
### Nichols Re-elected As Iuka Mayor

### Death Trap Again?

Old U.S. Hwy. 72 which links Tuscumbia, Ala. and Memphis, Tenn. was known for many years by the truckers who drove it as a "death trap".

Again the stretch between Iuka and Burnsville is causing accident after accident and has taken the lives of two more young

No one knows why, but following last week's opening of the new 25 four-lane bypass which crosses old two-lane 72, some 9 reported accidents have occurred. Motorist seem to be confused by the crossing. Many have gone the wrong way, narrowly missing

What can we do?

We urge law officials to patrol the road, especially the crossing areas for some time. Slow the traffic down. Get in the highway medium, nothing slows down traffic like the site of a patrol car! Help the local people get used to the change. (Remember the many accidents that happened in Cherokee after 72

Again this newspaper urges local residents to enter the new bypass with caution. Watch the other cars. They might be going the wrong way or they might not know what to do at the 4-way stop. Do not take anything for granted!

Be aware of the road. The new 4-lane is just past the Iuka Hospital. It is marked with stop signs but it seems to just "happen" on you as you travel east or west.

### New Bypass **Fatal To Two**

Two motorists were killed and two more were injured Tuesday, June 14 as the result of an automobile accident at the intersection of Highway 172 and the newly opened Highway 25 Bypass in Iuka.

According to Iuka Policeman Ricky Cornelison, Tim Paul Sparks, 21, and Wendy Sparks, 18, of Belmont were killed when their 1991 Nissan collided with a 1994 Dodge pick-up, driven by Jeffrey D. Cornelius, 18, of

The Sparks' baby, 18-month-old Cory Andrew Sparks, was critically injured in the wreck and was transported by air to LeBonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis, TN.

Cornelius suffered minor injuries and was treated and released from

This was the ninth accident to take place at the intersection since its official opening last Monday. According to Cornelison, several calls had been made to the State Highway Department prior to Tuesday's wreck concerning the problems at the intersection. After Tuesday's incident, the Highway Department decided to make the intersection a 4-way-stop. Motorists travelling in that area are urged to use extreme caution.

At press time the baby, Cory Andrew Sparks, was still hospitalized and arrangements for Tim and Wendy Sparks were incomplete.

### **Fishing Your Pond**

The goal of most people is to have good fishing in their pond. One factor of having good fishing is to control the fishing pressure.

If you have a newly stocked pond, do not start fishing until June of the year following stockings of the fingerling bass. This should give the bass time to spawn. The pond should be fished sparingly this year. Generally it is not recommended to remove bass that are less than 12 inches long. They are easy to catch but should be released. Bass are the key to controlling the bream population. A rule of thumb is to remove 4 to 5 pounds of bream for each pound of bass removed. This should maintain the proper balance.

Small bream should not be returned to the pond. Most overpopulation problems are caused by small bream. Ponds have a

limited capacity to produce fish. An unfertilized pond might produce about 40 pounds of harvestable bream (120 fish) and 10 pounds of harvestable bass (8 to 10 fish) per acre per year. A well fertilized pond will produce about 160 pounds of bream (700 fish) and 35 pounds of bass (30 fish) per surface acre per year. In fed bream, bass and catfish ponds, up to 500 pounds of harvestable bream (about 2,000 fish) can be removed, but bass should not be removed at rates higher than that for a fertilized pond.


It is also best not to remove an excessive poundage of adult fish in a short period. Spread fish harvest over as long a period as possible. Excessive removal in the spring may result in rapid overcrowding by small bream.

These are some fishing tools that will help your keep your pond in good production for years to come. If you are fishing someone else's pond, remember

CANINE ALLERGIES

Allergies in dogs are a very common and frequently frustrating problem for pet owners.

The allergies typically begin when the animal is between 1 and 3 years of age. But allergies have been known to appear as early as 4 months and as late as 10 years.

Dogs, however, rarely have the respiratory problems associated with allergies in people. Instead, the dog may chew at its feet, rub its face or scratch almost any other part of its body. The animal's skin is often inflamed and may have a bad odor.

Canines, like people, can be allergic to virtually anything. The agents most frequently responsible for causing allergies in dogs are inhaled foreign material (allergens), including pollens from grasses, trees, weeds, house dust and molds in the air. Dogs also can become allergic to foods, external and internal parasites, drugs, hormones and the bacteria present on its own skin.

When an animal is exposed to an allergen to which it is allergic, the animal's body reacts in an abnormal manner and the clinical symptoms appear.

While allergic disease in dogs can seldom be cured, they can, in most cases, be controlled. Your local veterinarian can determine the offending allergen(s) and help you take the proper measures to control your dog's allergies. In some cases, simply removing the offending allergens from the dog's environment will be sufficient. Other times, anti-itch drugs or special allergy shots will be required.



