## Bates Re-elected Police Chief In Landslide Vote Tuesday

### Run-off Election For Alderman Nominees May 18th

Some 1090 voters turned out Tuesday in the Democratic Primary Election held in the City of Iuka.

The only position filled in Tuesday's vote was that of Chief of Police. Incumbent James (Amos) Bates defeated his opponents easily without a runoff. Bates tallied 772 votes; John Lyles, 112 votes; and Robert Till, 205 votes. Chief Bates will not have a Republican or Independent opponent in June.

In the race for City Alderman, five Democratic candidates must be decided to face the five Republican candidates on June 8. Nominated with a majority of the votes was James E. Bates with 626. Eight candidates for alderman will face a run-off election on May 18. Voters will select four out of the group of eight which will include Marvin Baker, Herbert D. Booker, Jackie Bryant, Leroy Dean, Mildred L. Martin, Cecil Phifer, Scotty Skinner, and Bessie M. (Bess) Young. Bates along with these four will face 5

Republicans and 1 Independent in June.

### McNeil Wins Primary In Burnsville

In Burnsville's Republican Primary Barbara T. McNeil defeated Kenneth Hutson by a vote of 122 to 114 for the Republican nomination for Mayor. Mrs. McNeil will now face the Independent candidates in the June 8 General Election.

Randy Sheffield received 91 votes to secure a position on the June ballot for alderman. He will face the Independent candidates.

### Belmont Officer Injured In Car Crash

Byron Mabry, a police officer with the City of Belmont, was seriously injured in a one vehicle crash, Tuesday evening, May 4th.

According to Chief of Police, Donald Reno, the accident occurred about 10:25 p.m. as Mabry was responding to a call for back-up by Chief Reno. The patrol car was traveling north on Hwy. 25 when Mabry lost control in a curve near the Belmont Journal Office and hit a tree broad-side.

Chief Reno said Mabry was wearing his seat belt and the car's air bag did inflate at the time of the collision. Mabry was trapped in the car some 25 minutes as the Jaws of Life were used to free him.

The injured patrolman was carried to the Red Bay Hospital and later transferred by helicopter to Tupelo. His condition was not available at presstime.

Mabry's home is in Saltillo. He has worked in Belmont one year.

## Home Economics Tips

SLOW COOKERS: A REVIVAL  
IN THE '90s

You may have one leftover from the '70s, that long-ago wedding or Christmas present stashed at the very back of a kitchen cabinet. In fact you may have forgotten that you have one. But the slow cooker (or Crock-Pot, the name copyrighted by the Rival Co.) has stood the test of time as a convenient addition to any kitchen.

These countertop appliances cook foods slowly at a low temperature, so vitamins and minerals are retained, less expensive cuts of meat are tenderized and meats shrink less. Best of all, the slow cooker can do all this while you're away from home.

Because of renewed interest in this appliance, new cookbooks on crockery cookery are appearing in bookstores. Many recipes have been revised to give better quality products than those in older cookbooks.

One concern that many people have about slow cookers, given

the renewed interest in food safety, is whether they are safe to use. The answer is "yes", if properly used. The direct, intense heat, combined with the bacteria-killing steam created within the tightly-covered container, makes the slow cooker a safe alternative to the risky process of cooking foods for extended periods at a very low temperature in a conventional oven.

To ensure your slow-cooker foods are safe to eat, U.S. Department of Agriculture's Meat and Poultry Hotline offers the following advice:

1) Keep everything clean. Wash hands before and throughout food preparation. Begin with a clean cooker, clean utensils and a clean work area.

2) Keep perishable foods refrigerated until preparation time. The slow cooker may take several hours to reach a safe, bacteria killing temperature. Constant refrigeration assures that bacteria, which multiply rapidly at room temperature, won't get a "heat start" during the first few hours of cooking.

3) Meat and poultry should be completely thawed and cut into

small pieces of like size to ensure through cooking. (Although contrary to recipes in some cookbooks, the Meat and Poultry Hotline does not recommend using the slow cooker for large pieces, like a roast or whole chicken, because the food will cook so slowly it could remain in the bacterial "danger zone" too long.)

