Hwy. 30-25 Intersection **Scene Of Fatal Crash**

A Social Worker with the Mississippi Department of Health was killed Tuesday in a two-vehicle accident at the intersection of Mississippi Highways 25 and 30.

Jimmy T. Robbins, 36, of Ripley, had been in the Tishomingo area visiting patients as a part of his social work job with the State Department of Health, according to reports. He was traveling West on Hwy. 30 in his 1992 Honda when he ran a stop sign and collided with a 700 series Ford truck, driven by Jeff L. Gillis, 29, of Iuka, according to witnesses.

Mississippi Highay Patrolman Leslie Blaylock stated that the accident occurred at about 12:30 p.m. Tuesday. Gillis, who suffered some broken bones, was taken to Iuka Hospital and then transported to Tupelo to the North Mississippi Medical Center, reports stated.

Blaylock warned motorist to take extra precautions when traveling through this particular intersection. "This intersection is very dangerous. Motorist from out of town sometimes don't realize that there is a stop sign there. There needs to be a flashing light installed," Blaylock said. "We encourage those traveling in that area to be very cautious.

Two Florida Residents Arrested In Insurance Scam

Two Ft. Waldon Beach, Fla. residents were arrested in Tishomingo County Tuesday, August 24, after they went around to some area residents, claiming to be from an insurance company and collected money.

Alyassa Roberts, 24, 110 Doodle Rd. Ft. Waldon Beach, Fla. & Robert Humphries, 25, 221 Moony Rd., Ft. Waldon Beach, Fla. were arrested after they went to some county resident's homes claiming to be representatives of AFLAC Insurance Company, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley. "Roberts was charged with False Pretense Felony, one count, and Humphries was charged with False Pretense Felony, two counts, Nunley said. One resident was swindled out of \$5,400, the Sheriff reported.

The pair was tracked to Tupelo by authorities and were arrested at approximately 5 p.m. Tuesday.

Nunley warned residents that if someone comes by trying to sell them insurance using this company name, they should contact the Sheriff's Department at 423-6185. Apparently the con men prey on the elderly. If you think you may have already been ripped off by these suspects arrested Tuesday, you may come by the Sheriff's Department and look at pictures of them.

Lt. Governor Speaks At T.C.D.F. Annual Banquet

Lt. Gov. Eddie Briggs told (August 19) Tishomingo County those attending Thursday's Development Foundation An-

nual Banquet that the 1993 legislative session was the most productive session (he) had seen in the 10 years (he) had served in the legislature."

According to Briggs it was the first time in a long, long time that there was a surplus in the state treasury. "Six million dollars was left on the table at the close of the session, while many improvements to Mississippi programs were made''.

The Lt. Governor also stated that the 1987 Highway Program will be completed. "We will find revenue and it will be completed," Briggs vowed. "This project is critical for economic development."

Briggs' agenda for the state includes an opportunity for voters to choose if they want to reduce the 174-member congress to fewer members. "Mississippi has approximately 2.5 million people and 174 legislators. This equals 1 legislator for about every 14,000 people...California, one of the most populous states, has a population of 29.7 million and only 120 legislators." Most other states have fewer congressional members, also, Briggs explained. The reduction would make the legislature operate more efficiently and save taxpayers money, according to the official.

TCDF Executive Director, Mack Wadkins made the announcement at the banquet that he had been contacted by

executives at Belmont Homes who said that they are in the process of an expansion that will provide 200 additional jobs to the county

Wadkins presented a certificate of appreciation to last year's volunteer of the year, Frank Jordan (accepted by his wife Molly), and Volunteer Business of the Year, Bonds Company (accepted by David Bonds), Mary Mason of the Key West Inn was chosen as this year's volunteer of the year.

Alvia Blakney, TCDF Chairman, gave the annual activity report, listing projects undertaken by the foundation in the past year. Among those were the purchase of the railway line servicing Sunshine Mills and West Baco, thereby saving many jobs; Tri-County Incubator program in the Iuka Industrial Park; several industrial recruiting trips; tourism related programs and plans to help save the ASRM project, just to name a few. Blakney also pointed out that the per capita income indicated that Tishomingo County was the fastest growing county in North Mississippi. During the past year a net gain of 340 new manufacturing jobs were created in the county. It was noted by Blakney that the county has the lowest unemployment rate in 13 years.

Entertainment at this year's banquet was presented by Dianne Dean of Iuka and also by Northeast Exposures, directed by Dr. Bob Taylor.

Highway Robbery

Before the dust settled with the passage of the 1993 tax bill, I began efforts to repeal the bill's tax on Social Security recipients. On the day the tax bill passed the Senate, I introduced legislation to repeal a provision that steals nearly \$24.6 billion in taxes from retirees.

