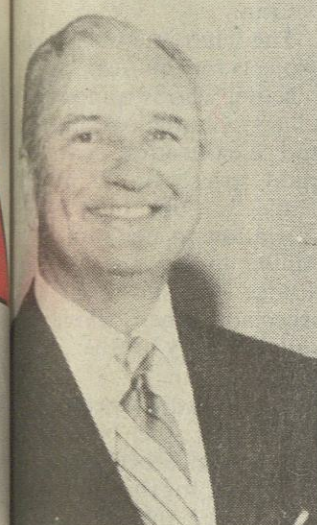

Tishomingo County Mourns A Son



Roy C. Adams

Roy C. Adams returned to Tishomingo County and the people of Iuka a final time Monday. As friends of friends were there to bid him farewell, Mr. Adams died at 10:00 a.m. on January 21, 1994 at his home in Itawamba County. He was 52 years old.

Roy C. Adams loved to boast of his strong roots in Tishomingo County. He was born to the late and Mrs. Martha Gardner Adams in 1917, one of two sons. He moved to the family farm at Crossroads where Mr. Adams taught school for 52 years. He taught his boys what it meant to work and earn a living from the land. He never forgot that he was a farmer, gardening every summer and raising crops. His generosity in sharing of those crops were well known throughout Tishomingo, Itawamba and Lee Counties.

Mr. Adams received his public education in Tishomingo, Prentiss and Alcorn County schools. He was a proud graduate of Mississippi State University and served as President of the Mississippi State University Alumni Association and as a member of MSU's Development Foundation Board.

Following his World War II military service, he assumed a teaching position on the faculty of Northwest Junior College in Iowa. It was while on the faculty he met and married Sarah Wanda Gilliland, a native of Tishomingo County. Mrs. Adams survives along with their four children: Mrs. Nancy Collins of Iuka; Mrs. Kathy Cooke of Iuka; Roy Clark Adams Jr. of Iuka; and Dr. John C. Adams of Iuka and 12 grandchildren.

Mr. Adams was proud of his democratic heritage, serving as Tishomingo District Highway Commissioner from 1947-1967. During this time he had the opportunity of helping the area come out of the mud with farm to market roads in 31 counties. As there were no major legislative appropriations for the primary highways in the district, Mr. Adams directed any monies to improving the secondary system and getting the people out of the mud.

As a Democrat, he made an unsuccessful bid for governor in 1971. He also served as director of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and personnel director for Mid-South Packers Inc. He retired to his farm, about 14 miles north of Iuka, 15 years ago and assumed the Presidency of Pine Trees Partnership.

Mr. Adams regularly walked the tree farm and was happiest there. His son, Clark Adams, said, "He was never sick a day in his life and didn't even have a cold."

Mr. Adams died following a heart attack. It was thought he was training a young bird dog when the accident occurred. His dog was still at his side when he was found. Some 150 people and four dog teams responded within minutes from Itawamba, Tishomingo, Prentiss and Franklin Co., Ala., sheriff's departments, the State Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks, the Rescue Squad and

various other agencies and friends. "We are indebted to all the friends who responded to our need," Clark Adams said. "He was always interested in the people and in trying to do whatever he could for them. He was a good public servant and instilled that in his children."

Those who worked and supported him through the years were always amazed at his special gift of never forgetting anyone he came in contact with. He always remembered your name and you were a friend.

Mr. Adams will be remembered by many as a fluent speaker, an aggressive campaigner, and a dedicated public servant; however, to his family he was a loving husband and father who knew God and appreciated His works.

Roy C. Adams asked to be remembered as "a man who believed."

Funeral services were held Monday at 10:00 a.m. at W.E. Pegues Funeral Home in Tupelo. Mr. Adams was returned to his Tishomingo County home Monday afternoon and buried beside his parents in Oak Grove Cemetery in Iuka. The Rev. W.T. Dexter, a longtime friend officiated.

Pallbearers were his brother-in-laws, J.E. Gilliland, Doug Gilliland and Charles Gilliland; his nephews, Dr. Mac Adams and David Adams, and long time friends Bill Curtis and Charles Johnston.

She was one of Tishomingo County's pioneer educators, coming to Tishomingo County to teach after attending Grenada College and Blue Mountain College as a young girl. During her career, she taught many years at Forest Grove, Snowdown and Central, all rural elementary schools which have long since closed.

Suspect Arrested After Chase By Authorities

A late Sunday night chase by Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley has landed a Soso, Miss. man in jail on charges of aggravated assault with a motor vehicle and possession of controlled substances.

