Utah Jobs Moving To Yellow Creek NASA Site

Public Invited To Official Announcement and Reception Today At T.C.H.S. Auditorium

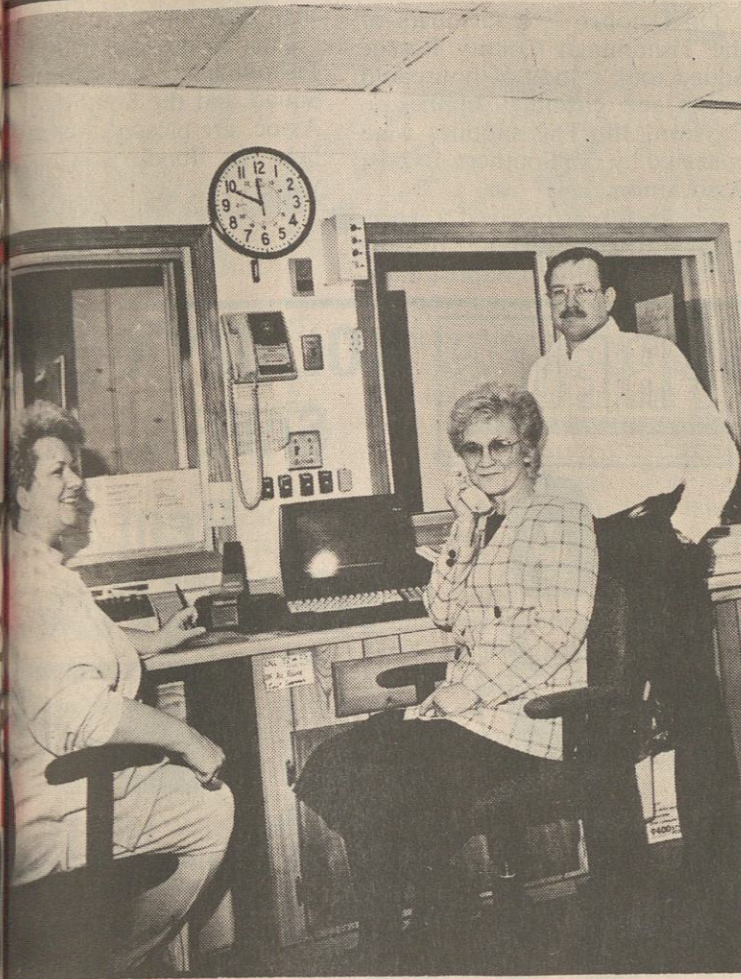
More than 1,000 jobs will be moving to NASA's Yellow Creek Facility from Morton Thiokol Corp. over a three-to-four-year period, according to a Utah Senator Tuesday, November 30.

Although Mississippi Congressmen have not confirmed the report, a special announcement ceremony and reception has been scheduled for Thursday, December 2 at the Tishomingo County Magnet High School auditorium beginning at 11 a.m. The public is encouraged to attend.

A delegation of Mississippi and Alabama lawmakers have been working to find an alternative use for the site at Yellow Creek after the Advanced Solid Rocket Motor project was canceled in October.

Thiokol makes the Redesigned Solid Rocket Motors currently in use by NASA. The announcement Tuesday said that Thiokol would be moving production of rocket nozzles used on these redesigned motors to the Tishomingo County plant from their Utah facility.

Mack L. Wadkins, Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation will serve as Master of ceremonies at the official announcement Thursday. Daniel Goldin, administrator of NASA and Edwin Garrison, chairman of the Board of Morton Thiokol are scheduled to speak. Also on the tentative schedule are members of the congressional delegation including Rep. Jamie Whitten (D-Miss), Sen. Thad Cochran (R-Miss.), Sen. Trent Lott (R-Miss.), Sen. Howell Heflin (D-Ala.), Rep. Robert Cramer (D-Ala.). Governor Kirk Fordice will be rounding out the morning's ceremony. A reception is scheduled to follow at the Tri-State Learning Center, located adjacent to the school's auditorium sponsored by the T.C.D.F.

