ARC Grants To Benefit The Northeast

Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) grants totaling \$340,200 will benefit five northeastern communities, Governor Kirk Fordice announced today.

The ARC grants will assist in establishing a three-county-business incubator in Alcorn, Tiptah, and Tishomingo counties and help make infrastructure improvements in Lee County and the City of Aberdeen.

"These ARC grants address two very basic strategies for economic development in the northeast area," Gov. Fordice said. "Improving infrastructure needs and encouraging employment opportunities are valuable uses of these funding sources, and I am delighted that the State could assist these communities in obtaining these federal monies."

The \$200,000 grant to City of Aberdeen will help fund improvements to its sewage collection system, lift and pumping stations, and wastewater treatment systems. These improvements will assist the expansions planned for the city's major motel and several industries.

The \$75,000 grant to Alcorn, Tiptah and Tishomingo counties will be used to complete the financing of a three-county incubator project. The Northeast Mississippi Business Incubator System will have its headquarters in Corinth with satellites facilities in Tiptah and Tishomingo counties. The ARC funds will be used to help defray the costs of new construction in Tiptah County, refurbishing an existing facility in Tishomingo County, and purchasing equipment for the main facility in Corinth.

The \$65,200 Lee County grant will help fund the grading, drainage work and paving of an access road to serve the Bryce Toga USA plant site in the Tupelo-Lee Industrial Park South. The access road will provide service to an additional 30-acre site and other future plant operations proposed at the park. Bryce Toga, a leader in the candy packaging market, will invest \$6 million in equipment and building cost, creating some 87 jobs when the project is completed.

The Mississippi Office of the ARC is located in the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development (MDECD) Northeast Field Office in Tupelo. In conjunction with MDECD, ARC serves a 21-county area in northeast Mississippi. The program is a partnership of federal, state, and local governments. In fiscal year 1993, approximately \$2.5 million was allocated through ARC for economic development projects.

Redmonth Fiberglass & Plastics To Purchase County-Owned Facility

A county-owned 64,000 sq. ft. building in Belmont's new industrial park will become the permanent home of Redmont Fiberglass and Plastics after the company's officials signed a lease/purchase agreement with Tishomingo County Supervisors Monday.

Redmont Fiberglass and Plastics, which manufactures primarily fiberglass bathtubs, shower stalls and whirlpool baths, began production in 12,000 sq. ft. of the building, located about 3/4 of a mile East of Hwy. 25 in Belmont, in February of this year. At that time, there were only five employees, according to company president Mike Stockton. "Now we employ 17 and expect to hire up to 25 by next spring," Stockton said. "Since our beginnings, we've seen a 35 to 40 percent increase in production."

Along with the initial product line, the company has added other products to meet the needs of another local industry, Stockton explained. "We initially began the plant to serve the needs of the mobile home industry in the area, including Belmont and Sunshine Homes, then we expanded our production to include fiberglass seating used by Falcon (formerly Kaydee)." Falcon uses the seats in many of the restaurant chains that they design and install including Taco Bell, McDonalds and Kentucky Fried Chicken, he said. "We also sell our bathtubs and spa line to the public, including new and also blemished tubs," Stockton said.

"We have to thank Mack Wadkins, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors and Belmont Mayor Bob Yarber for their help and cooperation in the acquisition of this building. We

had picked another site in another state, but they convinced us to remain in the building in Belmont," Stockton said.

In addition to Mike Stockton: Greg Sparks, Lex Sparks, and Rayburn Stockton are officers in the company. All the officials work in the actual production of the company's products.

This is the second industry to locate in county-owned buildings recently. Bauhaus U.S.A. announced its plans to locate in an Iuka Industrial park last week during a press conference.

Public Service Commission Hears Complaint Filed By Tishomingo County Residents

The Mississippi Public Service Commission Tuesday gave Albert Shadburn his day in court on his complaint filed in August against the Tishomingo County Water District.

