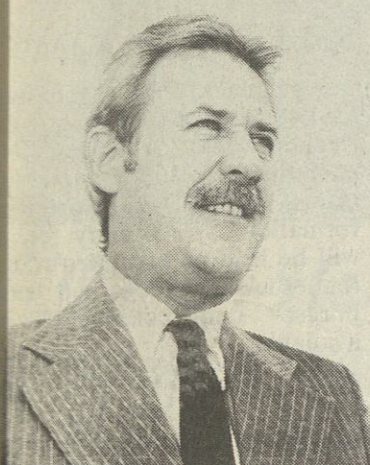

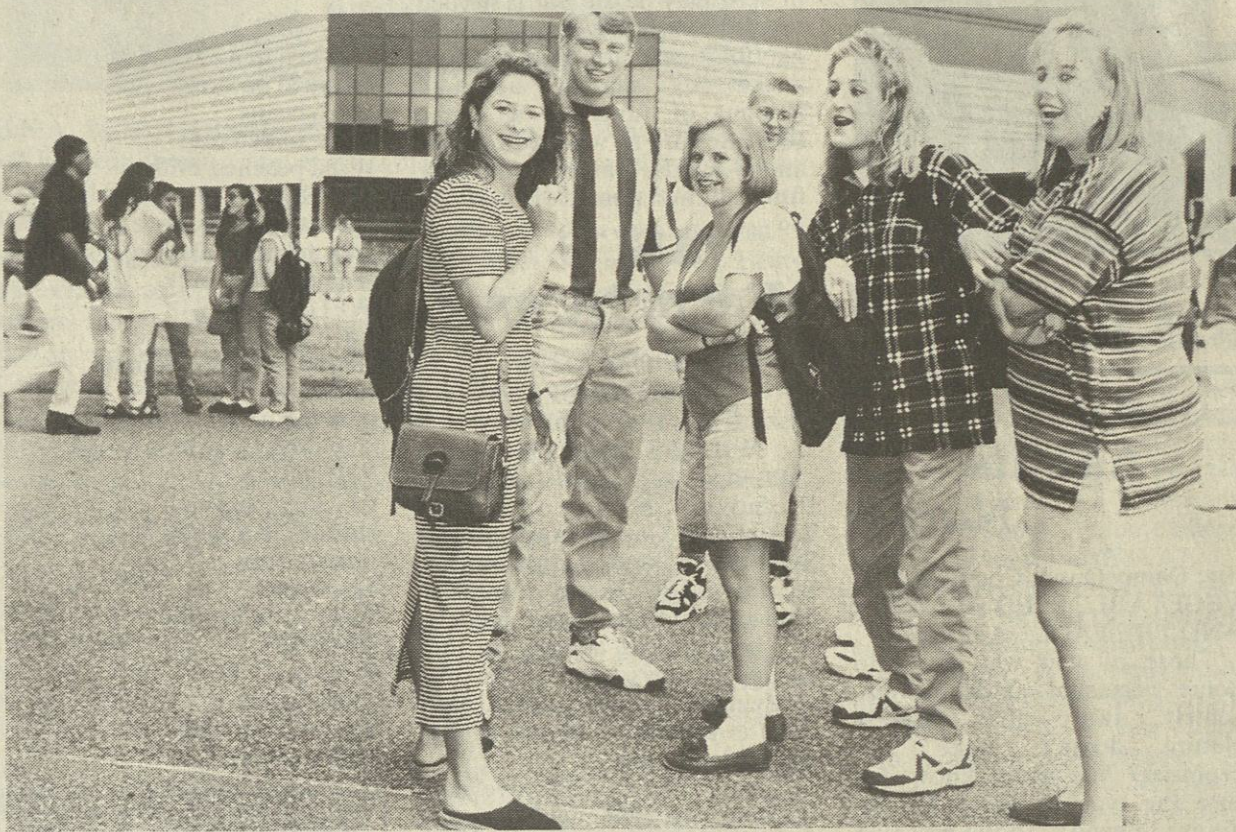

NASA's ASRM Project Assets To Be Liquidated

National Industrial Services Incorporated (NISI) of St. Louis, MO, in conjunction with Henry Butcher & Company of London, England, announced today that they have been awarded the contract to conduct the orderly liquidation of assets formerly used to produce the NASA Advanced Solid Rocket Motor (ASRM) project in Iuka, Mississippi; Mount Vernon, Indiana; Torrance, California; Lowell, Massachusetts; Orono, Ontario, Canada, and other sites.

