will construct the plant, may begin earthwork at Yellow Creek within the next six weeks, Younts said. RUST will be hiring a number of subcontractors, and a job center will be opened at Yellow Creek soon to initiate hiring of work crews, Younts said.

Aerojet has been working with numerous small businesses in the tri-state area which might serve as subcontractors during construction and development of the plant. Currently, there are about 450 businesses on file, Younts said. Small business seminars have been offered in Memphis, Tupelo, and Muscle Shoals to provide information on how businesses can participate in bidding on the numerous contracts associated with the NASA project.

Lockheed Aerojet is developing other public relations programs, which include a speaker's bureau, program for local schools, and an exhibit for college/career days, Younts said.

Lockheed Aerojet expects to occupy the Iuka office facility for 18 to 24 months until construction of the plant is completed.

School Registrations Throughout County

School bells will be ringing again soon as Iuka city schools and Tishomingo County Schools return to classrooms on Monday, August 20.

Mr. Larry Green, Superintendent of Education for the Tishomingo County Schools, announces that students will report to their respective schools on the 20th for registration and for the first day of classes. School will begin at 8 a.m. and be dismissed at 3 p.m. Buses will run their regular routes and lunch will be served.

A county-wide staff development session will be held for faculty Wednesday, August 15 at 8 a.m. This will be a joint session with the Iuka School faculty. Additional staff development sessions will be conducted on Thursday, August 16, at Iuka High School and Friday, August 17, at the Burnsville Attendance Center.

Dr. Jerry Stone, Superintendent of the Iuka School District, announces that student registration for Iuka schools will be held August 15 and 16, from 3 to 8 p.m. at the Iuka High School cafeteria and Iuka Elementary School cafeteria. Classes will begin on August 20. Parents are reminded that each student must present verification of residency in order to register.

Iuka High School will offer 54 courses for the 1990-91 school year. Included will be four foreign languages -- Spanish, French, Japanese, and Russian -- to be taught by satellite instruction. The school will offer computer instruction in Computer Literacy, Basics, and Word Processing. Available to students will also be advanced placement courses in Biology, Macro Economics, and Micro Economics. Advanced Chemistry has also been added to the school curriculum. Students also have the opportunity of attending the Tishomingo County Vocational Center, which offers an additional 20 units of work. The combined course offerings total 74 courses.

