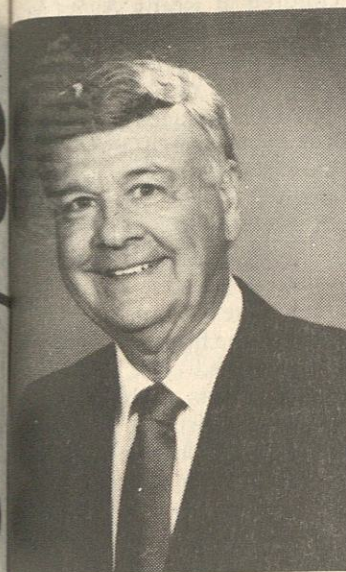

County Sheriff's Department Recovers Stolen Items

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department recently recovered a number of stolen items and arrested the suspects involved in the burglaries.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley, James Steven Gattis, 18, of Dennis, Edward Scott Murphy, 19, of Iuka and three juveniles have been arrested in connection with the burglary of a number of businesses and residences throughout the county.

Gattis has been charged with one count of burglary of a dwelling, 20 counts of larceny and 16 counts of burglary of vehicles. Murphy has been charged with one count of burglary of a dwelling, 11 counts of larceny and nine counts of burglary of vehicles.

One of the juveniles will be tried as an adult because of repeated offenses, according to the Sheriff. The unnamed youth age 17, has been charged with one count of burglary of a dwelling, 19 counts of larceny and 15 counts of burglary of vehicles.

The recovered items had been taken from Hellums Trucking, Cardinal Trucking, B & B Campers, Petree residence, Brumley residence, Fugitt residence, Skinner residence, plus two other trucks. The Sheriff's Department recovered some of the items at a residence in Burnsville and other items in the possession of the suspects, Nunley confirmed.

Tishomingo Man Arrested On Drug Charges

A Tishomingo man was arrested by local authorities Monday, May 23, on drug charges.

Christopher Griffin, 22, of Tishomingo was arrested and charged with manufacturing marijuana and possession of an illegal firearm following the execution of a search warrant at his residence by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Monday morning, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley.

Nunley stated that 18 marijuana plants were discovered during the search.

At press time, the suspect remained in the Tishomingo County Jail.

