## Chief Bates Responds To Increased Enforcement

Last Thursday the Iuka Police Department set up a roadblock on Paul Edmondson Industrial Drive and wrote several tickets to employees working at the NASA buildings for improper tags and drivers license.

On Friday morning police set up radar on the same street and wrote several tickets for speeding.

The sudden enforcement of traffic laws has NASA employees upset.

Iuka Police Chief Amos Bates told the Tishomingo County News that he "has given the newcomers a full year to get right." Bates said that "the people working for NASA were no better than the people of Iuka to have to buy tags and license and drive the speed limit." He said "I am glad the NASA people are here but the people of Iuka have to abide by the laws and so do they." Bates said "we are not aiming the law at NASA people but if they are violating the law they don't get a free ride. We write Iuka people the same as we do anybody else."

The increased enforcement is a direct result of the budget cuts to the police department. Chief Bates said he was informed that he would have to lay off some of his officers even though he was well below the budget allotted for the police department. The Chief was told that his department was not writing enough tickets to generate revenue in the general fund. Bates said "now that we are writing tickets the mayor wants to tell us not to write the NASA people. If we write tickets to Iuka people we will write tickets to anybody violating the law."

Bates said he was misquoted in an Alabama newspaper calling the NASA people "a bunch of noggin heads". The Chief said he told the newspaper "They think we are a bunch of noggin heads and they don't have to abide by the law." According to Chief Bates the whole thing is being blown out of proportion and that roadblocks and speeding tickets are nothing new. "We have been writing speeding tickets and assisting the Mississippi Highway Patrol with roadblocks since I have been in office."

According to The Timbes Daily, an Alabama newspaper, Iuka mayor David Nichols said the actions taken by the chief are "unsanctioned".

Chief Bates said the enforcement will continue until people buy tags and drive the speed limit. Bates said "we are not picking on anybody and I think we have been very lenient so far."

