Deadlines Near For Voter Registration, Local Candidates in Nov. 8 Races

Friday, Sept. 9 is the deadline to register by mail if you want to vote in Mississippi's Nov. 8 general election. In-person registration extends until noon Oct. 8.

Secretary of State Dick Molpus said mail-in registration applications can be obtained from circuit clerks, municipal clerks and in many public facilities such as libraries.

"Mail-in registration is a convenient way to register or to let elections administrators know you have changed your residence," Molpus, the state's chief elections officer said.

Mail in registration has been in effect since July 1992, and nearly 30,000 persons have used the method.

Other election deadlines to remember:

—Sept. 9, the qualifying deadline for local special election candidates and those running for county school boards. Questions about those races should be directed to the county circuit clerk's office.

—Sept. 26, absentee voting for the general election can begin in the circuit clerk's office. Also, persons may make application to vote absentee by mail.

—Oct. 8 by noon, to register in the circuit clerk's office if you want to vote in the Nov. 8 general election. During the week of Oct. 3-7, the office will be open from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. for voter registration.

TVA Chairman Announces Stable Rates In The Valley

TVA will again hold its electric rates steady in the Tennessee Valley for fiscal year 1995, TVA Chairman Craven Crowell announced today.

"I want to congratulate our employees on achieving this goal and at the same time challenge them to find new tools to help us maintain this trend of stable rates into 1997," said Crowell.

Crowell made the announcement at today's regularly scheduled TVA Board meeting.

If TVA can achieve its rate goal into 1997, it would mark a decade of stable electric rates in the Tennessee Valley, Crowell said.

"To be able to achieve that goal, we must continue to exert tight controls on spending, increase productivity, raise revenues through growth in power sales and continue to manage interest costs," he said.

At today's meeting, TVA Chief Financial Officer William F. Malec told the Board that while TVA's power rates have been steady since October 1987, the Consumer Price Index has increased 27 percent.

Board member Harold Sparks said that the board feels that the administration is in very capable hands with Mr. Magill. "We will act as quickly as is practical" Sparks stated.

Ferguson, who will end his employment in Tishomingo County, August 31, has accepted a position in Picayune, Miss., according to board member Larry Bonds. In addition to this vacancy, an opening will be created at the Child Development Center where Dr. Ferguson's wife, Sylvia, was director.

The board assured that the change in administration will not interfere with the operation of the Tishomingo County School District in any way and that the school system is in sound shape.

Band Boosters

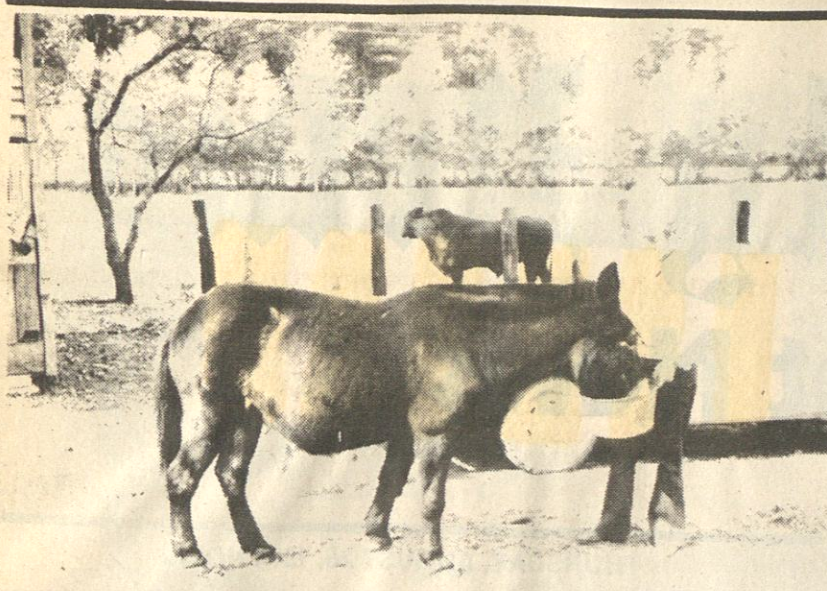
Tishomingo County High School Band Boosters will have their meeting Monday, August 29, 1994 beginning at 7 p.m. at the school band hall.

Soil Conservation Service

Winter forage is important to many cattlemen in North Mississippi. Cattlemen depend on winter annual forages, particularly in stocker grazing or where fall and winter calving is practiced.