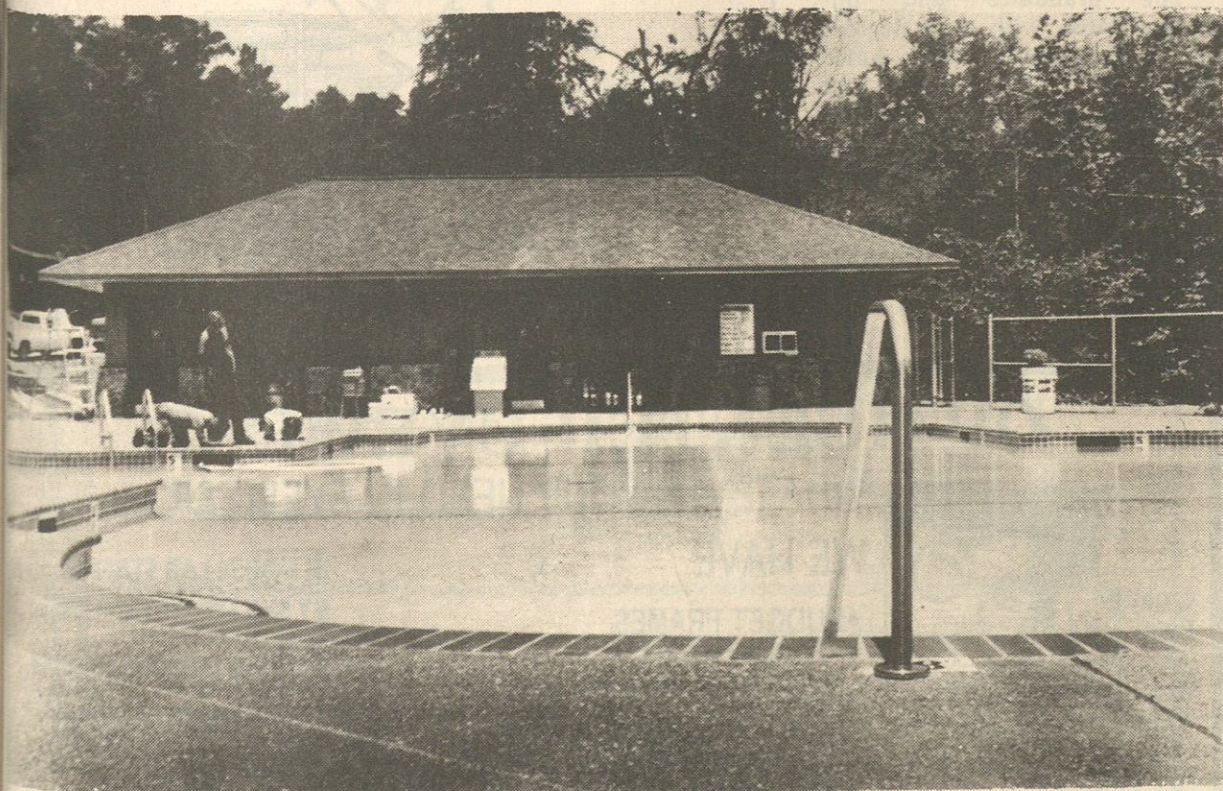

Home Economics Tips

HOT DOGS: ARE THEY MAKING YOU ILL?

Hot dogs have long been a favorite food of children and caregivers alike. Children like them and as a result even the most finicky eaters will eat them. Caregivers like them because they are such a convenient food and most kids will eat them.

Prior to the 1980s, listeriosis, the disease caused by the bacteria *Listeria monocytogenes* and often referred to as *Listeria*, was primarily of veterinary concern. But in the '80s and on into the '90s, scientists recognized *Listeria* as an important food-borne pathogen.

Listeria monocytogenes is a microorganism responsible for multiple food-borne illness outbreaks and product recalls in the recent years. *Listeria* can grow in a wide temperature and pH range. It is salt tolerant, can survive for long lengths of time in very dry conditions, is fairly resistant to drying and lower temperatures enhance survival. It is, however, killed with proper heat treatment.

In healthy individuals, the symptoms are mild flu-like conditions. However, it can lead to meningitis, abortion, perinatal septicemia and even death in high-risk individuals. High-risk people include the unborn infant, healthy pregnant women and immunocompromised persons. (Persons with cancer, diabetes, alcoholics, AIDS and individuals receiving steroids, chemotherapy and renal dialysis.)

Many of us grew up eating raw hot dogs right out of the package. However, if that same practice is followed today, the outcome could be devastating. Raw hot dogs are a potential risk for

causing food-borne illness. In 1992, Food and Drug Administration warned of the dangers from delicatessen products, including undercooked hot dogs, and issued recommendations to high-risk individuals which included:

Avoiding soft cheeses such as Mexican style, feta, Brie, Camembert and blue cheese. There is no need to avoid hard cheese, processed sliced, cottage cheese or yogurt.

Reheating leftover foods or ready-to-eat foods such as hot dogs thoroughly until steaming hot before eating. The bacteria is killed when hot dogs are heated to 160 degrees for several minutes.

Although the risk of listeriosis associated with foods from delicatessen counters is relatively low, pregnant women and people with suppressed immunity may choose to avoid these foods or thoroughly reheat cold cuts before eating.

Listeria does not change the taste or smell of a food. Most people are at very low risk for listeriosis, however, the risk can be reduced by following these tips:

Avoid raw/unpasteurized milk.

Keep raw and cooked foods separate when shopping, preparing, cooking and storing foods.

Wash hands, knives and cutting boards after handling uncooked foods.

Wash raw vegetables thoroughly before eating.

Thoroughly cook and reheat all food of animal origin, leftovers or ready-to-eat foods such as hot dogs.

Read and follow label instructions to "keep refrigerated" and "use by" a certain date.

Keep hot foods hot (above 140 degrees F) and cold foods cold (at or below 40 degrees F). Do not keep them out for longer than two hours at room temperature before eating.

Divide leftovers into small, shallow, covered containers before refrigerating, so that the food chills rapidly and evenly.

Keep your refrigerator clean, and keep the temperature at 34 degrees F to 40 degrees F.

Four hundred and 75 students received graduate and undergraduate degrees at the University of North Alabama on Friday, May 13 after hearing Dr. Howard Dean, the governor of Vermont, deliver the commencement address.

President Robert L. Potts presented the degrees as Dr. Joseph C. Thomas, the vice president of academic affairs and provost, and Sue Wilson, the registrar, assisted.

Nineteen people each received a master of arts degree, while 37 got a master of arts in education and 20 a master of business administration.

