Special Election For Constable and Election Commissioner

Vacancies in the office of Northern District Constable and Fifth District Election Commissioner for Tishomingo County will be filled this November during the general election.

Candidates wishing to run for either of these positions must qualify with the Tishomingo County Election Commission at least 60 days prior to the election. They may begin qualifying August 9, 1994 at the Circuit Court Clerk's office, according to the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors.

The general election is slated for November 8, 1994.

T.C.E.P.A. Membership Meeting Saturday

The Annual Membership Meeting of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association will be held in the Tishomingo County Courthouse, in Iuka, Mississippi, on Saturday, August 6, 1994, at 10:00 A.M. in accordance with the Bylaws, five percent of the members must be present in order to conduct business. The membership will nominate and elect election commissioners to serve with the commissioners appointed by the Board of Directors to conduct the election to be held on August 13, 1994, for vacancies on the Board of Directors.

Also, in accordance with the Bylaws, nominations may be made for five directors. You may nominate, or be nominated, from the floor at the Annual Meeting

provided five percent of the membership is physically present.

Rubbish Landfill Sites Approved By M.C.E.Q.

At its regular meeting on July 28, 1994, the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality approved amendments to the Northeast Mississippi Regional Solid Waste Management Plan including two landfill sites in Tishomingo County.

The amendments include provisions for five proposed solid waste management facilities within the planning area: (1) a private rubbish disposal site located in Section 14, Township 7, Range 10 East, Tishomingo County, to be owned and operated by Belmont Homes, Inc. for their exclusive use for rubbish disposal; (2) a public rubbish disposal site located in parts of Sections 21 and 22, Township 4 South, Range 10 East, Tishomingo County (land previously known as the Lester Skinner Place and purchased from Franklin Woods) to be owned and operated by Tishomingo County for rubbish disposal; (3) a public rubbish disposal site located in Section 5, Township 2 South, Range 8 East, Alcorn County, to be owned and operated by Alcorn County for rubbish disposal; (4) a public rubbish disposal site located in Section 32, Township 5 South, Range 7 East, Prentiss County for rubbish disposal; and (5) a private waste tire disposal facility located in Section 12, Township 5 South, Range 7 East, Prentiss County, to be owned and operated by Tire Disposal System, Inc. for the disposal of processed waste tires.

Tishomingo County Supervisors explained that it will be between 3-4 weeks before the new public landfill site will be ready for use.

Any interested person may request that a formal evidentiary hearing be conducted regarding the approval of these amendments to the plan. Such a request must be made in accordance with Section 49-17-41 of state law by writing to Mr. J. I. Palmer, Jr., Executive Director, Department of Environmental Quality, P. O. Box 10385, Jackson, MS 39289, no later than August 28, 1994.

You Can Help Prevent Child Neglect & Abuse

More than 16,000 incidents of child neglect and/or abuse were reported in Mississippi last year alone. Between October 1, 1992, and September 30, 1993, Prentiss County received 271 referrals, a 15% increase from the previous time period. Tishomingo County has received a 21% increase over the same time period. The children taken into custody has increased 42% in Prentiss County and 83% in Tishomingo County.

Tami Childers, Parent Aide Coordinator for Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties, said that because of the large number of referrals in this area, more time is being spent to take care of the children who were reported to be abused or neglected, leaving little time for the social workers to work toward preventing the abuse. The Productive Parenting Program, funded by a mini-grant under the Child Abuse Prevention Act, is being operated through the Family and Children's Services of the Mississippi Department of Human Services in both Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties, which received this funding to help fulfill the need for preventive measures.

The Productive Parenting Program has two areas. The first is a parenting class for parents whose children may have already been taken into custody. This is an eight week class offered at no cost that teaches the fundamentals of parenting, self-esteem, nutrition, and money management among other needs. "There has already been a tremendous response (to the parenting classes)," said Childers.

The second area of the program involves volunteers who

attend a Parent Aide Training Workshop, then are assigned to a family to help them develop values, attitudes, and behaviors that produce positive growth in children and parents who previously have had difficulties in their relationship in the family and community.

Volunteers are needed to help complete this program. To volunteer, one must be 18 years of age, have a high school diploma or the equivalent, a valid driver's license and own transportation. These volunteers will receive training and they will be matched to families according to the strengths of the volunteers and the needs of the families.