There are two basic types of winter forages. The first type is small grain, such as wheat, oats, and rye. The other type is ryegrass. Oats will provide the earliest grazing in the fall, but it is not very cold tolerant. Wheat and rye will provide the most winter grazing in the colder months. Rye provides the least spring grazing, since it matures by mid April.

Ryegrass is the most planted of all winter annual forages. Ryegrass will provide some fall grazing and tremendous grazing in mid March, April and May. However, ryegrass produces very little growth in mid winter.

To gain the advantage of the earliness of small grain and the persistence of ryegrass, it is often recommended to plant a combination of small grains and ryegrass. Cool season legums, such as crimson, subterranean, arrowleaf, ball, or red clover can also be added to the mixture. The

addition of clover will reduce the amount of nitrogen needed and will improve the quality of the forage.

For more information on winter grazing, contact the Soil Conservation Service.

County Agents Notes

By: Danny Owen, County Agent PEACHES AND PLUMS

Now is the time to control peach tree borers on peach, nectarine, and plum trees. Trunk sprays prevent newly hatched borers from getting into trees. Preventative sprays are a must because there is no acceptable way to treat once the trees are infested. Thorough coverage of the tree trunk is essential. Hopefully you have followed the recommended spray schedule using seven, diazinon, or malathion up to this point in time. I was talking with Dr. James Jarrett at the recent Fruit Field Day and he stated that the numbers of moths have increased dramatically in the last week. This means eggs are being laid on the branches and trunk. Once they hatch, they will bore into the wood and you will no longer be able to control them. You must have the insecticide on the tree so that when they hatch, they must eat through bark that has been treated. An application of Thiodan should be made now, then one more application 3 weeks later. Use two tablespoons of Thiodan 9.7 EC per gallon of water.

HAY STORAGE

I believe that most producers realize the importance of good hay storage in order to preserve quality. The question is, "Am I losing enough to justify building a pole barn or other protection structure?" With our hot, humid weather, we lose too much quality to outside storage of round bales. Wraps will help but I feel that we need to work toward good inside storage.

It's almost that time of year again. The Tishomingo County Fair is just around the corner. Dates will be October 4th through October 8th. A great week of festivities are being planned so mark your calendar and make plans to bring the whole family.

NIGHT SHORTSIGHTEDNESS

Many people who have perfect vision in daylight have difficulty in focusing clearly upon distant objects at night. Known as night myopia, this problem often begins with headaches and fear of driving after dark. The trouble is that vision is usually tested either in daylight or in strong artificial light conditions under which night myopia cannot ordinarily be detected (Unless you report difficulty in seeing after dark). Night myopia must not be confused with night blindness, a disorder of the retina that is due to a deficiency of vitamin A or as a result of a disease called retinitis pigmentosa. Night myopia is permanent and occurs in those who, even by day, are almost, but not quite, in need of glasses for distant vision.

For mechanical reasons, when the lighting is poor, the lens has more difficulty than usual in changing its shape to focus upon objects at a distance. Night myopia is easily treated with spectacles that need to be worn only when driving after dark.

Home Economics Tips

USE CAUTION WHEN SHOPPING SALES

Does the word "sale" draw you toward a store almost as swiftly as you read the advertisement? Do you comb the morning newspapers looking for those four magic letters that almost shout out at you? Do you anticipate major holidays, in part, for the good buys that traditionally surround them?

If so, then you know from the crowds joining you that your behavior is not unique. All of us hope to find a good buy--top quality at a low price.

Most families can save 15 to 30 percent on their annual purchases by taking advantages of discounts offered through sales. But remember that finding a good buy on sale involves the same kind of thinking, planning, interpreting, comparing and judging used in determining a good buy at any time.

To get the most from your money by shopping the sales, keep the following guidelines in mind:

Now your needs and wants. Know the difference between the things you need and things you want. Aimless bargain hunting can result in useless buys and can be a waste of time, money and energy. Remember that nothing is a bargain unless you need it.

Be your own comparison shopper. Know the original price of items so you can recognize a reduced price. Compare quality, prices, dealer reliability and services.

Become familiar with "sales talk." Learn the meaning of terms used in sales, such as irregular, seconds, as is and slightly damaged. Although much sale merchandise is not defective in any way, there may be some that is. Such merchandise can be a money saver, but you need to know what you are getting. Examine sale items carefully before buying.