One shy of 400 received bachelor degrees. The breakdown is as follows: bachelor of arts, 16; bachelor of fine arts, two; bachelor of music in music education, two; bachelor of science in education, 75; bachelor of science in music, three; bachelor of science in nursing, 60; bachelor of social work, 36; and bachelor of science, 205.

UM Students Befriend Troubled Children

As the cars roll to a stop in the driveway, children stream from every portal at Reedy Acres in Water Valley, one of five Baptist Children's Village branches in Mississippi.

Greeting the children are students from the University of Mississippi's Baptist Student Union (BSU).

Each week 15-20 students from the BSU, including David Carely of Iuka, visit Reedy Acres, volunteering to spend the afternoon with the young residents there. During their visits, the college students offer help with homework or an afternoon of fun. But, most importantly, they provide friendship, time and attention -- things that many of the

children at Reedy Acres have seen much of.

The facility is a group home for abused, neglected and dependent children ages 2-18. Although it is sponsored by the Mississippi Baptist Convention, the home accepts children from a wide variety of backgrounds.

"We provide a place when, for whatever reason, a child can no longer live at home," said Don Brown, the licensed social worker at the home.

Brown has nothing but praise for the efforts of the Ole Miss students. "They have really become an asset to our program and serve as good positive role models for our children. I think it makes them feel more accepted and confident because the BSU students recognize them as an individual with special talents and abilities."

