### Nichols Re-elected As Iuka Mayor

Iuka citizens re-elected David Nichols to the office of Mayor in Tuesday's special election.

Unofficial totals in the race are David Nichols - 666 and candidate J. R. Long - 526.

The election was ordered by a Circuit Court jury who could not determine a clear winner in last year's election due to irregularities in the absentee voting process.

A total of 1,192 electors out of approximately 2,000 listed on the poll books voted in Tuesday's election.

Marshall AFB is used to house non-violent prisoners, according to Nunley. Teague reportedly escaped from there on Saturday, June 11.

### Editorial

#### Death Trap Again?

Old U.S. Hwy. 72 which links Tusculumbia, Ala. and Memphis, Tenn. was known for many years by the truckers who drove it as a "death trap".

Again the stretch between Iuka and Burnsville is causing accident after accident and has taken the lives of two more young people.

No one knows why, but following last week's opening of the new 25 four-lane bypass which crosses old two-lane 72, some 9 reported accidents have occurred. Motorist seem to be confused by the crossing. Many have gone the wrong way, narrowly missing collisions.

What can we do?

We urge law officials to patrol the road, especially the crossing areas for some time. Slow the traffic down. Get in the highway medium, nothing slows down traffic like the site of a patrol car! Help the local people get used to the change. (Remember the many accidents that happened in Cherokee after 72 4-lane opened.)

Again this newspaper urges local residents to enter the new bypass with caution. Watch the other cars. They might be going the wrong way or they might not know what to do at the 4-way stop. Do not take anything for granted!

Be aware of the road. The new 4-lane is just past the Iuka Hospital. It is marked with stop signs but it seems to just "happen" on you as you travel east or west.

### New Bypass Fatal To Two

Two motorists were killed and two more were injured Tuesday, June 14 as the result of an automobile accident at the intersection of Highway 172 and the newly opened Highway 25 Bypass in Iuka.

According to Iuka Policeman Ricky Cornelison, Tim Paul Sparks, 21, and Wendy Sparks, 18, of Belmont were killed when their 1991 Nissan collided with a 1994 Dodge pick-up, driven by Jeffrey D. Cornelius, 18, of Cherokee, Ala.

The Sparks' baby, 18-month-old Cory Andrew Sparks, was critically injured in the wreck and was transported by air to LeBonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis, TN.

Cornelius suffered minor injuries and was treated and released from Iuka Hospital.

This was the ninth accident to take place at the intersection since its official opening last Monday. According to Cornelison, several calls had been made to the State Highway Department prior to Tuesday's wreck concerning the problems at the intersection. After Tuesday's incident, the Highway Department decided to make the intersection a 4-way-stop. Motorists travelling in that area are urged to use extreme caution.

At press time the baby, Cory Andrew Sparks, was still hospitalized and arrangements for Tim and Wendy Sparks were incomplete.

Raccoons do not actually "wash" their food, as many believe. Experiments show the animals dunk in water food that is already clean or wet as often as they dunk dirty or dry food.

## Fishing Your Pond

The goal of most people is to have good fishing in their pond. One factor of having good fishing is to control the fishing pressure.

If you have a newly stocked pond, do not start fishing until June of the year following stockings of the fingerling bass. This should give the bass time to spawn. The pond should be fished sparingly this year. Generally it is not recommended to remove bass that are less than 12 inches long. They are easy to catch but should be released. Bass are the key to controlling the bream population. A rule of thumb is to remove 4 to 5 pounds of bream for each pound of bass removed. This should maintain the proper balance.

Small bream should not be returned to the pond. Most overpopulation problems are caused by small bream. Ponds have a

limited capacity to produce fish. An unfertilized pond might produce about 40 pounds of harvestable bream (120 fish) and 10 pounds of harvestable bass (8 to 10 fish) per acre per year. A well fertilized pond will produce about 160 pounds of bream (700 fish) and 35 pounds of bass (30 fish) per surface acre per year. In fed bream, bass and catfish ponds, up to 500 pounds of harvestable bream (about 2,000 fish) can be removed, but bass should not be removed at rates higher than that for a fertilized pond.

