Is Area Feeling NASA Growth?

Some statistics show that luka and the surrounding area are experiencing growth, while other figures reflect little or no change yet.

Over the summer, between June 1 and August 31, the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association recorded 150 new customers on its records. In comparison to 240 total customers for the whole calendar year 1989, this was quite an increase in just three months, said TCEPA manager Robert Grisham.

In luka, operating permits have been issued to 31 new businesses since January of this year. These include service stations, convenience stores, builders, and other businesses. Another 17 selfemployed workers -- plumbers and electricians - obtained permits to provide services in luka, city hall

In the real estate market, sales have been up for Ables Real Estate in luka. Dianne Ables said that her sales have increased about 60 percent over last year. The majority of sales have been to newcomers, with most of the homes in Tishomingo County, she

Estate said that her firm has been busier in the last month, working with several new families in the area.

The market for resort homes continues to be very high, reports Beth Davis, broker for Paul Callens Real Estate. There is a shortage of rental property, however, which may be hurting the area, she said.

P.O. Beard Real Estate reports that about half of its recent sales have been to newcombers.

Enrollment at luka High School is up this fall, but only slightly, IHS principal Aubrey Ray said. Grades 7-12 have 492 students, as compared to 473 for fall of 1989. The increase is not really significant, Ray said, since the size of classes changes each

luka eating establishments seem to be reaping benefits of a heavier lunch crowd. Full parking lots are evident during the noon hour at Will's Restaurant, Pizza Hut, Bet's Family Restaurant, and others. Norma Vandiver, owner of Country Cupboard, said her lunch business was "very

Several local churches have been heavily visited by newcomers, with

A spokesperson for luka Baptist said that many new residents were probably "visiting around" before relocating their membership.

No progress has occurred on two new motels planned for luka. Groundbreaking was held for a Days Inn Motel at the intersection of Hwy. 25 bypass and Hwy. 72 several months ago. Work on the project is scheduled to proceed next week. A Key West Inn planned for Hwy. 72 just west of the city limits is awaiting approval of a state Community Development Block Grant to the city of luka to help laun-

Plans for the new luka hospital are still under negotiation, said county development foundation director Mack Wadkins. How ownership of the facility will be handled has not been determined, but the \$5.8-million complex should soon be under construction in luka.

Unemployment figures for the county rose in July, after a drop to 14.4 percent in June. The state statistics are not a true reflection of the county's workforce, however, because of layoffs by certain industries in the county, Wadkins ex-

Study Shows Impact Of NASA In Area

the long-range impact of the NASA plant at Yellow Creek predicts that the project will bring 647 new residents to Mississippi. However, this tigure is probably not accurate. according to a Tishomingo County development official.

The study, released last week, shows that the plant will bring 1,075 new residents to three Alabama counties and 654 to Tennessee. The Quad Cities area currently has a higher population than the other areas because that is where the jobs are, County Development Foundation director Mack L. Wadkins said. If jobs are created in Mississippi, this is where the people will choose to live, he said.

Conducted by Mississippi State University, Memphis State University, and the University of North Alabama, and regional planning and development districts, the study also predicts an addition of 1,800 jobs in 12 tristate counties surrounding the advanced solid rocket motor plant.

The new families will bring an estimated 810 school age children to the region, requiring as many as 45

estimates.

More than \$33 million annually will be generated in new retail sales and about \$460,000 in additional tax revenue for the region.

The study identified and quantified the predicted impacts on locally provided public services and facilities to be expected in the targeted com-

Total population impact for Tishomingo County was predicted at 242, with 121 in new population, 46 new households, 18 pre-school age children, and 41 school age children.

The population forecast for 1995 in Tishomingo County is 18,570. A second figure, 18,691, was forecast to represent 1995 plus newcomers to

According to the study, approximately 50 percent of the total new workforce (900) persons) can be expected to be hired from the local labor market. Of those hired from the local area, approximately 50 percent (450) persons) may be hired from the unemployed. The remaining are expected to be hired from existing local

the tri-state region located within a 50-mile radius of the plant site.

Although the plant is estimated to bring \$50 million a year in new paychecks to the region, local governments may feel a financial pinch, the study suggests.