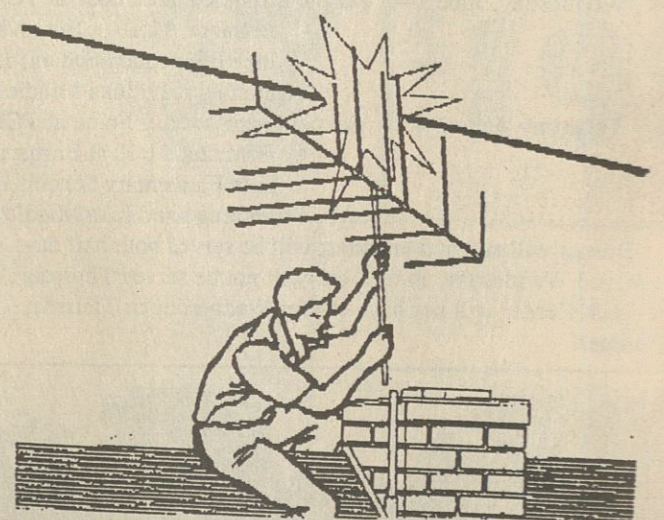
SAFETY FIRST

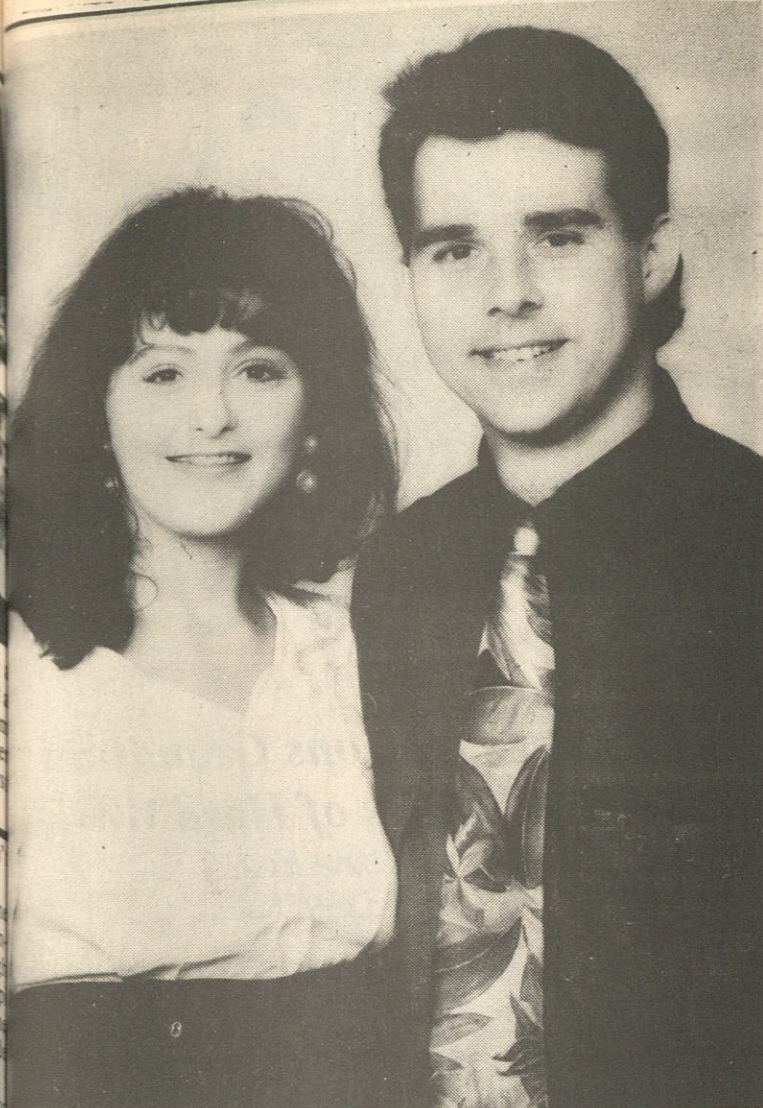

HOW POLARIZED LENSES WORK

Polarized lenses can make your eyes more comfortable by cutting down on reflected glare. Glare is caused by surfaces that reflect light, such as water, snow, metallic surfaces, etc. A normal gray lens reduces the intensity of light, but the ratio of light to glare remains the same.

Light waves vibrate up and down, sideways, and at an angle. A polarized lens is oriented so as to filter out the horizontal portion of the waves, allowing only the vertical to pass through, thus greatly reducing the intensity of the glare.

If you own a pair of polarized sunglasses, you can demonstrate this effect easily. Holding the glasses at arms length, look at a shiny surface, such as a polished floor. Shut one