Commissioner Bo Robinson heard arguments for plaintiff Shadburn, represented by attorney Michael D. Cooke and respondent TCWD, represented by Nicholas B. Phillips at the Tishomingo County Courthouse. The Commission was represented by attorney C. Frances Corley in the proceedings.

Robinson will make his ruling after receiving written proposed orders from attorneys for the plaintiff and respondent within 10 days.

Cooke presented testimony from 10 witnesses and submitted exhibits for the Commission's consideration. The first group of witnesses included Shadburn; Karen Jones of Booneville; Anthony "Andy" Tigner of Indian Creek Road, Iuka; Ida Ann Bean of Eastport Road, Iuka; and Randolph W. "Randy" Rye of Aberdeen - were property owners who had joined in the petition for water service from TCWD. Each witness responded to questions about the availability of water service to their property, and their expectations for service from the water district.

Shadburn testified that at a public hearing held in May 1991 to determine if the Eastport-Snowdown Water Association would give up its certificated area to form the Tishomingo County Water District, he was assured by county officials at that meeting that his property would be served under the new water district. Shadburn said his expectation of service was reinforced when the engineer contracted by the county to develop the project, Bobby Hodges of Cook Coggin, came to see him with former county supervisor Frank Williams Jr. and showed him a map which included service to Indian Creek Road. Testimony from Williams confirmed Shadburn's statement about the meeting with Hodges, Shadburn and Williams, but he was unable to recall specific statements made to Shadburn at the May 1991 public hearing. Charles Jones and Gaylon Jones, two brothers who also attended the public hearing, added their testimony to the effect that assurances were made to Shadburn at that time that his property would be served with water by the newly-formed water district. Cooke then questioned Hodges closely on several points: whether or not he attended the May 1991 public hearing; the meeting and conversation between Hodges, Williams and Shadburn; the line of authority in approving the water district service area map; criteria for determining who would be served by the water district; technical aspects of extending service to Alabama residents out Snowdown Road; and funding sources for the construction project.

Home Economics Tips

RECOGNIZE SCHEMES AND HOW THEY WORK

Learning to recognize common schemes can be your best defense against fraud and deception. While numerous types of fraudulent acts exist in today's society, three schemes to watch out for are the "Pigeon Drop," the "Bank Examiner," and the "Phony Official."

With the Pigeon Drop scheme, a person is approached by strangers who claim to have found a large bag containing cash. Through a series of deceptions, the victim is convinced to put up "good faith" money to share in the find. Once the victim puts the good faith money in a purse or parcel for safekeeping, he or she is distracted and the parcel containing the money is switched for another one. The Bank Examiner scheme involves a con artist posing as a bank official or police officer. The "official" requests assistance in

checking on an employee suspected of defrauding the bank. The con artist persuades the victim to withdraw large sums of cash from his or her bank account, supposedly so the official can mark the bills and track down the employee. The victim never gets the money back.

A third scheme is the Phony official where swindlers pose as representatives of an official agency, such as Medicare, the local zoning board or Social Security. They persuade victims to buy insurance for medical costs not covered by medicare, or for home repairs, furnaces or other appliances.

The swindlers then trick victims into buying high-priced and shoddy or non-existent repairs, equipment or insurance policies. In another version of this scheme, victims are told they may be eligible to receive larger Social Security monthly benefits, but a physical examination will be necessary. While the victim is being examined by one swindler, his or her partner is stealing the victim's belongings from another section of the house.