"We realize we cannot correct all the problems our families face today, however we want to prevent as many problems as we can."

This program is to help keep the family functional and to protect the children from being removed from the home, said Childers. "We would like to start the volunteer program immediately, so we need volunteers." Ice Cream Supper

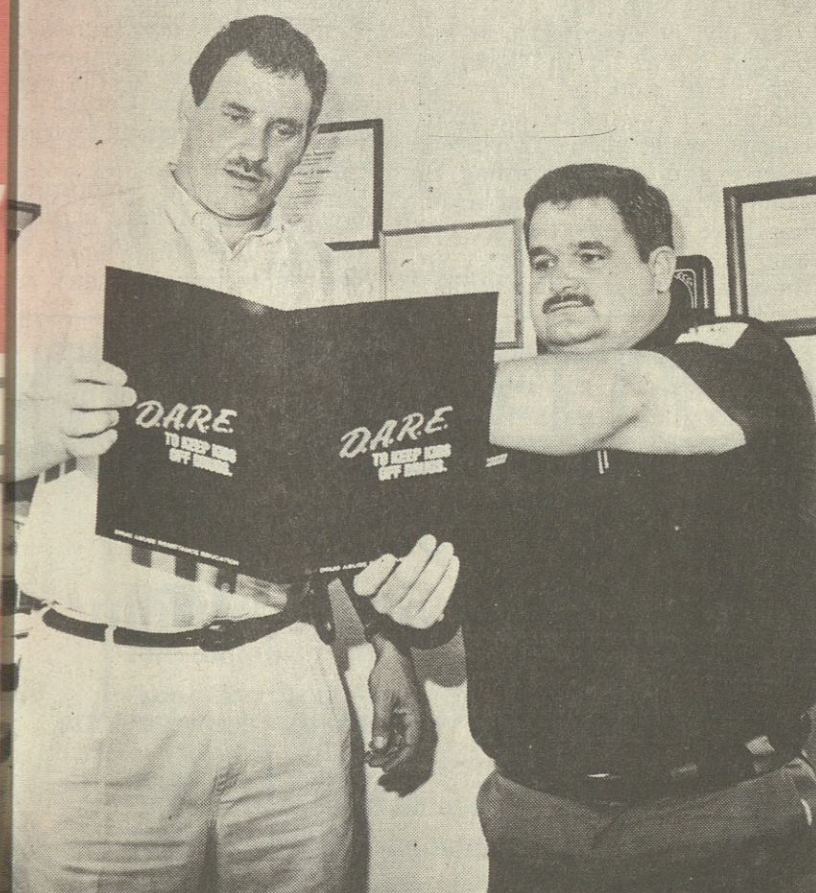

Sheriff's Department Introduces Drug Prevention Program

This fall the Tishomingo Co. Sheriff's Department and the Tishomingo County School District will introduce Project D.A.R.E. into the schools of the county.

Project D.A.R.E. is a uniformed officer-led self-management and social skills program aimed at reducing or delaying the onset of substance abuse.

Project D.A.R.E. is designed to equip elementary and junior high school students with the skills for recognizing and resisting peer and other social pressures to experiment with drugs. The D.A.R.E. program also focuses on building a child's self-esteem, consequential thinking and risk-taking, communication skills and positive alternatives to substance abuse behavior.

