## Hwy. 30-25 Intersection Scene Of Fatal Crash

A Social Worker with the Mississippi Department of Health was killed Tuesday in a two-vehicle accident at the intersection of Mississippi Highways 25 and 30.

Jimmy T. Robbins, 36, of Ripley, had been in the Tishomingo area visiting patients as a part of his social work job with the State Department of Health, according to reports. He was traveling West on Hwy. 30 in his 1992 Honda when he ran a stop sign and collided with a 700 series Ford truck, driven by Jeff L. Gillis, 29, of Iuka, according to witnesses.

Mississippi Highway Patrolman Leslie Blaylock stated that the accident occurred at about 12:30 p.m. Tuesday. Gillis, who suffered some broken bones, was taken to Iuka Hospital and then transported to Tupelo to the North Mississippi Medical Center, reports stated.

Blaylock warned motorists to take extra precautions when traveling through this particular intersection. "This intersection is very dangerous. Motorist from out of town sometimes don't realize that there is a stop sign there. There needs to be a flashing light installed," Blaylock said. "We encourage those traveling in that area to be very cautious."

## Two Florida Residents Arrested In Insurance Scam

Two Ft. Waldon Beach, Fla. residents were arrested in Tishomingo County Tuesday, August 24, after they went around to some area residents, claiming to be from an insurance company and collected money.

Alyssa Roberts, 24, 110 Doodle Rd. Ft. Waldon Beach, Fla. & Robert Humphries, 25, 221 Moony Rd., Ft. Waldon Beach, Fla. were arrested after they went to some county resident's homes claiming to be representatives of AFLAC Insurance Company, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley. "Roberts was charged with False Pretense Felony, one count, and Humphries was charged with False Pretense Felony, two counts," Nunley said. One resident was swindled out of \$5,400, the Sheriff reported.

The pair was tracked to Tupelo by authorities and were arrested at approximately 5 p.m. Tuesday.

Nunley warned residents that if someone comes by trying to sell them insurance using this company name, they should contact the Sheriff's Department at 423-6185. Apparently the con men prey on the elderly. If you think you may have already been ripped off by these suspects arrested Tuesday, you may come by the Sheriff's Department and look at pictures of them.

# U.S. SENATOR TRENT LOTT MISSISSIPPI

## Highway Robbery

Before the dust settled with the passage of the 1993 tax bill, I began efforts to repeal the bill's tax on Social Security recipients. On the day the tax bill passed the Senate, I introduced legislation to repeal a provision that steals nearly \$24.6 billion in taxes from retirees.

The president's budget package, which squeaked through the House (218-216) and the Senate (51-50), contains many unfair provisions, but the portion that raises taxes on middle-income Social Security recipients is probably the most heinous. The bill rakes in \$24.6 billion over five years by raising taxes on single retirees with as little as \$34,000 in income and couples with as little as \$44,000 in income. What makes it even worse is that this tax money is not added to the Social Security trust fund, but used instead to pay for other spending programs.

Here's how this tax clobbers Social Security recipients. It hits a significant number of the elderly, and since it is not indexed, it will affect more and more retirees as times passes. This is blatantly unfair for seniors who are living on fixed incomes. Just like that, they are being told that they have to absorb an exorbitant tax increase and to make matters worse, it is retroactive to January 1st -- three weeks before Bill Clinton was even sworn in as president.

As I wrote in February and March, Social Security is a trust fund and recipients should not be forced to pay higher taxes on their benefits so the president and Congress will have more money to spend. Social Security did not create the budget deficit and is not adding to the deficit.

This tax punishes Americans who have worked hard throughout their lives and saved for retirement.

It also sends the wrong message to our youth. It tells them that saving for retirement is futile. Who in their right mind is going to scrimp and save knowing all along that Uncle Sam will come along at any time and take it for the bottomless pit of the Treasury?

The taxes could have been a lot worse for Social Security recipients if some of the president's early proposals, such as taxing individuals who make as little as \$25,000, had made it into law. However, what passed is still unacceptable as far as I'm concerned -- no matter how you slice it, \$34,000 a year in income is not rich.

I am baffled at why lower- and middle-income Social Security recipients have been a target of this administration from day one. I've been fighting against the administration proposal to tax Social Security or limit COLAs since the second week of the new administration when the president suggested reducing COLAs, raising the retirement age from 65 to 67, and taxing Social Security benefits. In June, I offered an amendment to the budget to strike the tax increase, but it failed in a close vote. This is an important battle, however, and I don't plan to give up easily.

