County To Vote For School Board Members Nov. 6th

Candidates interested in serving on the school board of the new Tishomingo County school district have until October 8 to complete the qualifying process.

Voters in Tishomingo County will elect the new five-member board at the November 6 general election, less than three months away.

According to Jamie Barnette, attorney for the Tishomingo County School Board, the opening date for candidates to qualify was Wednesday, August 8.

The election was contingent upon receiving approval from the U.S. Justice Department, which was received last week.

The new board will be comprised of the trustee from each supervisory district. Trustees will be elected for six years, and the trustees from districts 3 and 4 elected to four-year terms. The trustee from District 2 will serve two years.

Potential candidates are required to file a petition with the county election commissioner not more than 90 days nor less than 30 days prior to Nov. 6. October 8 will be the deadline for qualification, Barnette said.

The petition must contain the names of at least 150 qualified electors of the county. The person

receiving the highest number of votes in the general election will be declared the winner, Barnette said.

Also on the Nov. 6 election day, voters from the Tishomingo County school district will elect two new school board members to serve until the new board assumes office on July 1, 1991.

The terms of District 5 trustee Harold Sparks and District 3 trustee Kary Dailey must both be put up for election on Nov. 6.

Candidates for these positions will serve only until July. Any candidate for the office of county trustee must file a petition signed by at least 50 qualified electors, Barnette said. September 7 will be the qualifying deadline for candidates.

Because voters will be selecting members for both school boards and the supervisor districts do not coincide with the current Tishomingo County School Board districts, the election could become confusing, Barnette said.

There is also the possibility that candidates could file petitions for election to both boards, he said, which would be complicated for poll workers giving out ballots.

County election commissioner Cliff Wigginton said that the commission would be working to organize and publicize the specifics of the election prior to November.

Vocational Courses Offered At Iuka High

Students attending Iuka High School may choose from a variety of vocational course offerings.

Basic Vocational Skills is an entry level course designed to introduce ninth grade students to the vocational field and to encourage career exploration and planning.

Child Care I and Child Care II both include skills for students who are pursuing careers in child care or related fields.

Cooperative Education I and Cooperative Education II allow students to combine the world of work and their educational pursuits. Students receive credit for on-the-job training at area work stations (community employers) and related classroom instruction at IHS.

In addition, students may take advantage of the many vocational courses which are offered at the Tishomingo County Vocational Center.

Basic Vocational Skills offers one unit of credit. Child Care I, Child Care II, and courses at the Tishomingo County Vo-Tech Center offer 2 units of credit for each course. Cooperative Education I and Cooperative Education II offers 2 1/2

units of credit for each course.

Ownership Finalized

Contractor Paid For Office Building

After several months of negotiations, ownership of the Lockheed Aerojet temporary office building has been finalized, and the contractor on the project has been paid.

The property sale was closed Tuesday, August 7. The Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority acquired the title to the building and 14.07 acres from Vanderheyden Construction Company for a \$2.68 million agreed purchase price, said attorney Mike Cooke.

Cooke's office was engaged to handle the closing transactions for the Authority.

The Authority purchased the land and building with the proceeds of a grant received from the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors.

The grant was approved in June and the money placed in an interest-bearing account, with Vanderheyden and the subcontractors receiving a portion of the interest, Cooke said.

In addition to Vanderheyden, payments were also made to the subcontractors on the construction project, and to the City of Iuka and Ripley Screen Co. for parcels of land.

The 80,000-sq.-ft. building was constructed in the Iuka Industrial Park to serve as temporary office space for Lockheed and Aerojet employees working on the NASA rocket motor plant at Yellow Creek.

The City of Iuka owned 5.1 acres and Ripley Screen Co. held 8.9 acres of the site. Both tracts were acquired by Vanderheyden after problems with land titles were cleared up in Tishomingo County Chancery Court.

The Authority is now leasing the

building to Lockheed. The lease is open-ended, with an option to continue past the agreed terms, said Gene Jourdan, Authority chairman. Lockheed plans to occupy the facility for 18 to 24 months.

