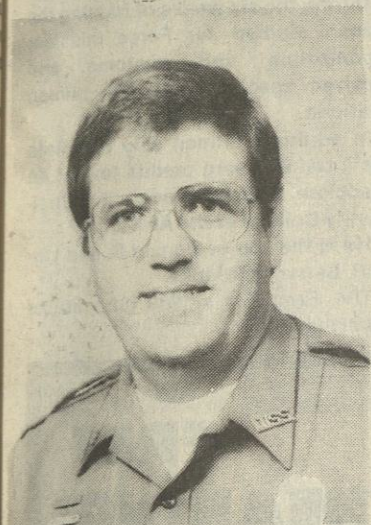

I have been employed by the luka Police Department since 1984 and before then I was a deputy for the Tishomingo County Sheriffs Department.

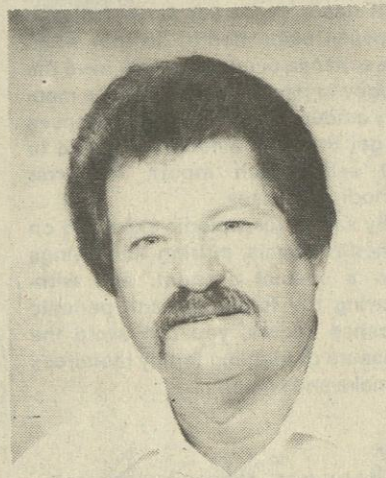

## NASA Official Visits luka

The deputy administrator for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration said Monday that he was very impressed with what he had seen and heard during his brief visit to luka.

J.R. Thompson, who is a former director of NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, said he was back in luka to "get a feel for how the work was going."

Following a brief update on the design of the advanced solid rocket motor manufacturing facility and the solid rocket motor design, Thompson said that the project was progressing "quite well."

Thompson said that the ASRM project was a "high-priority program" with NASA and also represented a long-term investment for NASA.

"We are pleased to be here," he said. "I hope the people of Mississippi are behind NASA," Thompson added. "It is a major commitment NASA has made to Mississippi."

The ASRM project will focus on reliability, safety, and performance, Thompson said.

The payload capability of the new rocket motor will have a 12,000-lb. performance advantage, an over 25 percent increase in efficiency, he said.

The solid rocket motor is scheduled to launch shuttle flights beginning in 1996, which is the same year that the assembly of the space station is set to begin, Thompson

said.

"The space shuttle is fundamental to the space station, and the advanced solid rocket motor will be an integral part of the shuttle by then," he said.

Over \$5½ billion has been invested in the space station, and the American public is in favor of the station, he said.

The vote of 240 to 160 in favor of the space station in the U.S. House of Representatives illustrates the public support behind it, he said.

Thompson said he was surprised and disappointed that all but one of Mississippi's representatives voted against the space station.

Although the space station is a high priority of NASA, it is balanced with other NASA projects.

The budget cuts and budget talks may continue, but there should not be any hiring delays, Thompson said.

"We have plenty of time after all the voting to shift gears if we need to," he said. "We are going to do the job Congress asked us to do and appropriated the money for in 1991."

Thompson provided some employment statistics during the brief press conference. There are about 800 Lockheed and Aerojet employees currently on the team, with several hundred additional workers in the construction area. By 1992, there should be 1,000 or 1,200 construction workers employed on the project, he said. The project workforce should stabilize at 1,200 to 1,300.

## Editorial -----

There's been no groundbreaking yet for a new hospital in Tishomingo County. Months of negotiations between involved parties still haven't yielded a solution.

Gov. Ray Mabus announced in Dec. 1989 the awarding of \$2.3 million from the Major Economic Impact Authority for a new hospital to replace the luka Hospital.

The new facility was to be owned by the county but administered by the North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, it was announced.

But, plans to go ahead with the hospital stalled when NMMC said it must own the facility. NMMC then decided to pull out of its lease agreement with the county and withdraw its intentions to build and manage the new hospital.