The assets being liquidated represent a recovery in value in excess of \$25 million. NISI will utilize a worldwide marketing effort and anticipates the program to effectively recover the maximum value from these assets will cover an 8-month time frame.

Iuka Public Library Expansion Gets Underway—Thursday, August 9, 1994 was a red-letter-day in Iuka. A good crowd gathered to watch as ground was broken to mark the official start of construction of the library expansion.

Mrs. Bette Nelson, Chairperson of the Building Committee, introduced Mayor David Nichols and Representative Harvey Benderman who served as honored speakers and official shovel wielders for the event.

Besides the above mentioned, present were Iuka City Aldermen, Tom Redard of the Mississippi Library Commission, Northeast Regional Library staff, Iuka Library staff, Library Trustees, Friends of the Library Board members and members at large, Architect of the project—Mr. George Thomason, the building contractor—Little Brothers Construction.

The present library contains 4,125 square feet—a small building to produce such large circulation. Latest figures indicate 50,733 books circulated, compared to the much larger Corinth facility's 57,370. The additional 5,300 square feet will give more space for books, equipment, meeting room, working area and kitchen.

All who have been involved in this project are extremely grateful for the community support, the Aldermen who voted to match the grant monies, and especially Mr. D.O. Jourdan for the generous donation of land to make it all possible. Watch our progress now, and wait for a very special ribbon cutting ceremony in 1995!

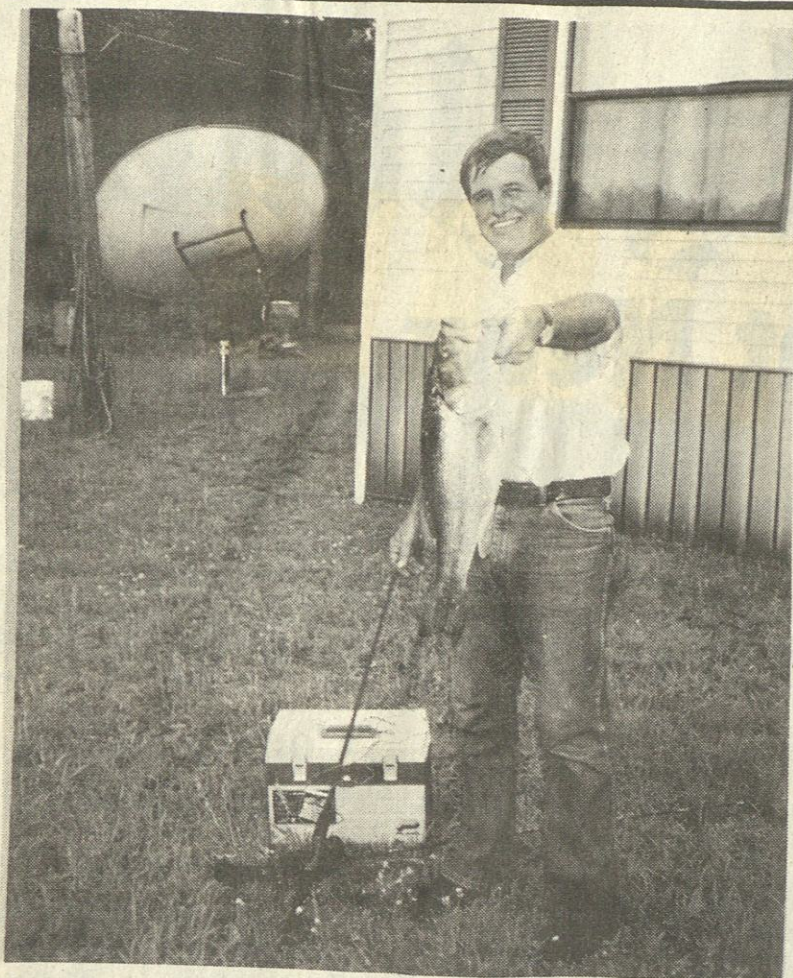

County Agents Notes

VEGETABLE SEED HEALTH AND THE FALL GARDEN

Those of you who are into home vegetable gardening are acutely aware that Mother Nature doesn't make any promises! We never know for sure the type of growing conditions to expect, so the best rule of thumb is to try and get started right in the hope that the weather will cooperate. Since many gardeners are preparing for a fall garden, one of the most important ways of starting right is to use healthy vegetable seeds.