My bill would eliminate this unfair tax on Social Security recipients. I can assure you that I will keep pushing to round up the votes needed to undo this biased tax on middle-income retirees who have already contributed their fair share to the federal Treasury. (8/16/93)

## TCDF News Briefs

This month, News Briefs will attempt to share with you what the "Leadership" of Tishomingo County has identified as the GOALS that must be achieved if we are to prosper according to our VISION. They are:

1. BUILD A MORE UNIFIED, COORDINATED, AND WIDELY SUPPORTED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM.

Economic development is not simply the job of the Development Foundation; it is the job of every government, business, and civic leader in Tishomingo County. Improving the county's competitiveness for new and expanding firms depends on everyone working together toward shared goals. It also requires making significant investments from the public and private sector to fund programs that promote progress. Without a unified effort with widespread participation, Tishomingo County will probably not capitalize on the many opportunities that are present.

2. PROMOTE DIVERSIFIED BUSINESS AND INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT. Future economic prosperity for communities will depend on developing a diversified economic base that can withstand fluctuations in the larger economy. Tishomingo County is fortunate to have many assets such as the NASA rocket plant project, the Yellow Creek Port, over 1,700 acres of land designated for industry, and a Development Foundation that is actively recruiting targeted industries. However, there is much more work to be done to further improve the county's competitive position. Communities must put forth greater effort in the coming years just to stay even with their competitors.

3. IMPROVE EDUCATION AND SKILLS TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES. As emphasized by each of the experts that participated in the "Strategic Planning" workshops, public education and workforce skills training will be one of the most important elements in any community's economic development potential. Inexpensive and unskilled labor is simply not the advantage it used to be for attracting industry. A community that does not produce educated and trainable people will be at-risk in the coming years. The new education facilities in Tishomingo County represent tremendous assets to build upon.

4. DEVELOP ADEQUATE INFRASTRUCTURE AND TRANSPORTATION FOR INDUSTRY. Infrastructure and transportation remain key elements of a community's economic development potential. While having some very important assets such as the Port and recent road improvements, Tishomingo County must continue to enhance roads and sites.

5. IMPROVE THE COUNTY'S OVERALL QUALITY OF LIFE. Continuous improvements to Tishomingo County's quality of life are important to enhancing its competitiveness. While Tishomingo County is a pleasant community and offers many attractive qualities, like any other location, it cannot afford to remain contented and satisfied. Quality of life can include many concerns which all add up to making a community a safe, pleasant, attractive location that offers a range of amenities. Obviously a small community cannot offer the same amenities of a large city, however, it can offer other appealing characteristics. In essence, a community must improve its weaknesses and capitalize on its strengths and not try and be something else.

## Home Economics Tips

### ENCOURAGE CHILDREN TO BELIEVE IN THEMSELVES

Children, like the lion in the "Wizard of Oz," want courage to face fears, to be confident and brave in the face of danger. The Great Oz told the lion courage would come when he believed in himself. So it is with everyone, especially children. Parents build courage in their children by practicing the art of encouragement.

Courage is facing fear in danger. It means trying when things get hard. Courage is believing you can do it. Parents need to expect their child to succeed. State expectations in a positive manner like, "I know that is a difficult task, but I believe you can do it," or "You have good ideas. I know you can think of a way to get the job done."

Allow children to make mistakes without making a big deal out of it. They learn from what happens and do not need to be told they are wrong every time. When parents make mistakes, they should admit it and apologize if that is appropriate. Children learn in this way that it is OK not to be perfect. Even adults make mistakes.

Accept the child's strengths, weaknesses and uniqueness. Don't require a child to conform to set ideas of what a little girl or little boy should be like. Give special attention to the things a child does well. Appreciate special talents and let them know their abilities are important.

Don't compare children. One child is likely to look bad and feel inferior, which causes discouragement.

Encourage effort and improvement. When a child tries a new skill or practices an old one, appreciate and emphasize the effort it takes to try rather than demanding perfection. Say things like, "Those math problems are tough, but I see that you are really trying," or "I am very proud of the effort you put into that task."

Set a good example. Parents should show by word and deed that they believe in themselves and their abilities. If they are a little uncertain about a new task or event, let the child know how they feel and how to develop a positive mind-set. Explain that sometimes parents are not sure of

the outcome of a situation, but they should always try.

Parents can be a source of encouragement for children as they develop the courage life requires.

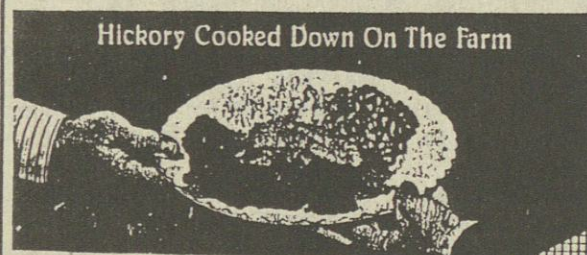

### MONOVISION EXPLAINED

When contact lens wearers reach the age where they need extra correction for reading (usually after 40), they often get reading glasses to wear over their contacts. There is another option available to them called "monovision."