Many people moving into the area will be demanding services, said Luchy Burrell of Memphis State's economic development center.

Burrell said that state and local governments may have to spend as much as \$2 million just for new classrooms, teachers, and improved curriculum to meet the educational needs of the new families in the

Tishomingo County is constructing a new magnet high school as part of improvements connected with the NASA plant, at a cost of \$7 million in state funds and \$3 million in local

The study was designed to provide a basic framework from which local and state governments can plan needed expansions of services, a spokesman from the University of North Alabama explained.

County Area Included In Aerospace Triangle

The location of the NASA plant near Yellow Creek could draw the region into the southwest point of an aerospace triangle based on high technology industries and research facilities in the Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee region, a recent economic impact study said.

The results of the study, conducted to assess the long-range impact of the ASRM project, indicated that the aerospace industry has had a presence in the tri-state area for quite some time, possibly starting with the establishment of the Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, AL, in the

The triangle includes Nashville, where a large air craft structures plant is located. Also within the triangle is Tullahoma, TN, site of the University of Tennessee Space Institute and the Air Force Arnold Engineer and Development Center.

The creation of the predicted 1,000 new jobs by the ASRM plant in Tishomingo County will provide the third point in an imaginary triangle formed by 2,600 jobs in Nashville, and 4,794 in Huntsville, said Luchy Burrell of Memphis State University's

Regional Economic Development

Since the area represents a concentration of highly skilled and highly paid aerospace manufacturing employment, it could be designated as

the Aerospace Triangle. The concept could be used as an economic development tool to market the area to new industries requiring a high quality labor force, Burrell explained. The concept was contained in a year-long report released by the

Mississippi State University, Memphis State University, the University of North Alabama, and regional planning and development districts to predict how the NASA plant will impact 12 counties in three states.

Nashville has been the site of an aircraft plant since World War II, and the Air Force has been conducting research into supersonic aircraft design, rocket nose cones, and aircraft and rocket engines at Tullahoma since 1948, Burrell wrote in the study. This activity should be exploited to attract additional high-tech manufacturing and research. The growing automobile industry presence in the region could complement the

aerospace manufacturing and research, she said.

Burrell suggested that a sophisticated communications network might help spread the benefits of high-tech activity within the triangle. A system, such as a fiber optic system, would allow people to work in their homes, using computer terminals and facsimile machines to communicate with offices in large

Small towns would be able to enjoy many of the benefits of economic development without many of its problems. Small communities would get a better educated population and labor force. increased personal income with its corresponding purchasing power, increased property tax base and retail sales without the corresponding increase in traffic congestion, air, and noise pollution,

The study area includes Alcorn, Prentiss, Tippah, and Tishomingo counties in Mississippi; Colbert, Franklin and Lauderdale counties in Alabama; and Chester, Hardeman, Hardin, McNairy, and Wayne counties in Tennessee.

PESTS IN THE HOME

Crickets are wandering into Tishomingo County homes. Use aerosol sprays containing Malathion, Diazinon or Sevin to control them. These same products can be used to control love bugs and other small flying insects outside the home.

Treatments may have to be repeated as necesary if these insects persist. Don't overtreat in these situations, however. Excessive use of any insecticide in and around the home is not recommended.

Wasp and yellowjacket activity in the county is on the increase. Wasps make paper nests and hang them from roof borders or to the shelteree areas. Yellowjackets also have paper nests, but they build them in the ground or other hidden locations.

Pyrethrin or Resmethrin sprays work well when applied directly into wasp or yellowjacket nests. Treat nests at night when these insects have gathered at the nest. Remember to wear protective clothing before sprays are applied.

Fleas are a problem in homes this fall. Remove fleas and fleas eggs by thouroughly vacuuming the house. Put the contents of the vacuum bag in an air-tight plastic bag and discard. A household spray containing 2 percent malathion can help rid a house of fleas too.

Aspirin: Many Forms and Many Uses

Aspirin has been called the "miracle drug." Each year, tons of aspirin are consumed for the treatment and/or prevention of a variety of health conditions. It is reported that about 19 billion dosage units of aspirin are taken each year.