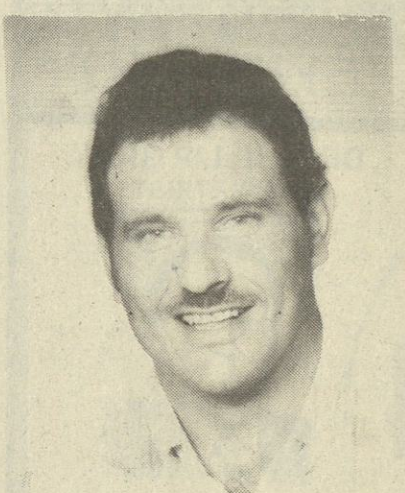

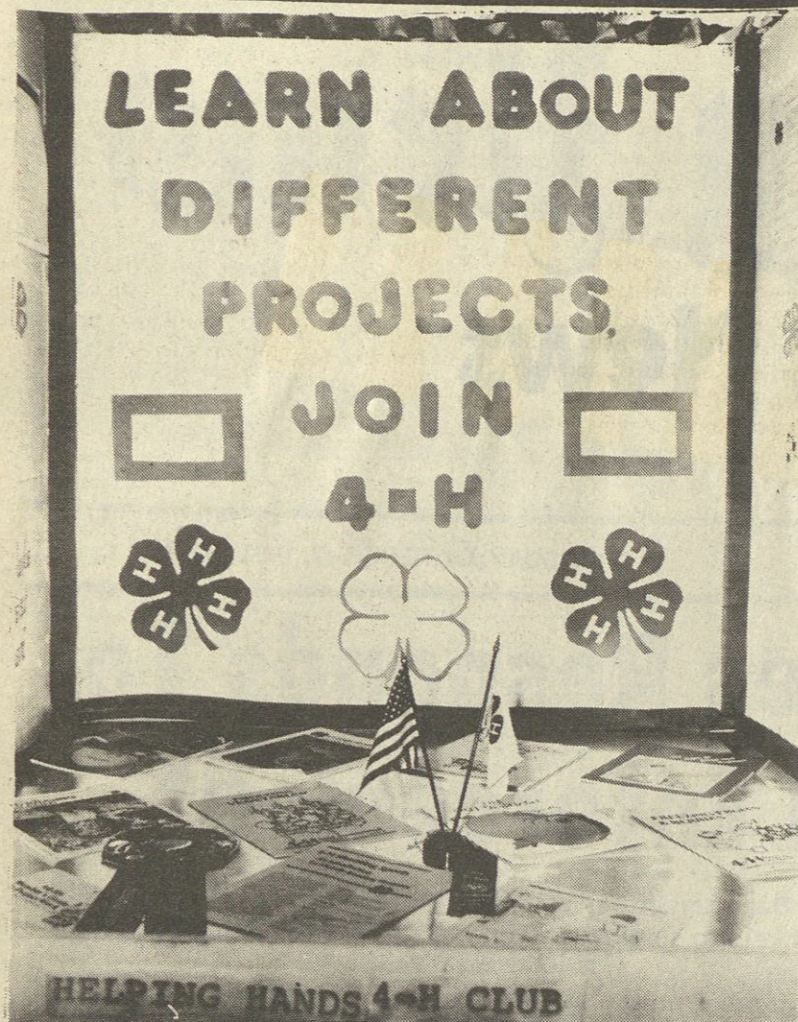
### Turkey And Ham Shoot

**HUNTING COURTESIES THAT WIN FRIENDS AND INFLUENCE PEOPLE**

With many deer hunters already in the woods with their bows and gun season fast approaching, I thought a reminder of the ten hunting courtesies would be appropriate. Learn to follow these courtesies when hunting and many unnecessary conflicts can be avoided.

(1) The landowner has the right to give permission for the use of his land or to restrict the use of it. Remember the farm is the farmer's home and business. You are his guest, -- act like one. The more inconsiderate his guest are, the more restrictions he will place on them.

(2) Your permission to use his land is not transferable unless specifically stated. An invitation to you to hunt or fish doesn't mean that you can invite all your friends unless they are specifically included in the invitation.

(3) Pastures, cultivated fields or woods are no places to be driving in wet weather. Try walking. The exercise will do you good and make the landowner much happier.

(4) It takes hundreds of years to add an inch of top soil, but only a few minutes to destroy it. Careless starting of a fire won't improve relations, increase game or make money for the farmer. It costs so little to be careful.

(5) Even the smallest bush or tree is the possession of the farmer or landowner. The dogwood, mulberry or sumac is of value to the landowner from the standpoint of beauty and as a wildlife food. What if several people helped themselves to the farmer's shrubs?

(6) To protect the fences of the landowner, always go through gates or gaps whenever possible. Cross woven wire fences only at strong posts.

(7) When eating lunch, don't leave your trash. Remember, that stretch of pasture or woods in the farmer's front yard. Would you be happy if the farmer spread his lunch and left his trash on your front lawn?

(8) The game hog belongs to that special breed -- the gunner, Educate him if possible.

(9) Be careful. Never shoot near the farmer's house or barn. If you see the bushes shake, make sure it is game and not a cow, the farmer or another hunter.

(10) A gate left open is not the way to win friends and influence people.

Use these courtesies and be a good example for your fellow hunting buddies.

## INSIGHT INTO EYESIGHT

### BLOOD SPOTS IN THE EYE

If you have a blood spot on the white area of your eyeball, this condition is known as a sub-conjunctival hemorrhage. It may be as tiny as a pinhead or much larger, and often there is no blurring of vision, no pain or discharge to make it seem alarming. But it should not be ignored. Sometimes the hemorrhage is caused by a break in one of the tiny blood vessels on the surface of the eyeball. It tends to spread out in the space between the sclera (or white of the eye) and the conjunctiva (the thin transparent membrane which covers it). Tears won't wash it away because it is under the conjunctiva.

This can happen even to a person with healthy eyes. But is more common in older persons or those who have high blood pressure, diabetes, anemia, or hardening of the arteries. It may also be caused by stress or strain due to an injury or heavy lifting. Only an examination by your eye specialist can determine the cause and how the condition can best be treated.

skin and follow all label directions.

Remove mildew with a stiff brush and a mildew cleaner. One solution to clean mildew is 1 quart household bleach to 3 quarts water. Again wear gloves and read all label directions.

After removing dirt, grease or mildew, rinse away cleaner with water. Let the surface dry completely before painting.

Scrape away peeling paint. Scrape away rust from metal areas.

Sand rusted nailheads. Use a nail punch and hammer to sink the nail slightly below the surface. Then cover the nailhead with corrosion-resistant primer and putty. Sand the area smooth.