This technique, used by many eye doctors provides adequate vision for both reading and distance seeing. Without having to resort to reading glasses.

Simply put, one eye is fitted for distance seeing, while the other eye is fitted for near seeing. Naturally, a period of adjustment will be required. Some blur will be experienced at first; there will be flare around lights when driving at night; and more light may be required for reading. After a couple of weeks, most patients get along just fine, and since they're extended wear lenses, they don't have to be removed for at least two weeks.

However, in my opinion, this method of correction while it works in many cases, will never replace bifocal contacts, and I'll explain why in my next column.

#### 4-H Communicates

You can never be really sure you know something until you've actually done it...or better yet, taught it to someone else! Whatever you learn -- whether it's from your own independent research, from completing activities in a how-to manual or from reading information -- demonstrate it to others, so they can learn too. If something you read in this column helps you, you'll be helping them by sharing what you have learned.

**SEEING THE WHOLE PICTURE** - Decisions...life is loaded with them! And there's no stopping. As long as you're lucky enough to be living and thinking, you'll have decisions to make. Usually the decisions people make now affect decisions to be made later.

You're probably making some decisions now ... answering the storm of questions hurled at you every day.

Should I buy that expensive designer brand? Are you planning to try out for a sport at school?

Yes, you're faced with decisions every day. Some are more important than others. Some are easy to decide, some are difficult.

There are many popular ways to make decisions...flipping a coin, doing what someone else tells you to do, and even deciding not to decide, but the results aren't always that good. There must be a better way. The 4-H Personal Development project can help you find better ways to make decisions.

**A CHANGING SELF** - What do you and a daisy have in common? If you look closely at a daisy, you'll discover that, depending on how and when you hold it, it will always be a little different. That's what makes you and daisies so much alike. As you grow and change, so does your image of who and what you are...your self-concept.

Don't be too hasty about locking in an exact picture of yourself and assume you'll never vary from that. Continue collecting bits of information about yourself. Continue trying new

behaviors, new skills, and new ideas. Share your ideas with someone you trust. Listen to others' feelings. Don't compare yourself with others. Be your own best self.

Learning to identify and to accept your feelings is a very important part of growing up. Get to know yourself well enough so that you can label your feelings correctly. #### County Agents Notes

##### PEACHES AND PLUMS

Now is the time to control peach tree borers on peach, nectarine, and plum trees. Trunk sprays prevent newly hatched borers from getting into trees. Preventative sprays are a must because there is no acceptable way to treat once the trees are infested. Thorough coverage of the tree trunk is essential. Follow the recommended spray schedule using sevin, diazinon, or malathion. An application of Thiodan should be made immediately after harvest and then two more applications 3-4 weeks apart. Use two tablespoons of Thiodan 9.7 EC per gallon of water.

##### HAY STORAGE

I believe that most producers realize the importance of good hay storage in order to preserve quality. The question is, "Am I losing enough to justify building a pole barn or other protection structure?" With our hot, humid weather, we lose too much

quality to outside storage of round bales. Wraps will help but I feel that we need to work toward good inside storage.

#### COUNTY FAIR

It's almost that time of year again. The Tishomingo County Fair is just around the corner. Dates will be September 28th through October 2. A great week of festivities are being planned so mark your calendar and make plans to bring the whole family.

#### ASCS Farm News

To avoid Federal penalties and monetary fines, foreign owners of U.S. agricultural land must report their holdings, acquisitions, dispositions, leases of 10 years or more, and land-use changes within 90 days to the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

The report is required by law, and must be filed if all or part of the land bought, sold or on which the title is transferred to another person is agricultural. Failure to report could result in a civil penalty of up to 25 percent of the fair market value of the interests held in the agricultural land.

As of 12/31/92, foreign investors have reported owning 14.5 million acres of agricultural land in the United States, and 514,396 acres in Mississippi.

For reporting purposes, agricultural land is any tract of more than 10 acres in the aggregate now in farming, ranching, forestry, or timber production. This includes land in agricultural use when purchased, as well as land later converted to agricultural use.

Foreigners who own or have an interest in 10 acres or less in the aggregate do not need to report unless annual proceeds from the sale of agricultural products grown on these acres exceed \$1,000.

ASCS is responsible for monitoring how much

agricultural land is owned or controlled by foreign individual or interests.

#### Shenandoah Headlines Harvest Jam II Concert