eye, and look at the surface with the other eye. You should see no reflection. Now, rotate the glasses 90 degrees, so that one lens is above the other, and the surface will be shiny again; return the glasses to the wearing position, and the reflected glare disappears.

BEST TIME TO SPAY A KITTEN
Female kittens may mature much faster than males. A female kitten is capable of becoming pregnant during her first heat period which may occur as early as five months of age. If you wish to mate your kitten, you should wait until she is at least one year old.

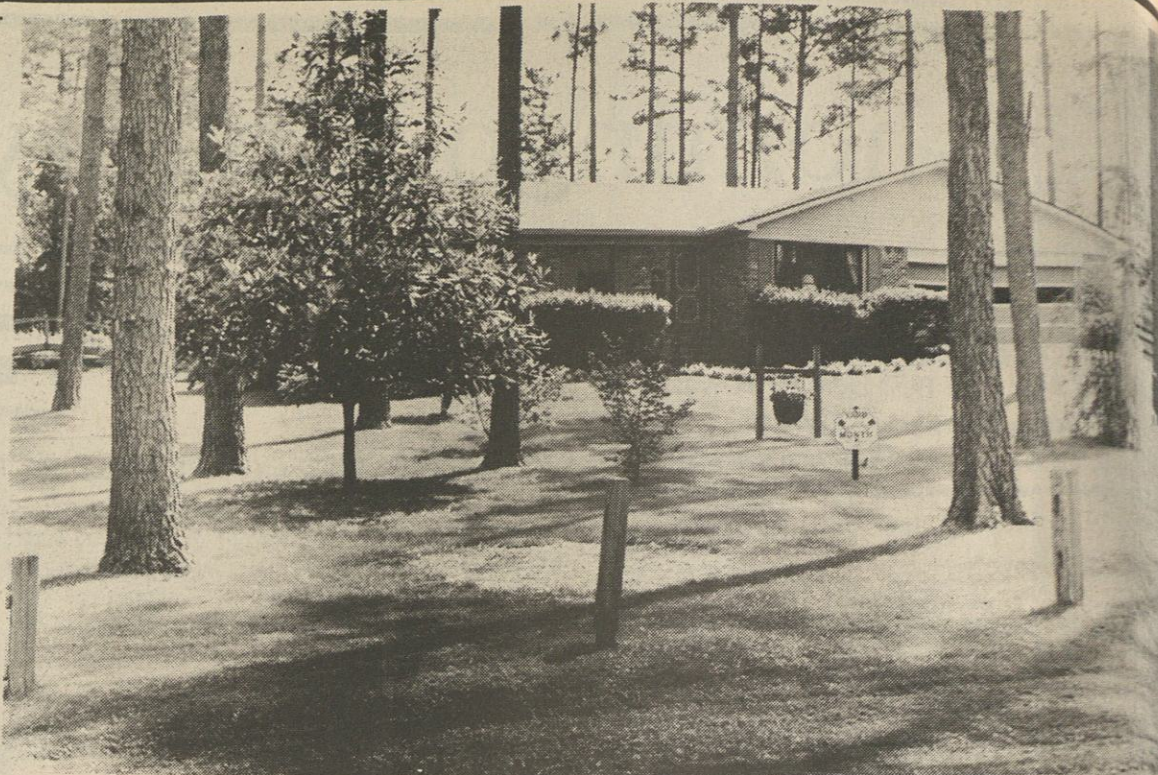
When a kitten is in heat, she becomes restless and nervous. She may roll around on the floor alot. Her voice can also change, becoming more piercing and demanding. Though her behavior can be unnerving, these changes are quite normal.