Shop at the start and the close of a big sale. The best selection is typically offered on the first day of a sale, but the last day may offer further price reductions.

Know store policies on sales. Find out what kind of sales are held and if sale merchandise is returnable.

Follow usual spending patterns. If you usually spend \$30 for shoes, look for \$30 shoes

reduced, or look for more expensive shoes selling for \$30. In this way, you will get the quality you usually buy for less money, or you will receive better quality for the money you generally spend.

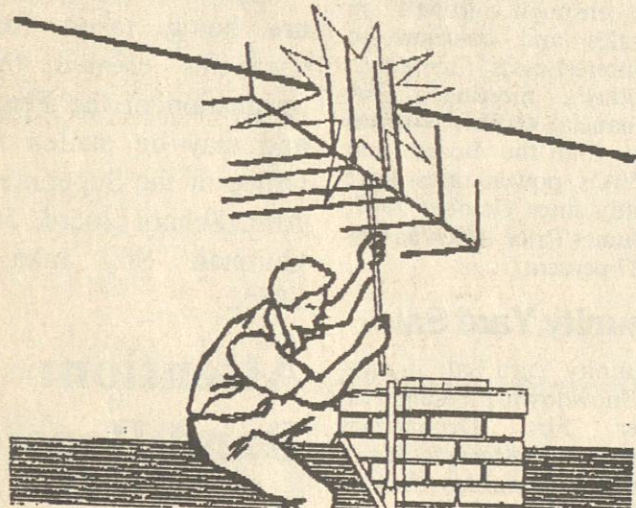
SAFETY FIRST

Unemployment Takes Seasonal Plunge

Mississippi's unemployment rate dropped one and one-tenth percentage points from June to July due to seasonal factors, according to information released today by Mississippi Employment Security Commission. The July rate was 7.0 percent, down from 8.1 percent in June but up from 6.4 percent for July 1993.

Despite downturns in agricultural and manufacturing jobs, employment grew in July by over 9,000 jobs. The ranks of the unemployed decreased by nearly 15,000 persons.

"Over the last two decades the drop between June and July has run at about this same ratio," said Raiford Crews, chief of labor market information for MESC.

Students and schools workers seeking summer jobs played two roles in the drop. Those who found work added to the numbers of employed. In many cases, those who did not find work by mid-July gave up the search, left the job market and consequently were not counted as unemployed. This phenomenon occurs regularly in July and accounts for the usual large drop from June rates, said Crews.

In July, Mississippi's non-farm industries provided 1,025,000 jobs. This was down by 8,700 jobs from June. Comparing by category, service producing jobs dropped by 6,300 over the month with 6,200 fewer jobs in education and 2,400 fewer in trade. Much of the drop in trade was also school related. Goods producing industries dropped by 2,400 jobs from June.

"All these losses were seasonal in nature and should not be interpreted as trends," Crews said. "To prove the point, consider the changes from one year ago. These same employers are providing 35,400 (3.6 percent) more jobs than in July 1993."

Goods producing industries

grew by 9,500 jobs, with mining up 100, construction up 2,600 and durable goods manufacturing up 8,800 jobs.

Service producing industries fared even better, adding 25,900 over the year. Trade, services and government showed the most growth. Trade was up 6,000 jobs, government was up 3,800, and services gained 16,000. Leading the services sector over the year were casinos, growing by 9,600 jobs, and health care, adding 3,100 more.

Safety Tips For The Back-To-School Season

While spring and summer are typically peak months for increases in injury rates, many injuries also happen during the back-to-school season. As children adjust to the routine of a daily school schedule, they need to learn safe ways to travel to and from school.

"Parents need to be aware that over the summer their children may have forgotten the safety lessons they learned from previous years," said Susan A. Helms, R.N., B.P.S., Coordinator, Mid-South SAFE KIDS Coalition. "Parents need to take an active role by teaching children back-to-school safety and reviewing their own safety measures each season."

The Mid-South SAFE KIDS Coalition, headquartered at Le Bonheur, offers the following guidelines to help parents and children this fall.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

According to the National

Center for Health Statistics, pedestrian injuries have become the second leading cause of unintentional death among children ages five to 14. The Center reports that each year approximately 1,000 children age 14 and under die in pedestrian incidents.