James K. Davis, 40, of Soso, Miss., was arrested and charged with two counts of aggravated assault with a motor vehicle and two counts of possession of a controlled substance (crystal methamphetamine and marijuana). Also seized during the arrest was \$11,700 cash; two firearms, a .380-caliber automatic pistol and a .22-caliber Magnum pistol; and also a 1989 Camaro IROC Z-28.

Authorities in Prentiss County began chasing the suspect, who eluded them on the Natchez Trace Parkway. Tishomingo County authorities set up a roadblock, but Davis turned off on to Hwy. 25. Sheriff Nunley chased him back toward the Trace where Davis wrecked. He is presently being held on \$35,000 bond at Tishomingo County jail, according to Nunley.

Assisting in the capture of the suspect were officials with the Natchez Trace Parkway Patrol, Tishomingo Police Department and Belmont Police Department. The illegal drugs were found by Tishomingo County K-9 Patrol/Drug dog, Faruck, Nunley said.

One Vehicle Collision Fatal To 2, Injures One

A one-vehicle wreck Friday, Jan. 21, has claimed the lives of two young Iuka men and has left another in critical condition.

David Adam Murphy, 26 and Scott Allen Senter, 20, both of Iuka, were both pronounced dead at the scene by Tishomingo County Coroner Dale White after their car, a 1989 Chrysler Daytona, struck a trash dumpster located at the intersection of Mississippi Highway 365 and County Road 298 near Burnsville. Another passenger, William Matthew Dexter, 18, also of Iuka, was critically injured in the accident and was transferred to the North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, according to Mississippi Highway Patrolman Ricky Marlar.

Marlar stated that the exact time and cause of the wreck is still unknown. It is also unknown as to which of the three was driving the car at the time of the incident. Apparently all three were not wearing seatbelts at the time of the wreck and were thrown from the vehicle, Marlar reported. "The vehicle, which was traveling North on Hwy. 365, somehow slammed into the dumpsters at that intersection and apparently flipped. The accident was reported at approximately 3:20 a.m. by James G. Freeman, who was on his way home from work when he spotted the wreck. We do not know how long before that time that it occurred."

"Both Murphy and Senter were found lying on the left side of the vehicle while Dexter was found lying in the middle of CR 298. Although the exact cause has not been determined, initial investigations into the incident have indicated that it was not due to alcohol or drug use by the victims. Further investigation into the causes of the accident are underway," Marlar explained.

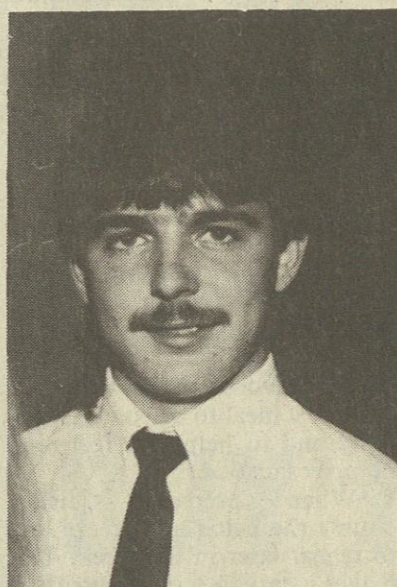
Responding to the wreck site, along with Patrolman Marlar, were the North Crossroads Volunteer Fire Department, Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the Iuka Ambulance Service.

Dexter, who is the son of Stanley and Teresa Dexter of Iuka, remained in critical condition at press time.

