## Groundbreaking Held For Iuka Library Expansion

Groundbreaking for a 5,000-square-foot expansion to the Iuka Library took place Tuesday, Aug. 9 with state, regional and local officials participating.

The new addition, located on land donated by D.O. Jourdan, Jr., will cost approximately \$500,000 and will more than double the library's present size.

Funding for the project includes \$200,000 from both the City of Iuka and the Federal government, with the remaining \$150,000 being contributed by the state.

The extra space will be used for additional shelf space, a meeting room and kitchen facility, according to Iuka Librarian Fredda Sanderson.

Construction of the project will take approximately 10 months. Little Brothers Construction Company of Corinth was awarded the contract with a bid of \$499,150.

## Site Preparation Underway In Northeast Miss. Waterway Industrial Park

A site in the Northeast Mississippi Waterway Industrial Park, located in Burnsville, is now being prepared for the construction of an available building that will be used as a selling point to a prospective industry.

Second District Supervisor Ricky Cummings and Town of Burnsville's Mayor Bobby Johnson, are working together to complete this initial dirt work and general site preparation before the bid on the building's construction is let in September. An access road that will link the site of the building with U. S. Highway 72 and County Road 219 (Old Hwy. 365) is continuing as a part of the project.

This paved road, when completed, will open up 200 acres of the park's prime industrial lots, according to Cummings. Funding for this phase of the project came from an ARC Block grant and matching county funds, Cummings explained.

According to Eugene Bishop, Director of the Yellow Creek State Inland Port, this work being done in the park by Cummings and Johnson is in support of the development of the state owned industrial park, managed by the Yellow Creek State Inland Port Authority. Bishop explained that professional industrial developers have suggested that the construction of an available building [also known as a SPEC building] in an industrial park is an effective marketing tool to attract industrial prospects to locate there. "We hope that by having that building available, a potential industry will consider our site first," Bishop said.

The site of the building, which is inside the park rather than on the edge of an existing roadway, was the result of a lot of thought and planning, Bishop stated. "It was decided that by putting the building inside the park, prospects would be able to view some of the other prime property available on their way to the site. Also, by locating it at this area, it will not divide up the park's larger tracts of land," he explained.

"The Yellow Creek Port Authority Board appreciates the partnership of Supervisor Ricky Cummings and Mayor Bobby Johnson with these infrastructure improvements to the industrial park," Bishop said. The construction of the building depends on this beginning site preparation and road construction.

Bishop indicated that there are several industries considering location in the park at this time. These improvements should enhance the chances of the park's selection. Bishop also expressed appreciation to the Tishomingo County Development Foundation and its director, Mack L. Wadkins, for his help in promoting the park to prospective industry.

## Funeral Services For Mrs. Lela T. Clark

Burial will be in Tishomingo Cemetery beside her late husband, Julius E. Clark, who died in 1970. Cutshall Funeral Home is in charge.

Mrs. Clark was a descendant of pioneer families - Timbes, Owens, Nixon, and Barrett - who settled here in the 1830's.

Her parents were the late Columbus Allen Timbes and the late Lura Janetta Nixon Timbes of Paden.

Mrs. Clark had a long unique career as a teacher. It began when, at sixteen, she rode a horse to a one-teacher school called Burnt Mills, site of a Civil War battle, near Paden. After teaching at several other schools in the County, she spent the last 20 years as a first grade teacher in the Iuka Elementary School, retiring in 1969.

During the 1930's she took "time out" from teaching to work as County Supervisor in several New Deal projects. She returned to the classroom when the Depression was over.

Mrs. Clark's column "Something Old", containing

local history and folklore, appeared in the Tishomingo County News for many years. She was a graduate of Mississippi State University.

She was a Charter member of the Chief Tishomingo Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution organizing president of Kappa, Kappa Iota, a national teacher sorority; Worthy Matron of both Tishomingo and Iuka Chapters of the Order of Eastern Star; president of the American Legion Auxiliary; a charter member of the Friends of the Library and the Mississippi Folklore Society.