There is no doubt that a hospital should be constructed. The people of Tishomingo County both want and need it. A new, state-of-the-art facility is a must for a county experiencing growth and providing a new home for residents moving in with the NASA project.

The agency chosen to build and manage the new hospital is obviously a crucial factor in the quality and development for the future.

The knowledge and expertise of local medical staff should be a major consideration in the design of the new facility. Over 100 years of combined service is represented by members of the medical staff of luka Hospital.

The overwhelming issue is that Tishomingo County should be permitted to own and manage a facility which serves the area and provides employment for local residents.

Public support of ownership by the county is widespread. The towns of Tishomingo, Burnsville, Paden, and Belmont passed resolutions advocating that the state award the impact funds directly to Tishomingo County rather than NMMC.

luka's mayor and board of aldermen have resolved to support improved health care for the county and surrounding area.

County officials are more willing to follow state guidelines in order to receive the impact funds. However, DECD should allow Tishomingo County freedom in making its own decisions to affect the future course of health care in the area.

### Mack Loyd Wadkins Asks For Re-election To Post

Wadkins said he had "proven leadership in the areas of health care, education, transportation, economic development and rural fire protection."

He attended Northeast Mississippi Community College then transferred to the University of Mississippi where he was graduated with a bachelor of arts in education. He has done

graduate work at the University of South Florida and attended the American Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C.

### Tishomingo County - Second Lowest Property Taxes In State

Tishomingo Countians pay next to the lowest property taxes in the state. The lowest state tax rate is that of Claiborne Co. where the Grand Gulf Nuclear Plant is located. The millage rate for Claiborne Co. is 53.25. Tishomingo County's is 56.75 (a mill is one-tenth of a cent). Prentiss County has the highest millage in the state - 112.95. These figures are according to the 1990-91 state tax commission's report.

What does this mean to the taxpayers of Tishomingo County as compared to those in Prentiss County? Using an example of a \$100,000 home for a young couple living outside the city without homestead exemption, Tishomingo Countians would pay \$750 in taxes compared to \$1,042 in Prentiss County. If homestead exemption were applied,

the rates in both counties would be reduced \$240.

Chickasaw County has the highest school tax: 54.20 mills. Tishomingo County's is 33.25. Tishomingo County's general county tax is the lowest in the state: 7.75 mills. Benton has the highest: 44.98. Car tags are cheaper in Tishomingo Co. than in other counties in the state.

Lower taxes are attributed to the TVA in-lieu funds that Tishomingo received. Since passage of a House bill diverting in-lieu funds back to Tishomingo Co., the county has received in excess of \$11.5 million that has gone into the county general fund.

In addition to the \$11.5 million, the schools have received in excess of \$1 million and the towns in Tishomingo County over \$340,000.

### URBAN FLOODING

No one would be foolish enough to invest his life savings in a house knowing that it would be ruined the first time it rains. But each year thousands of people in the United States -- astute people who take care of their money -- buy homes that are certain to be flooded, although information that could protect them from such a mistake is free and available.

Of all the people involved in housing, the buyer is the one least able to make a judgement about whether a home will flood or not. The family selecting a new home is beset with decisions. The new home must be large enough; it must be accessible to work, schools, and shopping; be in an acceptable neighborhood; be financially and have payments which can be met. In addition to this, the family is under pressure to make the move as fast as possible, in a few weeks or even days. It would be almost superhuman for a buyer under such circumstances to think about whether or not the new home is on a floodplain.

The mere suggestion that public agencies have information which might dictate whether or not a builder should build homes on flood-prone land stirs the blood of many who fear more government regulation. But the source of the information is not the important thing. The important thing is that, with modern knowledge of soil types, land form, and climate, we know which areas, if developed, will

### flood.

It is unwise for a builder to build a house, or a mortgage company to finance that house, or a homebuyer to purchase it, if it is built on an area where flood damage is a sure thing. It is true folly for investors to commit their money to developing floodplain land without fully studying available information.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Soil Conservation Service is a government agency that does not want people to build or buy in areas where overflow will damage homes and property and endanger lives. SCS employees will give available information on the problem to anyone for the asking.