The Authority, which operates as an arm of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation, approved all the payments made last week, said TCDF Director Mack Wadkins.

Now that the Authority has possession of the building, it will need an insurance policy for the building and property, Cooke said.

Lockheed was given the okay to occupy the facility after a joint agreement was reached in mid-June between the Authority, Vanderheyden, and the subcontractors on the project.

The delay in concluding the final purchase was attributed to the problems with securing titles to portions of the land.

Lockheed and Aerojet began moving employees into the building in late June. About 100 Aerojet workers have already arrived from California, and an additional 100 are expected by the end of September. Fifty area residents have taken jobs at the facility, with hiring to continue.

The contract for construction of the building was awarded to Vanderheyden in February by the county supervisors. S&J Steelbuilders of Booneville successfully appealed the supervisors' action in circuit court when the firm's low bid was rejected in favor of Vanderheyden's bid. S&J is seeking further court action to assess the amount of profit the company lost when it failed to acquire the bid.

Consolidation Approved By Dept. of Justice

The consolidation of the Iuka Special Municipal Separate School District and the Tishomingo County School District was recently approved by the U.S. Department of Justice.

A letter of approval from the department's civil rights division was received Friday, August 10, by attorneys representing both the city and county school boards.

The Iuka/Tishomingo County document was submitted to Washington on June 6, 1990, to receive preclearance in regard to the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

The consolidation plan has now been approved by voters in the school districts, the state Board of Education, and the Department of Justice.

The next procedure is required of the Iuka school district, which must file a lawsuit in U.S. Federal Court in regard to a desegregation order dating back to the 1960s. According to city school board chairman Nick Phillips, the proposed changes in the overall districting plan require the court action.

The legal procedure will be initiated by Mike Cooke, attorney for the Iuka School board, Phillips said.

In other developments, the city and county school boards have received approval from required parties on their interlocal cooperation agreement, made by and between the two districts.

The purpose of the agreement is to provide a basis for joint actions required by the two units in making decisions for the new countywide school district, Phillips said.

The planning and development for the consolidated school district has involved financial decisions, creating of joint funds and accounts, contracting for professional services, and establishment of policies.

The agreement will be effective until July 1, 1991, the date consolidation is to go into effect, unless terminated earlier by the parties involved.

The interlocal agreement was approved by the state Attorney General, Department of Economic and Community Development, and the state superintendent of education. The document will now be filed with the Department of Audit, Secretary of State, and the Tishomingo County Chancery Clerk.

Both boards met last week to approve revised plans necessary to keep the new magnet high school within budgetary requirements.

These plans have been submitted for DECD and the state board of education's approval, Phillips said.

The revisions called for elimination of some of the school's added features and a reduction in the size of the school, Phillips said.

Bids to begin site development for the new magnet high school will be accepted until August 21. A contract for construction of a physical education facility at Belmont has been awarded to a Booneville construction company.

The Mississippi Major Economic Impact Authority has awarded Tishomingo County a \$7 million grant for the project, with local funds required to make up the remaining \$3 million. Belmont is to receive \$1 million for construction and renovation projects.

T.C.E.P.A. Election To Be Held Saturday

An election will be held Saturday, August 18, 1990, to elect four (4) members for positions on the Board of Directors of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association. One director is to be elected for a three (3) year term for each of the following supervisory districts: 1st District, 2nd District, 3rd District and the Area-At-Large. Members of the Association may vote for one person for each position on the ballot.

The following members have been nominated for positions on the

Board:

1st District: Shelby Cliff Daniel; 2nd District: Lucien Epperson; 3rd District: Millard Kent, David Robinson and James N. (Red) Thornton; Area-At-Large: Paul Whitlock.

The polling places will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. so that members may vote. Members may vote at any poll regardless of their place of residence. The polls are as follows: Belmont City Hall, Burnsville City Hall, Tishomingo County Courthouse, Midway School Building, and Tishomingo Bank.