She worked in 4-H Clubs and Home Demonstration Clubs for over 25 years.

She taught piano, produced elementary school musicals, sold encyclopedias, and trained representatives for Girls' State.

She served as County chairman of the Republican party and has continued to be active in local, state, and national politics until her death.

She leaves two daughters, Mrs. Patsy Clark Pace, Aberdeen; Mrs. Janette Clark Pike, Plainboro, New Jersey, and one son-in-law, Dr. Isadore M. [Izzy] Pike. Her son-in-law William M. (Billy) Pace died in 1993.

She has one sister, Mrs. Corinne Timbes Witt of Memphis and four grandchildren, T.W. Pace of Amory, Julie Sarah Pike of Arlington, Virginia; Missy Pace Dowdy of Brandon; and Jill Janetta Pike of Plainboro, New Jersey. She has two great-grandsons Wilson and David Pace of Amory.

## Home Economics Tips

**FAT AND CHOLESTEROL  
MADE SIMPLE**

It's easy to lose track of some important nutrition fundamentals with so many reports in the media about the latest nutrition studies.

One of those fundamentals is the relationship between fat, cholesterol and heart disease. Here are a few basics worth remembering.

\*Studies indicate that a diet high in saturated fats may contribute to increased blood cholesterol levels.

\*Excess blood cholesterol accumulates on the inside of artery

walls and clogs them, which can lead to a stroke or heart attack.

\*Therefore, if you want to reduce your risk of coronary heart disease, begin by reducing your intake of saturated fats, say many health experts.

Foods from animal sources contain saturated fat. These include cheese, milk and ice cream, as well as the more obvious beef, chicken, pork and eggs. Exceptions are dairy products made from nonfat milk, which has little or no saturated fat.

Some vegetable sources also are highly saturated. Two examples are palm and coconut oil.

Reducing the amount of saturated fat in your diet can be done by making some simple substitutions. These examples are offered to help get your started:

\*Eat roast turkey or chicken

instead of beef. Remove the skin and you'll avoid even more fat.

\*Try cereal with skim milk for a lowfat snack instead of chips or sweets.

\*Top pastas with tomato-based sauces versus those made with cream, butter or cheese.

\*And, whenever possible, substitute lower fat alternatives for their full-fat equivalents, such as lowfat salad dressing instead of regular salad dressing.

## Slight Drop In Miss. Infant Mortality Rate

Mississippi's rate of infant deaths in 1993 tied the all-time low set two years earlier - a feat that means little in the overall fight to save babies' lives.

"Unfortunately, this slight drop in the infant mortality rate is not statistically significant," State Health Officer Ed Thompson, MD, MPH, told Mississippians gathered to develop community leadership skills to prevent teen pregnancy. The Mississippi State Department of Health and cosponsors the March of Dimes and the Infant Mortality Task Force staged the Take Care conference with funding from the Mississippi Humanities Council.

Babies in Tishomingo County have no better chance for survival than they did nine years ago. More babies in Tishomingo are likely to die in their first month of life than in the state as a whole, which has one of the worst infant death rates in the nation.

On the positive side, 84 percent of Tishomingo County mothers do begin maternity early in their pregnancy, within the first three months. This early care lowers the numbers of premature babies and the number of babies born at low birthweight, under five-and-a-half pounds.

Better health care for infants in the first year of life, when they are most susceptible to infections and environmental health problems, has the best chance of improving the infant death.

A HEALTHY MOUTH EQUALS A HEALTHY PET

The most significant advance in the last decade in veterinary care is improved dental techniques and the prevention and treatment of periodontal disease. Nothing will help keep a pet healthier and add years to a pet's life than keeping the mouth healthy.

Periodontal disease is disease of the supporting tissues of the teeth (gums and bone). 85% of dogs over 3 years of age are affected.