It is also best not to remove an excessive poundage of adult fish in a short period. Spread fish harvest over as long a period as possible. Excessive removal in the spring may result in rapid overcrowding by small bream.

These are some fishing tools that will help you keep your pond in good production for years to come. If you are fishing someone else's pond, remember

that when the balance becomes unbalanced (bream to bass ratio) fishing becomes bad and it may take years or even restocking to get the fishing right again.

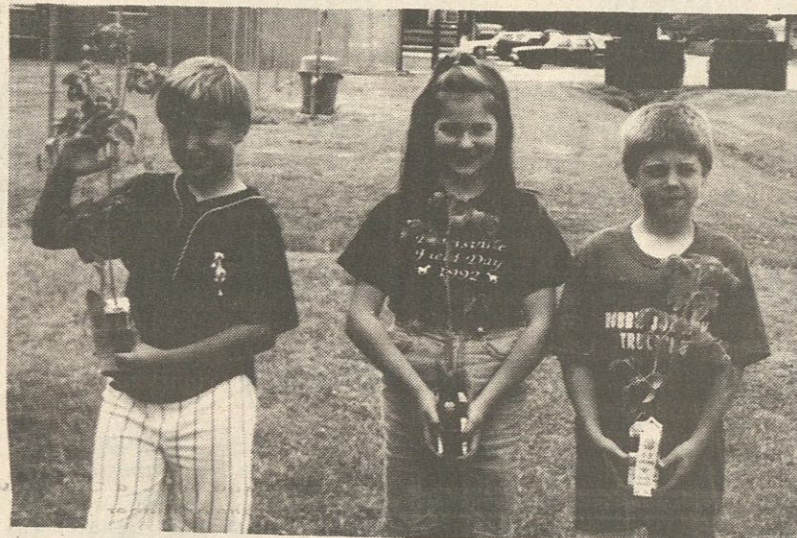

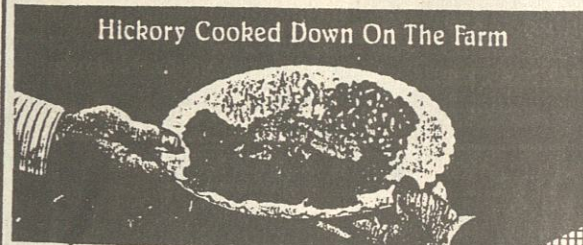

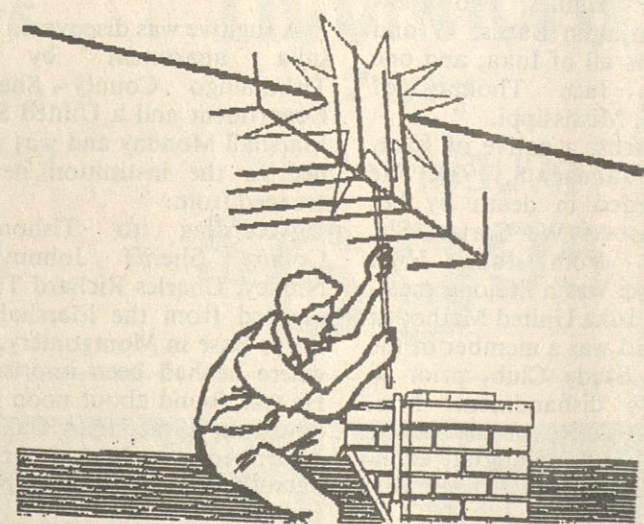
## SAFETY FIRST

### CANINE ALLERGIES

Allergies in dogs are a very common and frequently a frustrating problem for pet owners.

The allergies typically begin when the animal is between 1 and 3 years of age. But allergies have been known to appear as early as 4 months and as late as 10 years.

Dogs, however, rarely have the respiratory problems associated with allergies in people. Instead, the dog may chew at its feet, rub its face or scratch almost any other part of its body. The animal's skin is often inflamed and may have a bad odor.

Canines, like people, can be allergic to virtually anything. The agents most frequently responsible for causing allergies in dogs are inhaled foreign material (allergens), including pollens from grasses, trees, weeds, house dust and molds in the air. Dogs also can become allergic to foods, external and internal parasites, drugs, hormones and the bacteria present on its own skin.