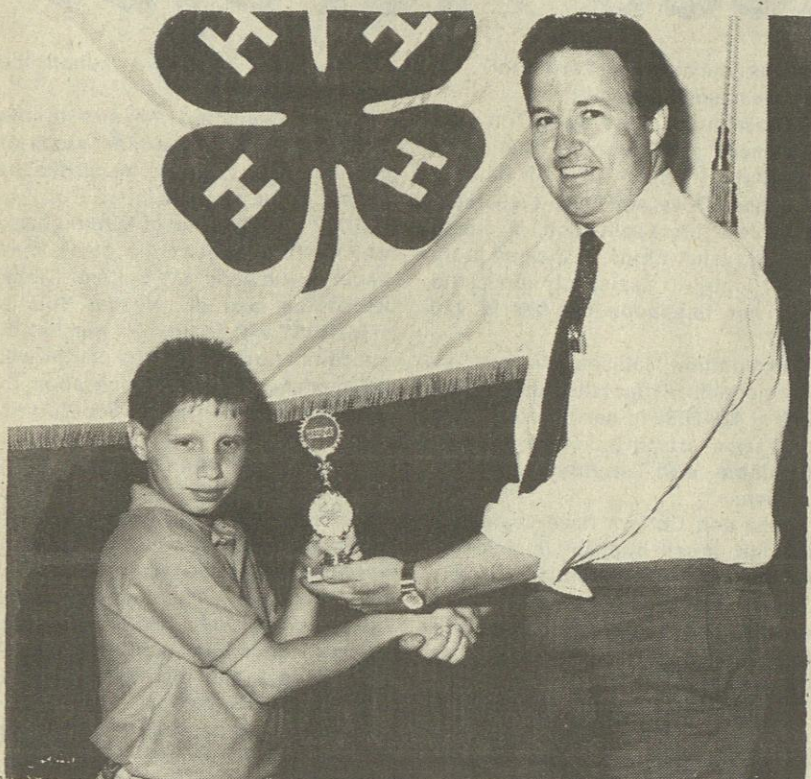

Chatting With Your Home Economist

HELPING YOUR PRESCHOOL CHILD LEARN

More and more people are recognizing the importance of successful reading and writing experiences for children. Children who enjoy reading and writing usually have an easier transition to formal schooling. To apply the same teaching techniques with preschoolers that are used with school-agers would be a mistake. For example, almost no 1-year-old child can sit at a desk or computer for extended periods. To force a young child to do so would result in frustration for parent and child. School work would become a chore instead of a pleasure.

Still, many parents want to do whatever they can to help their youngster succeed in school. Appropriate developmental experiences provide a solid basis. Here are some ideas, grouped by developmental stage.

INFANTS
Provide a variety of safe items for your infant to touch and hold. This develops finger coordination, which is important for using crayons and pencils later.

Select picture books with bright illustrations.
Hold your infant on your lap as you read, using a soft and reassuring voice.

Draw your infant's attention to the picture on the left first; then to the right. Tap it as you say "Look."

Name the objects in the picture and wait for a reaction -- laughing, gurgling, touching.

TODDLERS
Point occasionally to words as you read them.
Have your toddler turn the pages and name the pictures.
Ask "what" and "where" questions about details in pictures.
With favorite stories, pause and

omit a word occasionally for your toddler to fill in.

Keep plain paper, crayons and big pencils handy for drawing.

Write down what your child says. Label drawings. Take dictation if they wish to write a letter.

PRESCHOOLERS
Relate story incidents to your child's own experiences.

Read to your child regularly and often -- even the same books over and over again.

Encourage your child to write words and phrases and to read them back to you. Don't overemphasize spelling.

Make up stories together that have a beginning, middle and ending. Write them down. Read them.

Act out stories.
Most important, make reading and writing a pleasurable experience. Make sure your child sees you reading. With this basis, school-based reading and writing will follow naturally.

HERB BAKED TOMATOES

4 firm tomatoes
Garlic salt
Black pepper
1 teaspoon basil leaves, crushed
3 tablespoons mayonnaise
3 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Parsley flakes

Cut tomatoes in half crosswise, place on baking sheet (12x9x3-inches). Sprinkle each tomato half with garlic salt, pepper, and basil. Spread tomatoes with mayonnaise and sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake uncovered for 10 minutes or until cheese melts and is lightly browned. Sprinkle with Parsley flakes. YIELD: 4 servings.

Spotlight on Vitamin B-6: Pyridoxine

Pyridoxine, or vitamin B-6, is involved in a variety of chemical reactions that occur within the body. B-6 is necessary for the formation of the amino acid tryptophan and for the conversion of tryptophan to nicotinic acid (niacin). The vitamin is involved in maintenance of cellular immunity and in the formation of hemoglobin.

Adults who were given a chemical to cause a B-6 deficiency developed depression, nausea, vomiting, seborrhea, mucous membrane lesions, and an inflammation of the nerves called peripheral neuritis. A medicine used to treat tuberculosis -- isoniazid -- is a B-6 antagonist and can produce some of these symptoms. B-6 is often given with isoniazid to help prevent such problems.

Pyridoxine is present in a variety of foods including yeast, wheat germ and whole grain cereals, pork, glandular meats (especially liver), potatoes, bananas, and oatmeal. Many authorities believe that adults need only 1 to 2 mg per day of this vitamin to prevent deficiency symptoms. However, certain conditions increase the need for pyridoxine, including lactation, pregnancy, aging, heart failure, and use of some oral contraceptives.

Pyridoxine supplements can eliminate the beneficial effects of some medicines used in Parkinson's disease. In such cases, a pyridoxine-free nutritional supplement is preferred.