Just like people, plaque buildup is the main cause of gingivitis and periodontal disease. Periodontal disease begins as simple gingivitis (gum inflammation) and progresses to periodontal infection with bone loss and eventual loss of teeth.

Early signs of gingivitis are slightly swollen gums, increased redness at the edge of the gums, and bad breath. Pets with these symptoms should be scheduled for dental cleaning. When periodontal disease (which is irreversible, but controllable) has occurred, the pet will need more extensive cleaning, antibiotics and possibly extractions.

Untreated periodontal disease can lead not only to bad breath, mouth pain and loss of teeth, but it can also affect your pet's overall health. Periodontal infections can lead to heart, liver and kidney problems which can make your pet ill and shorten its life.

Paying attention to dental health pays dividends in the form of a healthier, happier pet and more years for you and your pet to spend together.

Teen pregnancy contributes to the state's too high infant mortality rate, the number of babies per 1,000 who die before one year of age. In 1993, the rate dropped slightly from 11.9 in 1992 to 11.4, MSDH statistics show.

The latest infant mortality figure includes a rate of 8.4 for white babies, up from 7.8 in 1992, and a 14.6 rate among non-white infants, down from 16.1 the previous year. Nationwide, non-white infant mortality rates generally rank twice as high as the rates among white infants.

Since the early 1970s, Mississippi's infant mortality rates have steadily decreased from more than 27 deaths per 1,000 infants to 1993's rate. But from 1988 forward, the state's infant mortality rates have leveled. They've fluctuated between 12.3 and 11.4, still among the highest in the nation.

DON'T OVERWEAR DISPOSABLES

Disposable contact lenses have not been on the market very long, yet eye specialists are already noticing a disturbing trend. More and more patients are risking the health of their eyes by trying to squeeze a few extra days - sometimes even weeks - out of the one week recommended usage of the lenses in order to save money.

Used by an estimated 10 percent of patients, disposable lenses are made to be worn for a week, then thrown away. What is happening instead is that some patients are bypassing their doctor's instructions about proper care and length of usage.

Disposable contact lenses, if used according to instruction, insure cleanliness and eliminate the task of solutions, cleaning and sterilizing. There is the secure feeling of having that extra sterile packed replacement handy when you need them. However, trying to stretch out extra days of wear in order to save a few dollars defeats the whole purpose. It's a surefire recipe for eye infection.

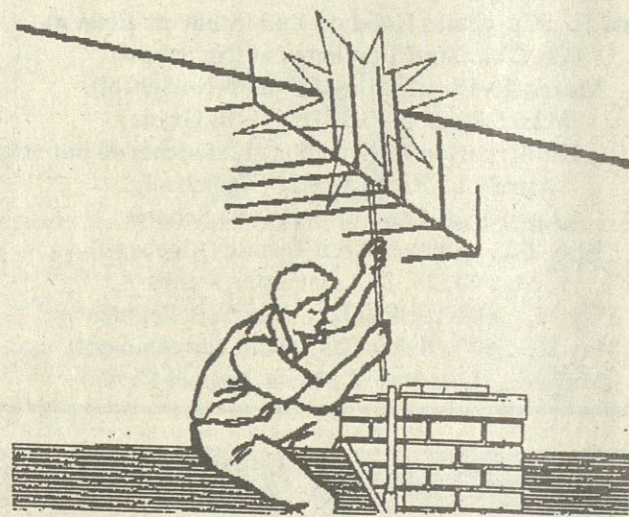
## SAFETY FIRST

### Dr. Phillip H. Gray Receives Award

## County's First Emergency Medical Responders Complete Training

The first class of Emergency Medical Responders finished their 40 hours required training on May 2, 1994.

Emergency Medical Responders, also known as a First Responders, were trained in the medical field to stabilize and care for persons until advanced emergency medical service arrives on the scene.