## Home Economic Tips

### THREE DAYS TO CANCEL

Door-to-door selling is a convenient way to shop. This ease of shopping, however, means limited opportunity to compare prices and features of the goods you are purchasing. And since it's only you and the salesman, you may feel that you must buy his merchandise. Or, you may even be fast-talked into a purchase.

Whatever the case may be, you have the right to cancel certain door-to-door sales contracts within three business days after the date of the agreement.

This right to cancel is known as a "cooling-off period." It was designed to protect consumers from irrational decisions they might make in their homes under the influence of high-pressure salespeople or because they did not carefully consider the purchase.

The "cooling-off period" applies only to door-to-door cash sales of \$25.00 or more or to credit sales in any amount where the contract was signed in a residence other than that of the seller.

Under this Federal Trade Commission rule, the salesman must tell you of your right to cancel the sale, give you a contract or receipt, and provide two copies of your NOTICE OF CANCELLATION.

If you decide to cancel a sale under the cooling-off period rule, first read the notice of cancellation. Then, detach, sign and date one copy and send or deliver it to the seller within three business days. Keep the other copy and send or deliver it to the seller.

within three business days. Keep the other copy and your contract or receipt for your records.

If you cancel the contract, within ten days the seller must refund all of your money, return any good or property traded in, cancel and return any documents that you have signed, and tell you if he will pick up or let you keep anything left with you.

### PLANNING FOR PERIODIC EXPENSES

Some important expenses come up periodically throughout the year, such as insurance premiums or car license tags. When these must be paid, you may find yourself skimping on other items -- even necessities like food or utility bills. To prevent periodic expenses from imposing upon other family needs, the best way to budget for them is to spread the cost over the entire year.

To do this, first list the periodic expenses you will have over the next year. Next, divide each expense into 12 equal amounts. This is the amount that needs to be set aside for each expense each month, so that when the expense occurs, you will have the money to pay it. Finally, add the monthly amounts of all periodic expenses to get the total amount you need to set aside each month to cover periodic expenses.

By saving for periodic expenses on a monthly basis, putting the savings into a special account, and withdrawing the funds as each periodic expense occurs, you can avoid the pressure of juggling family resources to make ends meet.

### CROCK POT - MAGIC MEAT LOAF

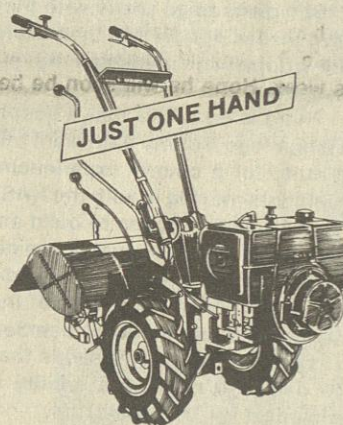
2 pounds ground meat  
1/2 cup chopped green pepper  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
1 cup cracker crumbs  
1 cup chopped celery  
1 egg  
1 (8-oz.) can tomato sauce  
6 or 8 small potatoes

In large mixing bowl, combine all of above ingredients except sauce and potatoes. Mold into a loaf shape. Place in crock pot. Pour tomato sauce over meat loaf. Arrange potatoes on sides of loaf. Cook on high for 3 hours.