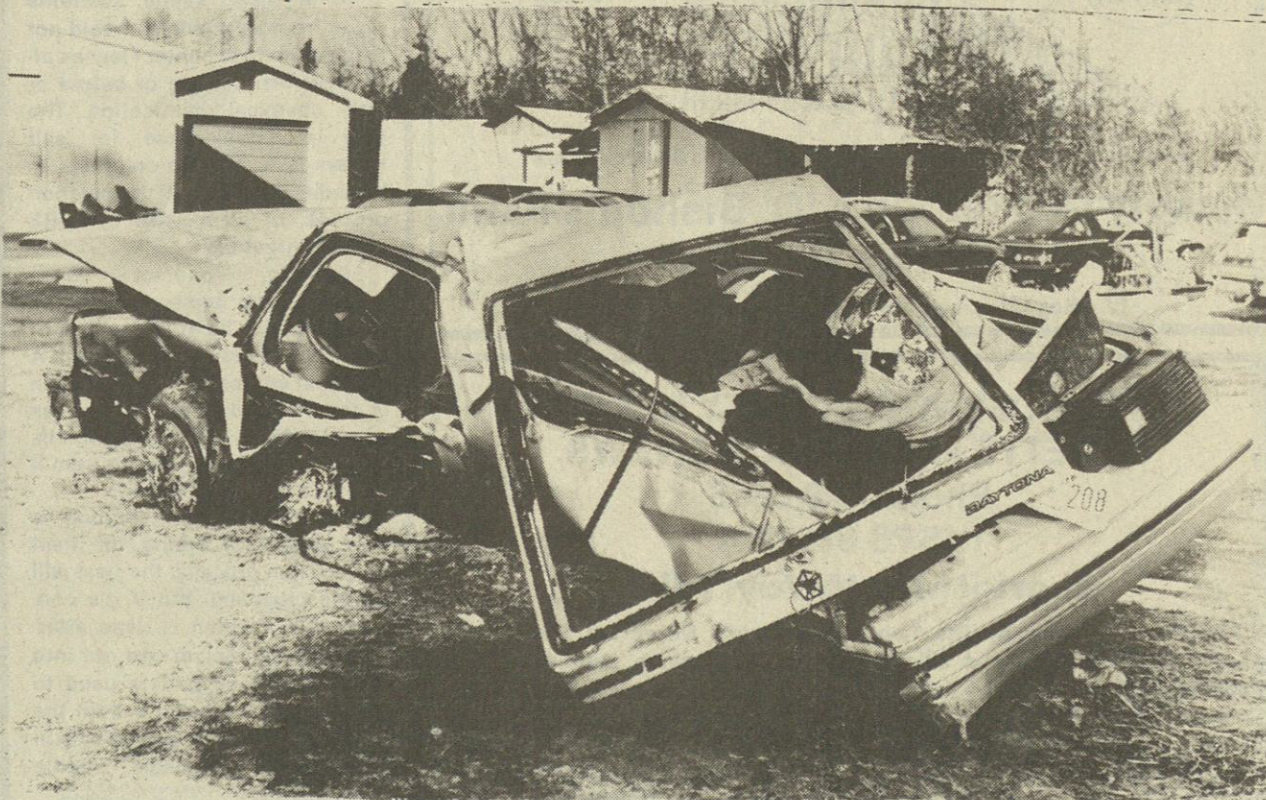

BACK TO HEALTHFUL EATING

Indulgent foods and the hectic schedule of the holidays can take their toll on an otherwise healthful diet. To get back to healthful eating habits, Barbara Guinn, Extension Home Economist, offers these suggestions.

*Be sure to eat breakfast. It supplies energy you need to get through the morning. Some research has linked eating breakfast to a more positive attitude.

*Eat three meals a day that include a variety of foods, such as fruits, vegetables, lean meats, lowfat dairy products and whole grains. Eating a wide variety of foods helps ensure a well-balanced diet.

*Supplement meals, if you like, with nutritious snacks, such as bananas, raw vegetables, non-fat yogurt and other favorite treats that provide important nutrients.

*Keep staple foods on hand

that will help you quickly make healthful meals. Stock up on pasta and rice, frozen vegetables, spaghetti sauce, seasonings, tuna packed in water, dried and frozen fruit and cereals.

*Shop for groceries when you're not hungry. Have a healthful snack first to reduce unneeded purchases.

*Sip flavored water while you prepare a meal to discourage nibbling and to help you feel temporarily satisfied.

*When preparing meals, double the batch and freeze half to reheat later in the week. This makes it easy to serve a nutritious meal on those days when you don't have time to cook.

*Eat slowly. Remember, it takes time for the food you've eaten to satisfy your appetite.

Guinn also encourages everyone to approach meals as a pleasurable activity. Eat consciously and enjoy each bite to its fullest, she says.

USDA ANNOUNCES SECOND WETLANDS RESERVE PROGRAM SIGNUP

The second Wetlands Reserve Program signup will be held February 28 through March 11, 1994, according to Grant Buntrock, administrator of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS).

"Landowners in Arkansas, California, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, New York, North Carolina, Oregon, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, Washington, and Wisconsin will have the opportunity to enroll eligible acreage in the WRP," Buntrock said.

The Wetlands Reserve Program, funded at \$55,675 million to enroll up to 75,000 acres during Fiscal Year 1994, protects and restores habitat for migratory birds and other wildlife, help purify water supplies, and helps absorb flood waters.

Last funded in FY1992 with a limitation of 50,000 acres, landowners on 2,337 farms sought enrollment for over 462,000 acres. Acreage was tentatively accepted for 49,888 acres on 265 farms. This acreage will be restored to 30,686 acres to forested wetlands, 14,105 acres to emergent wetlands, 3,374 acres to scrub-scrub and other types of wetlands and 1,542 acres of riparian area or upland buffers.