Some slow cooker recipes direct you to brown meat. Partial cooking is always risky, so cook meats thoroughly when you do this -- until brown or grey throughout. If the meat is to be used later, refrigerate in shallow containers until ready to use.

4) Fill the slow cooker no more than two-thirds full. If the container is filled beyond its capacity, the heat may not penetrate all food parts.

5) Cover the meat or poultry pieces with liquid. Liquids, in addition to keeping meats and poultry moist and tender, are good conductors of heat.

6) Keep the lid in place. Remove the lid only as often as necessary to stir the food or check for doneness. Significant amounts of heat are lost each time the cooker is uncovered.

7) If possible, set the cooker on the highest setting for the first hour of cooking time. Then choose the setting called for in the recipe.

8) Store leftovers in shallow containers and refrigerate within two hours after cooking is finished.

9) Do not warm cooked foods or reheat leftovers in the slow cooker. Repeated handling can introduce bacteria to cooked foods, and the slow cooker cannot get hot enough fast enough to keep these bacteria from multiplying. If serving cooked food for a party or buffet, bring the food to a boil on the stove and then use the slow cooker to keep it piping hot.

## County Agents Notes

PECAN POLLINATION

Although pecan trees have both male and female flowers on the same tree, Mother Nature has deemed it necessary to minimize self-pollination. Generally, self-pollinated nuts are small and inferior. Within a single tree, pollen shed does not overlap with female receptivity. Therefore, a mixture of two or more varieties is generally recommended to ensure adequate pollination.

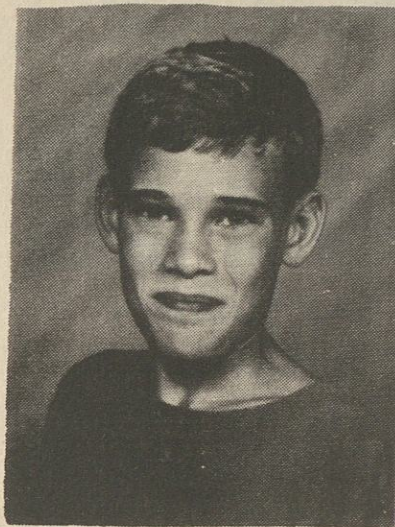
WHAT IS HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Many people think of hazardous waste as a liquid that gives off radiation that instantly kills people. In reality, it can be a solid, liquid or gas and it MAY be harmful to human beings or the environment when NOT HANDLED PROPERLY. It may be TOXIC, corrosive, ignitable, or explosive and care must be taken when storing, transporting, or disposing of it. We

have the technology available for proper management of hazardous waste so that it will not be a hazard. Be careful and be knowledgeable about the products you use.

## WEED CONTROL

Row crop producers in Tishomingo County have many herbicide options available in 1993. Many of these options have a wide range in per-acre cost, making weed control even more cost effective. Some chemical companies offer special purchasing programs, rebates and discounts. I suggest you list each company program you want to consider -- cost, advantages, disadvantages -- and compare them before you make a decision. Investigate the cost of prepackaged mixes versus the cost of products you mix yourself. Be wary of salesmen contacting you over the phone. Some "fly-by-night" companies change the spelling of a well known product and claim that it works the same or better.