ASTIGMATISM AND CONTACTS

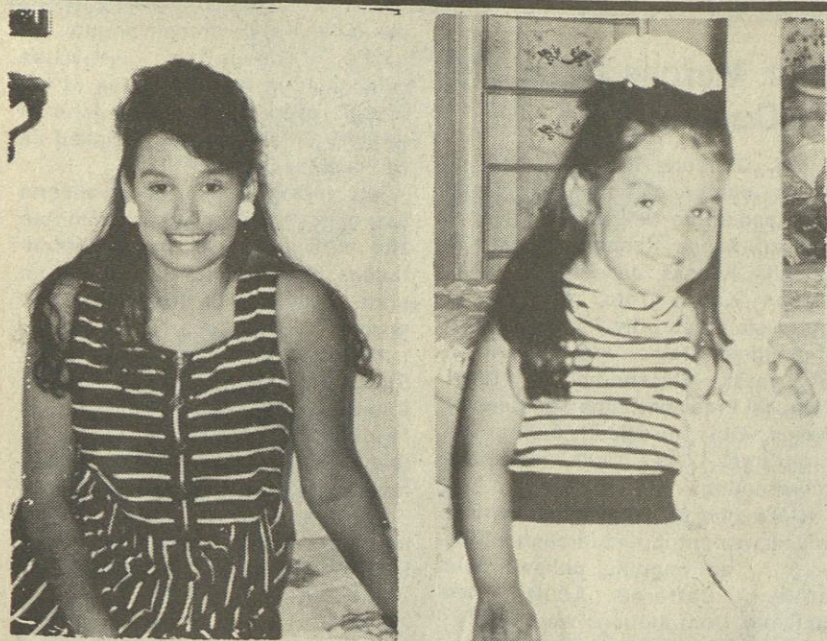

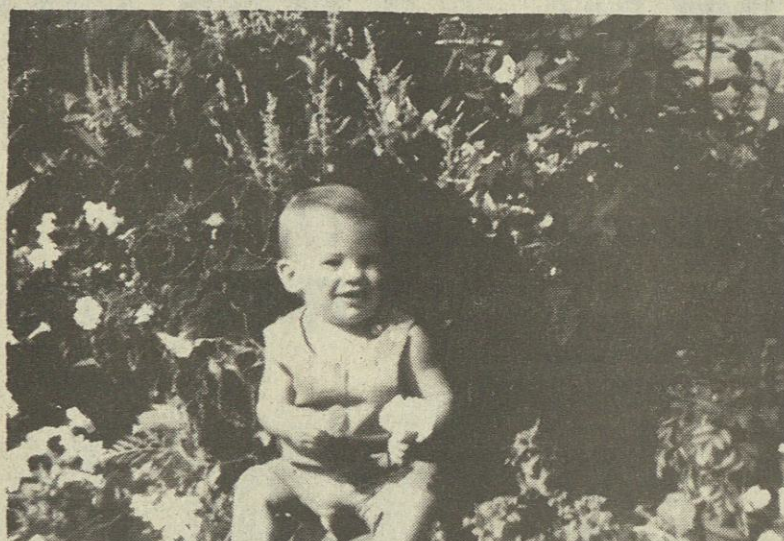

4-H Communicates

EXHIBITING VEGETABLES
AND FLOWERS

4-H members have the opportunity to exhibit their flowers and vegetables during the Tishomingo County Fair, October 2-6. Following are a few tips for exhibiting that might make your exhibits more attractive.

Remember, 4-H members, don't get so caught up in the competition that you exhibit flowers or vegetables that are past their prime and too immature to be of any quality.

When gathering exhibits from your garden take a pair of pruning shears or scissors with you so the vegetables and flowers can be cut and not pulled from the plants. This may come as a surprise, but most vegetables should be exhibited with a short piece of stem attached.

This holds true for snap beans, lima beans, cucumbers and summer squash as well as eggplant, peppers and green tomatoes. With you tugging at one end to pull a vegetable from the plant and the plant holding on, chances are what comes off in your hand won't have a stem and may not be the entire vegetable.

