T.C.H.S. & Belmont Plan Waterfalls Scene Of **Arrests By Officers**

A Memorial Day holiday surveillance led to several arrests at a favorite site on the Mississippi side of the Tennessee River by law officers.

Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department officers were joined by agents from Tennessee Valley Authority Public Safety, Coleman State Park Rangers, Tupelo SWAT team, Mississippi Game and Fish Commission, Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics and the luka Police Canine Unit on Friday night, May 22, in a vigil at the area known locally as "the waterfall."

Johnny Nunley, Tishomingo County Sheriff, said that the waterfall cove, located north of J.P. Coleman State Park, used to be a popular family place, but the Sheriff's Department had been getting complaints about the unlawful activities going on there for a while. "We are trying to get it back for the families," Nunley said.

On Saturday, approximately 200-250 boats traveled into the area, according to Nunley. The boats encircled the waterfall inlet, eight and 10

The collaborated surveillance, which continued through Monday night, May 25, led to seven arrests involving illegal alcohol and drugs. Sheriff Nunley named the suspects and their charges as follows:

Donald Chissom, 19, Route 1, Dumas. Chissom was charged with public drunkeness, possession of less than one ounce of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia. He was released on \$2,000 bond.

Home Economics Tips

By: Barbara Guinn. **Extension Home Economist** THAW MEAT CORRECTLY

Most foodborne illness is caused by bacteria that multiply rapidly in foods at temperatures between 60 and 125 degrees F. Foods that are potentially hazardous for bacteria growth must be handled properly to prevent foodborne illness.

Meats require special care in thawing. Do not thaw meat, poultry or fish on the counter. Bacteria can multiply rapidly at room temperature.

The safest way to thaw meat, poultry or fish is in the refrigerator. Place the package in a leak-proof container and place in the refrigerator immediately after removing it from the freezer. Thawing in the refrigerator takes extra time. A large cut of meat or poultry may take one to two days, so extra planning in meal preparation is a must

thawing, put the package in a watertight bag submerged in cold water. Change the water every 30 minutes. The cold water temperatures slows bacterial growth that may occur on the outer thawed portions while the inner areas are still thawing.

The microwave oven is another option for quick, safe defrosting. Follow the manufacturer's directions for your individual microwave. Cook foods defrosted in the microwave oven immediately after thawing.

Another option is to omit the thawing step completely and begin cooking the meat, poultry or fish that is still frozen. It will require about 11/2 times longer to cook a frozen product than in will the same cut when

symptoms pretty much like the flu. Keep up your liquid intake with water, tea, juices, bullion and ginger ale to replace fluids that may be lost through diarrhea or vomiting.

If symptoms are severe, or if the victim is young, pregnant, elderly or has a chronic illness, see your doctor immediately or seek hospital care. Foodborne illness can potentially result in death for the young, pregnant, developing fetus, elderly and those with a compromised immune system.

The three situations in which you should notify your local health authorities are: if you ate the suspect food at a large gathering; if the food is from a restaurant, delicatessen or commercial kitchen; or if the suspect food is a commercial product.

When you call the local health department, you need to be ready to give your name, address, daytime phone number and a brief explanation of the problem.

If the suspect food is a commercial product, try to have the container in hand so you can refer to it. Many products show a lot or batch number vital in getting to the root of the

After you have reported the incident, wrap the product in a plastic bag and place it on ice or in the refrigerator in a secure container marked "DANGER". Write down the name of the food, when it was consumed, and the date of the illness. Store the container in a location where it will not be mistaken for edible food. Keep it away from other foods, children and pets.

The sample may be useful to medical personnel treating the illness. Health officials may want to examine the product and its con-

TOXIC SHOCK SYNDROME

TSS was first recognized in 1978. Almost all of the young women infected has been under the age of thirty, who have used tampons during their periods. The exact cause of TSS has not been pinpointed, although researchers believe staphylococcus aureus bacteria is involved. The theory most widely accepted now is that the bacteria produces a toxin which causes the illness.