Opening Bell Signals Bullish Work At School

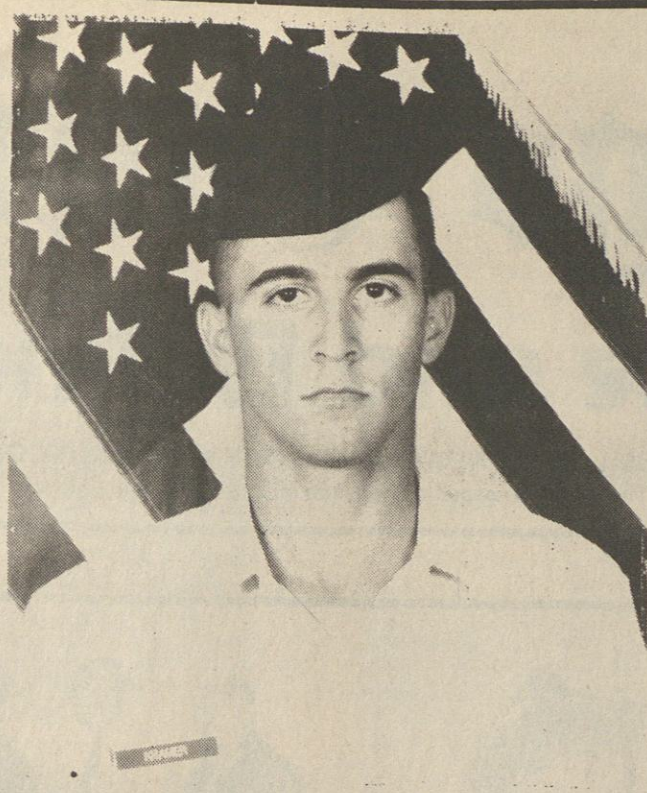

Marine Pvt. Shannon B. McMeans, son of Shirley Skinner of Iuka, Miss., is deploying to Somalia with 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, N.C. as a part of the USS Guadalcanal Amphibious Ready Group (ARG).

McMeans and his fellow Marines are joining other U.S. forces ordered to Somalia in response to recent hostile actions against American and other military personnel there. Naval forces being sent to Somalia include the aircraft carrier USS Abraham Lincoln and the guided missile destroyer USS Chandler; the USS Guadalcanal's three-ship ARG with the 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) embarked; and the four-ship USS New Orleans ARG with the 13th MEU embarked. Each MEU has

more than 1800 Marines.

The USS Guadalcanal was operating in Mediterranean when redeployment was ordered. Abraham Lincoln was in the Persian Gulf; and the USS Orleans ARG was in the China Sea.

This redeployment demonstrates the flexibility and mobility of naval forces. The Navy Marine Corps are full partner in joint operations and can operate overseas to respond swiftly to crises in distant lands, from sea.

The 1989 graduate of High School of Iuka, Miss., joined the Marine Corps in 1990.

ten for such television shows as "L A Law" and "Thirty Something", and sometimes has meetings in LA. Cynthia heard on the news that fires were out of control in Laguna Beach and school children were being evacuated. Cynthia has two children, Margo, 15 years old, and Brian, 12 years old. Not knowing exactly where her children were, the forty mile trip from Los Angeles to Laguna

Beach took four long hours. After all the blockades, traffic and rerouting, Cynthia finally reached home. Cynthia was shocked to see Laguna Beach was black, just as it would have been at night, yet it was the middle of the day. Her children were found and they went to their home where their work began.

Seeing the fires from her house, she and the children threw everything they could stuff into garbage bags and put it in their car. As they were grabbing what they could and watering their roof with the garden hose, the police were driving up and down their street telling everyone to "get out" over their loudspeaker. Everyone was being evacuated and told to move nearer to the beach. Cynthia drove their packed car with her children and their dog down the hill in bumper to bumper traffic. Not able to get down, they were finally rerouted down a "Fire trail" which is one of the dirt roads used in emergencies such as these.

Safe at last, she and the children planned to spend the night at a relatives house that was on the beach. They anxiously watched the news, not knowing if they would still have a home to go to in the morning.

The Laguna Beach Police were threatening people with arrest if they tried to return to their homes because the areas was unsafe. Unable to resist the temptation of returning to see for themselves, many residence, including Cyn-

injured.

The fire in Laguna Beach had been set by an arsonist as had four of the total twelve fires in southern California. The fires destroyed over 135,000 acres and burned over 700 homes. The homeless either stayed in shelters or stayed with friends.

Cynthia had helped a friend, the day before, gather the things she most wanted to save. When her friend returned home the next day, the things she took with her was all that she had left. Her house had burned during the night. Many residence of Laguna Beach did not even have time to take their mementoes and had lost everything. Even though the most important thing to save is one's life there is still a feeling of extreme loss to lose all the things that are symbols of the memories of your life.