Literacy Grant Approved

Congressman Jamie Whitten has been advised that the Appalachian Regional Commission has approved a \$57,073 grant to help improve workplace literacy in Northeast Mississippi.

The ARC funds, which will be matched with \$80,000 in Job Training and Partnership Act funds and \$34,260 for a total project of \$272,341, will be used for a mobile laboratory for training individuals in Tishomingo, Prentiss, Alcorn, Tishomingo, and Benton counties.

Northeast Mississippi Community Services, Inc. will use the funds to provide state-of-the-art training through computers to help individuals improve basic skills in reading and math as well as providing other employment training.


They were so happy that we came and that they could have a part in our program.

TEACH YOUR CHILD NUTRITION SKILLS

When the young adult leaves home for the first time, parents find themselves worrying about their child's well being. This includes the young adult's nutritional well being. Many young adults leave home without the experience or know-how to provide for their food needs.

The school-age years are an excellent time to make sure that your children acquire those skills. They can put academic skills into practice as well. For example, in learning the basics of cooking, children must read directions for recipes, measure out ingredients, set the timer or watch the clock, divide out portions, and learn the meanings of various cooking terms and the purpose of

cooking utensils.

Children also can practice reading and math skills while helping with the grocery shopping. Teach them what kinds of useful information they can learn from the label, such as what ingredients the product contains and whether the food is packed in water, syrup or oil.

Show them nutrition information labels on something interesting to them such as breakfast cereals. Let them hunt for cereals with the least sugar and have them check for added vitamins. Have them find the net weight of the cereal box and select the best size for your family. Help them compare unit prices of various

EYE SAFETY AND WORK

Whether you work with machines as part of your job, at home on weekends, or evenings as a hobby, you should always make sure your eyes are properly protected.

What protection do you need? Well, different eye protection equipment is needed for different tasks. Eye protection should be selected on the basis of the protection needed for specific hazards.

All corrective lenses prescribed by doctors of optometry are, by law, impact-resistant. Impact-resistant spectacles provide limited frontal protection against flying particles. However, "impact-resistant" lenses will break. "Safety glasses" with lenses meeting industrial safety lens standards offer greater protection for the worker.

Safety thickness goggles offer both frontal and side protection. They may be worn over regular glasses and offer excellent protection against flying particles.

Spotlight on Niacin (Nicotinic Acid)

A deficiency of niacin is associated with *pellagra* - a condition that once was rampant in Italy, Spain, and the southern United States. In *pellagra*, there are three major problems - called the three D's: *dermatitis* (skin inflammation and rash), *dementia* (mental and emotional problems), and *diarrhea*. Because the B vitamins interact, other B vitamins also are probably involved in *pellagra* - including thiamin and riboflavin.

Niacin is present in a variety of foods, and it is now known that *pellagra* is associated with a very poor diet - especially one that is composed primarily of corn. Interestingly, the amino acid *tryptophan* is converted into niacin. And, although corn contains much of this amino acid, it cannot be absorbed from the gastrointestinal tract. In Mexico, where corn is a major dietary component, corn typically is soaked in lye prior to cooking. This process makes *tryptophan* absorbable, and *pellagra* is uncommon. Animal protein contains *tryptophan* and, therefore, is a good source of niacin.

Both nicotinic acid and nicotinamide have niacin activity. Nicotinamide does not cause the flushing and burning sensation that frequently is caused by nicotinic acid. Niacin in large doses, but not nicotinamide, will sometimes lower blood cholesterol levels.

VEGETARIAN SPAGHETTI

- 6 tablespoons oil
- 1 cup chopped bell pepper
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1 cup shredded carrots
- 4 cups chopped eggplant
- 2 cups chopped yellow squash
- 1 quart tomatoes
- 1 (1 1/2-oz.) package spaghetti sauce mix

Senator Cochran Calls For Economic Pressure On Iraq

The United States should use diplomatic efforts and economic power to show its displeasure over the recent Iraqi invasion of Kuwait, U.S. Senator Thad Cochran said.