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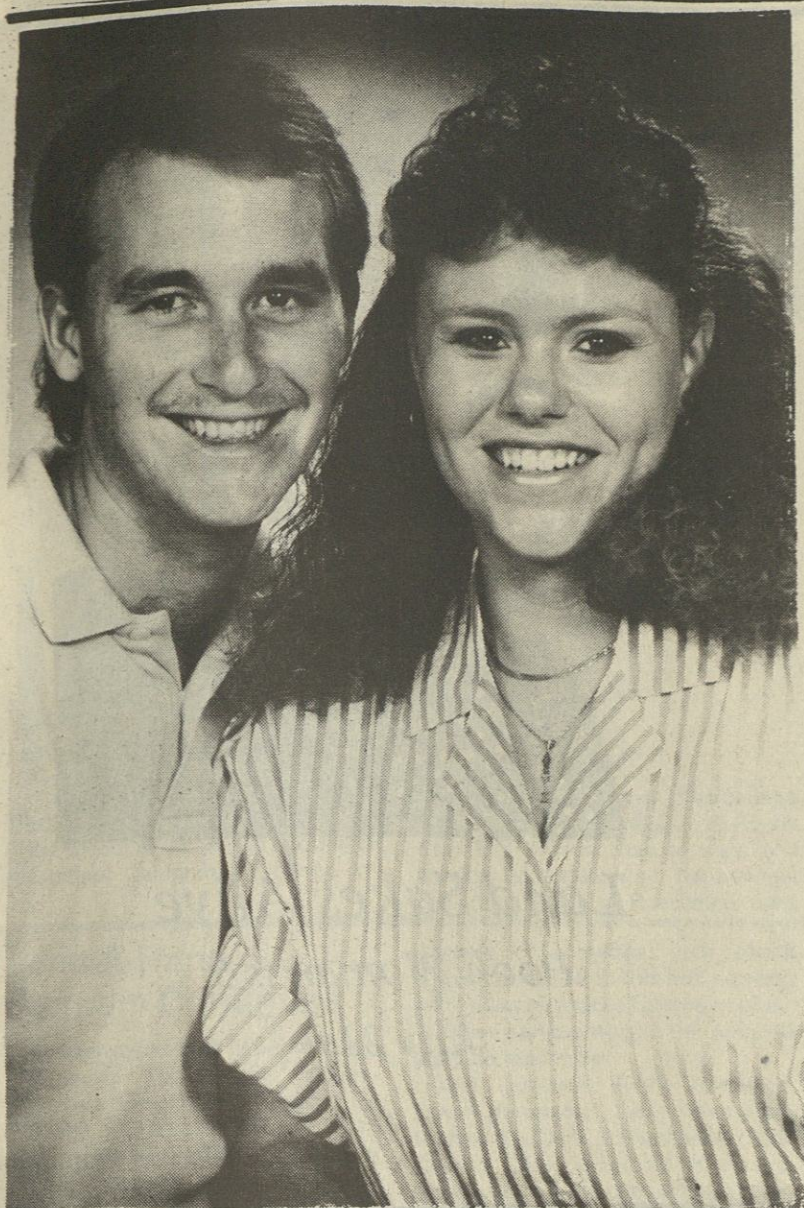

## ASCS Farm News

CRP SIGNUP ENDS JULY 19, 1991

On July 8, county offices of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service will open the eleventh Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) signup period. Bids will be accepted through July 19th.

This will be the only opportunity farmers will have to offer bids for the 1992 crop year.

Many provisions which applied to the 10th CRP signup apply to this signup. Bids on eligible land will be selected based on environmental benefits obtained per dollar of cost of the Commodity Credit Corporation. Since each producer's bid is compared to the productivity capability of the acres offered, farmers should not rely on bid amounts accepted in the past.

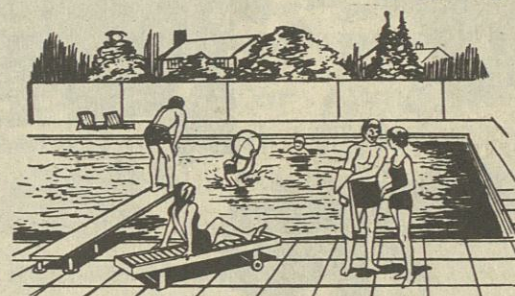
Eligible acres offered for enrollment must be land planted or considered planted to produce an agricultural commodity in two of the five crop years from 1986 through

1990. The cropping-history requirement may be considered met, under certain circumstances, with cropland planted to alfalfa and other multi-year grasses and legumes grown in rotation and also in connection with acreage designated either as Acreage Conservation Reserve or Conservation Use for Pay during those five years.