Fill open cracks between building materials with caulk to protect against moisture. Consult paint label for instructions about priming these areas before paint is applied.

### STUFFED PEPPERS

6 green peppers  
1 lb. ground beef  
1 1/2 tsp. salt  
Pepper to taste  
1/2 cup uncooked rice  
1/2 tsp. celery seed  
1 can tomato soup  
1 soup can water

Cut the tops from peppers and remove seeds. Brown ground beef and add salt and pepper. Add rice and celery seed, mix well. Place peppers close together in a deep pan, fill with mixture. Do not pack - rice needs to expand. Pour tomato soup over peppers. Add water, cover and bake at 400° for 1 hour and 15 minutes.

### Lyme Disease: Campers Beware!

According to Dr. Allen Steere, author of a recent article in the journal *Modern Medicine*, Lyme disease, a condition caused by ticks, can lead to heart, nervous system, and arthritic complications if the disease is not detected and treated during its early stages.

Campers, hikers, and people living in wooded areas should take extra precautions because of the presence of ticks in wooded areas. Lyme disease is caused by a bacteria that lives in ticks. Ticks bite humans and pass on the bacteria that causes Lyme disease. Symptoms of the disease are reported to appear as late as thirty days following the tick bite. The victim may experience red bumps, a bulls-eye rash, flu-like symptoms, fatigue, stiff neck, headache, chills, fever, and/or muscle aches.

If left untreated, Lyme disease often progresses into cycles of arthritic flare-ups. According to health experts, the most effective treatment for Lyme disease is with one of two antibiotics, *doxycycline* or *amoxicillin*. Prevention of Lyme disease begins with the wearing of protective clothing when camping or when going into wooded areas and the use of an effective tick repellent.

People's Bank has donated Spirit buttons for Brave fans. These will be available from People's Bank, at the pep rally and at the ball game Friday night.

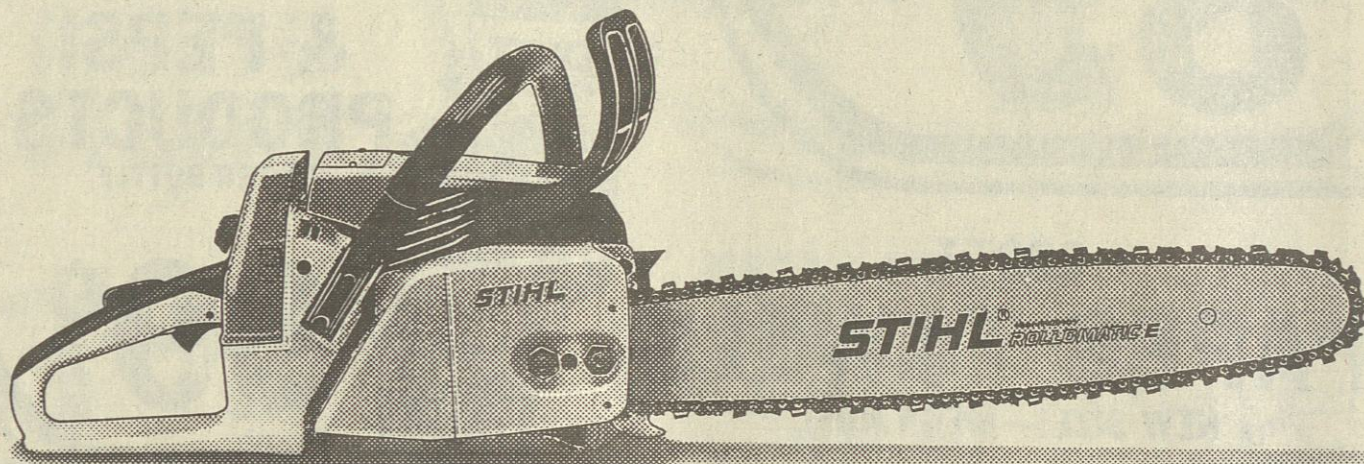

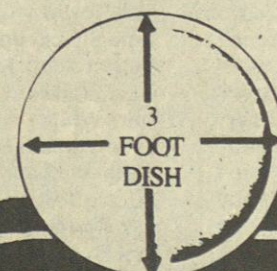

## ANSWERING A COMMON QUESTION

When the gospel first came to the ears of mankind, the same question kept coming up: "What must I do?" The same question still arises as people realize that God is and that He has spoken. And the most compelling answers are those given by the first preachers.