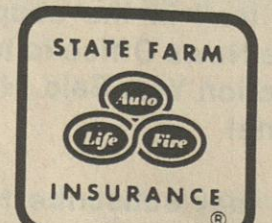

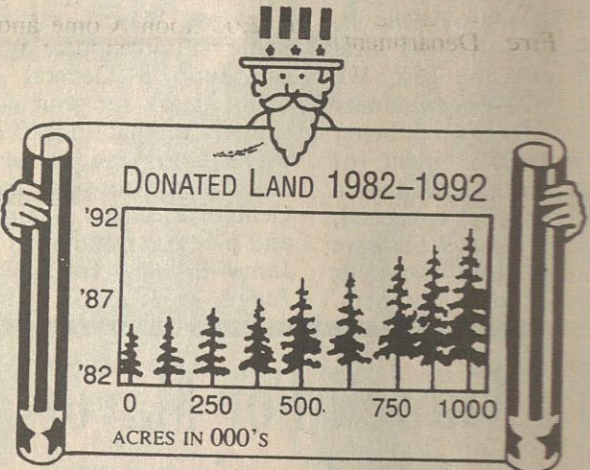

### EXPOSURE TO EYE HAZARDS

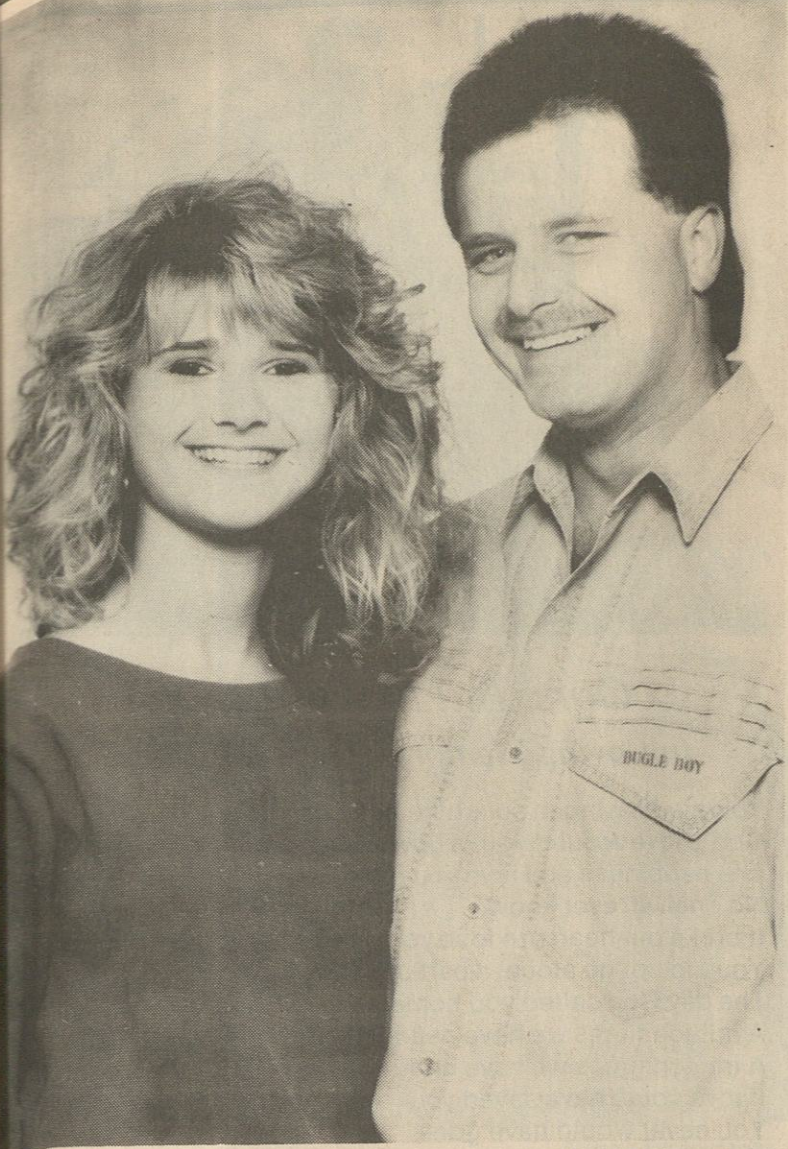

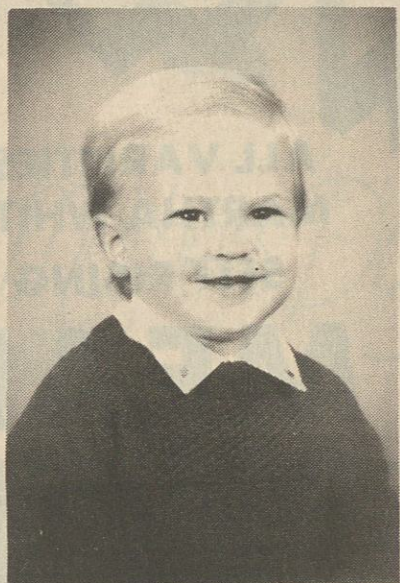

With the help of God, there are things going to be happening at Sardis before long. Stay tuned.