911 Goes Into Effect Today

On Thursday, December 2, the enhanced Emergency 911 system will go live throughout Tishomingo County after many months of preparation.

The 911 system, with its headquarters in the Tishomingo County Jail in Iuka, will operate 24 hours a day to handle emergencies throughout the county.

According to present 911-coordinator Geraldine Rushing, every residence, business, industry, etc., within the county has been assigned a number and county road number. When an emergency call comes in, the name of the person calling, their phone number and address (house no. and county road no.) comes up on the computer screen. "This is the advantage of the enhanced 911," Rushing said. "We have all the important information and can respond even if the person on the other end can't tell us the address. This will allow an officer or an ambulance to get to the scene faster."

Residents are reminded to only dial 911 in case of a real emergency. Pat Smith, one of four full-time dispatchers for the system, said that they don't mind people who are teaching their children to dial 911 calling as long as they tell the dispatcher when they answer that this is what they are doing. "When a 911 caller hangs up, we will return their call to see if there is an emergency situation. If we can't get through, an officer will be dispatched." She went on to explain that if the caller requires an ambulance, another law enforcement agency within the county, or the Mississippi Highway Patrol, the 911 system allows a three-way connection between the caller, the 911 dispatcher and these agencies. The 911 system can also be used to dispatch the various volunteer fire departments throughout the area.

Rushing, who gathered the information for the 911 system, said that there will be a 911-coordinator on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. daily to answer questions you may have concerning the system. Jerry Bonds will be taking over as 911-coordinator once the system is running. You may call him at 423-7004.

Ricky Cummings, president of the Tishomingo County Board of

Supervisors, said that he is glad to have the 911 system up and running. He expressed that Geraldine Rushing had done an excellent job pulling the system together. "She has worked real hard gathering all the information and putting it into the computer."

While many 911 systems in the state have reported having financial problems, Cummings assured that the Tishomingo County E-911 is in good financial shape. "The reason we are in good shape financially is that we have a good 911 Board and Sheriff Johnny Nunley allowed us to come into the jail and use his personnel, which cut down on the costs considerably. Also Jerry (Bonds) agreed to work as 911-coordinator on a part-time basis which helped curb the costs. At this time we see no immediate need to increase the 911 billing costs," Cummings said. He went on to say that he believes that our Tishomingo County System will be one of the best--if not THE BEST--in North Mississippi.

Everyone in the county needs to find out their new house number and county road number, if they don't already know them, from the 911-coordinator or the post office. The post offices within the county have already contacted many residents and will continue to do so until the process is completed.

Your house number should be clearly displayed in your yard or, according to Bonds, on your house if it is very close to the roadway.

Cummings said that there has been some problem in the county with people tearing down the county road signs. "It is important that these signs remain in place," Cummings said. "In addition to costing the county a lot of money to replace, the absence of the signs could endanger someone's life in an emergency situation."

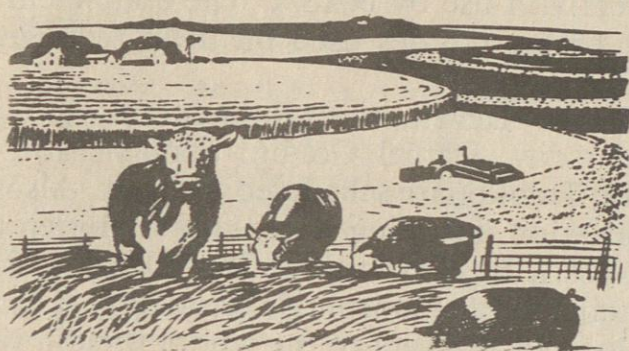

Soil Conservation News

A planned grazing system is a practice in which two or more grazing units are alternately rested and grazed in a planned sequence. Rest periods may be from a few days to one or two months throughout the year.