On the first Pentecost after the resurrection Peter spoke to the Jews who had gathered because of the miraculous sounds and sights. When they were convicted of their guilt in putting the very Son of God to death, he asked, "Men and Brethren, what shall we do?" "Peter's answer was, 'Repent, and be baptized everyone of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins...'" (Acts 2:37-38)

Neither repentance nor baptism was new to these people. John the Baptist and Jesus had been preaching both for at least three years, and "all the land of Judea, and they of Jerusalem" received John's baptism. (Mk. 1:5-6; Lk. 3:1-3) But when Jesus spoke to His disciples right before his ascension into heaven, he gave them a universal commission to preach and to baptize with another baptism. They were to preach to all creation, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be condemned." (Mk. 16:15-16) This baptism was the baptism preached by Peter on Pentecost. It was for the purpose of removing the guilt of sins from the lives of sinners.

When the Lord appeared to Saul of Tarsus, the same question came to his lips: "What shall I do, Lord?" When specific instruction came, it was the same as that given the three thousand on Pentecost. "Arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord." (Acts 22:16) Here was one who called himself the "chief of sinners." (1 Tim. 1:15) His sins were washed away in baptism.

There are many souls today asking this question, "What must I do?" The answer is the same. When Peter spoke on Pentecost, he added, "For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." (Acts 2:39) There is not anything complicated or difficult about being saved from sins. All that is required is a heart touched by God's mercy, a willingness to confess Jesus as Lord, a determination to turn from sin, and being baptized "for remission of sins."

## At The Old Courthouse

Ms. Juanita Lomenick Wolfard grew up in Iuka. I recently spoke with her about a job she had as a teenager. Ms. Wolfard worked in the old courthouse after school three days a week and on weekends for Mr. Gardner, a county supervisor and justice of the peace. She began working sometime during 1948.

Ms. Wolfard remembered the time saying, "Mr. Gardner's office was upstairs in the courthouse annex next to Mr. Finch's law office. I would look out the window occasionally and see a couple coming up the walk looking as if they were going to get married. I'd tell Mr. Gardner and he would let me walk downstairs. I would ask the couple if they were looking for a J.P. and if they were, I'd take them upstairs to Mr. Gardner's office." She says that when she brought in a couple, whatever they paid him for the ceremony, he would give her half. One couple she recalled tickled her. She said when the time came to pay, Gardner had no set price. The man looked at his new bride and back at Mr. Gardner saying, "Let me try her out and if she's any good, I'll give ya' somethin' in a week."

Ms. Wolfard started selling flowers

for the only flower shop in the county at that time when she worked at the courthouse. I'd have a box of corsages and boutonnieres. They were usually made out of carnations," she said, "and of course a few bouquets of flowers too." She charged about \$5.00 to \$7.50 depending on season and arrangement. Her most memorable sale was to country music singer Red Foley. "I had a pretty little bouquet for the bride to hold that he wanted made up special." Juanita would go back and forth between the courthouse and flower shop. "People were not as rushed in those days as they are now. People used to walk around a lot more and things were simpler. It was a lovely time," she pleasantly recalled.

Ms. Wolfard remembers one couple that she helped to arrange a wedding. Pilot Joe Freeman married his wife Bess in Iuka in 1950. The Freemans come back to visit on their anniversary every ten years. Now residing in Nashville, the Freemans came back to Iuka last week and took Juanita and her mother out to celebrate 40 years of marriage with the young lady that helped make it possible.

A.E. Thompson had the flower

shop at the time. In 1950, Juanita married Thompson. She had recently completed a course at the Tommy Bright Floral Design School in Chicago in late 1949. "A.E. ran a marina at Arora Springs on Rose Trail and that's where we lived. I ran the flower shop until we sold it some few years later to Mrs. Gober and Mrs. Gray." At that time it was the only flower shop in the county. This was shortly before a number of flower shops opened in the area. Juanita went to work at her in-laws flower shop in Tusculum. She was married to Thompson for six years then remarried a few years after that.