For children who walk to school, parents should choose the safest route and walk it with their children. They should look for the most direct route with the fewest street crossings and walk the route with children until they demonstrate traffic safety awareness. Children under eight years old should walk with an adult or older child every day, taking the same route and avoiding shortcuts.

Children should be taught the meaning of all traffic markers.

Children should be taught to look in all directions before crossing the street. They should look left, right, then left again before attempting to cross, and they should stay alert while crossing.

Children should not enter the street from between parked cars or from behind bushes or shrubs. Darting into the street accounts for 50 to 70 percent of pedestrian injuries among children ages nine and under.

Children should be taught to cross the street at a corner or crosswalk. They should allow plenty of time to cross, and they should not run across intersections. Children should listen to adult crossing guards or safety patrols at monitored intersections.

Children should be warned to be extra alert in bad weather. Visibility may be poor, and motorists may not be able to stop quickly.

Parents should demonstrate proper pedestrian safety by being good role models.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

An estimated 22 million students ride school buses daily. Many injuries occur when children are boarding or exiting because a blind spot extends about 10 feet in front of the bus, obstructing the view of the driver. Children may believe that if they can see the bus, the bus driver can see them.

While waiting for the bus, kids

should arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus arrives. They should stay out of the street and avoid horseplay. They should always wait for their parents on the same side of the street as the school bus loading/unloading zone. Children should cross at least 10 feet in front of the bus.

On the bus, children should remain seated at all times and keep the aisles clear. They should not throw objects, and they should not unnecessarily distract the bus driver. Children should keep their head and arms inside the bus at all times.

When boarding or leaving the bus, children should walk in a single file line and use the handrail to avoid falls. They should wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before exiting.

RIDING BIKES TO SCHOOL

Children who ride their bikes to school should always wear a helmet. Bike helmets have been shown to reduce the risk of head injury by almost 90 percent.

Children should not ride on the road without direct adult supervision until about the age 10.

Parents should choose a safe cycling route. A safe cycling route to school may not be the same as a safe walking route. Streets with a steady flow of fast moving are not appropriate for young cyclists with limited traffic experience.

Children who ride bikes to school should be taught to follow the rules of the road that apply to all vehicles. All too often, children ride out into the street without first looking for or yielding traffic; engage in risky behavior and make false assumptions about other vehicles at intersections; and swerve suddenly without signaling or looking for approaching traffic or ride against the flow of traffic.

Children should not be allowed to ride home from school after dark. Riding in non-daylight conditions (at dawn, dusk or night) is 3.6 times more risky for children ages 14 and under than riding in the daytime.

Children should park their

bikes in "safe areas", such as bike racks provided by schools.

DRIVING YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL

Parents who drive children to school or park in car pools should arrange to pick up their children at a spot away from the congested cars around the school.

Parents should drop off children as close to school as possible so that they do not have to cross the street.

Parents should not carry more passengers than there are seats in the car. Every passenger should wear a safety belt.

Drivers should allow extra time in the schedule to avoid the pressure of driving too fast.

The Mid-South SAFE KIDS Coalition is part of the National SAFE KIDS Campaign, a term effort to prevent child injury, the number one killer of kids ages 14 and under. More than 80 national organizations and 160 Coalitions in 47 states and the District of Columbia are taking part in the campaign. Vice President and Mrs. Al Gore are Honorary Chairs, and U.S. Surgeon General C. Everett Koop, M.D., is Chairman of the Campaign.