Seed selection is an important consideration for gardeners in the mid-South for several reasons. One of the most important has to do with plant diseases since our climate favors the development of many fungal, bacterial, and viral problems that may be carried over through infected seeds. Thus, it is generally unwise for the vegetable gardener to save seeds from season to season. Home gardeners should purchase seed each year from dealers who have a reputation for selling high-quality, disease-free seed. Certified seed should be used whenever available. Examples of seed-borne diseases that can cause severe damage when conditions are favorable are anthracnose of lima beans, early blight of tomatoes, mosaic virus of Southern peas, bacterial blights of beans, black rot of cabbage, and leaf spots of turnip and mustard greens. To help prevent diseases of this type, your seedsman will have seeds available that have been produced under stringent guidelines to insure that seeds are free from diseases. Often seeds originate from dry regions, such as the Western United States, where diseases are less common. After good seed have been selected, the next step is to make sure the seeds are properly treated with fungicides. Seeds are coated with fungicides to control seed decay and damping-off diseases. The use of treated seeds is especially worthwhile in circumstances where vegetables are to be planted in cool or wet soils. Often seeds bought from dealers are already treated and may have a reddish or green color. The most commonly used materials are products containing captan or thiram fungicides. Seeds not already treated commercially can be coated with fungicide by the gardener. Large seeded crops such as corn or beans can be treated by placing seed and fungicide in a jar and gently shaking or rotating the container until all seeds are evenly coated. As little as 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon of captan or thiram per pound of seed may be all that is needed to accomplish this. LATE CROP CERTIFICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED

Phillip A. Horn, County Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, (ASCS) said late-filed crop and land use acreage reports will be accepted as long as the producer pays the cost of verifying the acreage report, and there is physical evidence of the crop or land's use.

"Some farmers still have not certified their 1994 planted acres, and the crop reporting deadline was, "August 1, 1994."

For farm program participants, crop certification is mandatory. The report governs the level at which farmers are eligible for program payments and other benefits. "Without it, farmers are not eligible for these benefits," Horn said.

GOOD DENTAL HEALTH BEGINS AT HOME

Last week, we saw how important a healthy mouth is to a pet's overall health. What can you as your pet's caretaker do at home to promote a healthy mouth?

The first area that affects oral health is diet. Dry foods are best—the abrasive action of chewing dry foods and biscuits help keep teeth clean. Canned foods, semi-moist foods and table scraps can stick to teeth and cause plaque formation (which is the main cause of dental disease).

Now hear me out before you scoff at the next suggestions: The single most important thing you can do to keep your pet's mouth healthy is to brush his teeth.

Most animals can be trained to have their teeth brushed. Step-by-step instructions on how to train your pet are available. Special pet toothbrushes are best, but an old washcloth, q-tips (good for cats) and a strip of gauze around the index finger also work well. Use pet toothpaste which is enzymatic, not detergent. Do not use baking soda or salt-too much sodium for most pets.

If your pet absolutely refuses to let you brush his teeth, gel preparations and mouth rinses are available to fight plaque. These products are not as good as brushing, but their use is better than nothing at all.

Good dental care at home does not mean that your pet will never have to have its teeth cleaned, but it will definitely delay the time at which dental cleaning will become necessary.

The rewards of good dental care at home and dental cleaning as needed are fresh breath, an animal that will not lose teeth to periodontal disease, lack of chronic infection due to periodontitis and a stronger bond between you and your pet.

results indicate that 570 farm operators in Tishomingo County have certified their acreage and are eligible for 1994 farm program benefits.