The purposes of planned grazing systems are: to maintain existing plant cover and hasten their improvement while properly using the forage of all grazing units; to reduce soil erosion and improve water quality; to increase grazing efficiency; to insure a supply of forage throughout the grazing season; to promote flexibility in the grazing program and to buffer the adverse effects of drought.

Each grazing system should be tailored to help meet the cattleman's objectives and be designed to fit the size and number of grazing units, the types of

grasses and types of cattle. Consideration must also be given to fencing, water facilities and weed control.

All livestock should be removed from pastures being rested until the pasture has time to recover. Under good growing conditions, a pasture should be rested from 14 to 21 days. Under adverse growing conditions, pastures should be rested from 4 to 8 weeks.

If you would like more information on planned grazing systems, contact the Soil Conservation Service. Service from USDA will be provided without regard to race, color, sex, religion, handicap or national origin.

Home Economics Tips

NUTRITION HELPS ATHLETES GO THE DISTANCE

A well-balanced diet is essential for top performance and good health in young athletes.

Athletes must adjust their diet to match the energy needs of their sport, which often means adding extra calories to the recommended daily allowance.

A good diet should provide all the minerals, vitamins and protein that young athletes need. Eating enough can be a challenge because teens often have poor eating habits and may not eat at regular times.

The ideal diet, consisting of foods from each group in the Food Pyramid, should provide about 15 percent of energy from protein, 30 percent from fat and 55 percent of energy from protein, 30 percent from fat and 55 percent from carbohydrates.

Athletes participating in involving prolonged exertion such as swimming, running or cycling, should get 70 percent of their energy from carbohydrates and decrease fat intake to 15 percent. This can be done by adding bread, potatoes, pastas and rice to the diet.

To keep energy reserves "topped up," nutritionists recommend a well-balanced diet divided into frequent meals throughout the day including breakfast, lunch and dinner and at least two between meal snacks. Many teens rely on candy for quick energy, but better choices for snacks are low-fat granola, peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, bananas, a glass of low-fat milk, low-fat yogurt or dried fruits like dates and raisins.

Young athletes, especially girls, need to get enough iron and calcium. Iron carries oxygen to the muscles for the production of energy. Lean red meat and other iron-rich foods such as legumes and whole-grain or fortified cereals and breads are recommended to prevent anemia. Daily

servings of dairy products such as cheese, milk, and yogurt, are essential for the development of strong bones.

All athletes should drink plenty of water to replace the fluids lost through perspiration. Athletes need to drink a cup of cold water every 20 minutes while working out to prevent dehydration, heat cramps and heat exhaustion.

Young athletes should talk to a school nurse, dietitian or family doctor if they have dietary questions and concerns.

County Agents Notes

BEAVER CONTROL

There will be a program on Beaver Control on December 6, 1993 at 6:00 p.m. at the Tishomingo County Fairgrounds. This program is free to the public and everyone is cordially invited.

FIREWOOD

Check firewood for cockroaches, beetles, spiders, etc., BEFORE bringing into the house. Hit two pieces together to "jar" insects off. Don't spray firewood with insecticides because poisonous fumes may be given off when wood is burned. For the most part, pests living in firewood pose no threat to people, furniture, or to structures. However, most people are opposed to their presence. When stored outside, treat the ground beneath the wood with an approved insecticide for control of termites.

PEACHES

A chemical called Ethrel has been used experimentally for several years now on peaches and blueberries to delay bloom. According to Dr. Frank Matta, Professor of Horticulture at Mississippi State University, this delay in blooming can be one to two weeks. At the request of growers, Dr. Matta requested that the Bureau of Plant Industry pursue a Section 18 permit for the use of Ethrel on peaches. Rhone-Poulenc, the makers of ethrel, did not wish to support the request because of the questionability of how much delay in bloom would be obtained. Therefore Ethrel is NOT labeled for use on peaches or blueberries at this time. This is unfortunate because one to two weeks delay in blooming can mean the difference in saving or losing a crop in Tishomingo County.