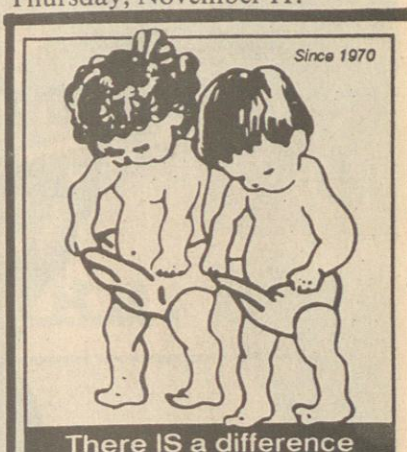
Californians have survived a lot in the past few years. Besides being the hardest hit state in the recession, they have also had a riot, a major earthquake, floods and now this devastating fire storm.

Hodges said the primary guiding factor was the Mississippi Department of Health's moratorium, and the system improvements which were required to meet their standards. He also said some priorities were based on terms of the FHA loan which helped finance the project.

Hodges said the map he had shown to Shadburn was a hydraulic map, not a construction map, and it was never intended that Indian Creek Road would be served in Phase I of the project. However, Hodges admitted under further questioning that the average individual like Shadburn would not know the difference between a hydraulic map and a construction map, and the map did not indicate work to be done in different phases.

The final witness for the plaintiff, and the only witness for the defense, was David O. "Bubba" Jourdan III, president of the water district.

Jourdan said the water district board had performed the task that was assigned to them when the water district was formed.

"We were formed to take what was presented to us as a board and obtain funds, select a contractor and get the work done," Jourdan said. "...People keep losing sight of what we've done. We now have two 100,000 gallon water tanks and room for expansion up to 2,000 customers. I think we've done a real good job so far. We did the best we could with what we had, with the limited funds available."

Saying the construction project is 92 to 93 percent complete, with an expected completion date of Nov. 27, Jourdan said the project has cost approximately \$1.7 million.

Jourdan said the water district board has explored several sources

of funding to provide service to the residents of Indian Creek Road and vicinity. Application for an Appalachian Regional Commission grant was submitted four to six weeks ago, grant funds from the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development were requested, and a loan from Farmers Home Administration was requested and denied.

Jourdan admitted under questioning that, of all Tishomingo County and Alabama residents being served by the water district, only the 34 residents around Indian Creek Road who had signed the petition had been asked to finance the proposed \$70,000 cost of providing service to their area.

Jourdan was also questioned about ownership of personal property in Alabama and development property in Eastport which will benefit from the water system improvements. He said his properties had not been served by the water system before but now will be.

Shadburn and 33 other property owners in the Indian Creek Road area of Tishomingo County had requested and petitioned for water service from TCWD and its predecessor Eastport-Snowdown Water Association for several months. As of the filing of the complaint, they had received no response.

The complaint before the Commission asserts that the Tishomingo County Water District:

■ Represented, prior to the formation of the Tishomingo County Water District, that the plaintiff and other landowners in present dry areas of the county would be served with water and have failed to do so to date.

■ Has begun construction with

grant monies to serve areas of the certificated area to the exclusion of the plaintiff and other landowners.

■ Has begun construction to serve landowners of the state of Alabama in violation of the laws of this state.

■ Has discriminated against the plaintiff and other residents by refusal and failure to serve them or to give any reason why they should not be served.

■ Has arbitrarily and capriciously selected certain landowners' areas to be served to the exclusion of other landowners in the certificated area.

■ Has failed to properly spend funds equally to all residents of the certificated area.

■ Has devalued the property of the plaintiff and other landowners in the area by failing to serve their property with adequate water.