The Emergency Medical Responder Training consists of cardiopulmonary resuscitation: Air Way Care: Shock and Bleeding Control: Fractures and Dislocation: Injuries to the Skull, Spine, and Chest; Heart Attacks, Strokes, Diabetes and Epilepsy: Poisons and Drugs, Burns, Emergency Childbirth, and Patient Assessment.

The Emergency Medical Responders will be working under the authority of North Mississippi Emergency Medical Service, along with the Iuka Hospital Emergency Medical Service.

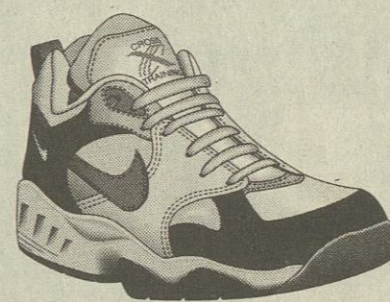

provisionally certified until a final WDCP is implemented nationwide.

The intent of the WDCP is to improve the quality and consistency of wetland delineations submitted to the Corps and to streamline the regulatory process by developing procedures for expediting review and consideration of delineations performed by certified delineators. The WDCP is consistent with the Clinton Administration's Wetland Protection Plan of August 24, 1993.

The Corps anticipates implementing the WDCP nationwide upon completion of the rulemaking process which should occur later this year. Prerequisites for those interested in becoming certified wetland delineators include training in the Corps 1987 Wetland Delineation Manual (1987 Manual) and a minimum of two years experience delineating wetlands.

## Welty Photograph Exhibit Opens

"Photographs by Eudora Welty," an exhibit of nineteen photographs taken by writer Eudora Welty in the twenties and thirties opens August 1, 1994 at the Bay Springs Resource Office and will hang through September 21, 1994. Between 1929 and 1936, Eudora Welty traveled her native state of Mississippi as part of the Works Progress Administration, turning a sensitive, empathetic eye to her surroundings and taking hundreds of what she called snapshots, because, in her words, "They were taken spontaneously-to catch something of the life going on around me."

The photographs, which depict common southern scenes such as men sitting on the courthouse steps, school children, church

scenes, and the state fair, were taken predominantly in Mississippi. The Photographs in this exhibit were selected by French photographer Gills Mora for "The Festival of Arles" in France in the summer of 1989. The photographs have gained increasing attention in recent years in exhibits, book, and journals. The Mississippi Department of Archives and History is the repository for Welty's negatives, which number over 1,000.

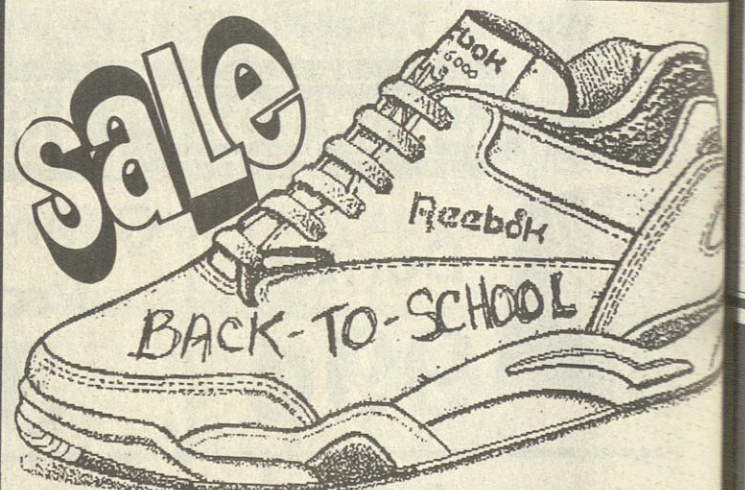

### Absentee Voting Begins September 26

Friday, September 9 is the deadline to register by mail if you want to vote in Mississippi's November 8 general election.

Secretary of State Dick Molpus said mail-in registration applications can be obtained from circuit clerks, municipal clerks, and in many public facilities, such as libraries.

"Mail-in registration is a convenient way to register for the first time or to let elections administrators know you have changed your residence," said Molpus, the state's chief elections officer.