Land eligibility requirements have been expanded to include water quality benefits under CRP. Special consideration will be given to designated hydrologic unit areas, which are determined to be a source of water quality problems and designated conservation priority areas. Wetlands will not be eligible for enrollment into the CRP during this signup.

Bid acceptance determinations will be made by USDA after a nationwide review and evaluation. Fifty percent cost-share assistance will continue to be available to establish approved permanent vegetative cover, including trees, on the accepted acreage. Depending upon the cover established, annual rental payments will be paid to CRP participants for 10-15 years, based upon accepted bid amounts.

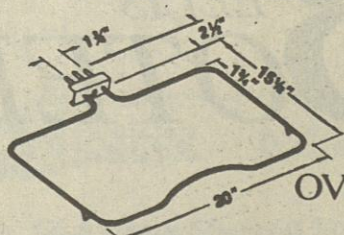

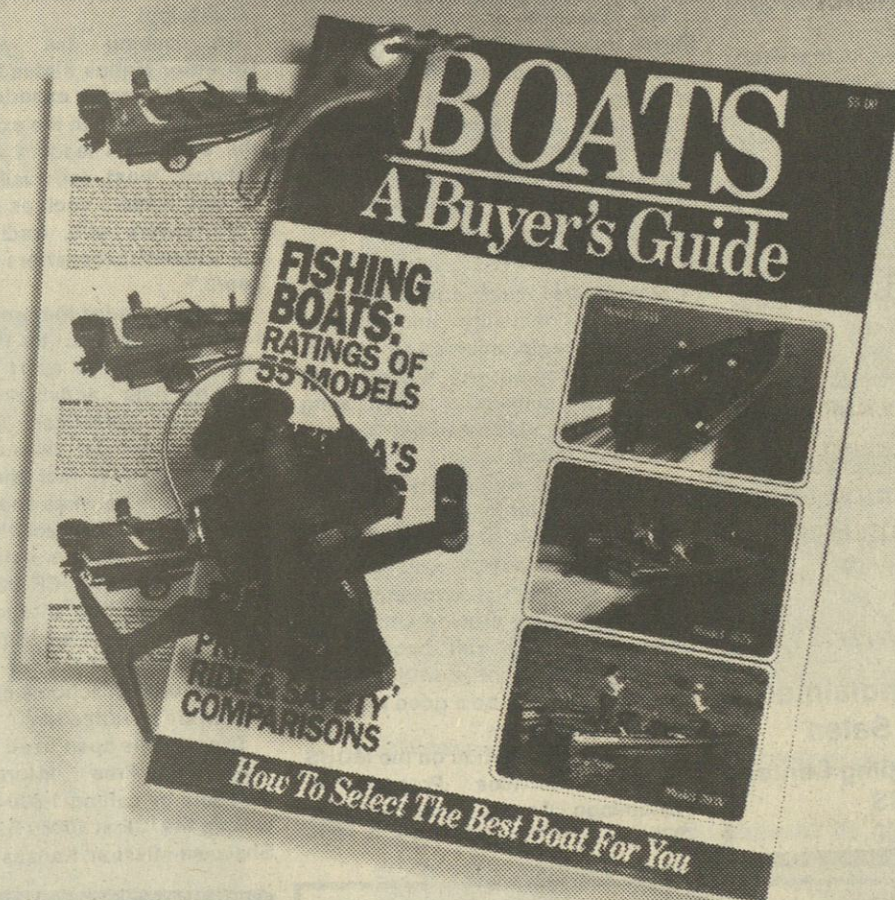

The event, conducted by the International Cheerleading Foundation, the world-wide organization for cheerleading and school spirit, will bring together cheer and leadership experts from across the United States who will conduct an intensive 4-day cheer skills and student leadership course for junior and senior high school cheerleaders from throughout Mississippi.