The best known use for aspirin is as a pain reliever. Aspirin acts at the pain site to prevent the local nerve endings from becoming sensitized to pain. As a fever reducer, aspirin adjusts the body's thermostat which is located in the brain. As an inflammatory agent, aspirin is useful in the relief of the inflammation associated with rheumatoid arthritis and osteoarthritis. Aspirin has been found to have a favorable effect on blood platelets. Studies have shown the antiplatelet aggregation action to be useful in preventing blockage of heart vessels following bypass surgery and in preventing certain types of strokes.

Aspirin is available in a number of dosage forms. Plain uncoated tablets have been sold for many years. Coated tablets are easier to swallow. Buffered tablets contain a special agent which helps tablets dissolve more quickly than regular tablets, producing less stomach irritation. Enteric coated tablets dissolve in the small intestine, decreasing stomach irritation. Chewable and time-release aspirin tablets also are available.

WHAT'S IN A FILLING? The filling material a dentist uses in filling a tooth is determined by the location of the affected tooth in the mouth and the extent of decay.

Dental amalgam - a silver filling material -- was developed in France in the 1820s and shortly after introduced in the U.S. The basic technique to restore decayed teeth has been used for the past 150 years. Dental amalgam is the material most often selected to fill decayed teeth, used in about 75% of all single-tooth fillings. It's estimated that about 100 million Americans have at least one such

To produce dental amalgam, one or more metals -- silver, copper, tin, and sometimes zinc are combined with mercury to form a pliable mass. The mercury triggers a chemical reaction when combined with silver or other metals that allows the filling to harden after it's been placed into the cavity. When mercury is combined with metals to form dental amalgams, its toxic properties are rendered inert and essentially harmless. Research has shown that for the majority of dental patients, mercury-containing amalgams pose no health hazard.

To help dentists choose from among the many brands of dental amalgam on the market, the American Dental Association has established an acceptance program that examines these products for safety and effectiveness.

In extremely rare instances, some patients have developed hypersensitivity or allergic reactions from contact with mercury. These reactions are usually seen as skin rashes, similar to other common allergies. If you have such an allergy, your dentist will select another restorative material.

Dental restorations are affected by the constantly changing conditions in the mouth. Following proper oral hygiene procedures at home and visiting the dentist regularly for examinations will help prolong the life of your dental restorations.

> **Resolving Consumer Problems** With Complaint Letters

Learning to be skillful consumers is one of the objectives of the 4-H Consumer Education Project. Through this 4-H project members learn how to get the best value for their dollar. They also learn how to get satisfaction when a problem arises such as your new "preshrunk" jeans come out of the dryer a size too small, or your new tape skips every fourth beat. You don't have to write it

off - you can write a letter. Writing a complaint letter to a retailer, manufacturer or trade association is an effective way of registering a complaint and getting satisfaction. Learning when it is appropriate to write a letter, and how to most adequately do so, are essential steps to becoming a skillful con-

Make sure the complaint is valid. Many problems result from improper care or use of the product by the consumer. But if you followed instruction and something still goes wrong, a letter is in order.

If the address for whom to write cannot be found on the product, accompanying literature or sales receipt, finding out where to write may be the most difficult part of the problem. Librarians should be able to help find the manufacturer's address and perhaps the name of a contact person.

If you are unsure of the product's maker, check with a local Better Business Bureau or the Mississippi Attorney General's Office.

A complaint letter should be to-thepoint and preferably no longer than one page. It should include the consumer's name and address; the name of the product; any serial, model or identification numbers; when and where the product was purchased; the price of the product; and the consumer's method of payment.

Describe the problem in detail but without sarcasm or outrage. Venting anger is not likely to help.

Just as important as the description of the problem is a statement of what you want done about the problem, whether it be to have the item repaired, replaced or to receive a Finally, explain what you will do if

you do not get an appropriate response to your complaint, such as contact the Attorney General's Office, Better Business Bureau or an appropriate licensing agency. If appropriate, attach copies of warranties or sales receipts to the

complaint letter. However, never send the actual documents, as they could Not every complaint brings the

desired result, but a well-written let-

ter often resolves the problem. So next time a product fails to live up its promise, don't write it off-write

September has been designated as pasture improvement month; so this ould be the ideal time to plant some winter grazing. Perhaps the best combination for the area is tall fescue and either Regal white clover or Kenland red clover. This combination of fescue and clover should be seeded on a prepared seedbed, you should plant 20 pounds of tall fescue with three pounds of Regal white or 6 to 8 pounds of Kenland red clovers per acre. After seeding a cultipacker or similar tool should be used to lightly cover the seed. This should be sown between September 1 and November 1.