The president's budget package, which squeaked through the House (218-216) and the Senate (51-50), contains many unfair provisions, but the portion that raises taxes on middle-income Social Security recipients is probably the most heinous. The bill rakes in \$24.6 billion over five years by raising taxes on single retirees with as little as \$34,000 in income and couples with as little as \$44,000 in income. What makes it even worse is that this tax money is not added to the Social Security trust fund, but used instead to pay for other spending programs.

Here's how this tax clobbers Social Security recipients. It hits a significant number of the elderly, and since it is not indexed, it will affect more and more retirees as times passes. This is blatantly unfair for seniors who are living on fixed incomes. Just like that, they are being told that they have to absorb an exorbitant tax increase and to make matters worse, it is retroactive to January 1st -- three weeks before Bill Clinton was even sworn in as president.

As I wrote in February and March, Social Security is a trust fund and recipients should not be forced to pay higher taxes on their benefits so the president and Congress will have more money to spend. Social Security did not create the budget deficit and is not adding to the deficit.

This tax punishes Americans who have worked hard throughout their lives and saved for retirement.

It also sends the wrong message to our youth. It tells them that saving for retirement is futile. Who in their right mind is going to scrimp and save knowing all along that Uncle Sam will come along at any time and take it for the bottomless pit of the Treasury?

The taxes could have been a lot worse for Social Security recipients if some of the president's early proposals, such as taxing individuals who make as little as \$25,000, had made it into law. However, what passed is still unacceptable as far as I'm concerned -no matter how you slice it, \$34,000 a year in income is not rich.

I am baffled at why lower- and middle-income Social Security recipients have been a target of this administration from day one. I've been fighting against the administration proposal to tax Social Security or limit COLAs since the second week of the new administration when the president suggested reducing COLAs, raising the retirement age from 65 to 67, and taxing Social Security benefits. In June, I offered an amendment to the budget to strike the tax increase, but it failed in a close vote. This is an important battle, however, and I don't plan to give up easily.

My bill would eliminate this unfair tax on Social Security, recipients. I can assure you that I will keep pushing to round up the votes needed to undo this biased tax on middle-income retirees who have already contributed their fair share to the federal Treasury. (8/16/93)



MONOVISION EXPLAINED When contact lens wearers reach the age where they need extra correction for reading (usually after 40), they often get reading glasses to wear over their contacts. There is another option available to them called "monovision."

This technique, used by many eve doctors provides adequate vision for both reading and distance seeing. Without having to resort to reading glasses.

Simply put, one eye is fitted for distance seeing, while the other eye is fitted for near seeing. Naturally, a period of adjustment will be required. Some blur will be experienced at first; there will be flare around lights when driving at night: and more light may be required for reading. After a couple of weeks, most patients get along just fine, and since they're extended wear lenses, they don't have to be removed for at least two weeks.

However, in my opinion, this method of correction while it works in many cases, will never replace bifocal contacts, and I'll explain why in my next column.

- 5. Governance/Financing



To avoid Federal penalities and monetary fines, foreign owners of U.S. agricultural land must report their holdings, acquisitions, dispositions, leases of 10 years or more, and land-use changes within 90 days to the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

The report is required by law, and must be filed if all or part of the land bought, sold or on which the title is transferred to another person is agricultural. Failure to report could result in a civil penalty of up to 25 percent of the fair market value of the interests held in the agricultural land.

As of 12/31/92, foreign investors have reported owning 14.5 million acres of agricultural land in the United States, and 514,396 acres in Mississippi.

For reporting purposes, agricultural land is any tract of more than 10 acres in the aggregate now in farming, ranching, forestry, or timber production. This includes land in agricultural use when purchased, as well as land later converted to agricultural use.

Foreigners who own or have an interest in 10 acres or less in the aggregate do not need to report unless annual proceeds from the sale of agricultural products grown on these acres exceed \$1,000.

ASCS is responsible for monitoring how much agricultural land is owned or controlled by foreign individual or interests.



County Agents Notes

PEACHES AND PLUMS

Now is the time to control peach tree borers on peach, nectarine, and plum trees. Trunk sprays prevent newly hatches borers from getting into trees. Preventative sprays are a must because there is no acceptable way to treat once the trees are infested. Thorough coverage of the tree trunk is essential. Follow the recommended spray schedule A CHANGING SELF - What using sevin, diazinon, or malathion. An application of Thiodan should be made immediately after harvest and then two more applications 3-4 weeks Thiodan 9.7 EC per gallon of water.

HAY STORAGE