A cantaloupe isn't exhibited with a

piece of stem because as the melon ripens the stem separates from the melon. Any cantaloupe with a firmly attached stem is a green melon. A watermelon or honeydew melon should have a short piece of stem.

Always harvest more than the exhibit calls for just in case one of the items gets damaged. If you need 12 pods of hot pepper, take about 15 to allow for damage. But, remember, only exhibit the correct number.

If the exhibit calls for three marigolds, put only three flowers in the container whether they are on the same stem or three different stems. However, if the exhibit calls for three stems of marigolds, then the exhibit may consist of more than three flowers but only three stems.

Cut flowers with the stems as long as possible. You can always shorten them, but you can't add to them.

Stems are important to flower exhibits and so are the leaves. All leaves should be free of dirt, disease and insect damage.

When an exhibit consists of more than one vegetable specimen on a plate or flower in a container, the key to success is to have them all as similar as possible; the same size, shape, color and stage of maturity. Take the time to count and recount the number of items called for and those exhibited. If the entry calls for 12 pods of pepper, exhibiting 13 or 14 doesn't make it better. It is cause for disqualification or at the least the loss of one ribbon place.

Place flowers in arrangements individually to avoid the impression of a handful of stems jammed in a jar. It takes time to make an attractive floral arrangement, so make your arrangements at home and bring them to the show, and allow yourself plenty of time to prepare and enter your exhibits before judging begins.

Prevention & Removal of Excess Ear Wax

The accumulation of excess cerumen or ear wax occurs in many individuals. Wax may accumulate due to overactive wax producing glands, narrow or curved ear canals, or secretion of a wax that is either harder or softer than normal. Ear wax may become impacted and will be difficult to remove when it is pushed deep into the ear canal. Generally, there is no wax in the inside half of the ear canal unless it has been pushed there.

The best approach to excess ear wax is to go to a physician for professional removal of the wax with the proper instruments. Do not attempt to remove the wax with a cotton-tipped stick applicator or swab. Wax pushed next to the ear drum can cause loss of hearing. Also, accumulated wax may trap water inside the ear, producing problems during the warm summer months when many individuals go swimming.

In some instances, accumulation of wax in the external portion of the ear canal can be prevented. Many nonprescription wax-softening products contain propylene glycol or glycerin. Other wax-softening substances include olive oil, mineral oil, and diluted hydrogen peroxide solution. After the wax has been softened, it should be removed by gently irrigating the ear canal with warm water, using a rubber ear syringe.

willow leaves are a particular favorite of these pests.

It doesn't take much of a touch to get stung, so don't.

BEEF MANAGEMENT

Most beef producers in Tishomingo County need to be in a good "frame of mind" right now. Herds can only be helped by timely and sound management programs.

Cull old cows from the herd. Don't gamble that they will breed back or produce a calf in 1991.

Also get rid of the "no mouth" cows. Check the teeth on the herd when running them through the chute. If a cow does not have any bottom teeth or if those teeth are short and peg-shaped, she needs to be sold.

Cows should have teats of normal size and a frame in good condition. If the udders are bad, those cows will not be as productive as they could be.

Life is too short to handle a mean cow that may be worth more money at a sale today than later. If you say, "I ought to sell that cow," then do it.

LAWN ENEMY

Chinch bugs are some of the most damaging insects a lawn in Tishomingo County can have. If you find these insects in your lawn, you need to begin control measures as soon as possible.

These insects do the most damage when they suck the grass juices. In the process of sucking, the bugs secrete poison, which causes yellow, brown patches in the lawn.

Chinch bugs are sunshine lovers, and they feed on grass where the sunshine hits. Check for these insects once a week or more when the sun is shining. You can find them by sliding your shoe through the lawn sod and watching adults and nymphs crawl over your foot.

Nymphs are on-twentieth of an inch long. They are a reddish color and have a single white band on the backs.

Adult chinch bugs are one-fifth of an inch long. They are black and have white patches on their wings.