About 7,509 acres will directly benefit the recovery of threatened or endangered species. Another 30,095 acres may be utilized by

threatened or endangered species or lie within ongoing State or Federal wetland restoration and wildlife project areas.

Under the program, permanent easements are purchased from participating landowners of farmed wetlands; prior converted wetlands; and riparian areas that link wetlands. Participants agree to accept no more than the fair market value of their land for agricultural use, in return for a lump sum payment and cost-share assistance for implementing wetland restoration practices. Specified compatible uses are permitted on the restore acreage by the landowner and any successors. USDA's Soil Conservation Service and the Department of the Interior's Fish and Wildlife Service will assist ASCS in determining the eligibility and environmental quality of the acres offered by landowners.

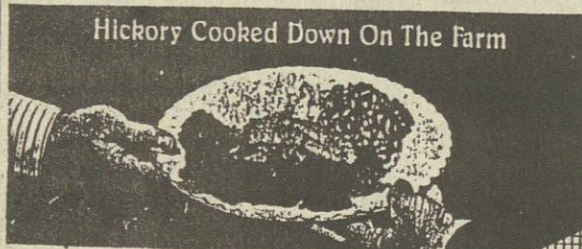

HOME MADE SALINE WARNING

Home made saline solutions made from salt tablets should not be used to rinse contact lenses after heat disinfection or before or after chemical disinfection. The only acceptable use for salt tablets is to prepare solutions to be used in the heat disinfection process, or as a rinse BEFORE heat disinfection.

Evidently, contact lens wearers using home made saline solutions may be at higher risk of a rare but serious eye infection. A potential source of contamination is non sterile distilled water often used to dissolve the salt tablets. Therefore, a solution made from it may also be contaminated.

If a contaminated solution is used before or during the heat disinfection process, the heat will kill the organism. But if the contaminated solution is used afterwards, the organism can get into the eye. Enzyme tablets used to remove protein deposits from the lenses should be dissolved only in commercially available sterile saline solution.

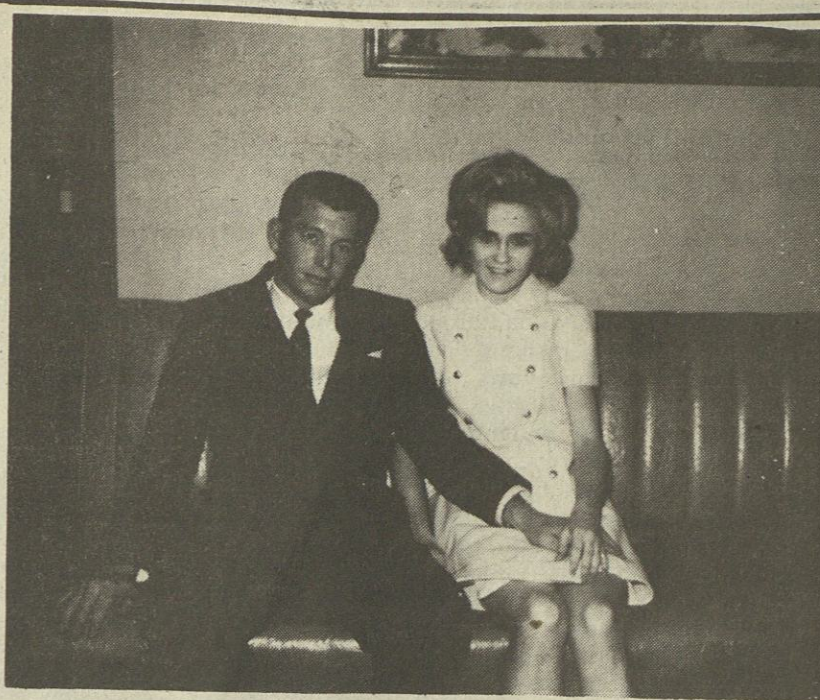

Massive Job Cut At Magnolia Hospital

Fifty-seven Magnolia Hospital employees learned this morning their jobs no longer exist, the result of a \$1.2 million loss from operations during the past fiscal year and changes in the health care field.

Officials of the local medical center began meeting at 7 a.m. to discuss employees affected by the permanent reduction in work force. The elimination of positions is effective today.

These were very difficult decisions to make and we feel for employees and their families who are affected," said Dr. Stephen Lee, chairman of the hospital's board of trustees. This action is not one we took lightly or lightly. We have been monitoring the situation very closely during the past several months, always hopeful that a change in the financial picture would come and actions such as this would not be necessary.

The hospital has a responsibility to this community to

person staff.