A high absobency tampon call RELY was associated with many of the cases of TSS in 1980. The manufacturer of that product voluntarily took it off the market. TSS is on the decrease and it remains a rare disease, about twenty cases per month in the United States. Although it is still a problem, the alarm associated with tampon use has declined. Nevertheless, if you are a young woman who uses tampons, be sure to change them frequently. You should use the lowest absorbency tampon appropriate. Some

The initial symptoms of TSS inrecommend intravenous replacement of lost bodily fluids.

Although TSS is now relatively uncommon, it's still a serious and potentially fatal infection.

Federal Emergency Management Agency gives notice of the proposed determinations of base (100-year) flood elevations, in accordance with Section 110 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (Pub. L. 93-234), 87 Stat. 980, which added Section 1363 to the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (Title XIII) of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 (Pub. L. 90-448), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR Part 67.4 (a).

These elevations, together with the floodplain management measures required by Section 60.3 of the program regulations, are the minimum that are required. They should not be construed to mean the community must change any existing ordinances that are more stringent in their floodplain management requirements. The community may at any time enact stricter requirements on its own, or pursuant to policies established by other Federal, State. or Regional entities. These proposed elevation will also be used to calculate the appropriate flood insurance premium rates for new buildings and their contents and for the second layer of insurance on existing buildings and their contents.

Pursuant to the provisions of 5 USC 605 (b), the Administrator, to whom authority has been delegated by the Director, Federal Emergency Management Agency, hereby certifies that the proposed flood elevation determinations, promulgated, will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small entities. A flood elevation determination under Section 1363 forms the basis for new local ordinances, which, if adopted by a local community, will govern

plain area. The elevation determinations, however, impose no restriction unless and until the local community voluntarily adopts floodplain ordinances in accord with these elevations. Even if ordinances are adopted in compliance with Federal standards, the elevations prescribe how high to build in the floodplain and do not prohibit development. Thus, this action only forms the basis for future local actions. It imposes no new requirement; of itself it has no economic impact.



County **Agents** Notes

By: Danny Owen MUD DAUBERS

You can safely remove mud dauber nests from your home without fear of being stung. Mud daubers are solitary wasps that build small nests of mud on outside walls of buildings and structures. They don't defend those nests when threatened.

Most mud dauber nests can simply be picked off and discarded.

Know the difference between mud daubers and stinging wasps. Mud daubers are long and slender; and have a prominent threadlike waist.

Some mud daubers are black and yellow, and they build a series of cylindrical mud cells. They plaster these cells with mud to form a nest the size of a human fist.

Other mud daubers are robust and black-colored. They insects pipelike tubes on the sides of smooth surfaces of walls and bridges.

Still a third group of mud daubers inhabits abandoned nests of other mud daubers. These daubers are easily recognized by their bluish-toblackish metallic color and bluecolored wings. Remember that all you have to do to remove mud dauber nests is pull them off. **BITING PESTS**

Ouch! Chiggers, fire ants and tickin Tishomingo County are getting ac-

Chiggers (you may call them "red bugs") are moving from weeds and woody areas into lawns. Invisible to the naked eye, chiggers attach themselves to skin. What causes people to itch is the poison they release when they attach.

Warm, soapy water will help remove chiggers. You can treat your lawn with label rates of an approved pesticide to control the buildup of chigger populations.

Fire ants are another problem in Tishomingo County. Those large ant mounds you see may contain up to 150 queens and nearly 500,000 worker ants. Control these insects with applications of an approved insecticide.

Ticks are spreading to our lawns from woody areas. They will latch on to dogs, cats, livestock and warmblooded humans like you and me. Treat lawns with label rates of an approved insecticide to keep ticks from moving inside the house.

You can also use one of several recommended insecticides to control ticks on livestock and pets. Be aware of special precautions that govern insecticide use on animals. Follow label instructions.