Unlike dogs that normally come into heat every six months, a sexually mature cat can go in and out of heat repeatedly over a period of weeks or months.

There is no reason to postpone having your kitten spayed unless you do plan to mate her. The best time to spay a kitten is at four to five months, before she has her first heat period. Young kittens heal very rapidly.

Once your kitten has been spayed, her disposition will not change except for the better. She may become less nervous, less noisy and more relaxed, playful and affectionate.

(Contrary to the old wives' tale, neither cats nor dogs need to "have a litter" to be well adjusted pets. Spay and neuter your pet so that you do not contribute to the millions of unwanted pets that are destroyed in this country every year.)

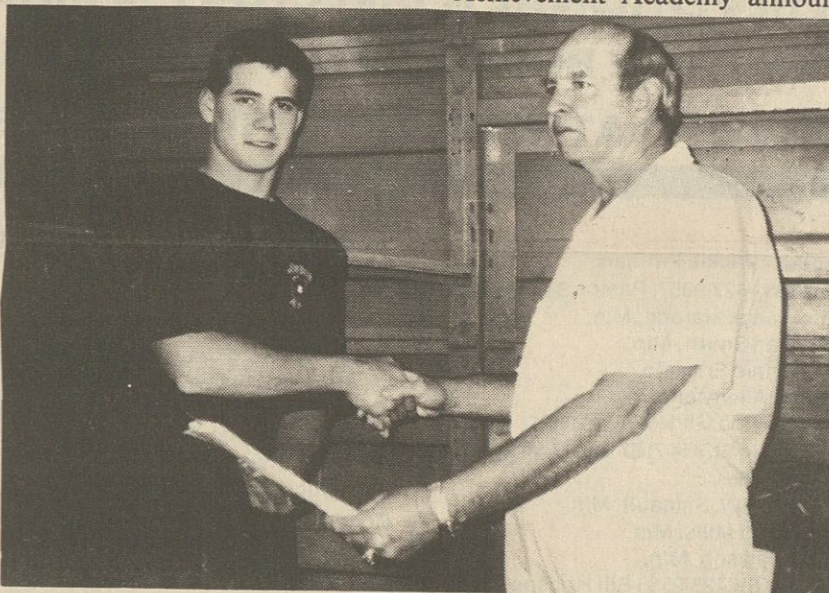

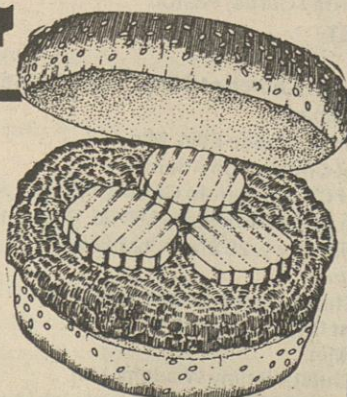

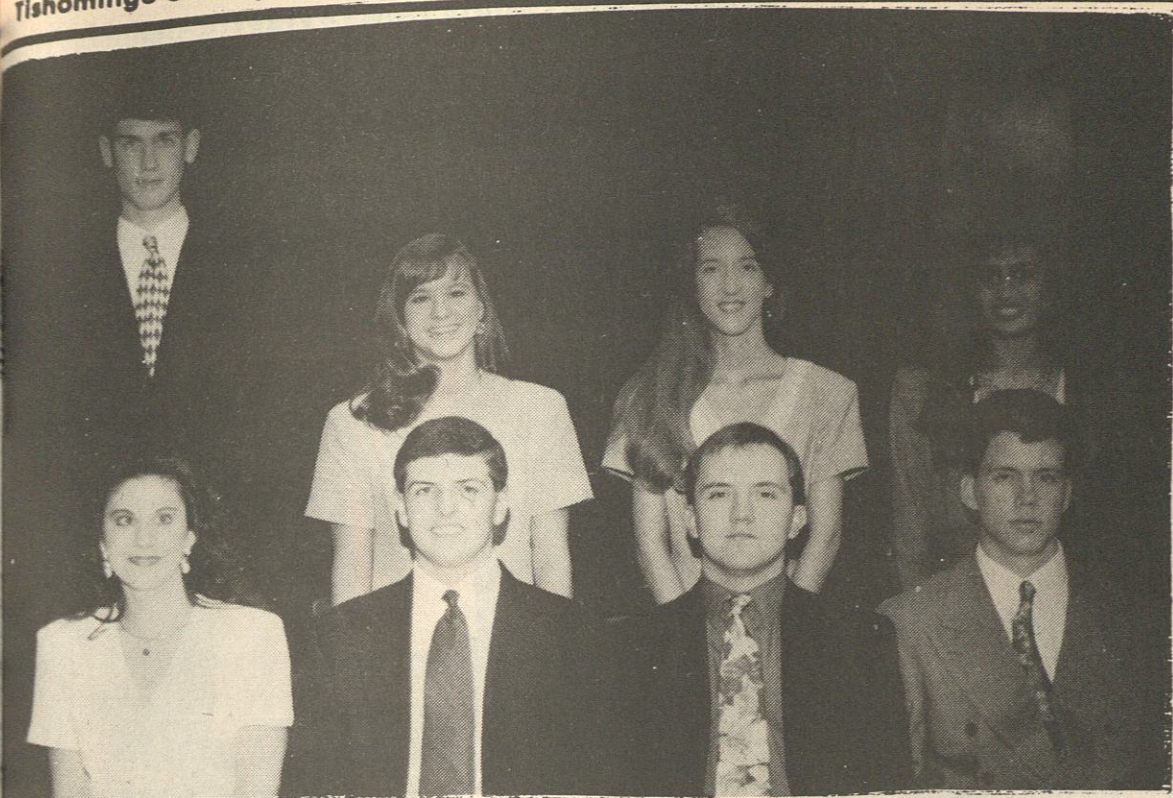

Remember Veterans This Memorial Day

The bond among those who go to war - welded by fire and fear - is immortal. It draws warriors together, regardless of gender or the cause for which they did battle.

Today's young men and women of Desert Storm share honor with the veterans of Belleau Wood, the Coral Sea, Chosen and the jungles of Vietnam.

The memory is eternal, intensified this Memorial Day 50 years after the beginning of World War II.

Nations remember and citizens honor those who fight, suffer or die for their beliefs. It is a heritage of humanity, beginning before civilization and continuing through every creed.

Although those who die in battle are honored by all peoples, it was the United States - a government under Abraham Lincoln - that created a vast shrine where honor is eminent, the National Cemetery System.

No other nation recognizes its military veterans the way Americans do.

These are the images that will be invoked in small towns and major cities, in rural graveyards and national cemeteries, in the privacy of homes and courthouse square observances, in public display and personal reflection as we sustain the tradition of honoring our fallen heroes on the last Monday in May, Memorial Day.

Though our losses have been considerable -- more than one million have died in military service -- Memorial Day is not intended to be a mournful time, but rather a time to rejoice. It is an opportunity to recount the mettle and indomitable spirit to those who have humbled and crushed the forces of hostility and oppression. It is a time to declare our gratitude to those who give heart and inspiration to the convictions that keep America and other nations free. Memorial Day is a time to thank God for placing

such individuals among us.

Though it was initiated as a special moment for decorating gravesites, it is equally appropriate on Memorial Day to pay homage to the living, the nearly 27 million veterans who are our family, our friends, our neighbors. However, a meaningful acknowledgement of their service goes well beyond grateful nods or ceremonial fanfare.

America likes anniversaries and none are so poignant as those which recall our heritage, its

glory and toll. America is strong and resilient, and what makes us so is our unparalleled ability and desire to remember what got us here, to embrace our past, to commemorate the selflessness and sacrifice of those upon whose very lives rests the foundation of freedom. That is why there is a Memorial Day. That is why 218 years into this remarkable odyssey of ours we still place flags on veterans' gravesites, we still make speeches in the town square, we still recount the battles, and we still pay silent and public tribute to those who stepped well beyond the lines of fear, doubt and self-preservation to give us security and prosperity.