Treat your entire lawn with an approved insecticide. Wet the lawn thoroughly with water and apply the insecticide. This will help the insecticide penetrate into the grass.

If you have heavy infestations of chinch bugs, you need to treat again in two weeks to kill nymphs that may have hatched. Some of the more effective insecticides to use are Aspon, Sevin, Diazinon, Dursban, or Ethion. Read product labels carefully and follow suggested application rates.

A DROP IN TIME

As we move into August, our cotton farmers in Tishomingo County must pay close attention to the water needs of the plants. August in Mississippi is usually the hottest and driest month of the year. That's why many cotton farmers consider irrigation a necessity, and not a luxury.

BAGGING THE CULPRIT

Too often, homeowners in Tishomingo County wait until their ornamentals have been nearly stripped of foliage before they pinpoint bagworms as the culprits.

Bagworms cause considerable damage to ornamentals at this time of year. You can control the bagworms with insecticides such as Sevin, Malathion, or Diazinon.

Spider mites prey on ornamentals too. They suck sap from the shrubs and trees, causing leaves to change from green to a yellowish gray. Uncontrolled, these pests can kill young ornamentals in a single season. Older plants and shrubs may slowly die

over several seasons.

Hose down ornamentals with water to break up spider mite webbing. You can also apply the same insecticides for them that were used to control bagworms.

News From Ochsner

Last October a 68-year old Mississippi woman awoke one morning to what she described to her family as "the worst headache of my life."

A CAT scan at the local hospital showed a massive hemorrhage, bleeding in the space surrounding the brain. She was transferred to Ochsner Foundation Hospital in New Orleans where an angiogram revealed a large aneurysm, a permanent swelling of an artery caused by weakness in the artery's wall, at the junction of two large blood vessels in front of her upper brain stem. Its location made it difficult to reach to correct in surgery, but, in a rare procedure Ochsner surgeons successfully operated on the aneurysm.

Aneurysms can form anywhere. "Think of an aneurysm as the bald spot on a tire," explains Dr. Rand M. Voorhies, neurosurgeon at the Ochsner Clinic in New Orleans. The most common and troublesome sites are arteries of the brain and of the aorta, the large major artery through which the heart pumps blood to the rest of the body.

"Each hemorrhage from an aneurysm is potentially life-

threatening," notes Dr. Timothy Molony, Neuro-otologist at the Ochsner Clinic who worked on the case with Dr. Voorhies.

An aneurysm's location will usually dictate the route the surgical team takes. In this particular case it was determined that the best approach was through the patient's ear.

The procedure performed at Ochsner is known as the transcochlear approach and involved the complete removal of the bone surrounding the inner ear and moving the facial nerve which supplies motion to that half of the face.

Observes Dr. Molony, "These techniques require cooperation between the neurosurgeon and the neuro-otologist who each have specific expertise in managing disorders of this area."

The entire operation was 11 hours. During the first four hours the neuro-otologist made the route to the aneurysm more accessible for the neurosurgeon. An incision was made behind the ear and the mastoid bone and inner ear were removed. The neurosurgeon was then able to clip the aneurysm which looked like a balloon at the junction of the artery. A permanent metal clip was clamped at the base of the aneurysm, which caused it to collapse and allowed the blood to flow continuously through the artery. A postoperative angiogram confirmed a successful procedure.

The usual neurosurgical approaches to aneurysms, says Dr. Molony, are from behind, moving or retracting the brain out of the way, or going from either the front or above. Both routes are extremely long reaches through very narrow exposure. By going directly through the ear the "key to this procedure is to be able to gain access to the front of the brain stem with no retraction on the brain," explains Dr. Molony. Because the brain is soft tissue retraction produces pressure on the brain and can result in unpredicted damage.

"This team approach is relatively new," explains Dr. Molony. "In this particular procedure the neuro-otologist gives the neurosurgeon the

extra dimension of going directly through the ear to handle various problems, whether it's aneurysms, tumors or work on nerves."