SOIL SAMPLING

Don't forget that this is the time to soil sample for lawns, gardens, and agricultural crops. Results will be received with sufficient time to add lime, if necessary. Phosphorus and potash can also be applied. Call or come by the Extension Office for instructions and soil sample boxes.

Now is also the time for soybean producers to take nematode samples. Soybean fields need to be monitored periodically to make sure that your crop or variety rotation system is working properly. We have information and materials needed to take a proper soil sample to be tested for nematodes.

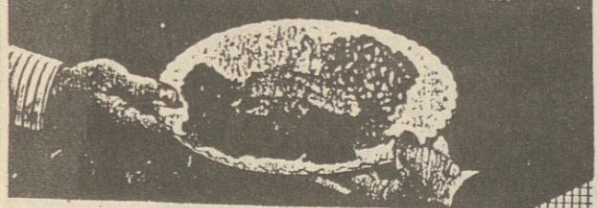

FRAMES OUT OF SHAPE

You're not getting all the benefits of a good corrective vision prescription if your frames are out of shape. All eyeglasses need realignment periodically just from normal usage. How often they will need realignment will depend on how well you take care of them. No matter how accurate your eye prescription may have been, if your eyeglass frames become bent or twisted even slightly, this can affect your vision.

If you have noticed that your eyeglass frames seem out of shape, don't make the mistake of trying to straighten them yourself. This should only be done by an eye care professional. Another thing to avoid is using just one hand to put your glasses on or take them off. This can also destroy the careful and delicate alignment that helps you see well. Use two hands to put your glasses on, and put them on evenly.

When you take them off, pull them gently downward over your nose. If your glass frames are not as snug-fitting or straight as they should be, call us for an appointment to have them checked.

EASING STRESS ON CHILDREN

In these days of dual-career families and longer working hours it is challenging to be an effective parent. Easing your stress is important, but don't transfer it to your children. They lead stressful lives too.

Don't use the telephone to scold children or remind them of chores or homework to be done. Instead, allow them to use the telephone to communicate with you their concerns, hurt feelings or fears. Let them talk to you about their day.

Get rid of stress before you greet your children at home. Take a walk before you go inside, or run some errands on the way home. The first few minutes at home sets the tone for the evening, don't ruin it by scolding or interrogating your children.

If your work climate is right, take your children with you occasionally. Let them know what you do when you are away from them.

Remember children enjoy consistency, so try to establish at least one ritual they can look forward to. Set aside at least one evening a week to spend time with them doing what they want to do.

Red Man Mississippi Division Qualifier Results

At the completion of the six Red Man qualifying events, the top 30 anglers determined on a basis of pounds and points, will move on to Regional competition. There they will compete against fishermen from other divisions for a spot in the Red Man All-American. The winner will receive \$100,000. All Red Man tournaments are catch and release events.

ASCS Farm News

PRICE SUPPORT LOANS AVAILABLE

"The Price support loans are available to all eligible producers who comply with applicable provisions of the 1993 farm programs," Phillip A. horn, County Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, said.

Loan rates on 1993 crops are: Upland Cotton .532 lb; corn \$1.81 bu.; Soybeans \$5.11 Wheat \$2.42.

Horn said some producers may wish to store their crops after harvest to take advantage of future price increases, and a price support loan will provide

operating cash for them.

The Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) makes loans to eligible producers under the support loan program. "mature on demand, but more than the last day of the month following the month which the note and the agreement is approved," said. Stocks may be stored in a warehouse. The commodity serve as collateral for the loan.

Producers who plan to mingle their 1993 and 1992 vests must first contact office. Price support loans, wheat, canola, flaxseed, and other small grains available through March 1994. Corn, sorghum, rice, mustard seed, safflower seed and soybeans are available until May 31.