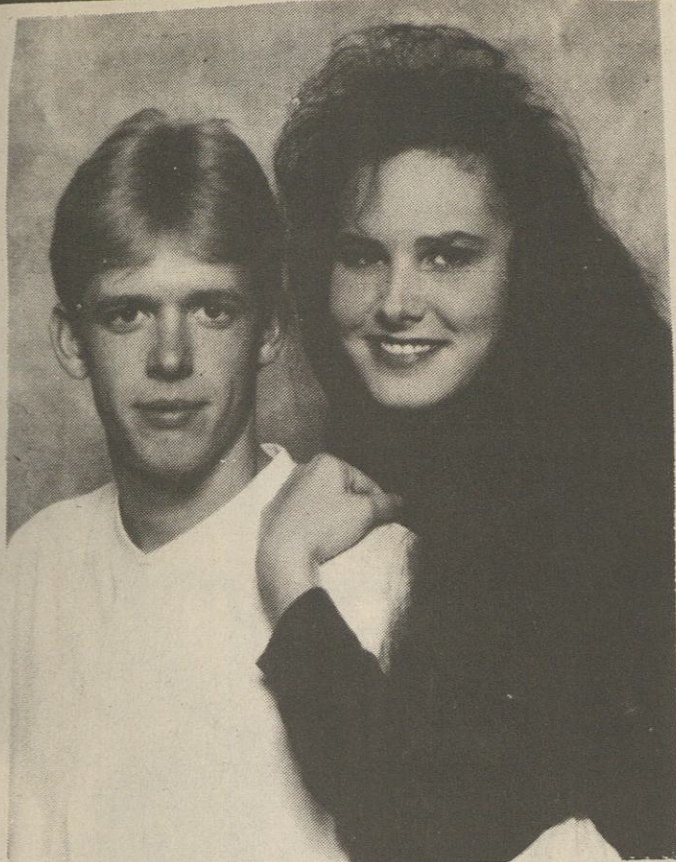
The program content for grades 5-6 is organized into seventeen 45-60 minute sessions to be conducted by a specially trained

police officer on a weekly basis.

Deputy Sheriff Glenn Whitlock of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has just completed 80 plus hours of course work in D.A.R.E. training and will be doing the instruction in all the County schools this year. This program is a joint effort between the Sheriff's Department and the school district to better help our children resist the temptations of drugs and alcohol.

Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley said that he had been looking for a program for a while to incorporate into the schools to assist in the prevention of drug abuse. He said he decided on the D.A.R.E. program because of its broader base of information. "I believe it's a good program that can benefit our young people, with its results benefiting the entire county."

Nunley said that he hopes to eventually extend programs like this one to the older students.

things while using an ATM. If the area is poorly lit, or if you see someone or something suspicious, go to another location. Report any lighting or safety problems to the ATM operator, usually displayed on the machine.

Minimize the time you spend at an ATM. Have your card ready and fill out any forms in advance.

Stand between the ATM and those waiting behind you to block their view of your transaction.

Put your cash in your wallet or purse right away. Don't count it or expose it. As soon as you've completed your transaction, take

your card, money and receipt

move away from the machine. Always take your receipt. You will need it to verify the transaction against your monthly count statement.

Lock your car doors and use a drive-up ATM.

"The Peoples Bank and Trust Company has had very few incidences at our ATMs, although the number of wide incidents which occur at ATMs is small," McClellan stated further, "following simple safety tips can prevent problems with ATMs."

They described the services offered by the libraries in Tishomingo County and asked that the Board consider a 10 percent increase from last year's budget.

Senate Approves Language To Protect Hunting On Refuges

The Senate has approved language which restrains the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service from eliminating traditional uses of National Wildlife Refuges, Senator Thad Cochran (R-Miss) announced Tuesday, July 26.

The bill calls for additional funding for refuges to help address operation and maintenance needs, so activities like hunting and fishing will not be restricted for budget reasons.

The language in the accompanying report to the Interior appropriations bill requires the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to

notify the public and receive approval for congressional oversight committees before eliminating any activities on refuges.

"I hope this puts to rest the concerns of hunters and others who have been alarmed by the plans to cut back on hunting in the federal refuge system," Cochran said.

The Interior Appropriations bill now goes to a conference committee to work out the differences in House and Senate bills.

"Remember to add, rather than take away," she says. "For instance, add a salad to a hamburger meal."

Other tips to make fast food more nutritious include:

*Add extra vegetables to a sandwich.

*Choose milk instead of a soft drink and make that milk low fat or skim.

*Pizzas are great if you load up on vegetable toppings. Got to have little meat on there? Try Canadian bacon instead of fat-laden pepperoni.

While a low-fat diet—30 percent or less of total calories a day from fat—is recommended for all family members, McLaurin does caution that children younger than 2 years old should not have any fat restrictions. After that age, however, it's time to begin watching the old fat percentages.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR SUPERVISOR DISTRICTS ONE, TWO AND THREE OF SAID COUNTY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$250,000.00 TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PLANNING, DEVELOPING, CONSTRUCTING, ENLARGING, IMPROVING AND EQUIPPING THE TISHOMINGO COUNTY AIRPORT FOR SUCH DISTRICTS, INCLUDING BUILDINGS AND OTHER FACILITIES INCIDENTAL TO THE OPERATION THEREOF; AND ACQUIRING REAL PROPERTY THEREFOR; AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. The County is authorized by Section 61-3-1 through 61-3-83, the Airport Authorities Law, of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, (the "Act") to issue Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purposes and amounts set forth in Paragraph 2 of the preamble.

2. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue General Obligation Bonds for Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County in the principal amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) to raise money for the purpose of planning, developing, constructing, enlarging, improving and equipping the Tishomingo County Airport (the "Airport") in and for such Districts, including buildings and other facilities incidental to the operation thereof; and acquiring real property therefor.

3. Assessed value of all taxable property within Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is \$43,829,197.00; Supervisor Districts Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County have no outstanding bonded indebtedness which is subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit as prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and no outstanding bonded and floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

The issuance of the Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued pursuant to the Act, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of such Districts of the County, will not result in a bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within such Districts of the County, and will not result in indebtedness, both bonding and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within such Districts of the County, and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by such Districts of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors for Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body")

as follows:

Section 1. The Governing hereby declares its intention to issue General Obligation Bonds for Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of Tishomingo County in the principal amount not to exceed \$250,000.00 (the "Bonds"); pursuant to the purpose of planning, developing, constructing, enlarging, improving and equipping the Airport in and for such Districts, including buildings and other facilities incidental to the operation thereof; and acquiring property therefor. The Bonds may be issued in one or more series and be general obligations of the County. The Bonds shall be payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the available direct continuing tax to be levied annually without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the property within the geographical limits of Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County.

Section 2. The Governing proposes to direct this issuance of the Bonds in the amounts, for purposes and securities aforesaid, at a meeting of the Governing Body in its regular place in the Tishomingo County Courthouse in Mississippi, at the hour of 10:00 a.m. on August 25, 1994.

Section 3. If on or before 10:00 a.m. on August 25, 1994, twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of Supervisor Districts Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County, or fifteen hundred (1500), whichever is less, shall have written protest against the issuance of the Bonds pursuant to law. Bonds for such purpose or purposes shall not be issued unless authorized in an election on the question of the issuance of the Bonds to be held as provided by law. If no protest is filed on or before 10:00 a.m. on August 25, 1994, against the issuance of the Bonds, then the Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof any time within a period of one year after the date specified in Section 2 hereof.

Section 4. This resolution shall be published once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper published and having general circulation in Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County, qualified under the provisions of Section 11, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this resolution shall be made no less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the fixed herein for the issuance of the Bonds and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date.

Section 5. The Clerk of the County shall be and hereby is directed to procure from the publisher of a newspaper the customary publication of this resolution have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

Section 6. If any one or more provisions of this resolution shall be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any of the other provisions of this resolution, but this resolution shall be construed and enforced as if the illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained herein.

Jury Awards \$1.7 M In Jail Death Case

A Wheeler man's 1990 death in the Booneville City Jail was vindicated Thursday when a Federal Jury awarded \$1.69 million to Harold Goff's nine year old daughter and only heir. It took only one hour and fifteen minutes for the four man and four woman Jury to return the verdict.

On August 20, 1990, in temperatures exceeding 100 degrees, Harold Goff wandered away from his job on a Prentiss County garbage truck. In a semi-conscious state, incoherent and unable to walk, he was subsequently arrested by two Booneville police officers. The officers charged Goff with public drunkenness and transported to the Booneville City police department. During the booking process when Goff was unable to sit upright, the officers placed

him on the floor and proceeded with the booking. Unable to walk, Goff was then carried by the officers to the City's isolated drunk tank, where, four hours later, he died from severe heat stroke.

Throughout the four day trial the officers contended that, Goff's breath smelled strongly of alcohol. Autopsy reports, however, revealed that Goff's blood and other body fluids had an alcohol content of 0.0, and tested negative for drugs.

Attorneys for the plaintiff, Joey Langston and Ronald Michael, of Booneville, praised the jury for having the courage to value life so highly.

The law firm of Langston, Langston, Michael and Bowen also represent the families of two prisoners who died in the City Corinth jails. Those cases are still pending, but should be in a "trial posture" within six months, said Langston.