### Area Teens Participate In Confederate Soldier's Burial

On May 29-30, 1994, they took part n the services for the renterment of the remains of Lt. Simeon W. Cummings, Confederate States Navy. Lt. Cumnings was the only Confederate soldier killed during the war that was buried on foreign soil. He was killed in Saldanha Bay, South Africa on August 3, 1863 while engaged in a hunting expedition. He was killed by the accidental discharge of a shotgun at point blank range. He was buried at the Kilprug Farm cemetery, atended by a British Naval Contingent and the entire crew of the .S.S. Alabama along with their egendary commander Admiral Rapheal Semmes. Cummings' arket remains were disinterred in May 1994 with the permission and assistance of the government of ingo South Africa and local istorians. His re-internment akes place on the grounds of the nternational Headquarters of he Sons of Confederate Veterans and the Military Order of the tars and Bars at Historic Elm Springs, Columbia, Tennessee. ### What Are Farmers Made Of?

A farmer is a man who wears out two pairs of overalls growing enough cotton for one.

A farmer can shape an ax handle from a persimmon sprout - and shoe a horse with a hunk of car tire.

A farmer starts every year with nothing, loses everything he grows and at the end of the year comes out even.

Nobody knows how he does it. He doesn't even know himself.

What are farmers made of?

Farmers are made of bent nails, rusty horse shoes, barbed wire and held together with callouses.

Planting time and harvest season he finishes his forty hour week by Tuesday noon · then painin' from tractor back puts in another seventy-two, He can make harness out of hay wire, feed sacks and shoe scraps. He grows corn and meions mostly to make fat crows.

He loads his planter with fifteen hundred dollars worth of seed, fertilizer, herbicide and insecticide. That's one hour's worth.

In a normal farm afternoon, one to ten p.m., he'll bury \$13,500 in the

Odds are it'll get too-wet or too dry - or there'll be hail, wind, early frost, early snow, bugs, brickbats and bureau-crats.

And if he gets a good crop, he won't meet expenses. Yet the only lines on a farmer's face are from grinnin'.

You look at his unattended chores, unpainted buildings, unsharpened tools

and untidy barnlot and you say, "The smartest man in the world would starve trying to do all that!"

And you're right. The smartest man would starve.

But not the farmer.

His wife won't let him.

She has a basic menu; she serves what she has. In good years that may be six vegetables at one meal.

In lean years she jumps from poke salad to black-eyed peas. The farmer orders a seventeen inch John Deere disc - \$4,300.

By the time it's delivered it's \$6,500. He's got a forty thousand dollar machine needing repair. It's five-thirty p.m. and the company owned stores are closed. And he's got five hours of daylight

he can't let go to waste. So he borrows a machine from a neighbor, is movin' it down the highway when

he's run into a ditch by some joker pullin' a boat. Yet he remains the world's most stubborn optimist.

#### **Home Economics** Tips

By: Barbara F. Guinn, **Extension Home Economist** NEW FOOD LABELING

"After 20 years of discussions on whether to provide consumers with vital information about meat and poultry products, this administration has ended the debate and has taken action to help American families," said Agriculture Secretary Mike Espy.

"The safe cooking and handling labels will better educate the consumer that meat and poultry could contain dangerous bacteria, and they list basic cooking and handling instructions. This will help consumers protect themselves and their families."

Beginning on Friday, May 27, USDA mandated that the packaging of all raw and notready-to-eat ground meat and poultry must include a safe cooking and handling label designed by the department. The label will be mandated on the packaging of all other cuts of raw and not-ready-to-eat meat and poultry on July 6. Over the past several months, with urging from Espy, some companies voluntarily placed the label on their products.

The label's preamble states: "Some food products may contain bacteria that could cause illness if the products is mishandled or cooked improperly." This statement was placed on the label to emphasize for the consumer the importance of the safe cooking and handling instructions. The label further notes that raw meat and poultry should be: refrigerated or frozen and thawed in a refrigerator or microwave; kept separate from other foods and working surfaces (while hands and utensils should be washed after touching raw meats); cooked thoroughly; and refrigerated immediately discarded.

"As we move our meat and poultry inspection systems to science-based systems and as we learn how to better detect harmful bacteria in the meat and poultry supply, we must keep the consumer aware about safe cooking and handling procedures," said Espy. "I want to emphasize, however, that this label does not affect our continuing responsibily to improve the meat and poultry inspection system. It also does not relieve industry from the responsibility to sell safe products."

In addition to the label, which will appear on more than 15 billion packages annually, USDA is conducting several other safe cooking and handling education campaigns. The USDA recently distributed 9,000 safe cooking and handling information packets to fast--food chains around the nation and send public service announcements to 5,500 radio stations. The radio PSA's feature a Washington State couple who lost a child due to E coli 0157:H7 in January, 1993. Espy also launched an educational campaign in conjunwith the National Association of School Nurses which includes sending more than

2 million post cards to families around the nation. The cards list basic information about safe cooking and handling and state the hamburgers should only be eaten if they are cooked until they are brown in the middle.

Since coming to office last year, Espy has made several improvements to the meat and poultry inspection system including: initiating surprise insepctions of meat and poultry plants; enforcing a zero tolerance policy for fecal matter; emphasizing public health with the creation of a Food Safety and Inspection Service public health division with epidemiologists; and moving toward creating a new system using scientific microbiological testing in the plan-

ts. Microbiological tests are now being used during inspections of equipment in the plants and a team of USDA scientists are developing microbiological test that can be used to detect contamination on meat and poultry.
