## Home Economics Tips

From the cart to the cupboard. From the stove to your table. Healthful eating begins at the supermarket. Understanding and using the nutrition information supplied on labels can help you make wiser choices.

Nutrition claims such as "light," "free" or "low" previously may have created con-

sumer confusion, because there were no uniform criteria for using these terms. However, new nutrition labeling regulations from the Food and Drug Administration and the U.S. Department of Agriculture have now established standardized definitions.

While shopping, use these nutrient descriptors to guide your choices.

\*More: Describes a product with 10 percent more of the recommended daily amount of a nutrient compared to another

food. Refers to protein, vitamins, minerals and fiber.

\*Reduced or Less: Describes a food with at least 25 percent fewer calories, or 25 percent less cholesterol, fat, saturated fat, sodium or sugar than a reference food, which might be the leading brand or an average of several leading brands.

\*Light: Refers to a calorie reduction of at least a third or a fat reduction of at least half, when compared to a reference food. It also describes a low calorie, lowfat product with a sodium content that has been reduced by at least 50 percent.

\*Free: Refers to calories, cholesterol, fat, saturated fat, sugar or sodium. There can be none, or virtually none, of whatever is listed as "free".

\*Low: Describes a food with fat, saturated fat, cholesterol, sodium or calories at or below a specified limit.

To learn more about wise food choices, ask a registered dietitian.

## AVOID HOT WEATHER PROBLEMS

People who own dogs should remember that their pets can suffer the effects of summer heat and humidity just as humans do.

Heatstroke can be a very serious threat to a pet during warm weather. Death can occur in a very short while if an animal suffering from heat stress does not receive proper attention.

Remember, your pet doesn't perspire the way you do. The animal's cooling system is in its lungs. So your dog needs cool air.

Never leave your pet in a parked car when it's warm or humid outside -- not even for a "quick errand." A parked car -- even one parked in the shade and with the windows left open as much as four inches -- can be a death trap for the family pet.

For example, if it's 85 degrees outside, it would take only 32 minutes for the temperature in a closed car to reach 120 degrees. When a dog's temperature rises just a few degrees, severe brain damage or heat stroke can result.

Be sure and provide cool shade and plenty of clean, fresh water for your pet. As the temperatures rise, your animals tend to drink more water.

Make sure your pet doesn't overexert during the hot part of the day.

If your pet exhibits signs of heat stress -- panting, a staring or anxious expression, failure to respond to commands, warm dry skin, extremely high fever, rapid heart beat or collapse -- the recommended first aid is to immerse the animal in cool (not cold) water immediately. Spraying the dog with cool water from the garden hose will help.

Then take the animal to your family veterinarian.

Special care and precautions can make the summer safer and more enjoyable for you and your pet.

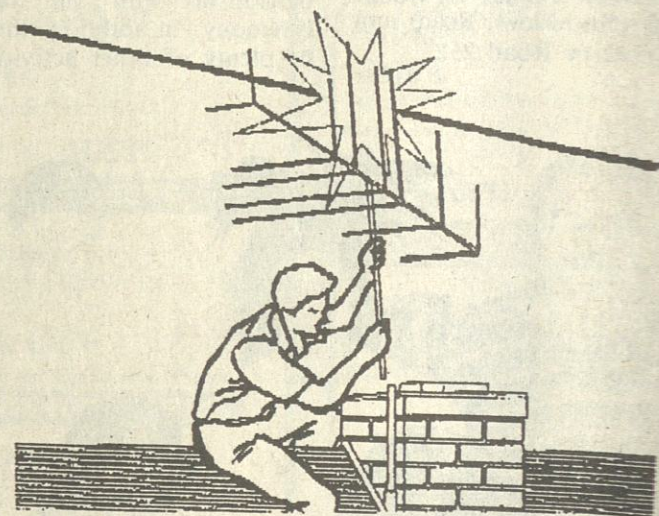
## SAFETY FIRST

## CONTACTS: WHICH KIND?

Basically, we have three kinds of contacts with which to fit our patients: hard, soft and gas-permeable. The hard lenses were made of PMMA, a plastic developed in the 1940's. Although they provided excellent vision correction and were quite durable, they just were not comfortable. If you wore them too long, your cornea, being deprived of oxygen, became swollen and irritated.

Soft lenses are made of hydrophilic (water loving) plastic. Since 38-79 percent of their weight is water, they are very comfortable to wear, due to the fact that oxygen can pass through the lenses to nourish the cornea.

The most recent development is the gas-permeable lens. These allow clear vision, will correct astigmatism, and are much more durable than soft lenses. Since they allow as much oxygen to reach the cornea through the lenses as soft lenses do, they approach a level of comfort equal to that of soft lenses. These lenses require more expertise for fitting than do soft lenses.

Bill has long been a powerful advocate of improved health care for all Mississippians and for victims' rights. In 1989 he authored a physical therapy assistance bill that now makes health care professionals more widely available to rural patients. That same

year he added an amendment to the Parole Board bill that required the Board to inform victims, their families, and local law enforcement officials of an impending review of a parolee's status.

Over the last several sessions of the legislature, Bill has been the leader on improving rural fire protection. He co-authored a bill in 1988 that increased funding for rural fire departments from \$1.6 million to \$4.5 million annually. In 1990 he amended the legislation to increase rural and municipal fire protection funding to \$5.5 million each. He has also been involved in fine-tuning legislation for fire districts such as establishing county fire coordinators and improving training facilities at the state level.