Mail-in registration has been in effect since July 1992, and nearly 30,000 persons have used the method.

Other election deadlines include:

-September 9, the qualifying deadline for local special election candidates and those running for county school boards. Questions about those races should be directed to the county circuit clerk's office.

-Sept. 26, absentee voting for the general election can begin to occur in the circuit clerk's office. Persons may also make application to vote absentee by mail.

-Oct. 8 by noon, to register in the circuit clerk's office if you want to vote in the Nov. 8 general election. During the week of Oct. 3-7, the office will be open from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. for voter registration.

### Senate Committee Approves Funding For Camp Shelby

The Senate Appropriations Committee has approved funding for a number of improvements at Camp Shelby, Senator Thad Cochran (R-Miss.) announced today.

The Defense Appropriations bill included \$900,000 for armor targetry upgrades and \$200,000 for a new security system.

"The committee also approved language urging the expansion of Camp Shelby as a matter of national security importance," Cochran said.

The bill's provisions include \$2.66 billion for three new Aegis DDG 51 Aegis destroyers, two of which will be built at Ingalls Shipyard in Pascagoula, Mississippi.

Other programs receiving approval include \$13.7 million for the Mississippi Army National Guard's Avenger Missile System; more than \$154 million for two Hughes defense programs at Forest, Mississippi; and \$6.8 million for the Gulf States Counter-Drug Initiative, which includes funding for the Regional Counterdrug Academy in Meridian, Mississippi.

"The battle against drug smuggling has to involve our military resources if we are to win," Cochran added.

The bill now goes to the Senate floor for consideration.

Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement.

In planning and performing our audit for the year ended September 30, 1992, we considered the county's internal control structure in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the county's general purpose financial statements and not to provide assurance on the internal control structure.

The management of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of internal control structure policies and procedures. The objectives of an internal control structure are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of general purpose financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Because of inherent limitations in any internal control structure, errors or irregularities may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of the structure to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the effectiveness of the design and operation of policies and procedures may deteriorate.

Reportable conditions involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of the internal control structure that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the county's ability to report process, summarize, and report financial data consistent with the assertions of management in the general purpose financial statements.

## Board of Supervisors.

## 1. Finding

Inadequate internal controls exist in the financial recording function. We noted the following inadequacies:

- Legal documents did not exist for the industrial lease with the Corder Drum Company in amount of \$187,200.
- Kaydee Metal Products Corporation did not pay their industrial lease in the amount of \$61,268. The Board of Supervisors did not monitor the account to ensure payment from industry.

## Recommendation

The Board of Supervisors should install an adequate system of internal control over the financial affairs of the county. The board should monitor more closely to insure that all proceedings are recorded, approved and filed in a timely manner.

## Board of Supervisors' Response

- All documents are in order and filed at the present time. This was an oversight and has been taken to prevent this from happening again.
- This has been paid. Accounts will be monitored in the future.

## 2. Finding

Budgetary control procedures were not maintained adequately to insure that the budget was properly, which is necessary for reconciling the budgetary (cash) basis to the accounting basis for reporting revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances. Therefore, the auditor's independent report is qualified for omission of the budget financial statement, which is a departure from generally accepted accounting principles.

## Recommendation

The Board of Supervisors should establish adequate control procedures to insure that the budget properly amended on the board minutes.

## Board of Supervisors' Response

The board will, in the future, take measures to insure the budget is properly amended on the board minutes.

A material weakness is a reportable condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities in amounts that would be material in relation to the general purpose financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions.

Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might be reportable conditions and, accordingly, would not necessarily disclose all reportable conditions that are also considered to be material weaknesses as defined above. However, we consider the reportable conditions described above involving the internal control structure and its operation to be material weaknesses. These conditions were considered in determining the nature, timing and extent of the procedures to be performed in our audit of the general purpose financial statements of Tishomingo County, Mississippi for the year ended September 30, 1992, and this report does not affect our report thereon dated July 30, 1993.