ASCS uses crop reports to determine program compliance and to document crop acreage bases. Before receiving price support loans, deficiency payments and other farm program benefits, producers are required to report crops and acreage planted, the uses to be made of these crops, and the number of cropland acres devoted to conservation uses.

"Producers who fail to certify will be credited with zero plantings for their future crop acreage base," ASCS official Horn said.

CHECK-UPS: HOW OFTEN?

How often should you have your eyes examined? That depends on a number of factors. People who know they have vision problems probably should see their eye doctor at least once a year. This is especially true for children and young people whose bodies are still growing and changing. Once they reach adulthood and their eye problems seem under control, some people are content to stretch this time out a little longer. However, it would be wise to remain on the annual schedule. There are good reasons for this.

Most people are aware of major changes in their vision. They know when seeing objects is more of a problem, when words in a book are becoming more blurred at normal reading distance, or when they are experiencing headache or eyestrain. What they NOT aware of are the subtle changes that come on slowly, such as early, unrecognizable symptoms of critical diseases as glaucoma and retinal problems. These can be treated successfully if caught early and the only way to do that is by a professional examination.

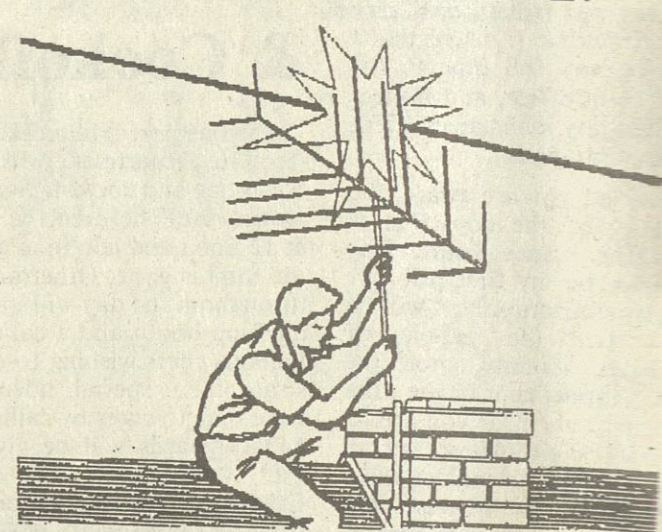
SAFETY FIRST

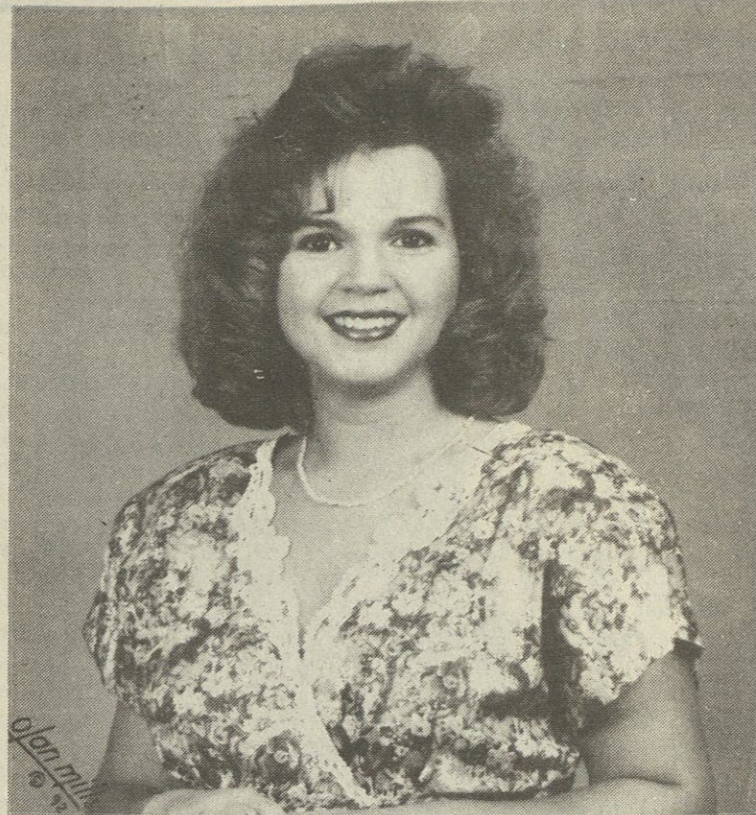
The wedding ceremony will take place at 6 p.m. on August 27, 1994 at the First Baptist Church in Corinth, followed by a reception at the Rubel House.