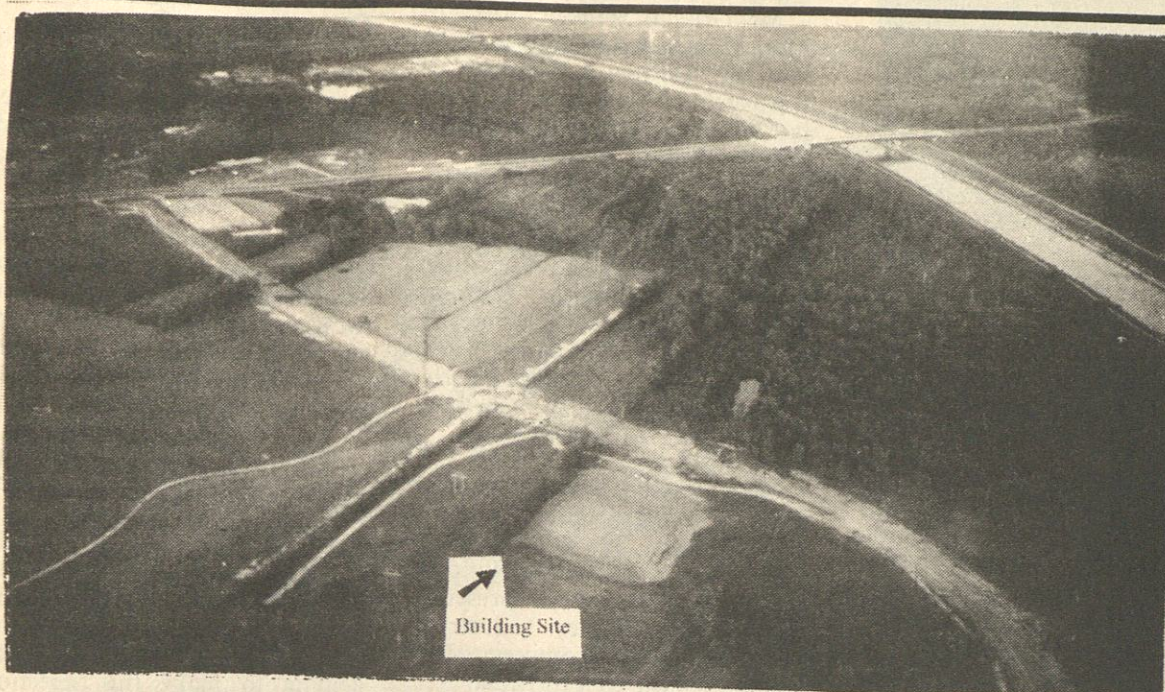

Does Anyone Recognize This Building?.....

It's the one room, one teacher school known as Boggs Chapel School. The school taught grades 1 through 8. After finishing there they went to Paden or Tishomingo.

In the early 1900's, just a few miles from Paden, was a school called the Pace School. After this school closed part of the students went to Bethlehem and part to Boggs Chapel, where they had school in the church building until a school house could be built. Earnest Ligon was the first teacher. Other teachers were: Miss Scott, Miss Williams, Dixie Massey, Bonnie Bickerstaff, Ollie Selby, Ruth Massey, Kern Belue, Alver Belue, Ouida Humber, Olene Rikard, Ila Tucker Trimm who taught from 1938 to 1943 with a perfect attendance for the 5 years. During that time the school went from 5 months to 8 months and began receiving free text books. They also won a set of Encyclopedia given by Sears Roebuck for improvement of the school. Teachers following Ila Trimm were Beatrice Joslin, Artie House, Ruth Dawson, Jean Deaton Luttrell, and Bennie Sue Crane Williams. Ruth Dawson taught more years in succession than anyone, from 1945 to 1952 Bennie Sue Crane Williams was the teacher the year the school closed.

It would be impossible to name

all the students but, Mrs. Lessie Humber Deaton was in one of the first classes started there. Other family names were: Owens, Ligon, Twitty, Massey, Frederick, Rutherford, Searcy, Luttrell, Tucker, Bryant, Epps, Belue, Cadle, Borden, Anglin, Dawson, Strickland, Buchanan, Puckett, Deaton, House, Scruggs, Hill, McKee, Cox, Meeks, Floyd, South, Moore, Turner, McVay, Flanagan, and Davis. There are probably others we can't recall Paden School got a good number of good students who went on to graduate from high school.

Allergy & Hay Fever Sufferers Prepare For Harsh Season

People who suffer from allergies and hay fever should prepare for a pretty harsh season according to area allergists and immunologists. With the heavy amount of rainfall in Memphis and the Mid-South this summer, plants that produce pollen have grown larger than normal, and they are likely to produce more than their usual amounts of pollen.

One such plant is ragweed. "People who are allergic to ragweed are in for a tough allergy season because this pollen-producing plant has grown rampant due to the summer's weather," says Michael S. Blaiss, M.D., Pediatric Allergist/Immunologist, Le Bonheur, Associate Professor of Pediatrics, University of Tennessee, Memphis.

Dr. Blaiss says the symptoms often associated with allergies and hay fever, including itchy, watery eyes, repetitive sneezing and clear nasal drainage, will most likely be more severe than they have been in the past few years.

"The first cases of hay fever and severe allergies usually begin in the middle of August, but the worst time seems to be in September," he says. "Dr. Blaiss. The season lasts until the first frost."