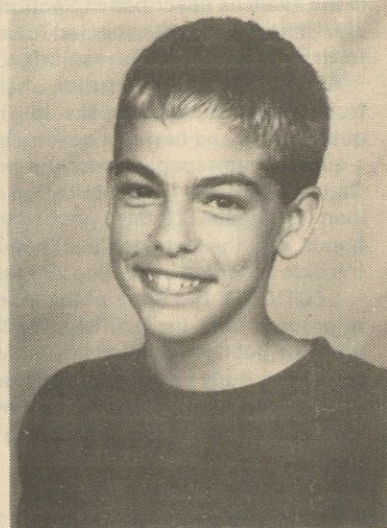

## Legal Notice

There came on for consideration the matter of issuing special obligation, negotiable, interest-bearing combined water and sewer system revenue bonds of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, and after a discussion of the subject matter, Alderman Cecil Phifer offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF SAID MUNICIPALITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$280,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND EXTENSIONS TO THE COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM OF SAID MUNICIPALITY, CONSISTING PRIMARILY OF IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND EXTENSIONS TO THE WATERWORKS AND WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES OF SAID SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Municipality"), acting for and on behalf of the Municipality, hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. The waterworks, water supply, sewerage, and sewage disposal facilities of the Municipality have heretofore been combined and are operated as a combined system known as the combined water and sewer system of the Municipality (the "System").

2. It is necessary and advisable and in the best interest of the Municipality and its inhabitants to issue combined water and sewer system revenue bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$280,000) to raise money for the purpose of making improvements, repairs and extensions to the System, consisting primarily of improvements, repairs and extensions to the waterworks and water supply facilities of the System for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand.

3. The Governing Body has employed Cook-Coggin Engineers, Inc., Tupelo, Mississippi, a competent engineering firm, to study the System, determine the nature and extent of the improvements, repairs and extensions necessary thereto, and make an estimate of the cost thereof.

4. Said engineers have determined the nature and extent of the necessary improvements, repairs and extensions to the System and have made an estimate of the cost thereof, which estimate is the aggregate amount of Two Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$280,000).

5. Said improvements, repairs and extensions are necessary, are economically feasible and would be in the public interest and of benefit to the Municipality, and the findings of said engineers are hereby adopted, including the estimate of the costs of said improvements, repairs and extensions.

6. Under the provisions of Sections 21-27-11 through 21-27-69, Mississippi Code of 1972 (the "Act"), the Municipality is authorized to make such improvements, repairs and extensions and to provide for the payment of the costs thereof, or any portion of such costs, by and through the issuance of bonds, the principal and interest of and on which shall be payable from the revenues of the System.

7. The Municipality reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of said bonds and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse expenditures made in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds.

8. A sum not exceeding Two Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$280,000) must be provided and raised by the issuance of special obligation bonds in said amount, payable both as to principal and interest from the revenues of the System, as authorized by the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body does hereby declare its intention to issue combined water and sewer system revenue bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$280,000) to raise money for the purpose of making improvements, repairs and extensions to the System, consisting primarily of improvements, repairs and extensions to the waterworks and water supply facilities of the System.

SECTION 2. Said bonds in the amount, for the purpose and secured as aforesaid will be authorized to be issued at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at the City Hall on June 1, 1993, at 7:00 o'clock P.M., which date so fixed will be more than ten (10) days after the third date of publication of this resolution, as directed by Section 3 hereof. If a petition signed by not less than twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of the Municipality be filed objecting to and protesting the issuance of such revenue bond issue on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then an election on the question of the issuance of such bonds shall be called and held as provided by law. If no such protest be filed, then such bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof, and may be sold under the regular procedure for selling such bonds.

SECTION 3. The Municipality reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of said Bonds, which it intends to reimburse with the proceeds of said bonds upon the issuance thereof. This declaration of official intent to reimburse expenditures made prior to the

issuance of said bonds in anticipation of the issuance of the bonds is made pursuant to Department of Treasury regulations section 1.103-18 (the reimbursement regulations). The project for which such expenditures are made is the same as described in Section 1 of this resolution. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for the project is the amount set forth in Section 1 of this resolution.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in the Municipality, and being a qualified newspaper under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, the first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for issuance of said bonds, and the last such publication to be more than ten (10) days prior to the date specified in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 5. The Clerk of the Municipality shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of publication of this resolution and to have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.