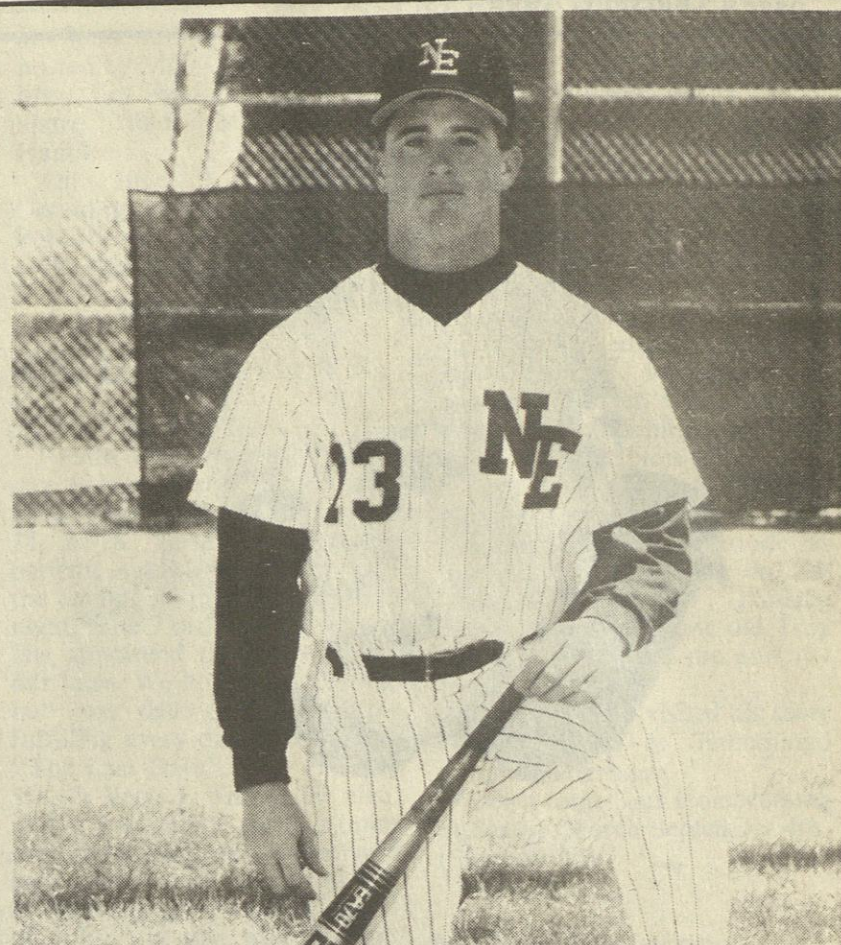

In order to make the NJCAA's scholar athlete list, a nominee must have completed three semesters or four quarters of

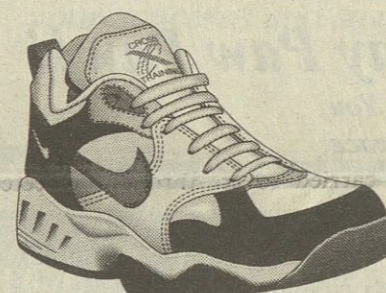

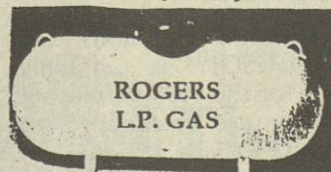

Home Movies Shed Light On Mississippi's History

Remember those old home movies you hated so much -- the ones of Sissy face down in a chocolate cake at her first birthday party and Bubba after his first honest-to-goodness Little League homer.

You may have thought those

antiquated reel-to-reel movies had been banned to dusty boxes in the attic, but that was just a forlorn hope. The University of Mississippi's Center for the Study of Southern Culture is ferreting out home movies from throughout the state for the very reason you may have hated your own family's movies -- they show the best and worst of Southern

life.