To protect families from personal bankruptcy or forfeiture, Bill authored legislation in 1991 to increase the amount of property protected under state Homestead Exemption laws from \$30,000 to \$75,000. This increased protection was aimed at helping avoid the loss of family farms, homes and property.

In 1992 Bill sponsored major legislation to save a stretch of railway from Corinth to Red Bay, Alabama which was about to be abandoned, a bill that ultimately saved over 400 jobs. The Mississippi/Alabama Authority Act will not only have a direct positive economic impact, it will serve as a model for involving local and private investment in the economic survival of communities across the rural South.

Bill's personal background, education, and training has amply prepared him for a life of public service. A former Eagle Scout, he received an Associate Arts degree in pre-law from Northwest Alabama Community College where his parents taught. He was both student body President and Valedictorian. He graduated from Millsaps College in 1984 magna cum laude and was elected to an unprecedented two terms as student body President. He received his Master's degree from The George Washington University on a full tuition scholarship.

As a graduate student, he interned on the office of Senator Howell Heflin (D-AL) where he was assigned to work on the 1985 Agriculture Act. He conducted extensive research on the Social Security System, as well as the 1946 Employment Act.

In 1992 Bill was chosen to serve as one of twenty-four nationally recruited Fellows to participate in the European Community Visitors Programme to study health care policy abroad. He was also selected to participate in the George A. McLean Institute for Community Development, a leadership conference conducted annually that encourages creative approaches to community and governing problems.

As a candidate for the U.S. Congress, Bill remains committed to a platform of job creation, economic development, improved education and health care for all Mississippians. He has a proven record of hard work and accomplishment and will labor to improve the lives of his constituents through active leadership and a creative approach of solving his state's and the nation's toughest problems.

If the same people come, who showed up at the meeting when Jerry McDaniels was fired, there should be a heck of a crowd.

## ASCS Farm News

ASCS RECOMMENDS  
PERMANENT COVER  
FOR ACR

Phillip A. Horn, County Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, says farm program participants should seriously consider designating the same acreage each year as acreage conservation reserve (ACR). ACR is cropland that is required to be removed from production and maintained in conserving uses, in order to participate in and receive benefits under annual acreage reduction programs.

"We recommend that farmers seriously consider devoting these acres to a permanent vegetative cover, such as perennial grasses," Horn said. This practice is especially effective on fragile, erosive soils and will help maintain the ground from year-to-year, he said.

Producers had the opportunity, when they enrolled in the 1994 farm programs, to request cost-share assistance to establish perennial cover on ACR. The Multi-Year Cost-Share Program, authorized by the Food, Agriculture, Conservation and Trade Act of 1990, provides 25 percent of the cost for establishing a perennial cover on land diverted from wheat, feed grain, upland cotton, and rice production.

"By planting a perennial vegetative cover on ACR, producers will help reduce soil erosion on the land, improve water quality, and improve

wildlife habitat," Horn said.

He said annual covers are not eligible for cost-share assistance under the program, and perennial cover must be a grass, legume, or grass-legume mixture, maintained for a minimum of 2 years after the calendar year the practice is established.

ASCS official Horn said cost-shares will be paid only once for establishing a perennial cover. 1995 WHEAT PROGRAM ANNOUNCED

In 1995 Wheat Program contains a zero percent acreage reduction, the same as in 1994, according to Phillip A. Horn, County Extension Director of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. Producers who participate in the 1995 program will not be required to

reduce their planting to qualify for price support loans and deficiency payments.

"The means that there is no requirement to place eligible cropland into an Acreage Conservation Reserve," Horn said.

He said the zero-percent acreage reduction continues to be the best choice because it provided the highest income for producers, the greatest economic activity for rural communities, and the highest quality grain for processors. This level was chosen from the statutory range of 0 to 15 percent to allow wheat growers to produce sufficient wheat supplies for domestic and export needs.

As in 1994, the wheat program offers target price protection at \$4.00 per bushel. A paid land

diversion will not be implemented.

ASCS official Horn said other 1994 wheat program provisions will be announced later.

## New Highway Safety Legislation Effective July 1st....

Although preventing death and serious injuries in motor vehicle crashes has been the overwhelming reason for using safety belts and child protective devices, July 1 will usher in two more reasons, according to the Department of Public Safety's Division of Public Safety Planning.

Beginning on this date, drivers and front-seat passengers not using safety belts and drivers of vehicles transporting children

under the age of 4, who are not secured in child protection devices, will be subject to a \$25 fine. Previously there was no penalty for not using safety belts, and the requirement for children to use protection devices applied only to children under age 2.

"The goal of these legislative measures is to encourage motorists to take the steps that could save their lives or prevent serious injuries in motor vehicle crashes," said Donald O'Cain, the division's executive director. "We want the penalties to be a deterrent rather than punishment. I don't know of any law enforcement officer who gains pleasure from writing traffic law violation citations, but many of them have seen the tragic consequences of not using motor

vehicle occupant devices."

Billy Terrell, Office of the State Safety, noted that the nature is such that protection laws need laws to protect our children...laws as speeding, driving or causing vehicle crashes, causing vehicle crashes, obeying traffic signals, course, failing to use protection devices."

O'Cain said that new laws will increase safety belts and child protection devices with the result of many serious injuries on Mississippi road.
