Furniture Manufacturer To Open Plant In Iuka

Good news for the County came Monday morning as officials with Bauhaus U.S.A., Inc., a high-tech furniture manufacturer, announced their official plans to locate in Iuka.

The upholstered furniture makers, headquartered in Saltillo, said that as soon as contracts can be finalized, they plan to begin renovations of the 80,000 sq. ft. building, once occupied by Lockheed Aerojet & NASA employees on Paul Edmondson Drive in Iuka.

Bauhaus President Marty Silver said that it was not only the quantity of people who responded to the plants initial employment survey that made his company decide to locate in Iuka - 550 total - but the quality of the applicants. "You can teach people a skill, but you can't teach attitude," Silver said.

Operations at the plant are ex-

pected to begin by January of 1994, Silver stated. Hiring is expected to begin very soon with between 125 & 160 employees and an annual payroll of approximately \$2 million dollars expected when the plant is in full operation, the executive explained.

The Iuka plant will do frame construction, sewing, upholstery & shipping, according to Bauhaus controller Larry Gentry.

Bauhaus Vice President, Bruno Policicchio explained that the plant will be engineered from the ground, up to focus on quality and efficiency with automated operations used throughout the facility. "We plan to invest \$750,000 in equipment for the plant," Policicchio said.

The Bauhaus officials said that the employees of their company will have an average wage of about \$9 per hour and will also be

able to enjoy the benefit of health & dental insurance.

The first employees will be taken to the Saltillo plant for training, according to Silver. This training period will be prior to January 1.

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation and its Executive Director, Mack L. Wadkins, worked hard to help recruit the Furniture manufacturers to the Iuka Facility. Wadkins said that by the company locating in the building, it helps vindicate Tishomingo County officials who received a lot of criticism for constructing it as a temporary headquarters for NASA's ASRM project. "The building was constructed with reinforced concrete floors so that it would be able to be used for a factory such as this in the future, according to Wadkins.

"One thing that impressed me

about Bauhaus was that they said that they were not looking for a place with no competition; they said they wanted to help us recruit more furniture manufacturing industry to the area," Wadkins said.

The Bauhaus line of furniture unlike most manufactured in Mississippi, is considered a more contemporary, urban line sold mostly in higher-end furniture & department stores such as Bloomingdale's, Rich's, Goldsmith's, The May Co., The Hudson Bay Co. (in Canada) and also outlets throughout Europe.

The Bauhaus officials were welcomed to the area during their announcement by Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors' President Ricky Cummings and the other Board members and also by Iuka Mayor David Nichols.





Home Economics Tips

AUTUMN IS TIME FOR APPLES

"An apple a day keeps a doctor away"...well, maybe not, but it sure is a pleasant way to get a tasty, low-calorie, convenient snack.

Apples are one of America's favorite fruits, and there are literally thousands of varieties. Colors range from lemon yellow (such as Golden Delicious) to bright green (Granny Smith) to purplish-red (Winesap). Textures vary from tender (Jonathan) to crisp (red Delicious). Flavors go from tart (York) to sweet (Fuji) and many variations in between.

Some varieties that are well-suited for eating out-of-hand or raw in salads include Red Delicious, Golden Delicious,

Gala, Jonathan, McIntosh and Winesap. Apples that are excellent for pies and sauces tend to be tart, such as Granny Smith, Jonathan and York. For baked apples which hold their shape well, consider firm-fleshed ones, such as Rome Beauty, Winesap and York.

These fruits are available year-round thanks to modern commercial storage techniques, although they are especially good in the fall months, when freshly harvested. You usually will find most economical in the fall.

Apples are best when they are allowed to ripen on the tree before picking. Look for firm and well-colored apples; those that lack color for the particular variety are probably immature. Also avoid those that are overripe, as they become "mealy" in texture. (Gently press your thumb into the apple; if it "gives" very easily to pressure,

the apple is probably overripe.) Look for apples without defects such as bruises, skin breaks, shriveled skin and decayed spots. Irregularly-shaped tan or brown spots on the outside of apples (called "scald") do not usually affect flavor.

Notice any bruised or injured areas caused by handling of apples after purchase, cut these portions away and use the remaining portion as soon as possible. Store only firm, good quality apples for later use.

Store apples in the refrigerator humidifier compartment (fruit and vegetables drawer) or in a moisture-resistant container, such as a plastic bag, cut a few scattered small holes in the bag to permit ventilation. For optimum quality, use apples stored in the refrigerator within a few weeks.

One medium raw apple (with skin) contains only 80 calories, less than one-half a gram of fat and no sodium. It also provides fiber and potassium to the diet.

Apples can be used in a variety of ways. They can be used in main dishes, main dish accompaniments, salads, breads, cakes and cookies, other desserts and beverages.

Freezing, canning or drying will preserve apples for later use. They can be made into butter, pie filling, chutney, jelly, preserves, relish, spiced rings, or applesauce. (to create one of the wonderful spicy smells of fall in your home, start homemade applesauce cooking in the kitchen.) Contact this office for safe ways

to preserve your apples for later use.

One pound of apples is equivalent to about three medium apples, which pared and sliced, will yield about 2 3/4 cups. Made into applesauce, the pound of apples will make about 1 3/4 cups applesauce.