We pause today, to contemplate a special day in history. It was on this date in 1918, that an eerie silence crept over battlefields in Europe, ending four terrible years of fighting in World War I. Guns fell silent on that morning at the eleventh hour, of the eleventh day, of the eleventh month...and the gaunt figures of soldiers in opposing trenches emerged into sunlight. Voices were raised in several languages, thanking God that the fighting was over, and expressing hope that war would never come again. That hope proved to be naive.

Following is a copy of an original letter written to the mother of five boys, all losing their lives for their country from Abe Lincoln.

Copy of Original Letter From Abraham Lincoln

Executive Mansion
Washington, Nov 21, 1864

To Mrs. Bixby, Boston, Mass.,
Dear Madam,

I have been shown in the files of the War Department a statement of the Adjutant General of Massachusetts that you are the mother of five sons who have died gloriously on the field of battle. I feel how weak and fruitless must be any word of mine which should attempt to beguile you from the grief of a loss so overwhelming. But I cannot refrain from tendering you the consolation that may be found in the thanks of the Republic they died to save. I pray that our Heavenly Father may assuage the anguish of your bereavement, and leave you only the cherished memory of the loved and lost, and the solemn pride that must be yours to have laid so costly a sacrifice upon the altar of freedom.

Yours very sincerely and respectfully
Abraham Lincoln

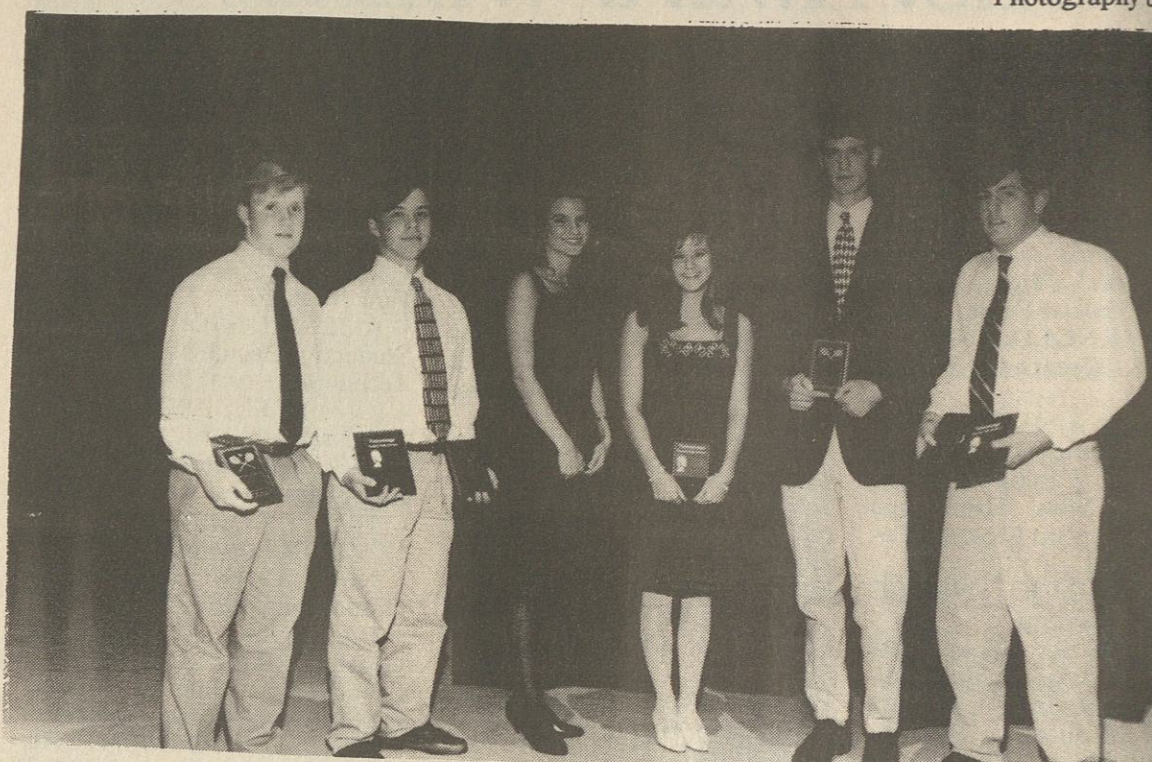