With assistance from the Mississippi Humanities Council and the National Endowment for the Humanities, which awarded a grant to the project, the center is beginning a series of community programs to help people understand the importance of preserving home movies.

"Picturing Home: Family Movies as Local History" will be presented in public libraries in Yazoo City, Indianola and Clarksdale to discuss the historical value of home movies as reflections of everyday life. While the three formal programs will be in the Delta, the Center is interested in home movies from all regions of the state.

"This is an effort to see ordinary life through the eyes of Mississippians," said Tom Rankin, associate professor of art and Southern studies. "So often our state is depicted through images made by outsiders of photojournalists. This is an attempt to discuss the historical relevance of films made by local families."

Amateur photographers captured local history of the 20th-century South on home movies, Rankin said. By the late 1930s, every town and many rural communities in Mississippi boasted camera buffs. Men and women filmed family celebrations, churches, schools, businesses, festivals, fires and floods in their homes and towns.

These visual records fit together like a patchwork quilt, forming an autobiography of the state and region. They are a treasure of information for community members, genealogists and historians. "Picturing Home" is an educational effort designed to alert Mississippians to the historical value of these films and their preservation needs, Rankin said.

"After the sentimental value is lost or forgotten, families often discard the old footage or simply neglect it," said Karen Glynn, project researcher. "This amounts to the same thing -- the loss of the visual history of Mississippi."

At this moment, reels of film are deteriorating in closets, barns, attics and cupboards throughout the region, Glynn said. The footage is threatened by the hot, humid climate and by advances in inexpensive film-to-videotape technology that en-

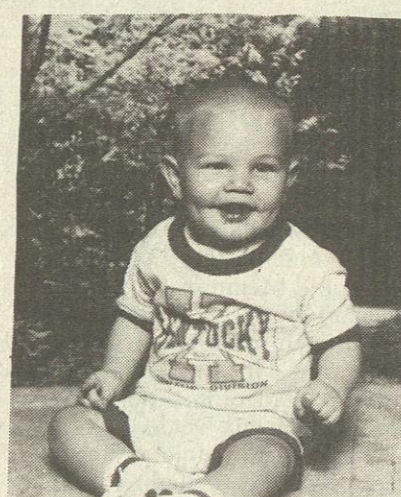

courages customers to discard film for videotapes.