"I think we should be very disturbed by the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait, and the continued threat that they pose to other countries in the Middle East," he said.

U.S. Naval forces are available in the region and will be prepared to act if the interests of the United States are threatened by an escalation of the invasion activity, he said.

"We should send a clear signal that the United States is very seriously concerned about these action, and that we may be willing to act in the case of further escalation by Iraq of activity that threatens U.S. interests," he said.


Senator Cochran urged the con-

ced use of diplomatic and economic pressure from U.S. allies and partners to convince the Iraqi government it should "cease and desist" from any further armed aggression in the area.

"We hope that we will see peaceful resolution of differences that Iraq has with its neighbors. We will try to be an influence in regard," Senator Cochran said.

The Senator's comments came during a news conference with Mississippi reporters Friday morning.

Sealants

Q. What are pit and fissure sealants and why does my child need them?

A. To prevent decay, the dentist can apply a clear or shaded plastic coating to the biting or chewing surfaces of back teeth. These molars have natural grooves or depressions (pits and fissures) where plaque and food particles collect. The sealant acts as a barrier, protecting the deep, prone areas of the back teeth from plaque and acids. Studies have shown the sealants can reduce tooth decay by as much as 90 percent, and the American Dental Association is recommending sealants for all children.

Application is usually simple and fast, often requiring only a few minutes for each tooth. The teeth to be sealed are cleaned, then swabbed with a solution that helps the sealant adhere to the tooth surface. The sealant is then brushed onto the tooth and allowed to harden. Some sealants require exposure to a special light to help them harden; however, other sealants do not.

The sealants should be checked regularly by the dentist, since they do wear away and need to be reapplied. If lost, sealants should be replaced immediately, since they are effective only as long as they are retained on the teeth.



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

**Verification
Of Residence**

A Verification of Residence policy was passed by the Mississippi State Board of Education on April 20, 1990. This policy requires that all public school districts in Mississippi verify the residency of students attending the district.

Effective with the 1990-91 school year in the Tishomingo County School District, parents, legal guardians, or other adults seeking to enroll students must provide documentation which will verify that each student resides in the school district. (Students approved for legal transfer from another school district are exempt from the residency process).

During the first year of enrollment, each parent seeking to enroll a student must verify residency by submitting any two of the following valid items:

- (1) Filed Homestead Exemption Application
- (2) Mortgage documents or property deed
- (3) Apartment or home lease
- (4) Utility bills
- (5) Driver's license
- (6) Voter precinct identification
- (7) Automobile registration
- (8) Affidavit and/or receiving a personal visit by a designated school official

In addition to the above listed documents, other items may be used which will objectively and unequivocally establish the residence of the student within the district to the satisfaction of the local school district.

After the 1990-91 school year, new enrollees and students whose home address has changed will be required to verify residence. Continuing students whose residence has not changed must submit a declaration certifying that the previously verified residence remains the same. The school district may at any time require additional verification.



sributes food directly from centers in every county, where other states issue vouchers for participants to get food from retail stores.

Adapting Mississippi's method, other states began contracting for infant formula based on highest rebate bid. Last year Congress mandated this kind of cost containment, which saved enough money to add nearly one million participants to the program nationally.

Formula companies have raised their re-bids this year, some by as much as 100 percent. This problem, combined with greater food inflation than predicted, forced 29 states to cut back on participation or borrow against next year's appropriation.

Congress passed emergency legislation in June, authorizing states to use up to three percent of next year's appropriation to keep from cutting participants off. Barr expects Congress to appropriate only enough

money to sustain the WIC Program at current levels.

Food inflation boosted the cost of a Mississippi WIC food package by more than 11 percent this year, Barr said. With the cost of formula for 28,000 infants up 55 percent, the Mississippi WIC Program's growth will slow considerably.