"My sister, Bobbie Sue (Finch) was younger than I. We were close though. I had her working for me on deliveries", she recalls. "There was one in particular delivery while we were in Iuka to an old house in the Pogo Community." (I have no idea where this is, maybe somewhere near Belmont?) "I drove an old van truck on roads, which were single lanes of red clay ruts. You tried not to get behind anyone for the mud they would sling. When two cars met, one had to pull over to let the other one by. We had no idea where to go so we asked young Dean Deaton from the Funeral Home to go with us as a guide."

Bobbie Sue asked how we would know where this place was. I made up a story that they didn't embalm people out in the country, which I wasn't lying for those times, then I looked at Dean and said for Bobbie to look for Buzzards flying over and that's where we were going. Dean and I smiled because she started looking out the window" Juanita said. Then she began to chuckle recalling that the joke was on them, "Bobbie Sue pointed at some buzzards flying ahead of us and it turned out to be

right where we were going."

Juanita has been living away from this area for over thirty years. She owned her own flower business until she retired recently. Her sister passed away last spring, her mother Mrs. Mattie Lomenick still lives in the families home. Ms. Wolfard still calls Iuka home and she plans to return now that her children are married and have families of their own. After being a florist for over forty years, I am sure that Juanita's flower garden blooms with the beauty of many fond memories and friendships. (a note from Juanita's cousin Daisy - "I can relate to this because I helped her Mother's Day and every Easter.")

## Racing Review

### Ray Bugg Spanning 33 Years Of Racing

In 1958, at the age of 20 years old a young man from Iuka, Mississippi started racing in what was then known as an A-Car now more commonly called a Sprint Car.

"I went to Lehi and watched them (Sprint Cars) run and as soon as I saw 'em, I knew I had to have me one" says Ray Bugg. Bugg, now a veteran of racing, started his career at Riverside Speedway in West Memphis, Arkansas. Ray who pilots the number 25 Sprinter, a number he's had since his first day of racing, recalls "Bobby Ward from Conway, Ark. was on of the better racers in this part of the country." "He was always a frontrunner" says Bugg. Ray is well qualified to talk about not only Sprint Car racing but asphalt racing as well. Having run with the likes of Ward, Hooker Hood, Red Farmer, Bob Gillingham, Bobby and Donny Allison among others, the 53 year old Bugg has run both dirt and asphalt. For 3 years in the 60s Bugg ran asphalt at places like Lakeland, Nashville and Chattanooga, Tennessee; Laurel, Mississippi and Pensacola, Florida. But it was in Mobile, Alabama that Bugg recalls having went through a bad crash. It was in October, 1967 Bugg says, "I tore the car to pieces and suffered a broken chest bone in two places, crushed four vertebrae in my neck and two below the belt" and believe it or not says Ray "lost two inches in height". Ray was out until the middle of the next year (1968) when he returned to racing driving a B-Car at Riverside Speedway. Then in the early 1970s, Bugg drove the Razorback Special for West Memphis Mayor: Keith Ingram. Although Ray enjoys racing on asphalt, he says "to run locally, I had to run dirt because there are no asphalt tracks" (locally). "If there was an asphalt track here, I would run it" says Bugg. He adds, "you could build a good asphalt car or buy a factory Winston car for what it costs to build a Sprint Car." As for dirt track racing, Ray says he is switching to a Limited Sprint this year but plans to keep his Sprinter for specials and out-of-town races. It's in keeping his Sprint Car that Ray says he would like to see the local tracks run the full Sprints again. Remarried in 1978 for his second time, Ray found support from wife Velma. "If it wasn't for her, I couldn't race" says Bugg. "She works and helps pay for the car and helps work on it and sometimes if it's just her and me, she is my pit crew." So unlike his first wife, "she (1st wife) hated racing" he says. Ray has helped others get started in racing. Todd Williams is one of those. Todd, then a neighbor, was 12 years old when he helped Ray with his car. Nephew Marshall Skinner was another Ray Bugg helped get into racing. And of course, there is Ray's son, Danny who drives the number 25 Limited Sprint. Ray Bugg has two other children; daughter Renee and son David. What does the future hold for Ray Bugg? He plans to move back to his hometown of Iuka, Mississippi in early 1993. As for racing, his fans and peers certainly hope to see Ray Bugg at the races. Ray is the son of Katie and the late Daniel Bugg of Iuka.