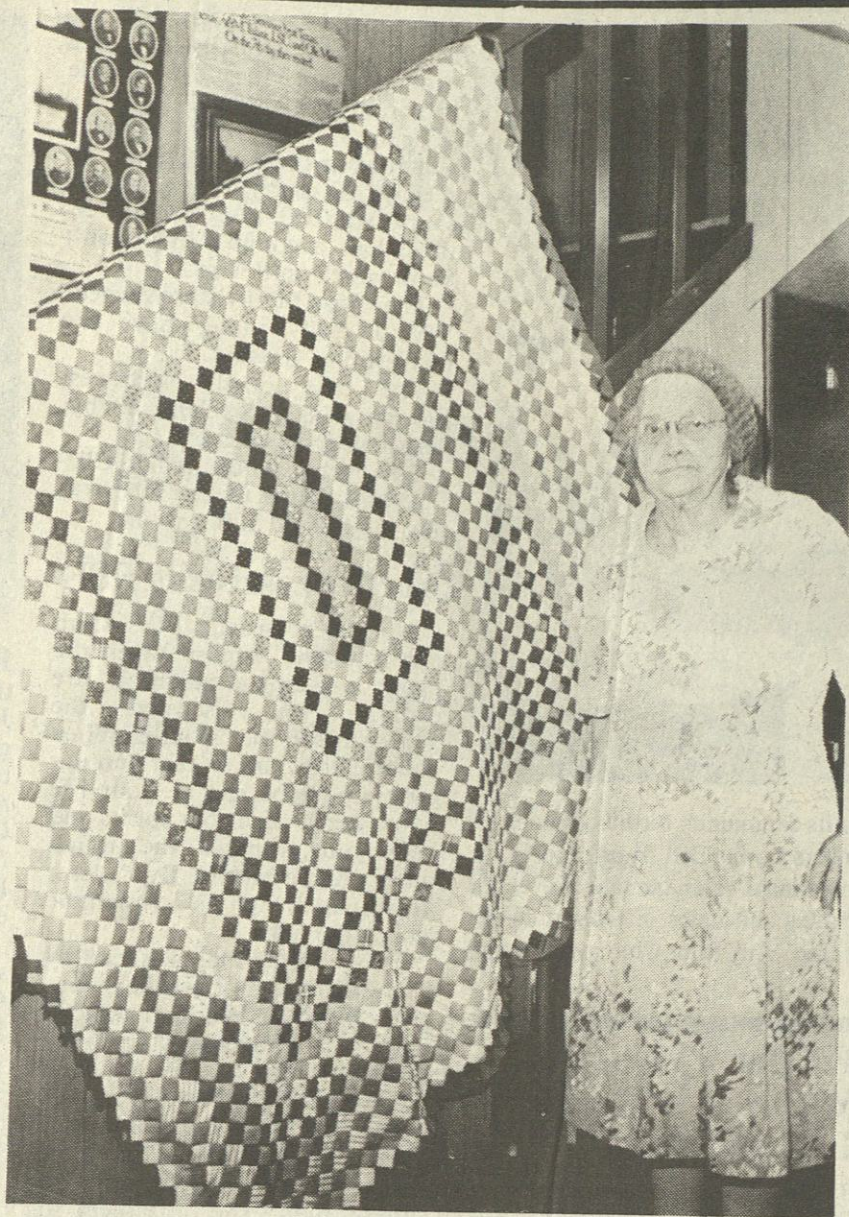

Home Economics Tips

MAKING SENSE OF LABELS
Food packages tell you more than ever before about the fat in your food.

As a result of the new labeling regulations, we're now seeing the "Nutrition Facts" label on food products throughout the supermarket. It provides valuable information about fat and other nutrients. You can use the information every day in planning your meals and snacks. On the new label, you'll find the following fat information:

*Number of calories that come from fat in one serving of the food.

*Amount of total fat and amount of saturated fat in a serving, both listed in grams. Other types of fat, such as polyunsaturated, may be listed, if desired, by the manufacturer.

*Daily values for total fat and saturated fat. A daily value for fat might be described as "the amount of fat that's right for your calorie level." On the label, daily values are listed for a daily diet of 2,000 and 2,500 calories. The 2,000-calorie diet is what the Food and Drug Administration says is about average for adult Americans. Your daily values may be different depending on your calorie needs. If you want to

determine your actual calorie requirements, we suggest contacting a dietitian.

*Calories per gram for fat, as well as for carbohydrates and protein, will be found on some labels. Fat has 9 calories per gram.

Use these facts from food packages to help your moderate the amount of fat in your diet.

NUTRITION CLAIMS

Some food packages may make claims about fat. These claims, which must meet stringent government regulations, include the following:

Label Claim	Definition*
Fat Free - Less than 0.5 gram (g) fat***	
Low Fat - 3g or less fat**	
Reduced Fat or Less Fat - At least 25 percent less fat. Example: "Reduced fat brownies - 25 percent less fat than our regular brownies. Fat content has been reduced from 8 to 6 grams per serving."	

Lean - Meat, poultry, seafood and game meat with less than 10g total fat, less than 4g saturated fat and less than 95 milligrams (mg) cholesterol per Reference Amount and 100g. Main dish, meal and meal-type products with less than 10g total fat, less than 4g saturated fat and less than 95mg cholesterol per 100g and per labeled serving.

Extra Lean - Meat, poultry, seafood and game meat with less than 5g total fat, less than 2g saturated fat and less than 95mg cholesterol per Reference Amount and 100g. Main dish, meal and meal-type products with less than 5g total fat, less than 2g saturated fat and less than 95mg cholesterol per 100g and per labeled serving.

*Per Reference Amount (standard serving size). Some claims have higher nutrient levels for main dish products and meal products, such as frozen entrees and dinners.

**Also per 50g for products with small serving sizes (where Reference Amount is 30g or less or 2 tablespoons or less).