We also noted a certain matter involving the internal control structure and its operation that we have reported to the management of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, in our Management Report dated July 30, 1993.

This report is intended for the use of the management. This is not intended to limit the distribution of this report, which is a matter of public record.

The Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, is responsible for establishing and maintaining a central purchasing system in accordance with Sections 31-7-101 through 31-7-127, Miss. Code Ann. (1972). In addition, the Board of Supervisors is responsible for purchasing in accordance with the bid requirements of Section 31-7-13, Miss. Code Ann. (1972). The Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, has established centralized purchasing for all funds of the county and has established an inventory control system. The objective of the central purchasing system is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that purchases are executed in accordance with applicable state law.

Because of inherent limitations in any central purchasing system, errors or irregularities may occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of the system to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions, or that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

In our opinion, except for the condition described below, the central purchasing system of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, taken as a whole, provides reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that purchases are executed in compliance with the aforementioned sections.

Recommendation

MANAGEMENT REPORT

We have audited the general purpose financial statements of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, as of and for the year ended September 30, 1992, and have issued our report thereon dated July 30, 1993. We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and the procedures prescribed by the State Auditor, and accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

During the course of our audit, certain matters were detected which require the attention of management. These matters, which do not have a material effect on the general purpose financial statements, involve weaknesses in the county's internal control structure policies and procedures and instances of noncompliance with applicable state laws and regulations. The findings of the prior year in this and other reports have been corrected by management unless specifically stated otherwise. Our findings and recommendations and your responses are as follows:

Board of Supervisors

1. Finding

On April 28, 1992, the Board of Supervisors loaned \$200,000 to the City of Iuka for a proposed period of five days for matching funds for a federal grant. The board made no attempt to collect the money for the county until the auditor notified the board of the problem. The board did not monitor this matter to ensure compliance with the recorded board order.

Recommendation

The Board of Supervisors should monitor the financial matters more closely to ensure compliance with recorded board orders.

Board of Supervisors' Response

The money plus interest has been returned to the county.

2. Finding

Section 7-7-211, Miss. Code Ann. (1972), gives the Office of the State Auditor the authority to prescribe accounting systems. We noted the following deviations from the prescribed accounting system contained in the County Financial Accounting Manual:

- The received warrants were not filled out properly.
- Some debt obligations were not included in the long-term debt ledger.
- Some lease receivable receipts were not separated as to principal and interest.

Recommendation

The Board of Supervisors should comply with the accounting system prescribed in the manual.

Board of Supervisors' Response

- We will comply with the accounting system in the future.
- Debt obligation documents will be recorded in the debt ledger.
- Books will be set up to separate the principal and interest.

3. Finding

The county has a fiduciary responsibility to collect rental payments from private industry to retire industrial bonds. These bonds have been retired and the county has a deficit balance in the Winfield Manufacturing fund.

Recommendation

The county should collect the money due from the industry to erase the deficit balance.

Board of Supervisors' Response

The Board of Supervisors has been made aware of this problem.

Chancery Clerk

Finding

Section 27-105-315, Miss. Code Ann. (1972), requires the county to have its uninsured deposits fully collateralized (105%) by securities based upon market value and the securities are to be held in the name of the county. A significant amount of the county's uninsured deposits were uncollateralized.

Recommendation

The Chancery Clerk should monitor more closely to insure that all county uninsured deposits are fully collateralized.

Chancery Clerk's Response

This was an oversight. I was not aware of this problem.

Sheriff

1. Finding

Section 19-25-13, Miss. Code Ann. (1972), requires the Sheriff to settle all collections of fees and charges to the county on a monthly basis. Settlements of some collections were not made and the Sheriff withheld the money to use for the operations of his office. There is no authority for the Sheriff to keep funds due to the county for use by his office.

Recommendation

The Sheriff should settle all collections monthly.