Before seeding tall fescue and clover a soil test will provide information as to the amount of fertilizer and lime needed for establishment. In the absent of soil test use 250 pounds of 8-24-24 and one tone lime per

Fescue has the ability to survive under a wide range of conditions such as high and low fertility, but since clove produces nitrogen for the fescue a high rate of nitrogen fertilizer added will evenually kill out your clover stand.

The ideal stage to graze a fescueclover mixture is to turn on at a sixinch height and take off when grazed down to three inches high. This is, of course, not always possible; but rotating the cattle among three or more pastures will greatly benefit the grazing procedure. With a rotation

H.L. Shook **Urged Caution** For The Future

The late H.L. Shook, former administrator of the luka Special Municipal Separate School District wrote the following article to be printed in the 1964 school annual as an inspiration to the youth of our area. Now 26 years later one of our readers wants to share these words of wisdom with us today.

Mr. Shook began working with the luka School System in 1951 and retired in 1966 as a result of his diligent work our school, youth and community prospered greatly under his guidances and leadership.

We are living in a period when society is plagued with iconoclasts who would destroy ideals and principles centuries old and replace them with theories untried and unproved. This seems particularly true in the areas of government, political concepts, and social relationships.

It is my hope that luka High School may be providing all of its students with means of stabilization that you who allow your school to give some direction to your lives may find merit

in the old didactic couplet: "Be not the first by whom the new is tried, Nor yet the last to lay the old

In short, as I see it, some of these new concepts are full of danger and eventual destruction. Be cautious. A Tribute To A Teacher

A great man-Herman L. Hendrix-died on September 10, 1990. His name does not appear in "Who Is Who In America" or the "Guiness Book of Records" or among "Fortune 500's" listing of the nation's wealthiest men-His name does appear, however, at the top of a more important list--the list of teachers who have made a difference in the lives of their students. Mr. Hendrix was a master teacher. He was a Mississippi man-a resident of Burnsville and a graduate of Mississippi State. It was Alabama, though, that had a good fortune to have him as a teacher for almost thirty years. He retired after the 1989-90 school year.

I first met the "new red-haired freckled-faced teacher" in the fall of 1961was 14 when I walked into his first year algebra class at Cherokee Vocational High School. I did not want to be there. I did not like math, but I know it was a necessary evil for a girl who wanted to be the first in her family to go to college. Mr. Hendrix made his and the class's purposes clear from day one--his to

teach; ours to learn. And teach he did! As he scratched away with a stub of chalk on his blackboard and lectured in his soft Southern drawl, it was also clear that he knew and loved math. More importantly, he loved to teach.

Numbers, not the English language, were his strong suit. He apologized needlessly often for his misspelled words and "poor grammer." He more than compensated for any deficiency in those areas with his ability to communicate with numbers and his caring and supporting of those who relied upon his kind words and warm smiles to help weather the storm of first and second year algebra, geometry, and advanced mathematics-

Like any really good teacher, Mr. Hendrix cared about the whole student, in and out of class. First and foremost, he was my math teacher. He attempted for four years to instill in me an appreciation of the subject. Unfortunately, he did not succeed; I still do not like to work with numbers. During 22 years of formal education, I earned my only academic "C" in Mr. Hendrix's class-and was glad to get it. Interestingly, however, I have scored highest in math on every standardized test I have ever taken though my studies and professions have always been language-oriented. Obviously, Mr. Hendrix was successful in instilling in me the substance, if not the appreciation, of the subject.