In issuing his proclamation, Governor Mabus states that, "one of the great learning experiences for our young people is in the example set by the traditional leaders in America's schools, most especially their own elected leaders such as athletes and cheerleaders who, traditionally, are key student pacesetters among their peers."

A key basis for the proclamation is to draw attention to the role the cheerleader plays apart from his or her "on field" activities as a cheer and stunt performer. Traditionally, cheerleaders are viewed as entertainers when in fact their off field duties are to serve as coordinators of important student activities and to serve as "Example-setters" within their schools. ### Lightning On The Loose

Everyone should know the dangers of lightning and how to protect themselves during a thunderstorm.

Lightning is electricity in the clouds. During a thunderstorm only 20% of the lightning actually reaches the ground, but is so powerful that it does tremendous damage. All of which consist of forest fires, recreational damages, wildlife and human life. Lightning is the leading killer over hurricanes, blizzards or tornadoes. One flash of lightning can sometimes be over five miles long. You can estimate the distance between you and the lightning by counting the seconds between a lightning flash and the thunder that follows, about every five seconds equals one mile.

There are actually two parts to every lightning flash we see. Leader strokes are often invisible as they dart from cloud to cloud. Eventually they leave the cloud base looking for a clear channel to the tallest objects on the ground. When the final leader stroke reaches the ground, the return stroke flashes back up the channels to light up the sky. The return strokes

are much brighter and faster than the leader strokes.

It is important that you take cover and protect yourself against lightning.

If you are in a building don't use the phone unless it is an emergency. Also stay away from electrical appliances and plumbing. Don't use anything that could carry electrical, least it were to strike wires near your house.

If you are outside and a thunderstorm develops, go into a house, large building, or enclosed car (but not a convertible). A car is safer than being outside; but a clump of low trees might provide some protection. Always go to a low area where there are smaller (or no) trees.

If for any reason you are trapped out and cannot make it to a building or car, stay away from: metals, tractor and all tractor equipment, sheds in open areas, water and tall trees. Lightning is most always attracted to the tallest object in an area.

If you in a field or prairie and cannot get to a safe place, crouch in a huddled position but don't spread out on the wet ground.

If you are swimming get out of the water immediately and to a shelter. Do not stay on a boat, or on a hilltop.

Remember that the summer season is the time that the static

electricity between the heaven and the earth is the greatest. This means that lightning can strike without a moment's notice.

Be cautious, careful, and follow the safety rules because LIGHTNING IS ON THE LOOSE!!

## Governor Mabus Announces Block Grant To Town Of Tishomingo

Governor Ray Mabus announced today the awarding of a \$156,000 public facilities grant to the Town of Tishomingo through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program by the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development.

"Assisting communities in improving the standard of living for the citizens is a major thrust of the Community Development Block Grant program," Governor Mabus said. "I am delighted that Tishomingo is working to address the needs of its citizens and that we can assist in the effort."

Tishomingo will receive the grant to expand the sewer lagoon and make improvements to the town's water tank. The project will benefit 32 residents, of whom 244 are from low and moderate-income households.

"Basic infrastructure is essential to economic growth," said J. M. Holladay, MDEC director. "The CDBG public facilities grant program helps to provide the financial support that is necessary for the development of a community's infrastructure."

Other communities receiving the public facilities grants include the towns of Ethel, Maben, and Liberty. The grants will be used to assist the communities with improvements in water and sewer facilities.

The four grants comprise the remaining CDBG funds allocated to public facilities for Program Years 1990 and 1991. In January, Governor Mabus announced 55 public facilities grants valued at \$21 million awarded from the 1990 and 1991 allocations.