Sheriff's Response

I will make every effort to settle all collections on a monthly basis and insure that those collections are handled in accordance with state law.

2. Finding

Section 7-7-211, Miss. Code Ann. (1972), gives the Office of the State Auditor the authority to prescribe accounting systems. The prescribed voucher for purchase of information and purchase of evidence form was not properly filled out for reimbursement from the Board of Supervisors for expenses incurred in the procurement of evidence of liquor and narcotics violations.

Recommendation

The Sheriff should properly fill out the reimbursement form for expenses incurred in the procurement of evidence of liquor and narcotics violations as prescribed in the County Financial Accounting Manual.

Sheriff's Response

I will fill out all reimbursement forms for expenses incurred in the procurement of liquor and narcotics violations. In order to protect the confidentiality of sources supplying this information, the Sheriff reserves the right to handle informants' names through whatever process the auditors can suggest that will insure this necessary confidentiality.

3. Finding

Section 7-7-211, Miss. Code Ann. (1972), gives the Office of the State Auditor the authority to prescribe accounting systems for the various offices of the county. A supplemental budget was not prepared to account for forfeited funds that are to be used for the benefit of the Sheriff's office.

Recommendation

The Sheriff should submit a supplemental budget to the Board of Supervisors to account for the funds forfeited.

Sheriff's Response

I will submit a supplemental budget to the Board of Supervisors which will account for the use by this department of forfeited funds.

The findings in this report came to our attention as a result of the audit procedures and tests that we applied. For those items not tested, nothing came to our attention that would lead us to believe that Tishomingo County, Mississippi, had not complied with applicable state laws and regulations, other than the laws for which we noted violations in our testing referred to above.

The Office of the State Auditor will review the findings in this and other reports on future audit engagements to insure that action has been taken to correct all findings.

## Unemployment Stands At 9.2 Percent

According to Charles Smith, Manager of the Mississippi State Employment Service, unemployment in Tishomingo County stood at 9.2 percent in mid-June. This is the same as May, but 3.2 percent higher than June, 1993, when the rate was 6.0 percent.

The civilian labor force for the county numbered 11,480, 270 more than May and 470 more than June, 1993. Approximately 10,420 Tishomingo County residents held jobs in mid-June while 1,060 were unemployed.

Manufacturing jobs in the county numbered 3,750, 30 more than May and 220 more than June, 1993. Nonmanufacturing jobs numbered 3,770, 40 more than May and 160 more than June one year ago.

## Safeguard Pets From Heatstroke

"A few days ago I went to the supermarket to do my weekly shopping. It was mid-afternoon, the hottest part of the day. As I walked through the parking lot, I heard a dog whimpering and saw the poor animal locked in a car. One window was partially open, but it was 96 degrees outside and even hotter in the car."

Having two dogs myself, I knew the severity of this situation. I tried to locate the owners in the supermarket and had no luck. I purchased a bottle of water and helped the dog to drink it. Finally, the owner emerged from a nearby store. I explained to the owner how a dog can suffer heatstroke and even die in such situations. What are the signs of heatstroke and how can people protect their pets during the hot days of summer?"

A dog never should be kept inside a car during such extreme temperatures as we have experienced lately. Even leaving the window partially open cannot

compensate for the amount of heat generated inside a car.

Pet owners who leave their dog outdoors also need to safeguard their pets against heatstroke.

Unlike people, dogs do not perspire. Their body temperature is regulated through panting. But if left in an unshaded yard for very long, a dog's body temperature can rise very rapidly, causing heatstroke.

Symptoms of heatstroke include panting profusely, severe distress and an elevated body temperature. The dog even may collapse.

An animal found in this state should be brought into a cool place immediately and given water to combat dehydration. A cold bath or a gentle spray from the garden hose also will help to bring its temperature within a normal range. More serious cases require veterinary attention.

If you must leave your pet outside during the hot summer months, supply plenty of shade and fresh water. Some dogs even may enjoy a dip in a wading pool.