Second, Mr. Hendrix was my friend. In the 9th and 10th grades when I was devastated because I was not elected cheerleader, he observed the tears and quietly patted me on the shoulder, giving me a reassuring look and reminding me that there would be another year. When I was elected cheerleader during my junior year, his smile was big and his congratulations were hardy. As a senior, I was again devastated when the Auburn Tiger loveof-my-life wrote me his final "Dear Mitzi" letter. When I found myself starting out of the window much more frequently than I was focusing on Mr. Hendrix and his blackboard, Mr. Hendrix's response, as usual, exemplified his thorough understanding of teenagers. He did not ignore or attempt to diminish the significance of this event, nor did he return my focus to his blackboard with a harsh reprimand (which surely I deserved). He simply and quietly let me know that there was work to be done and that while my grief over lost love was understandable and appropriate, it must be kept in perspective. Not suprisingly, I responded by refocusing on the blackboard.

Because of Mr. Hendrix (and Miss Foster, Mrs. Burns, Mrs. Blankenship, c.), I decided to become a teacher. When I told Mr. Hendrix I was going to become an English teacher, he supplied much-needed encouragement. assuring me I would succeed. His assurances always remained with me through Auburn and Indiana University, seven years of teaching, law

school, and the practice of employment law. I have seen Mr. Hendrix only 3 or 4 times since graduation from CVHS in 1965. I last saw him in 1985 in the school lunchroom. After all those years. he still made me feel special.

On September 12 when I learned of Mr. Hendrix's death, I felt a tremendous loss, and the tears fell on my desk on the 25th floor of my downtown Indianapolis office building, a long distance from the small Mississippi town where others who loved and respected him were bidding Mr. Hendrix farewell. The influence of a good teacher on a student's life is enduring. immeasurable, and invaluabale. The power, prestige and wealth, rewards that accompany the pursuit of many other accupations and professions.

Thank you, Mr. Hendrix, for becoming a teacher. I trust you will never stop scratching on a blackboard, and I hope you can locate a good dictionary in your new quarters.

ASCS **Farm News**

GRAZING PERIOD OPENS OCT. 1

The official grazing period will open October 1, for acreage conservation reserve (ACR), or land designated as conserving use (CU) for payment under the 1990 acreage reduction programs.

Farm program participants then will be authorized to graze their ACR and CU acreage. The cover crops must not be overgrazed because sufficient cover must be maintained to prevent wind and water erosion.

Farm program participants are not permitted to graze ACR or CU for payment land during the 5-month nongrazing period set by the State ASC committee. The nongrazing period in Tishomingo County runs from May 1 to September 30.

The 1990 farm program enrollment report shows that percent, or 2,000 acres of Tishomingo County cropland was diverted from production to ACR and CU for payment under this year's program. Farmers are required to plant certain grasses, legumes, small grains or other approved cover crops on these acres, or to maintain various conservation practices on the acreage. Adequate protection is required to guard against wind and water erosion and control measures must be used to prevent weeds, rodents and insects on the land.

To maintain farm program benefits, producers must comply with grazing and conservation regulations as stipulated in the program contract. Those who fail to do so will be out of compliance and could lose payments





Vitamins, Minerals & Your Health

Spotlight on Vitamin C: Ascorbic Acid

We know that vitamin C, known chemically as ascorbic acid, prevents and cures scurvy, a disease first described during the Crusades. Signs and symptoms include poor appetite, weakness, anemia, swollen and imflamed gums, loose teeth, swollen wrist and ankle joints, and failure of wounds to heal. The Dutch discovered that feeding soldiers and sailors oranges, lemons, and limes prevented scurvy. To this day, an English sailor is known as a "limey."

Vitamin C has been promoted as beneficial in preventing or treating conditions as diverse as common cold and cancer. Usually, doses are advocated that are much larger than the approximately 100 mg adults need daily to prevent deficiency. Using vitamin C in nondeficiencies is controversial.

Sources of vitamin C includecitrus fruits, raw leafy vegetables, strawberries, cabbage, green peppers, and tomatoes. One kiwi fruit contains over 250 mg of C, and a stalk of fresh broccoli contains over 150 mg. Many multiple vitamin/ mineral supplements contain from 60 to 400 mg.

Because tobacco use adversely affects one's ability to utilize ascorbic acid, smokers probably need twice as much vitamin Cas do nonsmokers.