Hospital president Gary J. Blan cited dramatic shifts in the delivery of health care as factors creating the institution's financial position. "Magnolia, like hospitals throughout the country, has seen fewer inpatients, more outpatients, more home health and a rapid rise in the number of Medicare and Medicaid patients. These factors are a trap for hospitals like Magnolia.

"Like hotels, hospitals require a large specialized staff. Around the clock workers must be available to care for patients, cook meals, clean, fill prescriptions, and run clinical tests. Much of that staffing represents fixed expenses. It requires as long to process an insurance claim for a two-day hospitalization as it does for a one-month stay. But the revenue attached to that overhead is falling.

"This reduction in our work force is difficult -- difficult for the hospital and difficult for those whose jobs are eliminated," said Blan. "We are encouraging these employees to remain aware of positions which become open here."

The hospital president said that work force reduction is the first of several actions the institution will undertake to restore financial strength quickly. "The permanent reduction in work force is one of many measures that will be implemented to ensure that the overall performance and quality of care will continue to improve. The hospital will cut cost, trim supply bills and rethink inefficient processes," Blan revealed. "We have begun reorganizing and are finding ways to improve our services. We will build a new image based on customer service."

Blan said within the next few months the hospital will present to the community its plans for the future. He emphasized the need for community support of the local hospital.

"Too many people with private insurance are leaving our community to get health care despite the fact we have some of the best physicians, services and equipment available in this region," Blan stressed.

The work force reduction will not result in a reduction of services at the hospital. "We are not cutting services," said board chairman Lee. "Magnolia Hospital was built to meet community needs and it will continue to meet this community's needs. The hospital and its medical staff are a tremendous community resource, capable of meeting virtually all of the region's health care needs."



"Today's actions and those that are to follow are aimed at restoring the financial strength of the hospital," said Blan. "Having a strong hospital in this community is not only vital to the physical health of the region's citizens but also vital to the future economic development of the area."

Employees affected by today's action received a termination package that included their final payroll check, severance pay based on their length of service, payment for all annual leave accrued, a notice of termination to serve as their letter of recommendation and information about unemployment benefits. Hospital officials indicated the terminations were based generally on employee seniority within specific departments.

Magnolia Hospital is owned by the City of Corinth and Alcorn County. It receives no funding from either government body.

Third District Update

I, Danny Ryan, would like to share some changes being made in the county. One change is the installation of the 911 System, which will be very beneficial to the county. We are working every day to make the system work for all of us. A problem that concerns me is that some of the road number signs are being torn down and taken away. This could mean the matter of life and death to someone. It makes it harder for an ambulance driver or law officer to find their location. One minute could save a life. Let's not abuse these signs. Getting house numbers up as soon as possible will also help.

Our garbage collection and disposal is probably the most critical change that will be taking place within the next few months. Even though the present system was working throughout the county, the Federal Environmental Protection Agency has stated that we can no longer operate under this system. The EPA rules and guidelines are very strict and if we do not comply, a heavy penalty or fine would be imposed on our county. Because we have no choice, we must build a transfer station, rubbish landfill and go to a house to house pickup. Our transfer station will serve for the collection of household garbage that will be brought in by the county and city trucks, then transferred to trailers where it will be hauled to a major landfill that will pass EPA guidelines. The rubbish landfill that will be located in our county will be taking debris such as brush, old furniture, contractor wastes, etc. but will not handle household garbage. The house to house pickup will be scheduled for a once-a week pickup. All garbage will be placed next to the road.

All these changes contribute to the tax increase we had again this year. This is something I did not want to see but we have done everything we could to keep the tax increase as low as possible and still be in compliance with all the garbage requirements.

In 1992, our millage, which is the taxes we collect to help operate the county, was 57 mills. In 1993, we lowered the millage 3 mills to 54. In addition, we had a reappraisal of property, which was mandated by the State Tax Commission, that caused taxes to increase. The State Tax Commission stated that we must get our tax base rate correct within a limited time or we would have state taxes withheld from the county until we did. All this caused the taxes to increase in 1993 even though our millage was lowered. In 1994, our garbage changes and Tishomingo County Municipal Separate School District contributed to yet another increase in taxes. Our general county rose 5 mills and our school system rose 3 mills. The general county rate is 26 mills. Since we help operate the school systems maintenance system and minimum program with 33 mills and Northeast MS Community College with 3 mills, this makes a total of 62 mills.

Finally, I would like to say I will do the best I can to keep taxes as low as possible and continue to work for a better Tishomingo County. If I can be of help to you or if you have further questions, feel free to call me at home at 423-1939 or at the office at 423-7010.