Not only do dogs need shade to keep cool, but overexposure to the sun can cause sunburn, especially in short-haired dogs or dogs with white or light coats. Ears and noses also can be sensitive. Severe sunburn can lead to solar dermatitis and even cancer, so be sure to protect your pet.



A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR SUPERVISOR DISTRICTS ONE, TWO AND THREE OF SAID COUNTY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$250,000.00 TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PLANNING, DEVELOPING, CONSTRUCTING, ENLARGING, IMPROVING AND EQUIPPING THE TISHOMINGO COUNTY AIRPORT FOR SUCH DISTRICTS, INCLUDING BUILDINGS AND OTHER FACILITIES INCIDENTAL TO THE OPERATION THEREOF; AND ACQUIRING REAL PROPERTY THEREFOR; AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. The County is authorized by Section 61-3-1 through 61-3-83, the Airport Authorities Law, of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, (the "Act") to issue Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purposes and amounts set forth in Paragraph 2 of the preamble.

2. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue General Obligation Bonds for Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County in the principal amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) to raise money for the purpose of planning, developing, constructing, enlarging, improving and equipping the Tishomingo County Airport (the "Airport") in and for such Districts, including buildings

and other facilities incidental to the operation thereof; and acquiring real property therefor.

3. Assessed value of all taxable property within Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is \$43,829,197.00; Supervisor Districts Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County have no outstanding bonded indebtedness which is subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit as prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and no outstanding bonded and floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The issuance of the Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued pursuant to the Act, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of such Districts of the County, will not result in a bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within such Districts of the County, and will not result in indebtedness, both bonding and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within such Districts of the County, and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by such Districts of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors for Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body") as follows:

Section 1. The Governing Body hereby declares its intention to issue General Obligation Bonds for Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of Tishomingo County in the principal amount not to exceed \$250,000.00 (the "Bonds"), pursuant to the purpose of planning, developing, constructing, enlarging, improving and equipping the Airport in and for such Districts, including buildings and other facilities incidental to the operation thereof; and acquiring real property therefor. The Bonds may be issued in one or more series and will be general obligations of the Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a direct continuing tax to be levied annually without limitation as to time, rate or amount upon all of the taxable property within the geographical limits of Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County.

Section 2. The Governing Body proposes to direct this issuance of the Bonds in the amounts, for the purposes and securities aforesaid at a meeting of the Governing Body at its regular place in the Tishomingo County Courthouse in Iuka, Mississippi, at the hour of 10:00 A.M., on August 25, 1994.

Section 3. If on or before 10:00 A.M. on August 25, 1994, twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of Supervisor Districts Numbers 1, 2 and 3 of the County, or fifteen hundred (1500), whichever is less, shall file a written protest against the issuance of the Bonds pursuant to law, then Bonds for such purpose or purposes shall not be issued unless authorized in an election on the question of the issuance of the Bonds to be called or held as provided by law. If no protest is filed on or before 10:00 A.M. on August 25, 1994, against the issuance of the Bonds, then the Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date specified in Section 2 hereof.

Section 4. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper published and having general circulation in Supervisor District Numbers 1, 2 and 3 in the County, qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this resolution shall be made no less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the bonds and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date.

Section 5. The Clerk of the Board

shall be and hereby is directed to procure from the publisher of such newspaper the customary proof of publication of this resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

Section 6. If any one or more of the provisions of this resolution shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any of the other provisions of this resolution, but this resolution shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provision or provisions had not been contained herein.

Supervisor Price seconded the motion to adopt the foregoing resolution, and the question being put to a roll call vote, the result was as follows:

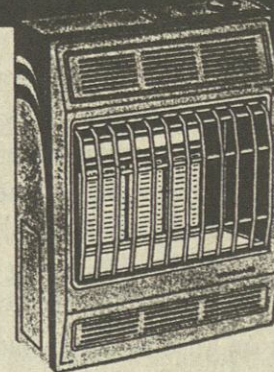