The Community Development Block Grant program, administered by the MDEC Community Service Division, provides funding for localities with populations of 50,000 or less for economic development, public facilities, housing, planning, urgent needs, and rural health care. The program is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Cummings and third district supervisor D.W. McKee. An additional crop of 1,500 plants seized on June 20 was destroyed by fire at the airport. The estimated street value of the marijuana crops was \$4.5 million, Sheriff Dobbs said.

## At The Old Courthouse

These Old Courthouse articles require alot of research on Tishomingo County History. At 26 years of age, my memory only goes back so far. There are several historical writings on Tishomingo County and they are all helpful to this column. Even so, I like to get the story straight from the source whenever possible. Who better to tell about a place or a time than someone who was there?

I talk to many of these people who give me a better insight into the past. One of my most favorite sources of living history is Mrs. Issac (Sis) Jackson. My visits with Mrs. Jackson have not only been entertaining, they are also educational.

Mrs. Jackson's family moved to Iuka in 1918. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jim Doan McRae Sr., were successful in a local business. Sis McRae was a beautiful seventeen year old lady. (The faded photographs are proof!) I should emphasize the word "Lady" because even today, it is the best word to describe the charm, grace and genteel disposition of Mrs. Jackson.

Her memory is still sharp at eighty-seven years of age. She recalls the

days when her brother, Jim Doan McRae Jr., was quite popular with the ladies and she had a number of gentleman suitors herself.

It wasn't but a short time later one of her suitors, handsome Issac Jackson, fell "Head over Heels" in love with her. "Ike" as she fondly calls him was some nine years older than she. He graduated from Iuka High School around 1910. Mr. Jackson attended Mississippi A and M (Mississippi State University) where he lettered in varsity football as a back.

Mr. Jackson graduated from State and worked until war broke out in Europe and volunteers were called. Issac Jackson was the first volunteer to enlist from Tishomingo County in the summer of 1917. He returned to Iuka in 1919 to find the crop of eligible young ladies had increased considerably, by one in particular!

"I guess it was love at first sight," she once told me. "I just don't remember who looked first!" She said with a chuckle. It wasn't long before 19 year old "Sis" became Mrs. Issac M. Jackson. Her engagement picture is my favorite of her. If I had been around then I would have given the old running back a run for his money!

In 1932, Mr. Jackson was elected Sheriff/Tax Assessor and Collector. Mrs. Jackson was not at all pleased that he ran for this post. It is still a touchy subject with her. "Ike wanted to be assessor/collector, but the job of sheriff was included with it at this time" according to Mrs. Jackson. "I didn't sleep a peaceful wink the whole time Ike was in office! One time I warned him if he got shot, I'd kill him!" she said with a chuckle.

In 1936 the Jackson's were blessed with a son, Jim. Mention Jim and Mrs. Jackson's face will light up in a smile! "He is a good son and a fine boy" she says. "He calls every Sunday night from Texas and I get a card in the mail every Wednesday."

Mr. Jim Jackson came home for a visit recently. He came by the museum and we talked about a lot of interested topics. I was impressed by his sense of history and the pride he showed in his native Tishomingo County. I agree with his mother. I think he is a "fine boy" too.

Mr. Isaac Jackson was postmaster in Iuka for a number of years. Mr. and Mrs. Jackson were active in the community, especially in their church work. Mrs. Jackson taught the Young People's Sunday School Class at the Iuka United Methodist Church for over sixty years. She is still loved and

## "I NEVER KNEW YOU"

Jesus said that there will be some expecting to go into heaven who will be told "I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!" (Matt. 7:23) He later drove His point home with a parable about a man who was rejected from a wedding feast for not having on the proper clothing. The king of the feast said "Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." (Matt. 22:13) There are some whom the Lord knows and accepts, and many who are not recognized by the Lord as faithful.

As unnerving as the Lord's warning is to those who attempt to serve God, there is another important fact that should give security and boldness to those who hope to go to heaven. That is that going to heaven is not a matter of blind chance nor a matter of good fortune versus bad luck. We can know if our names are written in the Book of Life.