Dr. Blaiss suggests trying over-the-counter medications with antihistamines. However, he advises patients to take them with caution since many of them cause drowsiness. There are also several over-the-counter eye drops to help relieve itchy, watery eyes.

If symptoms are not better in a few days, Dr. Blaiss says patients may need to see their doctor, who can prescribe non-sedating medications, as well as non-addictive nasal sprays. Additionally, Dr. Blaiss says over-the-counter nasal sprays should not be used to relieve allergies.

"Other than treating allergies with medications, allergy and hay fever sufferers should try to stay inside as much as possible," Dr. Blaiss suggests. "Also, keep the windows in homes and automobiles closed to help keep the pollen out."

Dr. Blaiss says the main difference between allergies, hay fever and colds is that people with allergies and hay fever do not actually run a fever even though they often feel hot.

Senate Committee Approves Funding For Educational Programs

The Senate Appropriations Committee has approved the Senate Labor, Health and Human Services and Education Subcommittee's bill for education and health programs, including \$7 billion for the Chapter 1 Program for Disadvantaged Students, Senator Thad Cochran (R-Miss.) announced today.

Mississippi's share of Chapter 1 funds could be as high as \$175 million, pending the outcome of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act Reauthorization bill.

An amendment offered by Senator Cochran was approved by the Committee to add \$20 million to support greater integration of technology into school classrooms. The funds would be used to carry out provisions of his Technology for Education Act of 1994.

"In my opinion this is a very cost-effective way for the federal government to help schools meet the educational challenges they face," said Cochran.

Other Cochran initiatives approved by the Committee include \$114 million for Tech Prep, a popular program that couples the last two years of high school with the first two years of college for an associate degree in a technical field; \$33 million for the Star Schools program, to incorporate satellite technology in the classroom; \$10 million for Ready to Learn, a program which helps prepare preschoolers for the first grade; \$3.2 million to fund the fourth year of the National Writing Project; and \$8 million for Library Literacy Programs.

The Committee also approved \$11.8 billion for college student

financial assistance.

"These funds will be very helpful to our state and the students in our schools and colleges," Cochran said.

For health-related programs, the Committee provided at Senator Cochran's request \$5 million for the State offices of Rural Health. These offices help rural communities make the most of existing resources and assist in the development of new systems of health care.

The bill now goes to the Senate floor for consideration.

Counties Receive Benefits For MHSP Citations

When traffic law violators receive a citation, there are benefits. The largest part of the money collected in fines remains in the individual county to provide local services.

In 1993, a statewide total of \$4,554,656 was generated by citations issued by officers of the Mississippi Highway Patrol. The average traffic fine on a traffic ticket is \$82.72. All revenue from tickets issued by state troopers stays in the county where the ticket is issued except for \$17 earmarked for various state assessment programs. Of the \$5,061 tickets issued in 1993, \$936,037 went to the state assessment programs and \$3,618,619 remained in the counties.

State assessment programs receiving money from traffic tickets include the State Law Library, Mississippi Alcohol Safety Education Program, Federal-State Alcohol Program, Driver Education and correctional facilities.

No portion of any fines collected from patrol-issued tickets is paid to Mississippi's general fund or the Highway Patrol budget.

Patrolmen To Increase Manpower Labor Day Weekend.....

Labor Day is the last major holiday of the summer and heavy traffic is anticipated near recreational areas.

"Because we envision congestion on specific highways, state troopers will be paying close attention to speeding and reckless drivers," said Col. Jay Clark, director of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol. "We also will be on the watch for drivers under the influence of drugs or alcohol (DUI) and for those who may be too exhausted to continue

driving."

The holiday begins at 6 p.m. on Friday, September 2 and ends at midnight on Monday, Sept. 5.

"Our goal is to reduce the number of fatalities on Mississippi's highways," Clark said. "Traffic law violators will be ticketed and drivers under the influence will be arrested."

The patrol will have 75 troopers working 600 hours of overtime in addition to the regularly scheduled officers.

Troopers will be using motorcycles and aircraft along with regular enforcement vehicles. Air surveillance is used to alert nearby ground enforcement units of speeders and stranded motorists.

Roadblocks are planned to for expired driver licenses, inspection stickers, tags and motorists who may be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Vehicles equipped with cameras will be in use, too. cameras are especially when stopping motorists suspected of driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol," Col. Clark said. "When a suspect sees video camera he is less likely to contest the charges."
