

Sheriff's Department Introduces Drug Prevention Program

This fall the Tishomingo Co.
Sheriff's Department and the
Tishomingo County School
District will introduce Project
D.A.R.E. into the schools of the
county.

Project D.A.R.E. is a uniformed officer-led self-management and social skills program aimed at reducing or delaying the onset of substance abuse.

Project D.A.R.E. is designed to equip elementary and junior high school students with the skills for recognizing and resisting peer and other social pressures to experiment with drugs. The D.A.R.E. program also focuses on building a child's self-esteem, consequential thinking and risk-taking, communication skills and positive

munication skills and positive alternatives to substance abuse behavior.

The program content for

The program content for grades 5-6 is organized into seventeen 45-60 minute sessions to be conducted by a specially trained

police officer on a weekly basis.

Deputy Sheriff Glenn
Whitlock of the Tishomingo
County Sheriff's Department has
just completed 80 plus hours of
course work in D.A.R.E. training
and will be doing the instruction
in all the County schools this
year. This program is a joint effort between the Sheriff's Department and the school district to
better help our children resist the
temptations of drugs and

Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley said that he had been looking for a program for a while to incorporate into the schools to assit in the prevention of drug abuse. He said he decided on the D.A.R.E. program because of its broader base of information. "I believe it's a good program that can benefit our young people, with its results benefiting the entire county."

Nunley said that he hopes to eventially extend programs like this one to the older students.





The New County Rubbish Landfill, to be located approximately 1-mile from the current landfill on the old Lester Skinner Place, should be ready for use in 3 to 4 weeks, according to members of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors. Pictured here is the transfer station located at the present landfill. Household garbage from throughout the county is placed on the concrete slab and pushed off into trucks which haul it to Houston, Mississippi.

At its regular meeting on July 28, 1994, the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality approved amendments to the Northeast Mississippi Regional Solid Waste Management Plan including two landfill sites in Tishomingo County.

The amendments include provisions for five proposed solid waste management facilities within the planning area: (1) a private rubbish disposal site located in Section 14, Township 7, Range 10 East, Tishomingo County, to be owned and operated by Belmont Homes, Inc. for their exclusive use for rubbish disposal; (2) a public rubbish disposal site located in parts of Sections 21 and 22, Township 4 South, Range 10 East, Tishomingo County (land previously known as the Lester Skinner Place and purchased from Franklin Woods) to be owned and operated by Tishomingo County for rubbish disposal; (3) a public rubbish disposal site located in Section 5, Township 2 South, Range 8 East, Alcorn County, to be owned and operated by Alcorn County for rubbish disposal; (4) a public rubbish disposal site located in Section 32, Township 5 South, Range 7 East, Prentiss County for rubbish disposal; and (5) a private waste tire disposal facility located in Section 12, Township 5 South, Range 7 East, Prentiss County, to be owned and operated by Tire Disposal System, Inc. for the disposal of processed waste tires.

Tishomingo County Supervisors explained that it will be between 3-4 weeks before the new public landfill site will be ready for use.

Any interested person may request that a formal evidentiary hearing be conducted regarding the approval of these amendments to the plan. Such a request must be made in accordance with Section 49-17-41 of state law by writing to Mr. J. I. Palmer, Jr., Executive Director, Department of Environmental Quality, P. O. Box 10385, Jackson, MS 39289, no later than August 28, 1994.

You Can Help Prevent Child Neglect & Abuse

More than 16,000 incidents of child neglect and/or abuse were reported in Mississippi last year alone. Between October 1, 1992, and September 30, 1993, Prentiss County received 271 referrals, a 15% increase from the previous time period. Tishomingo County has received a 21% increase over the same time period. The children taken into custody has increased 42% in Prentiss County and 83% in Tishomingo County.

Tami Childers, Parent Aide Coordinator for Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties, said that because of the large number of referrals in this area, more time is being spent to take care of the children who were reported to be abused or neglected, leaving little time for the social workers to work toward preventing the abuse. The Productive Parenting Program, funded by a mini-grant under the Child Abuse Prevention Act, is being operated through the Family Children's Services of the Mississippi Department Human Services in both Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties, which received this funding to help fulfill the need for preventive measures.

The Productive Parenting Program has two areas. The first is a parenting class for parents whose children may have already been taken into custody. This is an eight week class offered at no cost that teaches the fundamentals of parenting, self-esteem, nutrition, and management among other needs. "There has already been a tremendous response (to the parenting classes)," Childers.

The second area of the program involves volunteers who

attend a Parent Aide Training Workshop, then are assigned to a family to help them develop values, attitudes, and behaviors that produce positive growth in children and parents who previously have had difficulties in their relationship in the family and community.

Volunteers are needed to help complete this program. To volunteer, one must be 18 years of age, have a high school diploma or the equivalent, a valid driver's license and own transportation. These volunteers will receive training and they will be matched to families according to the strengths of the volunteers and the needs of the families.

"We realize we cannot correct all the problems our families face today, however we want to prevent as many problems as we

This program is to help keep the family functional and to protect the children from being removed from the home, said Childers. "We would like to start the volunteer program immediately, so we need volunteers." 
The contract for the expansion has been awarded to Little Brothers Construction, Inc. of Corinth and work should begin within a week or so of the groundbreaking.

for calcium is critical, her consumption of milk, one of the best sources of calcium - may be at its lowest. Between the ages of 12 and 55, milk consumption drops from about 26 gallons a year to under 10, according to the American Dairy Association.

In fact, the average American woman over age 44 consumes only half the recommended amount of calcium. Experts assembled by the National Institutes of Health recommend adults over age 25 consume 1000 milligrams (mg) of calcium daily.