County Agents Notes

FROSTED GRASS

Many cattlemen depend on an excess of frosted grass to carry their cattle well into the winter. Some also let their cattle glean row crop fields to utilize crop residues and frosted grass left in these fields. Where this is done, caution should be taken with cattle grazing plants of the sorghum family which have been frozen by frost. These include john-sorghum, sudangrass, sorghum-sudangrass hybrids, grain sorghum, silage sorghum, and sweet sorghum for syrup. When the cells of these plants are ruptured by frost, prussic acid may be released, which can be very toxic to cattle. After the plants are cured out, they can be safely consumed by cattle.

HORTICULTURE QUESTIONS

What type of lawn grasses can be planted now? Any of the TURF-type fescues can be planted now. Kentucky-31 is not recommended for lawns because it is a pasture fescue that is designed for tall, rapid growth.

Is it alright to prune fruit trees now? You should not prune trees if green leaves are present. This will weaken the tree and might cause regrowth during a warm spell.

Should sweet potatoes be washed before storage? No. Adding more moisture could lead to storage rotting and decaying.

Volunteers Sought For Local Hospice Program

More Americans are turning to hospice -- a special kind of care for terminally ill patients -- than ever before, increasing the need for volunteers. The National Hospice Organization recently indicated that 246,000 patients and their families received hospice services in 1992, a 17 percent increase from the previous year. Locally, Superior Hospice experienced a 39 percent rise in patients.

Advancing into its fifth year, the hospice program of Superior Home Health and Hospice is seeking more volunteers to meet the special needs of patients in their last months of life. Special training enables volunteers to add personal touches to the care of terminally ill patients. The first training session for volunteers will be at 9 a.m., Tuesday, November 9, in the private dining room at Magnolia Hospital.

"They (hospice) cannot add days to your life but they can absolutely add life to your days,"

said one hospice patient."

"A volunteer's service can be anything a person would do for a sick friend," said Ann White, volunteer coordinator for the hospice program. "The duties can range from grocery shopping, to sharing a hobby, to reading a story, or to sitting with a patient while a caregiver attends church. We need volunteers regardless of what they are willing to contribute."

"Volunteers are the heart of the hospice. They play extremely vital roles. We could not operate without volunteers," said White. "The role of the volunteer is unique. It cannot be filled by other team members. The companionship, caring and just being there is an invaluable service to families at this special time in their lives."

Hospice care is a team effort involving the patient's primary physician, the medical director of the hospice program, registered nurses with special expertise in the care of terminally ill patients, social workers with a knowledge of community resources, a chaplain, home health technicians and volunteers.

"The focus of the hospice team is to enable the patient to remain at home and be as comfortable as possible," said White. "The hospice program is a service to patients and their families. It provides palliative and supportive care to meet the special needs arising from physical, emotional, spiritual and social stresses experienced during the final stages of illness and bereavement."

"To qualify for hospice care a patient must be terminally ill with a life expectancy of six months or less, be unable to benefit further from curative therapy, and have a caregiver who will assume responsibility for custodial care and be the decision maker in the event the patient becomes no longer competent to make decisions."

"In hospice, we recognize dying as part of the normal process of living and focus on enhancing the quality of remaining life," stressed White.

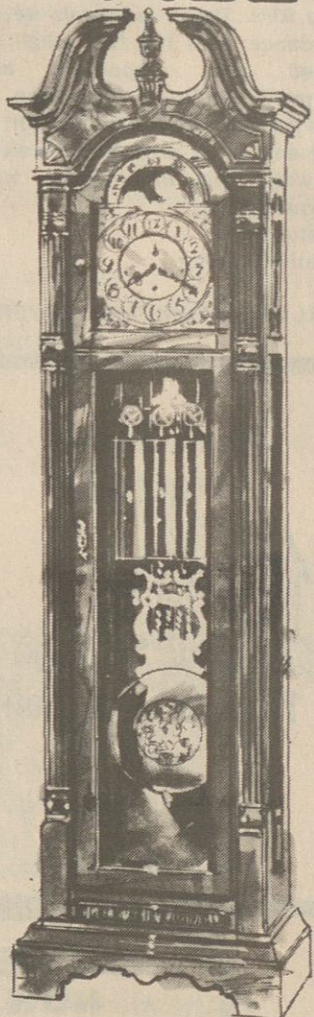