Here's a recipe provided by the Washington Apple Commission for a tasty dessert made with apples (another way to make the house smell wonderful!):

APPLE BREAD PUDDING (Makes 10 servings)

8 slices bread
3 medium (1 1/2 lb.) Rome Beauty apples (or other variety suitable for cooking)
1/2 cup raisins
1 1/3 cups skim milk
1/4 cup margarine
5 eggs, beaten
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon each ground nutmeg & salt
1/4 cup packed brown sugar

Toast bread lightly and cut diagonally into fourths. Arrange a single layer of bread in bottom of lightly buttered 11 3/4 x 7 1/2 x 2-inch baking dish. Core and slice 1 apple. Core and dice enough of remaining apples to measure 4 cups. Spread diced apples evenly on bread. Sprinkle raisins over apples. Arrange remaining bread in two lengthwise rows on diced apples. Place apple slices between rows of bread. Heat milk and margarine only until margarine melts. Combine eggs, sugar, spices and salt; gradually add milk, stirring constantly. Pour over bread and apples. Sprinkle with brown sugar. Bake, uncovered, at 350 degrees 40 to 45 minutes on until set. Serve warm or cold.

Nutrient analysis per serving: 253 calories; 8 grams fat; 270 milligrams sodium; 108 milligrams cholesterol. (Note: to reduce the cholesterol content, an egg substitute product may be used in place of the whole eggs.)

Happy Halloween! We all want our young people to have a fun-filled time on this night of ghosts and goblins. Too often, however, the fun can become tragic when simple safety precautions are not followed.

Costumes contribute to accidents by catching fire or causing falls. Many costumes can't be easily seen by motorists and masks often restrict the wearer's vision.


Here are a few tips to make Halloween safer:

- set up boundaries for trick-or-treating.
- Improve night time visibility by wearing a light-colored costume or by attaching reflective tape.
- Make sure the costume is fireproof.
- Check that the costume is neither too long nor too baggy, yet allows freedom of movement.
- Choose shoes that fit well enough for safe walking and running.
- Wear makeup instead of a mask.
- Accept candy only in the original wrapping.
- Know people you are trick-or-treating. Decide in advance what houses you will visit.
- Have parents examine treats before they are eaten.

One way to have a safe Halloween is to plan a party for that night. This will help to assure that the treats are safe and that your trick-or-treaters are home on time.

To make sure that homemade costumes are fire retardant you can treat the garment with the following solution:

Fire Retardant Solution
14 ounces borax
6 ounces boric acid

ASCS Farm News

CROP INSURANCE SALES
CLOSE OCTOBER 31 FOR CERTAIN CROPS

To be eligible for disaster benefits on 1993 crops, farmers who lost over 65 percent of their crops must purchase multiple peril crop insurance on the same crop for 1994, according to Phillip A. Horn, CED of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS).

"Producers of 1993 wheat, barley, oats and rye must purchase 1994 crop insurance by October 31, 1993 for these crops to be eligible for disaster benefits," Horn said. Crop insurance sales

on nursery crops, potatoes and sugarcane also close on October 31st.

He said farmers are required to certify that they understand the failure to pay the required crop insurance premiums will mean forfeiture of disaster payments. "Producers cannot avoid the insurance simply by delaying to file for disaster payments."

ASCS waived the crop insurance requirement for some crops because their 1994 crop insurance sales closing dates occurred before the 1993 Disaster Assistance Program was announced. Horn said the crop insurance requirement is waived only for 1993 crops of fresh peppers, citrus trees and sugar beets for Imperial County, California.

"Producers of any other 1993 crops with more than 65 percent in production losses must agree to obtain 1994 multiple peril crop insurance to receive 1993 disaster benefits," the ASCS official said.



Cellular One Expands Coverage Area

Cellular One of Northeast Mississippi has begun construction on a new cell site located five miles west of Booneville, Mississippi near Jumpertown.

The 350 foot structure is being constructed by one of the industry's leading construction companies, Summit Communications of Jackson, Mississippi.

Blasingame commented, "This decision was influenced by the large demand for increased cellular communications in the Booneville/Ripley area due to the numerous logging and agricultural businesses."

Cellular One of Northeast Mississippi presently operates six cell sites which are located in Tupelo, Fulton, Pontotoc, New Albany, Corinth and Iuka.

Tenn-Tom Hunters Get New Public Lands

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has recently acquired 3,459 additional acres of land for wildlife mitigation along the East fork of the Tombigbee River in Monroe and Itawamba Counties, Mississippi. These lands will be managed by the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks (MDWFP), and will become part of the Canal Section

Wildlife Management Area Prior to the 1994/1995 hunting season. However, for the 1993/1994 season, MDWFP and the Corps will cooperatively enforce hunting regulations there. State and Federal game laws, Title 36, and Corps hunting permit regulations will be enforced through this cooperative agreement between the Corps and MDWFP.

There is also evidence that suggest that McCormick may not have been the true inventor at all, that his wife may have been the machine's real creator.

Wilcie Elfe, 1800s. Elfe was a slave Pharmacist in South Carolina. According to some accounts, he kept a prescription book, last dated 1853, in which he outlined several drugs he created. Apparently Elfe also sold his concoctions, though little is known about those creations.

Soil Conservation

Crop residue management is one of the most economical and effective ways to reduce soil erosion on cropland during the winter months. By leaving the crop residue on the soil surface, soil erosion will be held to a minimum for harvest until planting next spring. All crop residue should be left on the soil surface after harvest; not burned,

removed or plowed under. On land subject to flooding, residues should be left standing.

Even distributions of crop residue will be more effective in reducing soil erosion than residue that is wind rowed or left standing. Effective shredding and distribution of crop residue can be accomplished by flail-type mowers or rotary mowers for standing cotton or grain sorghum. Chopper spreaders or double spin spreaders attached to the combine are also a good way to spread crop residue.

If fall tillage is needed it should be done with a chisel plow or sub-

soiler on the contour. A bedder should never be used in the fall. According to research, chiseling or subsoiling in the fall is only beneficial on soils that have developed a hard pan or plow plan. Research indicated that fall tillage has little or no benefit on soils.