Unfortunately, a lifelong shortage of calcium can contribute to osteoporosis, a disease in which bones grow thin with age and break easily. Osteoporosis affects an estimated 25 million adults.

Calcium can be provided through foods that also furnish a variety of other essential nutrien-

In addition to dairy products, other sources of calcium include green leafy vegetables and fish that is eaten with the bones, such as canned salmon. Following are some of the foods:

*3 ounces of canned salmon has 212 mg of calcium. *1/2 cup of cooked broccoli provides 94 mg of calcium.

*8 ounces of fortified skim milk has 302 mg of calcium. *1 ounce of Cheddar Cheese

has 204 mg of calcium. 8* ounces of lowfat, fruitflavored yogurt has 345 mg of

*3/4 cup of whole grain cereal with 1/2 cup skim milk provides 400 mg of calcium.

The best sources of calcium include dairy products, it's important to choose lowfat dairy products whenever possible. In addition to being lower in fat, they offer just as much, of even more, calcium as the higher fat versions. ******

THE KEY TO FLEA CONTROL

As many of you are finding out, flea season is going full blast. There are many effective weapons available, but to understand the key to controlling fleas, you must first understand how fleas reproduce.

Adult fleas lay thousands of eggs on an animal after sucking blood. These eggs fall off the animal into carpet or bedding, on to furniture and into the yard. The eggs hatch into larvae, near microscopic caterpillar-like creatures that feed on flea feces and other debris, and then encase themselves in a cocoon. In this pupae stage, they lay in wait until emerging as an adult. Then the cycle begins again.

A typical infestation consists of 1% adults, 34% eggs, 57% larvae and 8% pupae. Any number of products will do a great job of killing adult fleas, but you can see that this ignores 99% of the

The key to controlling fleas is to use a product that kills both adult and preadult fleas. Such products contain an insect growth regulator (IGR), a chemical that alters the flea's juvenile hormone and prevents the egg and larvae stages from maturing, therefore never

becoming adults. Flea infestation takes place in three places-on the pet, in the home and in the yard. To effectively control fleas, all three have to be treated. Products containing IGR are available for the pet in the form of sprays, dips and collars. Sprays and foggers that contain

IGR are available for the home. The key to flea control is keep preadult fleas from maturing, so be sure to use products that contain insect growth reulators (IGR).

Leon Smith A Corinth Boy

Mayor Smith also responded to JSU's Dr. Jerry Smith's question about the high and low points in his political life. "Always be prepared to lose," he said. 'Have a good plan and be able to describe it to voters, and tell them how much it's going to cost, too." Leon also recommended that a candidate be positive, work very hard and go from door to door to ask for votes.

"Richard Nixon pointed out how one cannot know what it's like to be on the mountain top until one has been in the valley," said Mr. Smith. Mayor Smith referred to how a person is lucky if he has three good friends in this life time. He described how Jesus Christ, his children and wife had stuck by him when they were needed most. "It makes me feel good to be able to serve people, to gain their trust and have enough political clout to help influence the building of a senior citizen home," said Smith. "The elderly have paid their

"I like to watch foodball as much as anyone," said Smith. Nevertheless, he couldn't understand why the State Department of Education only demands 52 minutes of each of the basics, while football practice lasted about two and one/half hours each day. To Leon, reform in education was mostly a farce or a hound dog barking. Besides, according to Leon, a recent study showed that Georgia and Florida

The eye has often been likened to a camera. 
SAFETY FIRST

Dr. Barbara McLaurin, human nutrition specialist Mississippi State University, says it's OK for children to eat fast foods if they make nutritious selections.

"Remember to add, rather than take away," she says. "For instance, add a salad to a hamburger meal."

Other tips to make fast food more nutritious include:

*Add extra vegetables to a sandwich.

*Choose milk instead of a soft drink and make that milk low fat or skim.

*Pizzas are great if you load up on vegetable toppings. Got to have little meat on there? Try Canadian bacon instead of fatladen pepperoni.

While a low-fat diet--30 percent or less of total calories a day from fat--is recommended for all family members, McLaurin does caution that children younger than 2 years old should not have any fat restrictions. After that age, however, it's time to begin watching the old fat percentages.

Jury Awards \$1.7 M In Jail Death Case

A Wheeler man's 1990 death in the Booneville City Jail was vindicated Thursday when a Federal Jury awarded \$1.69 million to Harold Goff's nine year old daughter and only heir. It took only one hour and fifteen minutes for the four man and four woman Jury to return the verdict.

On August 20, 1990, in temperatures exceeding 100 degrees, Harold Goff wandered away from his job on a Prentiss County garbage truck. In a semiconscious state, incoherent and unable to walk, he was subsequently arrested by two Booneville police officers. The officers charged Godd with public drunkenness and transported to the Booneville City police department. During the booking process when Goff was unable to sit upright, the officers placed

him on the floor and proceeded with the booking. Unable to walk, Goff was then carried by the officers to the City's isolated drunk tank, where, four hours later, he died from severe heat stroke.

Throughout the four day trial the officers contended that, Goff's breath smelled strongly of alcohol. Autopsy reports, however, revealed that Goff's blood and other body fluids had an alcohol content of 0.0, and tested negative for drugs.

Attorneys for the plaintiff, Joey Langston and Ronald Michael, of Booneville, praised the jury for having the courage to value life so highly.

The law firm of Langston, Langston, Michael and Bowen also represent the families of two prisoners who died in the City Corinth jails. Those cases are still pending, but should be in a "trial posture" within six months, said