When an animal is exposed to an allergen to which it is allergic, the animal's body reacts in an abnormal manner and the clinical symptoms appear.

While allergic disease in dogs can seldom be cured, they can, in most cases, be controlled. Your local veterinarian can determine the offending allergen(s) and help you take the proper measures to control your dog's allergies. In some cases, simply removing the offending allergens from the dog's environment will be sufficient. Other times, anti-itch drugs or special allergy shots will be required.

## Area Teens Participate In Confederate Soldier's Burial

Pictured above are Jamie Presley, Jon Riley, Cliff Enlow, Jon Moyers, and Michael Crabb; all recent graduates of Tishomingo County School. On May 29-30, 1994, they took part in the services for the re-interment of the remains of Lt. Simeon W. Cummings, Confederate States Navy. Lt. Cummings was the only Confederate soldier killed during the war that was buried on foreign soil. He was killed in Saldanha Bay, South Africa on August 3, 1863 while engaged in a hunting expedition. He was killed by the accidental discharge of a shotgun at point blank range. He was buried at the Kilprug Farm cemetery, attended by a British Naval Contingent and the entire crew of the C.S.S. Alabama along with their legendary commander Admiral Raphael Semmes. Cummings' remains were disinterred in May 1994 with the permission and assistance of the government of South Africa and local historians. His re-interment takes place on the grounds of the International Headquarters of the Sons of Confederate Veterans and the Military Order of the Stars and Bars at Historic Elm Springs, Columbia, Tennessee. Representatives from Saldanha Bay and Capetown, South Africa were in attendance.

As members of 48th Tennessee, the local boys helped provide guard for burial. Jamie Presley served as drummer and

led the funeral procession beginning at 6:30 from Oakes and Nichols Funeral Home in Elm Springs (a four mile walk). Cummings was then to lie in state in the antebellum Mansion until funeral services at 12 o'clock noon on Monday, Memorial Day. Jon Riley, Cliff Enlow, Jon Moyers and Michael Crabb had to serve a two-hour honor guard duty at the foot and head of the Confederate flag draped wooded casket. Michael Crabb stated that this was the hardest part, having to stand at attention with no expression or movement for two hours. After the funeral address the procession, again led by Jamie, made it's way to the graveside. Music was beautifully and touchingly done by bag pipes. After the graveside reading from Episcopal Burial Service all the soldiers passed by the open grave, tossing in buttons from their uniforms, along with hands full of dirt. All others in attendance were given the chance to do the same. A 21 artillery gun salute was given as part of the full military honors. It was a memorable experience felt by all. Others from Iuka attending the services were Hugh, Cathy, and Amanda Presley.

On Thursday, May 26th following Graduation Exercises, Men and their wives from the 48th Tenn. of Waynesboro, Tennessee honored the ten area youths that had taken part in the 48th Tenn. as Cadets for the past

year with becoming the 2nd Patton of the 48th Tenn. They were presented a Confederate Battle Flag to be used in their camp at future re-enactments. Jamie Presley was made Corporal, Jon Riley and Jeremy Lovelace as Hi Privates, Cliff Enlow, Jon Moyers, Michael Crabb, Steven Brown, Mark Milligan, Russ Lambert and Duston Ware were all made Privates. Plans are in the works to attend Parker's Crossroads in Lexington, and Liberty Gap near Bell Buckle in June; in October Elms Springs at Colombia, Tennessee.

And you're right.

But not the farmer.

His wife won't let him.

She has a basic menu; she serves what she has.

In good years that may be six vegetables at one meal.

In lean years she jumps from poke salad to black-eyed peas.

The farmer orders a seventeen inch John Deere disc - \$4,300.

By the time it's delivered it's \$6,500.

He's got a forty thousand dollar machine needing repair. It's five-thirty p.m. and the company owned stores are closed. And he's got five hours of daylight he can't let go to waste.

So he borrows a machine from a neighbor, is movin' it down the highway when he's run into a ditch by some joker pullin' a boat.

Yet he remains the world's most stubborn optimist.

He believes that the fact he's come this far proves he can go the rest of the way.