Knowing requires dedication and work. (Phil. 2:12) It is not a matter of God's picking the saved regardless of their action (Calvinism) or a matter of wishful thinking. It is that everybody is going to heaven (universalism. Matt. 7:13-14), although God wants every soul to be saved. (II Pet. 3:9) There is something a person can do to be saved.

Christ said "He that believes and is baptized shall be saved..." (Matt. 16:16) Of course, it isn't the act of dunking that saves ("water salvation"). But God has commanded baptism, and one cannot be saved in disobedience to God. (II Thess. 1:7-9) Obedience is saved.

There is a matter of repentance that is required for salvation. Repentance is turning from sin in attitude and action. "Godly sorrow produces repentance to salvation..." (II Cor. 7:10) Jesus said, "No one, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:62) This repentance would also involve a willingness to confess faith in Christ. (Rom. 10:9; Matt. 10:32-33).

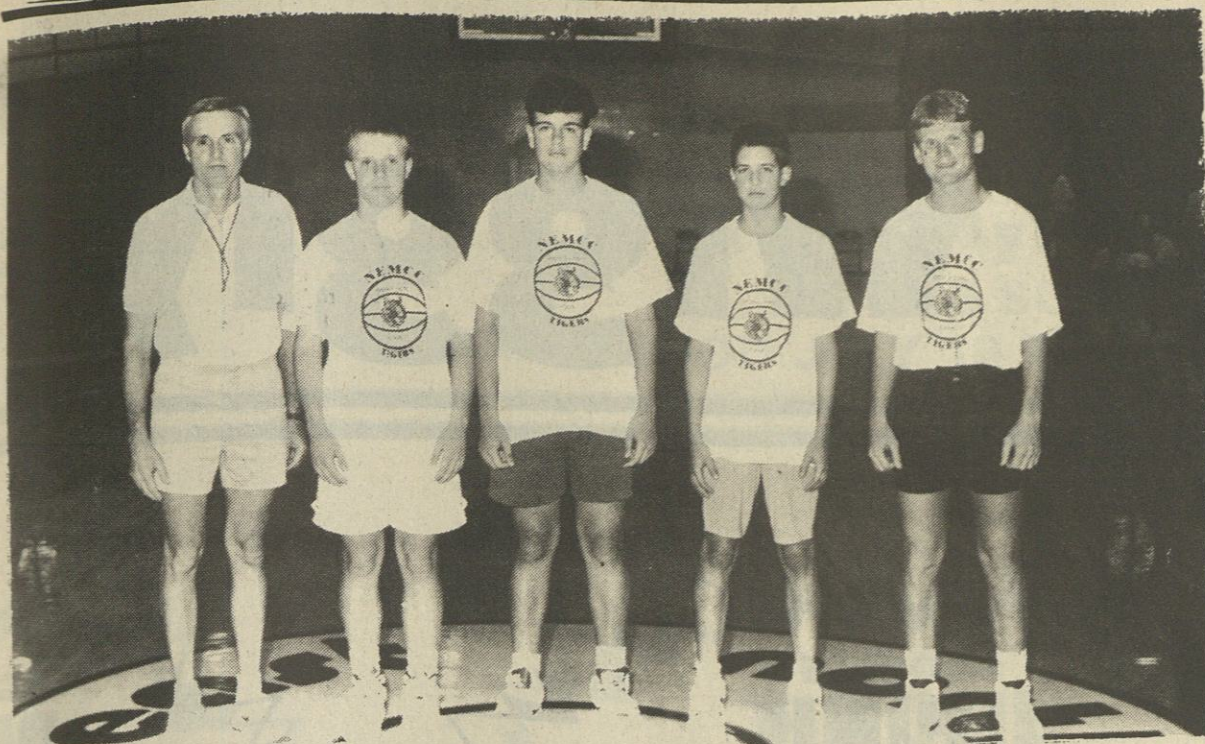
